2<sup>nd</sup> That State day be Observed

3<sup>d</sup> That we pledge to raise Equal to 25cts per resident member besides the offering on State day for state work -

4<sup>th</sup> A feeling is growing throughout our state of a lack of due respect for the Ministry thus instilling in the minds of the young the lack of veneration or respect due them, and further making it next to impossible to get young people into the ministry and also putting up a strong bar against securing men for our western fields - let this be Prayerfully remedied

5<sup>th</sup> That we appropriate 100. Dollars for our Lincoln interest - to be paid monthly beginning with Sep. 1<sup>st</sup> 1904 and Ending Sep 1<sup>st</sup> 1905

6<sup>th</sup> That Blanks be printed for the use of the Treasurer - Cards for Field Superintendent - Statements as to the field - What we have - What we hope to do - And how it is proposed to do it.

7<sup>th</sup> That "Announcements" be printed and circulated among our churches first preceding yearly Meeting - giving a brief outline of what will be done

8<sup>th</sup> That we increase our interest and knowledge - and pray in and for Bro and Sister H. R. Murphy - our missionaries to India - and that a letter be written and sent by the yearly Meeting to them

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7th That we request General Conference to make at least an appropriation of 100. dollars for the State Work

A letter from Rev. J. T. Bennett of the Missionary Baptist Church at Humboldt Neb was read expressing a desire to take work in this Yearly Meeting.

Voted that the Chairman investigate his Ministerial Standing with his present denomination and if found worthy and in full accord with our doctrine and polity to issue him a certificate of Standing.

Oct 3<sup>d</sup> The Ex Board of the N.C. G. M. of Free Baptist met in joint session with the Lincoln Church in the lecture room of their church - After investigating the financial condition of their church as instructed by the yearly Conference convened at the Smithfield Church in Aug to do before paying to them the appropriation made at that session.

The Board convened in special session in the same room Members present Wolfe - Grange - Fuller and Root

The minutes of the last meeting read and voted approved -

After which was decided by unanimous vote that the Treasure pay to the Lincoln church to apply on Pastors Salary - as voted at the last Y.M. amount \$ 1/3 dollars per month - for the year ending with Sep 1<sup>st</sup> 1905

Motion and sustained by vote that the churches of the yearly meeting be apportioned according to their resident membership an amount sufficient to meet the appropriations voted at the G. M.

Recommendation

Voted that the money be raised by what is termed the Bond Method
