AN EXPERIENCED AND A SERVICE

PROCEEDINGS -

The meeting was called to order by the president and Mrs. J. C. Moye, music director for the day, led the congregation in singing "All Hail the Power." Rev. Herman Hersey accompanied at the piano.

Morning devotions were led by Mrs. George Suggs using John 8:32 as her Scripture. After a brief but inspiring message, Miss Ada Beth Hickman favored the group with a solo, "Open Mine Eyes."

The convention was given an unusually hearty welcome to Bladenboro and the Pee Dee District by Mrs. H. C. Adcox of White Oak Church. Mrs. Clement Sullivan, of Pikeville, responded saying that we were happy to be present and felt sure that we would have a profitable day for the Lord.

In the president's message, Mrs. Ballard stressed the fact that the light of truth awakens only as we allow its rays to penetrate our hearts and minds;—as we study it and are obedient to its command.

Mrs. Ballard paid tribute to Mrs. J. C. Griffin for her splendid work in the state. She said that our Woman's Auxiliary work is better coordinated than ever before.

All auxiliaries were urged to continue sending their per capita dues and offerings for the state convention. We cannot promote our work without suffcient funds.

Following the president's message we were led in special prayer for the sick by Rev. W. H. Lancaster.

Mrs. Albert Coats and Mrs. Alice E. Lupton, two of our officers, were unable to be present due to illness. The secretary was instructed to send both of them cards.

The ministers present were welcomed and recognized. Each one was given an opportunity to make any remarks he wished to make.

The following ministers were present: Rev. Earl Glenn, Rev. M. E. Godwin, Rev. J. C. Griffin, Rev. R. H. Jackson, Rev. W. H. Lancaster, Rev. Adam Scott, Rev. L. L. Parker, Rev. S. A. Smith, Rev. Herman Hersey, Rev. Carey Cheshire, Rev. D. L. Whaley, Rev. Walter Carter, Rev. C. M. Coates, and Rev. J. Walter Jernigan.

The district presidents were then recognized, and the following were present: Mrs. Clement Sullivan, Western; Mrs. Carl Dudley, Cape Fear; Mrs. H. C. Adcox, Pee Dee; Mrs. Walter Carter, Piedmont, and Mrs. Jimmy Jones, Central.

Minutes of the last session and minutes of all the executive committee meetings were read and approved referring all resolutions to the resolutions committee.

The secretary then read the yearly report compiled from reports sent in by seven of the eight districts. See reports.

Mrs. H. L. Spivey, Orphanage chairman, urged that we continue sending sheets and pillow cases to the orphanage. "Their beds must be changed the same as ours and linens have a way of wearing out," she stated.

Rev. and Mrs. S. A. Smith, superintendent of the orphanage at Middlesex, reported needs of the home and urged our continued support. He thanked us for

our support during the past year and reported that N. C. Woman's Auxiliaries had sent \$7,890.62 to the orphanage in 1952.

The Stoney Creek Trio rendered special music at this time which was thoroughly enjoyed by everyone.

The president then appointed the following committees:

Nominating Committee (For field worker and Cragmont representative): Mrs. Clement Sullivan, Mrs. Wade Davis and Mrs. D. L. Whaley.

Finance Committee: Mrs. M. A. Woodard, Mrs. M. E. Godwin, Mrs. Charles Simpson and Mrs. N. E. Harris.

Resolutions Committee: Mrs. J. K. Rhodes, Mrs. Adam Scott and Mrs. Jimmy Jones. Courtesy Committee: Mrs. Earl Glenn, Mrs. B. T. Dail and Mrs. Almand Warrick.

The message of the day was brought by Miss Zaline Lloyd, returned missionary from India. Using as her topic, "The Light of Truth Awakens Missionary Endeavors," Miss Lloyd stated that we do not have to go to foreign countries to be missionaries, but that we need first to be missionaries at home by witnessing to those around about us. God's means of sending forth the light and the truth is through man. We must go forth as warriors into battle fighting a war against sin and wrong and bearing light and truth. Those who remain faithful "Shall doubtless come again with rejoicing bringing his sheaves with him" (Isaiah 55:11), said Miss Lloyd.

