A. to intro date of Tax<sup>1/3</sup> and to bring our amount up to Thirty four hundred and thirty dollars \$3430.00<sup>00</sup> we borrow five hundred dollars \$500.00<sup>00</sup> from the 1st State Bank in Tecumseh until the balance \$500.00<sup>00</sup> of the Royal mortgage is payed - which we are assured will be within this year - and as the Texas Book shows only \$3392.47 the Balance still lacking be taken from the General fund

In regard to Bro. Flemings resignation no action was taken - was hopeful he would again return to the State

In as much as the Union with the Missionary Baptist has been presented to our yearly meeting at two former Sessions and voted almost unanimous in the negative -

there seems to have been some agency at work in our churches to change sentiment - as evidenced by the number of requests received of late wanting the Board to give them a deed of their church properties but notwithstanding how willingly we might be to comply with their requests its evident legally we cannot do so that a matter for the yearly meeting to decide and that will take one year or more to do -

And in answer to the above request the Board submits the following  
To the Copp Memorial Free Baptist church of Adams, Nebraska.

Dear Brethren

In reply to your request for a deed of the church property situated in the city of Adams, Nebraska, and held "in trust by the Executive Committee of the Nebraska Yearly Meeting of Free Baptists".

Now after due deliberation and close study again of the co-operative System, incorporated under the Laws of the State of Nebraska; and the interpretation of said System guiding such matters by our predecessors for years; and after due consultation on the legal side of the matter by eminent lawyers of the State, viz. Judge Russ of Falls City and Atty Hugh Lancaster of Tecumseh; we find that a transfer of the property as requested cannot be granted. Because

1st. The Nebraska yearly Meeting in session for two consecutive years voted by a large majority that they could not adopt the "Basis of Union" the same being so reported to the following General Conferences, and because of this, the action of the General Conference Voting in favor of said "Basis of Union" does not in any way annul Said vote of the Nebraska yearly Meeting Governing her internal affairs."

2nd. Quoting from the Co-operative System "But the Committee shall have no power to convey property secured for any church or society, without legal vote of said church or society, and not then so as to divert the property from its original purpose . . . . or has taken itself out of the denomination without a reasonable prospect of another Free will Baptist organization taking its place . . . of which the Committee shall be judge." And from what we learn the church at Adams has joined itself ecclesiastically to the Association of Baptists of Nebraska and have expressed the desire to work more fully with the said Association, and the securing of a Baptist brother as pastor who lists himself as "Pastor of the Baptist Church of Adams, Neb." We therefore infer from these facts that practically the church has "taken itself out of the denomination."

3d From the fact that the Copp Memorial Free Baptist Church after its organization uniting itself to the Kenneha River Quarterly Meeting of Free Baptists and from that to the Nebraska yearly Meeting thus becoming unit with said Nebraska yearly Meeting and by so doing accepted the said Co-operative System, and never having held or Deed to said property cannot ask or demand for a "return of the Deed."

Thus the Laws of Nebraska and the co-operative system must harmonize, which leaves no right of a church securing an individual Deed so long as she remains connected with said Nebraska yearly Meeting.

The Chairmans report report and recommendations are as follows

To the Executive Board and members of the Nebraska Yearly Meeting of Free Baptists

Dear Brethren

In making this my 15<sup>th</sup> annual Report as Chairman of the 84. Board, I want to thank you all for your forbearance and also for your hearty co-operation during all of these 15 years.

We feel confident - that the work done by our faithful toilers, both laymen and ministry shall bear fruit for Eternity in the Kingdom. Our forces may not have been as large as some others but numbers do not always count; but loyalty, sacrifice, and a willingness to work.

Death has claimed, during these 15 years, a large number of our faithful and true workers; others have moved away out of the bounds of the yearly meeting, while a few have sought membership in other bodies. Several of our churches have been decreased in membership by death and removals until they ceased existence, while others have held on even tho-

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pastorless for years hoping and praying for the Lord to raise up loyal and true men to go before them in loyal service.

Others have done a good and lasting work, seeing a goodly number brought into the Kingdom and others strengthened in their faith and doctrine, thus building far better than they knew.

Out of the three, viz: Bros Dinsmore, Isachsen, and Taylor, all good loyal Free Baptists with whom to work was a delight.

The out-look at present may not be as bright as we could wish. In fact this is the trying time as we contend for the faith delivered to us as a people.

The Sideon 300 under God's guidance may be able to win many for our Master, Jesus Christ.

Very little in the way of visiting churches and this work has been done during the past year by your chairman, yet by letter and otherwise we have tried to do something.

Since Grandview church has had no pastor, I have supplied every two weeks and by so doing may have encouraged our church if no more.

We edited the Free Baptist Department in the Messenger by the kindness of its editor. This work was carried on for nearly a year, thus giving our people a medium of communication. Our General Baptist brethren should have our heartiest thanks for so liberal opening of their denominational paper while we were without our beloved Morning Star.

The Lincoln lots have been sold and the money placed on a first mortgage on a farm near Crab Orchard. The interest from this mortgage can be used for general work of which the principal cannot.

Our recommendations are few and yet we feel they are of vital interest to us as a denomination here in Nebraska. They are as follows:

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- 1<sup>st</sup> We recommend that we pledge our undivided fidelity to each other in the work.
- 2<sup>nd</sup> That more of our people subscribe for the Messenger as a means of communication for our people.
- 3<sup>d</sup> That so far as possible at least \$1 per resident member be collected by our churches for State work.
- 4<sup>th</sup> That we center our efforts for Home Missions on our Unicoi, Tenn field  
Note Y.M. conference failed to sustain this the 4<sup>th</sup>
- 5<sup>th</sup> That we use our own Free Baptist Sunday School supplies as published by our Southern brethren at Ayden N.C.
- 6<sup>th</sup> That our pastorless churches be willing to accept itinerancy with each other until such time that permanent pastors may be secured.
- 7<sup>th</sup> That Evangelism be our Motto for the coming year  
All of which I humbly submit for your consideration and if thought best your approval.
