NINeteenth session of the Nebr. Y. M.
of Free Baptists.

The ministers & Laymen's Institutes of the Nebr. Y. M. convened with the Lincoln church Aug 14-16 1901.

Business session called to order Thurs. morn. Aug. 15 9: A.M. by the clerk.

Bro. Wolff was nominated and elected as mod. of Institute.

The minutes of last meeting were read and approved.

The com. on By Laws & Constitution appointed the preceding year to draw up a new By Laws & Cons. presented the following.

Preamble

Realizing the need of a greater growth and development of mind and heart together with readiness of speech, and a larger investigation and free discussions of religious, Educational, and social topics connected with church work, we hereby adopt the following

Constitution

Article I The name of this organization shall be "the Ministers and Laymen's Institute of the Nebraska Yearly Meeting"; and its object shall be the free discussions of any subject coming before the Institute for the purpose of diffusing knowledge and making us better workers in the Kingdom life.

Article II The officers shall consist of a moderator chosen at the opening of each annual meeting, and the regular clerk of the Nebr. Y. M.

Article III. It shall be the duty of the Moderator to preside at all meetings of the Institute.

The duty of the clerk shall be to keep the records of all proceedings of this body. Business gist of sermons, speeches and papers - This shall be kept with the proceedings of the whole Inst. of M.

Art. IV. There shall be elected one person as program man, to work in conjunction with other committees of the yearly meeting.

In consultations with the other committees he shall make out program for the following year notifying three months previous to the annual meeting, all persons who are to come over programs with their subjects.

Art. V. Any minister or layman who shall be in attendance shall be considered a member of this Institute and as such shall have full voice in all its proceedings.

Art. VI. This Institute shall meet annually in conjunction with the Inst. of M. of which it is a vital part, the Institute to commence Wed. eve. before the third Sun. in Aug., with an Institute Sermon, closing Friday following at 9:30 A.M. subject to the Y.M. proper.

Art. VII. This constitution may be changed at any annual gathering by a two thirds vote, providing such proposed change has been read before the Institute one year previous with names of persons proposing it. Voted to send the Dodge paper on "Evangelization the Baptist."

past year etc., Provided there be money
sufficient and Kansas cooperate with us.

- 4th That we sanction and urge an Itinerancy for our pastorless churches.
- 5th That we renew our pledge to sustain Bro. & sister H. R. Murphy in Indiana both by our prayers and money.
- 6th That each church having a pastor for the full time, donate four weeks to him for Evangelist work in the state under the supervision of the Ex. board.
- 7th. That we appropriate to the Lincoln church the sum of \$200. 00 to be paid Quarterly. This to be raised by the \$5 & per resident member fee, special collections, personal pledges etc. That pastors see that this matter be laid before their churches at once and pledges taken.
- 8th That our "Ministerial year" be the first of April to harmonize with the Pastoral year of the Denomination, thus making it much easier to secure pastors for our fields.

Each recommendation was adopted as read except the 7th which was made on condition that Lincoln secure a pastor. Bro. Wolfe then asks for personal pledges and secures \$100. 00 in pledges and cash for state work.

Resolved 3rd That for the preservation of the work we request that Bro. Noblatt be kept at Smithfield and that Kansas and Elmer Island call Bro. Tresser to that pastorate.