The convention was dismissed for lunch.

- AFTERNOON SESSION

This session was opened by the congregational singing of "Co-Laborers," the National Auxiliary song.

Mrs. Carl Dudley then paid tribute to our deceased of 1952 in a very impressive way. The Bible was laid open on the table and a candle in holder, placed on either side. Behind the Bible was placed a beautiful arrangement of white flowers. Standing back of this scene, Mrs. Dudley read a fitting tribute and poem. The Stoney Creek Trio sung "Where the Roses Never Fade." A period of silent prayer followed and was closed by Rev. D. L. Whaley.

Mrs. Walter Carter, Enlistment chairman, urged that each local enlistment chairman secure the names of all women in her church from the church clerk. Give each member names of women to contact and go to work to enlist every woman in the auxiliary. She suggested that each woman spend 10 cents each month for post cards and send them to absentees and prospective members.

Mrs. Bagley Morris, Youth chairman, suggested a six point program for this year and urged that all local youth chairmen stand behind this program with their support.

- 1. Organize Youth Auxiliaries
- 2. Support Anna Phillips Loan Fund to help educate our youth
- 3. Bible College
- 4. Youth Conferences at Cragmont
- 5. Daily Vacation Bible Schools

- 6. Sponsor a Stewardship Declamation contest locally, then in a state-wide rally, and finally sending the winner to the National Woman's Auxiliary Convention.
- Mrs. H. C. Adcox, Program and Publicity chairman, urged that we try to have interesting and inspiring program at each meeting. "Remember that some work needs to be done ahead of time in order for a program to be worthwhile," stated Mrs. Adcox.

Study Course Chairman Mrs. Alice Lupton, and Benevolence Chairman Mrs. Albert T. Coates, were absent due to illness.

Mrs. J. C. Griffin, State Field Worker, reported that this was the greatest year thus far and that the cooperation was the best ever. She said the district presidents were wonderful helpers this year and urged their continued cooperation for the incoming field worker. (See Reports)

YPA time was conducted by Mrs. Bagley Morris. She urged that everyone do his or her bit to encourage youth. Youth of today needs encouragement as never before. Do what you can to strengthen their faith and understanding of the Bible truths.

Two girls sung a duet at this time, stating that the song was their personal testimony; "I'd Rather Have Jesus." Bobby Aycock of the Wilson Church, and Gene Outland, Union Grove, gave their testimonies as to what youth work and woman's auxiliary meant to them.

Mrs. Ballard, director of Woman's Conference at Cragmont, lead the women in singing the favorite chorus at Cragmont, "All My Sins are Gone." She announced that Cragmont would be dedicated at noon on June 10 and Mrs. J. C. Moye was appointed to represent the N. C. Woman's Auxiliary Convention at this dedication. Mrs. Ballard then gave the report of the 1952 conferences.

Motion duly sustained to add to constitution article No. 5. The date of the N. C. Woman's Auxiliary Convention shall be Thursday between third and fourth Sundays in May.

Motion duly sustained to change article No. 6 of by-laws to read: All money shall be placed in some reliable bank and disbursement made by check. Quarterly reports shall be made to our State Church paper.

Motion duly sustained to amend a former motion passed at 1952 Auxiliary Convention; amendment to read thus:

That the N. C. Woman's Auxiliary Convention allow the local auxiliaries to be counted A-1 if they have an active FWB League under the direction of the local youth chairman of the Woman's Auxiliary if they cannot have a PYA or GTA and have met all the other requirements.

Motion duly sustained that the Executive Committee work out an agreeable means of remuneration with the state field worker.

The following committees made reports: Finance, Resolutions, Nominating, Courtesy, and Treasurer's report. Reports of each of the above committees were accepted by the Convention. (See Reports)

The Stoney Creek Trio sung as a closing number "The Love of God." We were adjourned with prayer by Rev. Adam Scott.

On October 21, 1952, I received the first money for the "College Organ Fund." On Jan. 1, 1953, I sent the last of the third monthly checks to the national treasurer. Our quota was \$420.00-\$140.00 for Nov., Dec., and Jan. Some money was sent directly to the national treasurer, and all told, we went \$20.00 over the top of our quata of \$440.00. This was a national project.

