Meeting opened with prayer by Robbins

L. church but after some deliberation found they had no power to close a deal with us - only to get our price on property or property under consideration - which at that moment we were not prepared to give - but when they finally retired - we decided the property was well worth five thousand dollars: \$5000.00 but would consider an offer of less money - and as Bro. Robbins is located in Lincoln - we left the matter with him to present to the parties concerned and report at some future time - adjourned.

Kenesaw Aug 19

The Ex Board of the N. & N. met in annual session at the Kenesaw Church with Bros Haines, Robbins Prof. Norton present. Absent - Fuller and Taylor opened with Prayer by Bro Norton Minutes read and approved.

Voted that Bro John H. Wolfe, Field Sup., meet with the Board and record its actions for the clerk.

Rev Wolfe read his field Superintendent report which is as follows for 1908 - 1909

After my resignation from the state Ex-Board a year ago, and at the annual meeting of the members of that Board, there was a feeling that if by some way I might be retained so that the knowledge of the work, and field, both locally and abroad, and the ten<sup>10</sup>, years experience along this line might be utilized if possible without taking all of my time or taxing the strength too much.

The Board then placed me in the office of Field Superintendent for another year in conjunction with the Northern Kansas Yearly Meeting, without salary except expenses.

Not quite as much has been accomplished during the year as had been hoped, yet many little touches has been given to the work that eternity alone will or can reveal their worth.

Considerable correspondence has been done with local workers and churches and have kept in touch with the denomination at large which has been of no small value to our field.

A few short trips have been made and considerable "advice" given.

The unsettled condition of the denomination at large upon the Union question has hindered our work here in the west to no little extent.

The failure or part failure on the other hand on the part of our churches to work harmoniously with plans voted last year has crippled the work more than anything else.

But notwithstanding all of these hindrances, we are glad to note advancement and feel confident that out of it all must come Glory to the Kingdom of God

An attempt at Bible Study Classes has been made,  
And our Yearly Meeting motto, "O Lord Use Me" is to be  
seen in a few of our churches.

The Lord is still with us; the field with all its  
multitude of unsaved is yet here to be saved and  
trained; a good corps of workers are ours to be used,  
encouraged and prayed for; our leaders are here honestly  
striving to lead the army to victory, hold up their  
hands as Aaron and Hur did the hands of Moses.

And out of the large heart of our Chairman Bro Haines,  
I trust may come to us words of encouragement and  
strong recommendations for our guidance this  
coming year.

From my own personal observation and experience,  
I feel that yet in these coming years the Lord has  
plenty of work for us here in Nebraska and Kansas.

Perhaps we only need to look well to a  
few of the essentials leading to greater success in  
the work of which the following are a few:

1st. A little more taking hold of God.

2nd. More thoughts of others and our relation to them in the work.

3rd. More willingness to trust our leaders.

4th. Less criticism which kills like the Black Plague.

5th. A stronger unity of action for aggressive work.

6th. More money for State Work.

7th. More money and prayers for our India work and workers.  
the less looking to self and numbers and more looking to  
God our Helper.

8th. One day at least at our Yearly Meeting given over wholly to  
Denominational Departmental work such as Sunday Schools,  
Young People's work, Women's Mission Society, Prayer Meeting,  
Covenant Meeting, and attendance at the regular service of  
the church on the Lord's Day.

9th. Opportunities pass our way, but once like the securing of  
Rev S. H. Dull and a corps of singers for evangelistic work  
with a tent.

Grasp these bad sent opportunities for the sake of these  
lost ones among us.

Voted that we donate to Grandview church the carpets, pulpit chairs, and seats from the Lincoln church.

Voted that we request the Grandview church to leave their old seats for a reasonable length of time at the disposal of the Board.

Bro Robbins reported his action on renting the north wing of the Lincoln <sup>church property</sup> for five dollars \$5.00 per month to a party to make cement shingles leased for five months.

Talked over the Lincoln property and voted that we rent the property for such purposes as may not injure or destroy the property and same to be rented subject to sale. Bro Robbins to act as agent.

Adjourned at call of chairman.

Friday 5 PM Aug 20-

At the call of the chairman Bro Haines, the Board met in the office of Bro D. S. Norton in Kenoay Norton - Haines - Robbins and Wolfe present

Bros Haines read Chairman's Report

Voted its adoption which was as follows

In viewing the field from our present stand point we have no reason for discouragement but much reason for encouragement. Though we regret that some of our churches are still without pastors some of these could have been supplied with good men but for unfortunate railroad connections. But we are in hopes of seeing some of these pastors again in the near future.

