

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PROCEEDINGS

Minutes of the thirtieth annual session of the North Carolina Free Will Baptist Woman's Auxiliary Convention convening with Shady Grove Church, Sampson County, May 23, 1957.

Theme: "The Light Shines" (The light of the past shines on the path of the auxiliary today.)

Founder's Day Observance: 50 years Auxiliary work in North Carolina. 50 years "Labourers together with God" (1 Corinthians 3:9).

The convention was called to order by the president, Mrs. Carl Dudley, and the congregation was led in singing the Doxology by Mrs. J. C. Sasser, music director for the day.

Miss Juanita Dunn led in the opening devotions; topic, "Scenes of the Past Challenges our Work Today." Scripture, Psalm 11:3 and 1 Corinthians 3:10-15.

We were welcomed to Shady Grove Church and the Cape Fear district by Mrs. Norvelle Dawson, Cape Fear district president. She expressed a very warm and hearty welcome to all in attendance. Mrs. M. L. Johnson, president of the Western Auxiliary Convention, responded.

Prayer of invocation was led by the Rev. J. W. Alford.

Mrs. Carl Dudley, the president, in her message thanked each one who had served so faithfully this year, and urged all to continue throughout the day, as we commemorate fifty years of service. As we leave to return to our respective churches, may we be inspired to ask God to lead us in a marvelous way during the next fifty years. Mrs. Cecil Campbell, national stewardship prayer chairman, was recognized at this time.

We were favored with a duet by Misses Judy Jernigan and Linda Lou Godwin, "I'm in Love with the Lover of My Soul."

Executive committee minutes were read and approved, with the exception of Anna Phillips Loan Fund rules in the minutes of September 4, to be adopted later.

A Pageant, "Viewing Fifty Years of Progress," under the direction of Mrs. L. E. Ballard, was presented at this time. It was very challenging and inspiring, as it took us step by step over the fifty years. The following is a brief summary of the pageant: Mrs. J. C. Moye sang "Sunrise Tomorrow," which was followed by a memorial prayer by Rev. L. R. Ennis. Two pioneers of the past, Mrs. Alice E. Lupton and Mrs. Sudie Garrison, who were present at the first ladies aid society meeting in New Bern, were present with us today, and were duly honored. Mrs. Lupton was declared the leading pioneer of auxiliary work in North Carolina. Leaders in the eight districts were honored: Mrs. Henry Melvin, Mrs. J. C. Moye, Mrs. L. E. Ballard, Mrs. Alice E. Lupton, and our present president Mrs. Carl Dudley. To each one was given a small gift. Three past presidents were unable to be present, and they sent letters of regret, Mrs. C. B. Thompson, Mrs. Georgia Frost Barnes and Mrs. Clarence Bowen.

Rev. Burkette Raper, president of Mount Olive College, brought news from the college. He requested that the convention support the campaign to furnish rooms in the new college dormitory, at \$250 each. He also requested that the vacation Bible school offerings be sent to the college for the building fund, and made a stirring appeal for Free Will Baptist support of Christian education of our youth.

We were adjourned for lunch. A prayer of benediction and grace was pronounced by Rev. R. B. Crawford.

AFTERNOON SESSION

The afternoon session was opened by congregational singing of the hymn, "Our Best," followed with prayer by Rev. Norman Adams.

Mrs. Robert Crawford, youth chairman, presented the declamation contest winners: Sandra Wiggs, Y.P.A., Stoney Creek Church, Western Conference; Suzanne Mallard, G.T.A., St. Mary's, New Bern, Eastern Conference.

Miss Linda Lou Godwin, student at East Carolina College, told us of the work of the Free Will Baptist Student Fellowship at the college, and the great need for us to keep closely in touch with our college students.

Mrs. J. C. Moye presented life membership awards to nine women. Each membership represented a \$25.00 gift for Founder's Day offering for Cragmont Assembly. The convention business session was called to order by the president. The resolution committee made their report. (See report.) Item one of

the report was referred to the executive committee, all other items were adopted.

Motion made and carried that the Anna Phillips Loan Fund committee work out plans for a Mount Olive scholarship for the declamation contest winners, this work to be done in cooperation with the youth chairman, Mrs. Robert Crawford

Motion made and carried to elect two sponsors who will work with the youth chairman, they are: Miss Juanita Dunn, Y. P. A. sponsor; and Mrs. Cecil Campbell, G. T. A. sponsor.

The courtesy committee gave its report, which was accepted. (See report.)

The Cragmont Woman's Conference report was made by Mrs. L. E. Ballard, director, and adopted. (See report.)