On March 4, this year, I received the first money for a N. C. state project which we undertook shortly after the Missionary Conference at Hull Road Church, where we learned from Mrs. Mabel Willey, visiting missionary from Cuba, that the building housing her and her family and the Cuban office of missions was badly in need of a new roof. To date we have almost reached our goal of \$500.00. If you have not sent a contribution for this cause, please do so right away. Fine work you've done.

The Hickory Chapel Woman's Auxiliary recently sent me a check for \$81.75 to be used in the purchase of an adding machine for Miss Lucy Wisehart, a Bible College student, who plans to go to Cuba in the near future as a worker on the mission field there. Thanks to Hickory Chapel W.A.

MINUTES OF EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETINGS NOVEMBER 4, 1952

The Executive Committee of the N. C. State Auxiliary Convention met Nov. 4, 1952, at the Free Will Baptist Church in Wilson, N. C. The meeting was called to order by the president, Mrs. L. E. Ballard, and was opened with the singing of the hymn "Co-Laborers." This is the newly adopted National Auxiliary song. Rev. J. C. Griffin then led in prayer, followed by Scripture reading by Mrs. Clement Sullivan, president of the Western District.

The roll was called, and all officers were present except the directors of Benevolence and Enlistment, with Mrs. J. C. Moye serving as proxy for the chairman of Program and Publicity. Four visitors were present.

The minutes of the last convention were read and approved.

The various department chairmen made oral reports and recommendations for the year.

Mrs. J. C. Griffin made a motion that we recommend to the State Convention that the 10 cents per capita dues be used for an operational fund. Motion carried.

Motion made and carried that Mrs. L. E. Ballard continue as director of Woman's Conference with Mrs. J. C. Moye as her assistant.

Motion made and carried to have 20,000 individual report blanks printed at the best possible price. Mrs. Ballard was to look after this.

The secretary was instructed to investigate cost of stationery and report at a later meeting,

The secretary was instructed to proceed to have minutes of the 1952 session of the Auxiliary Convention printed at best possible arrangements with the F.W.B. Press, Ayden, N. C.

Motion made and carried that we contact officers of N. C. State Sunday School Convention and make arrangements to have our minutes printed with theirs, sharing the cost proportionately.

Motion carried to add the office of vice-president to our organization, since all other officers are now chairman instead of vice-presidents, and that this article be added to our constitution and by-laws. The duties of the vice-president shall be to assist the president and preside in her absence.

Mrs. J. C. Moye was duly elected as vice-president.

The secretary read a letter from Rev. R. N. Hinnant, secretary of N. C. State Convention, in regards to placing a woman on the Orphanage Board. Motion made and carried that we recommend Mrs. J. C. Moye from the Central Conference and Mrs. M. E. Godwin from the Cape Fear Conference to the Nominating Committee of the N. C. State Convention to serve on the Orphanage Board.

On motion we adjourn with prayer by Mrs. Alice E. Lupton.

The Executive Committee of the N. C. State Auxiliary Convention met Tuesday, January 13, 1953, at the Free Will Baptist Church in Wilson, N. C. The meeting was called to order by the president, Mrs. L. E. Ballard, and was opened with the singing of the hymn, "A Charge to Keep I Have." Rev. J. C. Moye led in prayer, followed by the reading, in unison, of a passage from the hymnal entitled "Service."

All officers were present or represented by proxy except the director of study course. Four visitors were present.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Motion made that all district presidents become members of the State Auxiliary Convention Executive Board and that their expenses to meeting be paid by their respective district conventions. Motion carried. Four district conventions were represented by their presidents at this meeting.

There followed the planning of the program for the 1953 session of the convention, to convene on Thursday, May 21, 1953, with White Oak Branch, Bladenboro, N. C., using the theme, "The Light of Truth Awakens."