Long Branch has united with the Baptist church at Johnson employing one of their pastors Rev M. R. Holt who put his membership with the Long Branch church after being questioned by the brethren on doctrine claiming to be in harmony with same (clerk church)

The Gopp memorial church has preaching every two weeks by the pastor of the Baptist church at Sterling.

Kenosaw church after varied experiences has settled down to good work having sold their former parsonage and erected a new one on the church lot. This was

accomplished under the leadership of Rev. H. M. Burns  
who shortly after resigned and was followed by  
Miss Louise Derby the present pastor.

Grandview is trying to carry along with the  
pastor they had a year ago and is probably crying  
with the martyred hosts of Revelation  
"How Long O Lord How Long"

The policy of concentration was  
carried out by the Board and a vote was taken to  
concentrate on Geneva church. With the result that  
the Lord sent them Rev. Wilmetta Marks who was  
wonderfully blessed of God and she was enabled to raise  
the church from a mere nucleus to a flourishing  
church of fifty or more members.

Truly we have abundant reason to praise God for  
his wonderful visitation of this field.

The recommendations of your former  
chairman Rev. John H. Wolfe have been but partially  
carried out, but as far as they were have shown  
the wisdom of adopting them and manifest to  
us our great loss in not having conscientiously  
carried them out to the fullest detail.

The Bible study class would have  
been of lasting benefit if it had been organized  
in all our churches.

If the one dollar a member had been raised  
by all our churches for state work our prospects  
for the coming year would be far brighter.  
but we are glad that at last one church did  
even better than that.

The printing of the business has proved  
very helpful to me and no doubt to all who are  
interested in the work of the Yearly Meeting.

The committee elected to confer with a  
committee from the North Kansas Y. M. met with the  
same and devised a plan which was adopted  
by the joint Boards whereby Rev. John H. Wolfe was se-  
cured as Field Superintendent for both Y. Meetings.

Some offers were made to the  
Board on the Lincoln church property but it was de-  
cided to repair the roof so as to stop the leaks and list it  
at the former price as the property is not likely to

depreciate in value.

Recommendations

- 1<sup>st</sup> That we solemnly consecrate ourselves to God for one more year's service.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> That at the close of the covenant meeting Saturday P.M. a few minutes be devoted to that service.
- 3d That our war cry be:- "The sword of the Lord and of Gideon."
- 4th That we renew our pledge of a year ago to endeavor to organize a Bible study class in each church and that the work be studies in the book of Acts.
- 5th That we also renew our pledge of at least one dollar per resident member for State work.
- 6th That each church be urged to secure as many "Cent-a-day" pledges for Foreign Missions as may be possible.
- 7th That the office of Field Superintendent be continued as during the past year.
- 8th That the policy of concentration be continued and where possible extended to other churches and to new points where openings may occur.
- 9th That our Bible study work be planned under the supervision of the Field Superintendent and that he or she be directed to supply at the expense of the State Board text books wherever a class may be organized.

The Ex Board met in special session at the residence of Wm Fuller near the Long Branch A.B. church members present - Taylor - Haines - Fuller and Robbins.

Absent Norton.

opened with Prayer by Robbins.

Minutes dating from Aug 19th read and approved.

In regard to the parties occupying the Lincoln church property to make cement shingles. Authorized Robbins to see that they vacate the property as soon as possible.

Talked about selling the old Lincoln church building & keeping the lot. And concluded the lot with the building removed would sell more readily and perhaps for as much money.

Robbins submitted a proposition from parties to purchase said Building for two hundred dollars \$200.00  
Voted to accept proposition.

And as a Board we find the ~~lot is~~ size six ft. and parties joining wish to purchase that ~~church~~ voted authorizing the Chairman to sell same 6 ft on south side, for not less than two hundred dollars \$200.00

The question of which church we should decide on to help from the G.M. fund was discussed voted in favor of the Thompson church and the amount be left with the chairman.

Voted, Expenses of the Delegate to General Conference be paid out of the yearly meeting Treasury.

The chairman to look after the Lincoln church Organ.

Voted Chairmans expenses to date 1908-1909 of \$4<sup>4<sup>a</sup>cts</sup> be paid out of fund on hand in Treas.

No other business appearing adjourned by Vote and Prayer by Rev Haines.