The field worker's report, was made by Mrs. Hattie Adcox, and adopted. (See report.)

The treasurer's report was made by Mrs. M. A. Woodard, treasurer, and adopted. (See report.)

The finance committee report was made and adopted. (See report.)

Motion was made and carried that the convention sponsor a drive to furnish the reception room of the new girls' dormitory at Mount Olive College.

Mrs. J. A. Evans was re-elected to the Anna Phillips Loan Fund committee for the term, 1957-1960.

Motion made and carried that the treasurer's books be closed one month prior to the convention, in order that the treasurer might be able to present a full report at the convention.

Motion was made and carried, that we finish our national tent quota from our treasury, and send it in.

Motion carried that the election of a treasurer for the Anna Phillips Loan Fund be referred to the executive committee.

Rev. Joe Fort represented the Free Will Baptist Press and reported that "Youth Banner" is again being published at the press, and urges all aux-

iliaries to use our new vacation Bible school course, written by and for Free Will Baptists.

Rev. Wilbert Everton spoke in behalf of superannuation and urged all to support this cause liberally.

Mrs. Marvin Moore, prayer secretary, presented a brief closing devotions; subject, "Let Thy Light Shine Through Testimony and Prayer."

Motion was made to dismiss. Benediction was pronounced by Rev. Wilbert Everton.

Recommendations for 1957, from the chairman of the various departments as follows, were mimeographed for them by the secretary and distributed at the convention:

ENLISTMENT

1. Obtain from the church clerk a list of all women members who are not enrolled in the auxiliary. Divide the auxiliary members into pairs and

assign each pair a certain number of these individuals to contact by visitation. Meet at the church on a given night for a talk and instructions by the enlistment chairman, and then go out on this important mission.

- 2. Work with the program chairman so as to be certain that recognition is given to the new members just recruited and that they receive necessary materials. Make the program so interesting that they will attend regularly. (Enlistment is good work—so is keeping all we enlist.)
- 3. Now that you have a number of new members you may find it needful to organize into circles. Make this suggestion to your group. Any auxiliary with as many as twenty members should have circles. Ten members in each circle will be a good number (may have a few more or a few less as your situation calls for). See Pages 34-38 or your manual for instructions.
- 4. In auxiliary or circles—have each person to write name, address, telephone number on a slip of paper. Then let all persons draw names. The name you draw becomes your responsibility for the year: to see that this person is notified each month as to when and where meeting is, also to see that this person has transportation. In this way every one becomes responsible to help in keeping attendance up.

YOUTH

BE IT RECOMMENDED:

- 1. (a) That the Y.P.A.—G.T.A. Rally Day be held annually on the third Saturday in May at Mount Olive Junior College. (b) That the declamation contests for the district winners be conducted as part of the program.
- 2. That every district youth chairman see that each local youth chairman be provided with a subscription to *The Free Will Baptist* and to *Contact* at their own expense, or at the expense of the local auxiliary if necessary, in order that they may be informed concerning the state and national youth work.
- 3. That every district youth chairman see that the name of each local chairman is placed on the mailing list of the National Home Mission Board and the National Foreign Mission Board, in order that they may be kept informed concerning the needs and the progress of our missionary work.
- 4. That each district youth chairman cooperate with the district study course chairman in a "Youth Work Clinic" at which time the book "Missionary Education of our Youth" will be studied and definite plans be made for the district youth work. All local youth chairmen would be expected to attend the clinic for their district.
- 5. That the State Auxiliary Convention continue to cooperate with the Free Will Baptist Press in sponsoring a state vacation Bible school clinic, or, as the need may arise, district vacation Bible school clinics. The state youth chairman, along with the editor of the press, will work with the district youth chairman in planning clinics in the districts, if requested.
 - 6. That the goal for the Anna Phillips Loan Fund for 1957-58 be

\$250.00 in new contributions. This amount to be divided on a percentage basis among the districts.

STUDY COURSE

"Variety for '57"—Let's dig out of the rut in '57 and present our study course in a realistic way. Christ expects our best. Following are only a few suggestions to start the ball rolling:

- 1. Stewardship—Pantomine the Scripture of the talents on which the book "To Whom Much is Given" is based and then go into a discussion of the book
- 2. Missions—Use Dodd's book "The Free Will Baptist Story" presented as a pageant (similar to the pageant being presented today in the history of woman's auxiliary).
- 3. Manual—Get acquainted with your new Year Book of Programs by the use of an informative game. Divide those attending into two groups. The head of each group has a Year Book. As the music starts, start passing the book down the line. The one possessing the book when the music stops in each group must find the question asked by the leader. End the study course with a panel discussion on the Manual of Methods.
- 4. Evangelism—Invite a well-known soul winner to visit you, teach one of the books suggested and share his own personal experiences.
- 5. Prayer—Study the book "How to Have a Family Altar." After the study, illustrate different ways to conduct a family altar and different times of the day. Also order tracts on the family altar ahead of time and give them to those attending.

