

PROCEEDINGS

The twenty-first Annual Woman's Auxiliary Convention of North Carolina met with the Kenly Church, May 20, 1948.

The opening devotions, "More Than Conquerors with Christ" led by Mrs. R. N. Hinnant, using as her scripture lesson Romans 8:26-27. Prayer by Mrs. Hinnant. Special message in song by Mrs. Barnes and Mr. Hinnant, "Follow Me."

Words of welcome were spoken by Mrs. Julius Corbett with response by Mrs. Lupton.

MORNING SESSION

The president, Mrs. J. C. Griffin, made some timely remarks on being "More Than Conquerors through Literature and Enlistment," Mrs. M. Second, put on the whole armor of God, third, study our Bibles, apply teachings to our every day lives. Hebrews 11:2—"For the word of God is quick and powerful and sharper than any two edged sword."

"More Than Conquerors through Literature and Enlisitment," Mrs. M. A. Woodard, first vice-president, said if we enlist ourselves we will be able to enlist others. She was much encouraged over the number of church libraries, which furnishes good literature for evereyone. Our Bibles should come first and is the best literature we can read. The young people are anxious to read good books, let's make them available to them through our church libraries.

"More Than Conquerors in the lives of our Youth," second vice-president, Mrs. L. E. Ballard; stressing the many opportunities to work with our youth through Daily Vacation Bible Schools, Leagues, and Youth Auxiliaries. It trains them in church and auxiliary work. She asked each auxiliary to send one young person to Cragmont this summer. Urged us to keep on keeping on in the building in the lives of our youth.

"More Than Conquerors through Records," Mrs. J. C. Sasser, Secretary, gave report of work done. Executive Committee minutes read and approved.

The treasurer, Mrs. Georgie F. Barnes, gave a part of her report.

The hymn, "Fling Out the Banner," sung by the audience. A special message in song by Mrs. Ballard and Mrs. Moye. "No One Ever Cared for Me Like Jesus." Mrs. Ballard introduced Miss Zalene Lloyd who brought the Convention message, using as her subject, "More than Conquerors through Christ which Strengthens Us." Miss Lloyd very impressively told of her soon departure for the foreign fields of India and urged us to continue to pray for her that through Christ and Him alone, she can conquer by leading

some benighted soul to a saving knowledge of our Lord. An offering was taken for Miss Lloyd to the amount of \$86.00. A prayer of thanks by Rev. Paul Ketterman. Special message in song, "Where He Leads Me," by Mrs. Moye and Mrs. Ballard beautifully rendered. Dismissed for lunch by Rev. E. G. Holland.

AFTERNOON SESSION

Opening song, "Savior Like a Shepherd Lead Me." Prayer by Rev. Albert Harris.

"More Than Conquerors in Personal Service," sixth vice-president, Mrs. James A. Evans, stressing the need of helping our retired ministers and making their lives as pleasant and comfortable in their last days. Her entire program was dedicated to one of our beloved ministers who has just passed on, Rev. W. B. Everett. Special message in song, "Never Grow Old," by Mrs. Jack Barnes, Mrs. J. C. Moye, Rev. R. P. Harris and Rev. R. N. Hinnant. Dedicated prayer by Mrs. Ballard.

Treasurer's report completed—Mrs. Barnes asked that we be allowed to print minutes with church body. Report approved and accepted. Offering for Orphanage taken at this time because Mrs. Barnes had to leave. Amount \$49.42.

"More Than Conquerors through Sending Forth the Words unto the Ends of the Earth," third vice-president, Mrs. Alice Lupton, urging that we be fruit bearing Christians in order that we carry the mission work at home and in the foreign fields. Mrs. Lupton said the N. C. State Convention was organized in Goldsboro, N. C., twenty-one years ago. In her message she was praising the Lord for the help and strength in organizing this work and for the progress made in twenty-one years. She expressed her appreciation to the Convention for the co-operation in making the foreign missionary work possible.

"More than Conquerors as Good Stewards," fourth vice-president, Mrs. E. G. Holland, stressing the need of building a bridge of understanding so that we might be a shining light and can help others to know Christ. She urged each member to prove her love as Christ proved His love to us. She urged us to be a good steward in all phases of the work. If we are good stewards we will be conquerors with Christ.

"More Than Conquerors through Ministry to Orphans," fifth vice-president Mrs. J. C. Moye, stating that she was much pleased with the year's report. She urged that we not neglect the obligation which has been accepted by the different Auxiliaries in the refurnishing of the girls' building. Reminded all not to forget coupons, can fruit and other commodities which can be used.

"More Than Conquerors through Better Organization" field worker, Mrs. Maurice Roach, listing four things it takes for a better organization, namely, compassion, co-operation, perseverence, and faith. Truly a better organization is what women need. She urged each local auxiliary be informed that the New Field Worker needs pay for her services.

Rev. Henry Melvin brought greetings and a report from our Bible Col-

legs at Nashville, Tenn. There were fourteen to graduate from the college this year. The greatest challenge before us is the open doors into which we can help our youth to enter. He stated that the college is a success and the people of the State are responsible. It is doing the very best it can under the circumstances and asked the prayers of the people and the co-operation to meet the needs of our youth.

Mr. Teasley brought greetings from Cragmont urging that as many go to Cragmont as possible, also asked each Pastor to send in the \$100.00 as early as possible. He gave dates for each group to attend the meetings.

Mrs. Ballard reminded the women of the date for Third Annual Women's Auxiliary Conference at Cragmont and gave her report.

Resolution Committee gave their report (see reports).

Petition Committee had no report as they had to wait on Albemarle District.

Nominating Committee gave their report (see reports).

A motion was made that Mrs. J. C. Griffin be put on as a stockholder to replace Mrs. Elizabeth Pollard. Carried.

A motion by Mrs. J. C. Moye, that the State Auxiliary go on record as having three representatives on Board of Stockholders of Cragmont instead of six and that other bodies be requested to do the same. Motion seconded by Mrs. J. P. Woodard. Motion passed.

Rev. J. A. Evans gave a short message, thanking the Convention for loyal support in his eight years as Superintendent of the Orphanage.

Mrs. J. C. Griffin requested Mrs. Lupton to prepare all data on the Women's work and present it to the Executive Board.

Mrs. Lupton reported that the Week of Prayer throughout North Carolina was a terrific success and expressed appreciation for the way "Footprints of Jesus" was accepted. Rising vote of thanks was given Mrs. Lupton for giving said booklet to convention.

Mrs. Lupton was appointed as delegate to National Auxiliary Convention at Pocahontas, Ark. Mrs. Harold Mallard suggested that we give the last year officers a rising vote of thanks.

A very impressive ceremony for the installation of officers was presided over by Mrs. Bagley Morris.