Mrs. J. C. Moye made a motion that the secretary write Rev. R. N. Hinnant, secretary of the State Convention, and ask him to inform us as to why our minutes were not printed with those of the State Convention this year as has been the custom in years past. Also, tell him that we wish to continue having our minutes printed with the State Convention minutes. Motion carried.

Mrs. M. A. Woodard, treasurer, was instructed to contact the F. W. B. Press concerning the bill for printing of 1952 minutes and make best possible settlement.

The secretary was instructed to send a notice to "The Free Will Baptist" to inform all local secretaries to order their "Individual Monthly Report Blanks" from their district secretaries.

The secretary was also asked to send a notice to "The Free Will Baptist" asking all auxiliaries to please increase their contributions this year to the district and state conventions.

The secretary was instructed to have one thousand registration cards printed to be used by the district conventions.

Mrs. Ballard, our president, asked that we use March to hold our officers clinics in all the districts. She stated that Mrs. Griffin, our field worker, will be available to help conduct these clinics. We were asked to make plans and contact Mrs. Griffin in plenty of time for her to arrange her itinerary.

Motion was made and carried that all local auxiliaries report from April 1 through December 31 for the year 1952, and hereafter report from January 1 through December 31. This would put all reports on a calendar year basis.

Motion made and carried that we recommend to the district conventions that they ask their local auxiliaries to make annual reports to the spring conventions but send contributions to both spring and fall conventions; and that the fall convention be inspirational without reports.

Motion made and carried to authorize secretary to purchase stationery for the convention. Mrs. J. C. Griffin made a motion that the \$30.00 in our treasury for National literature be placed in our promotional fund and that all future literature receipts be placed in this fund also. Motion carried.

On motion we adjourn with prayer by Mrs. H. C. Adcox.

MARCH 17, 1953

The Executive Committee of the N. C. State Auxiliary Convention met Monday, March 17, 1953, at the Free Will Baptist Church in Goldsboro, N. C. The meeting was called to order by the president, Mrs. L. E. Ballard, and was opened by repeating in unison the Auxiliary Motto, "Laborers together with God."—Cor. 3:9.

The roll was called with all members present except the following chairmen:

Enlistment, Orphanage, and Study Course. There were two visitors present.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Motion was made to instruct Mrs. Thomas E. Willey, our missionary in Cuba, to proceed with having a new roof put on the mission home there and assure her that the N. C. Auxiliaries will replace the money for same. Motion carried.

Motion made to increase the price of the book, "Footprints of Jesus," to 35 cents. Motion carried.

Motion made that we sponsor a stewardship declamation contest for our youth and have competent, experienced judges. Mrs. Bagley Morris, Youth Chairman, to work out all details as to time and place of contest and materials to be used. Motion carried.

Mrs. Ballard gave a report of the tentative program for Cragomnt Conferences, this summer, June 15-19 first conference, and August 10-17 (Homecoming Time).

Mrs. Carl Dudley made a motion that we pay our director of Cragmont Woman's Conference \$50.00 per week for the two conference weeks. Motion carried.

- Rev. S. A. Smith, Superintendent of the Orphanage at Middlesex, came before us stating needs at the Orphanage. He urged that we study the needs and get our minds and hearts into a building program, and pledge the support of the auxiliaries in this effort to provide suitable buildings to take care of our children there.
- Mrs. J. C. Moye made a motion that we go on record as sponsoring whatever program our superintendent might work out that is most advantageous for the children. Motion carried.

Motion was made that we print a guidebook for N. C. F. W. B. Woman's Auxiliaries instead of using the 1953 W. N. A. C. Manual of Methods, and that the constitution and by-laws of the N. C. F. W. B. Woman's Auxiliary Convention, and an installation service also be printed under the same cover; this guidebook not to be revised or changed without consent of the convention. Motion carried.

Mrs. L. E. Ballard, Mrs. J. C. Griffin, and Mrs. Alice E. Lupton were selected as a committee to prepare and have the guidebook printed; Mrs. Ballard to be editor-in-chief, with the others as contributors.

Motion made that we recommend to the district and state conventions that all monies be used from their treasuries for promotional work of N. C. Woman's Auxiliaries and not allocated out for all the phases of denominational work. Motion carried.