Moye, orphanage chairman; Mrs. Hattie Adcox, field worker; Mrs. Norvell Dawson, president Cape Fear District; Mrs. Alice E. Lupton, honorary; Mrs. James A. Evans, Anna Phillips Loan Fund; Mrs. J. C. Minutes of the last executive committee meeting were read and approved.

Mrs. J. C. Griffin reported on the National Auxiliary Convention which she attended in July. She reported that our national project for this year is to buy a tent for our national home missions, to be used wherever needed under the supervision of the National Home Mission Board. North Carolina was given a quota of \$350.00 to be raised by the National Convention. The executive board made the following allocations by districts:

It was noted that 1957 marks 50 years of auxiliary work in North Carolina. Motion carried that we have a Founder's Day program, and that it be held in conjunction with our regular state convention in May. Also, that we ask the district conventions to use a Founder's Day theme in their spring conventions as well as all local auxiliaries to observe a Founder's Week prior to our state convention.

The following committee was appointed to work out program and plans and publicize our program for the year: Mrs. Archie Willoughby, Mrs. J. C. Moye, Mrs. L. E. Ballard.

Motion carried that we set a goal of \$1,000 for Cragmont as our Founder's Day offering and ask each auxiliary to send at least \$10.00 for this offering.

Motion carried that Mrs. Robert Crawford, our youth chairman, proceed with her plans for a Y.P.A.-G.T.A. youth rally day, and that expenses of this rally be paid by our treasurer.

We were dismissed for lunch, with prayer by Mrs. Adcox.

Afternoon Session

The meeting opened with prayer by Mrs. Alice E. Lupton.

Motion carried that we recommend that the district conventions sponsor presentation of life memberships to worthy persons in woman's auxiliary work, upon payment of \$25.00 fee. It is further recommended that the 1957 life membership fees be applied on our Founder's Day goal.

Motion carried that the executive board present a life membership to Mrs. Alice E. Lupton.

Motion carried that we recommend to the state convention the election of a separate treasurer for the Anna Phillips Loan Fund.

The following rules were presented and passed concerning the Anna Phillips Loan Fund:

- 1. This fund shall be in charge of a committee known as the Anna Phillips Loan Fund committee, to be composed of three members elected by the North Carolina State Woman's Auxiliary Convention, to serve on a three-year rotating term, the expenses of said committee to be paid by the convention treasurer, in accordance with existing rules; also, said committee shall meet twice a year, and make annual report to the convention.
- All applications for loans shall be made to the chairman of the Anna Phillips Loan Fund committee. Applicants must appear in person at the call of the committee.
- 3. Amount of loans for any one person shall not exceed \$400.00. Loan may be obtained all at one time or in installments.
- 4. All applications for loans shall be made on standard Anna Phillips Loan Fund application blanks submitted with four recommendations as follows: Pastor or church clerk, auxiliary president, local business man, and principal of school last attended.
- 5. The Anna Phillips Loan Fund note, copy of which may be obtained from chairman of the committee, shall be executed with the endorsement of a property owner with interest at 4% per annum, payable in accordance with date of note.
- 6. Note shall be due in full in two years after completion of accepted course of study. Should borrower stop school, note becomes due immediately.
- 7. All applicants must attend school on a consecutive basis.
- 8. The treasurer of the Anna Phillips Loan Fund of the North Carolina Woman's Auxiliary Convention of Free Will Baptists shall hold all money of this fund and shall issue checks only as instructed by the loan fund chairman, and after receiving the note of the borrower, correctly signed and adequately endorsed. The treasurer of said loan fund shall be sufficiently bonded to cover all funds on hand.
- 9. The treasurer shall hold all notes and collect on these as they fall due, with the assistance of the committee when necessary.

ELIGIBILITY

- 10. All applicants for loans must have completed a standard high school course.
- 11. All applicants are eligible for funds who are worthy Christian characters, within our denomination and residing within the state of North Carolina.
- 12. Any worthy boy or girl graduating from high school while at our orphanage who desires to continue their education in some college, the same year of graduation, with a recommendation from the superintendent or orphanage board, be allowed to borrow from the Anna Phillips Loan Fund on their personal note with no co-signer nor interest. Thereafter, co-signer will be required and interest at regular rate.
