We feel that there is still a great work for Free Baptists to do in Nebraska; the building up of the work already started, and the reaching out into regions beyond.

The new fields opening up farther west invites to a still larger work for Free Baptists whose whose doctrines are always accepted.

Your chairman has made a few trips looking after the work, to strengthen the stakes wherever possible. Thompson has had the services of Rev. E. P. Lavine, whom we feel has done a good work in this field; Geneva has located Rev. E. C. Wheeler, who is the right man in the right place. The work up in the Central and out in the west-part of the state need evangelistic work done, and pastors settled in those fields.

We have sold the Lincoln lot for \$3225⁰⁰ which is added to the permanent fund.

Revivals have been held in the Long Branch and Grandview churches with Rev. J. L. Meads evangelist.

Recommendations -

That we raise at least one dollar (\$1.00) per member for State work and as much more as possible. This to be collected as soon as possible after this session of Yearly Meeting.

2 - That we favor evangelistic work, not only in the churches now established but in new fields. That the Y.M. will place the evangelist on the field, and while there the church raise the money for his services, but what ever work may be done in new fields, the support come from the Y.M. ~~board~~ funds all to be under the direction of Y.M. Board.

3 - That we centre on one or two churches for material aid, thus fully strengthening
