The executive Board of the Nebraska yearly Meeting of Free-Will Baptists met in special session at the Grandview Church.

Bro Wolfe submitted the following viz.

I hereby tender my resignation as member of the Board. Thanking you all from the depths of my heart for the privilege of working with you for the past fifteen years. I remain your Bro.

Above resignation was accepted by vote and by said action a vacancy was declared. and after some deliberation Bro. Wolfe presented the name of Carlton C. Fuller as the person who Bro. Morse favored. Motion and voted unanimous he be appointed to fill vacancy. The question as to Chairman was next considered decided was not advisable to change any of the present officers at this ~~present~~ time and the other two members of Board Comper and Hall declining to serve. Voted in favor C. C. Fuller as chairman and having received word that Fairview church declined to entertain the Yearly Meeting and there being no request from any of the other churches to entertain same. Voted to locate it at the Long Branch Church, to be held on the regular time in Aug. no other business appearing adjourned.
