

Minutes of the 15th session of the Ministers and

house is constantly adding new books of
special value to our denomination and
that each of our papers (The Star and F. Bapt)
have been greatly improved in both their

And also: as our pub. house has been
compelled to sell large quantities of the
books of the earlier editions at a large
discount, sometimes amounting to 50% in
order to get them in the hands of our
people.

And whereas: believing it to be the duty of
every Free Baptist and especially every Free
Baptist family to place our publications
in the home and to insist on their being
read by every member of the family who
is old enough to read.

Therefore be it resolved that we will strive
to carry out these provisions by giving our
Pub. house a hearty support so far as it is
possible so to do.

Star or Free Baptist or both and that our
Sabbath Schools be supplied with the

Star publications.

pay an amount equal to 2 cents per wk.

shall be used to pay debts, help needy
churches and furnish Evangelistic help.

requested to keep this matter before
their churches until the object is
