CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE NEW HOPE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST OF THE STATE OF ARKANSAS

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptist Church of this district, having been baptized by immersion upon profession of faith in Christ, as Saviour, and Lord, and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among our churches, do, for the purpose of coordinating our efforts for the extension of the Kingdom of God, ordain this Constitution and its affixed By-Laws for the betterment of our Association.

ARTICLE I

Name: This organization shall be called the New Hope Association of Free Will Baptists, affiliated with the State Association of Free Will Baptists of Arkansas.

ARTICLE II

Purpose: The purpose of this body shall be to unify the work of the churches composing said body in extending the Kingdom of God on earth.

ARTICLE III COMPOSITION AND REPRESENTATION

Section 1. The members of this body shall be all ordained ministers, deacons, church clerks, and elected delegates who are in good standing with their respective churches.

Section 2. Each church shall be allowed to represent with three (3) elected delegates. A letter from each church will accompany said delegates. If only part of the elected delegates of a church are present, those present may fill vacancies with other members of their church who are present. Any delegation not having a letter from their church shall be allowed to prepare a letter and present it to the body for its approval.

Section 3. As many as three (3) youth representatives shall meet, promote and plan their Associational activities.

Section 4. Churches desiring membership in our Association must come with recommendation from the Association to which they have held membership. New churches, when properly organized, shall be accepted by majority vote of the body providing they have complied with requirements of this Association.

Section 5. Ministers and deacons coming from another body must be examined and meet the requirements of our Association. He shall be examined in the same manner as any new minister. He must be recommended by a Free Will Baptist Church of which he shall be a member, and shall be received into this body by a majority vote of members voting. All shall fill in a questionaire to be placed on file.

ARTICLE IV

Discipline: See the National Treatise, Practices Division, Chapter three (3), all parts listed there. This body believes in and practices congregational government.

ARTICLE V

Finance: This Association shall be financed by the Churches belonging to said Association. Quarterly fees shall be ten dollars (\$10.00) and yearly fees of twelve dollars (\$12.00); the annual fees of twenty dollars (\$20.00) for the State Association. Offerings may be received and disbursed by the desires of the Conference.

ARTICLE VI

Officers: The officers of this body shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, and Assistant Clerk-Treasurer to be elected annually.

ARTICLE VII

BOARD AND COMMITTEES

- Section 1. This body shall have an Executive Board who will help coordinate the work of the Association and investigate any irregularity in the churches belonging to the body.
- Section 2. The Christian Education Board shall adopt the theme and plan meetings, giving plans to clerk to be sent to the churches of said Association as to inform them of opportunities in Ministering.
 - Section 3. Any committee needed shall be elected to the body.

ARTICLE VIII ORDINATION

- Section 1. Ministers to be licensed must be recommended by the church of which they are a member. They shall be examined by the Executive Board. If approved shall be licensed for one (1) year. After one (1) year should he be pastoring or doing evangelistic work, he may be examined for ordination. He must return to the Executive Board before license is renewed.
- Section 2. Deacons who have been approved by their local church are sent to the Conference for examination.
- Section 3. Ministers to be licensed or ordained and deacons to be ordained shall have the privilege of being ordained in their local church, by a presbytery of their choice, said presbytery shall be members of the New Hope Association.

Section 4. No prospective minister, deacon or those already ordained coming from this state, other states, associations, or denominations, shall be accepted into New Hope Association who has been divorced and or remarried. Neither shall a minister or deacon be accepted into this Association, whose wife has been divorced and or re-married. All ministers belonging to the Quarterly Conference for neglect or disorderly conduct. (Changed July 1, 1978, at First Church, Searcy)

ARTICLE IX

Meeting: This Association shall meet the first Saturday of January, April, July, and October for Quarterly Meetings. Selection of meetings with churches shall be selected at the July (yearly) meeting.

ARTICLE X

Rules for Conducting Business: The rules set forth in the State Minutes and proper parliamentary procedures shall be used.

ARTICLE XI

Amendments: This constitution may be amended or altered by a majority vote of members voting at any regular session of the body provided said amendments or alterations have been presented in writing at the last regular session of this body.

BY-LAWS

- 1. The clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence, the senior minister in years, shall call the Association into conference and if a quorum is present, the moderator, or in his absence, the assistant moderator, shall take charge, and if neither of them is present, the senior minister in years of service shall act as moderator.
- 2. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any one board, committee, or office, provided the person nominated be elected.
- . 3. A majority of all votes cast on any subject or discussion shall be final.
- 4. The officers of this body shall be nominated from the floor.
- 5. Letters of Quarterly Meetings shall be mimeographed so letters will not need to be read at meetings. Clerk shall send statistical report within one (1) month following the meeting. This report shall be sent to each church in said conference.
 - 6. This body requests that all churches of this body require their pastors to be a member of the church he serves unless he pastors in two (2) associations or two (2) different churches. However, he can only hold membership in one church and one Association.

- 7. The speaker for the Memorial Service shall be elected during the regular business session of the Association. The Christian Education Board will help plan the meetings, with theme that is to be used with each meeting.
- 8. These by-laws may be altered or amended at any regular session of the body by a majority (51%) of the members present who vote.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages and to provide things honest in the sight of men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scripture, secret prayer, family devotions and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour, Jesus Christ.

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the spirit" in the bonds of peace. To be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and to seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of education and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday School, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord, Jesus Christ.

It is not possible to compile a complete report, because so many of the sources of information have been lost. We give credit to all the ministers and deacons who have served in the New Hope Association from the time of its organization until the present time.

It is with regret that many of the names of people who were among the pioneers, have been omitted. These labored faithfully to make possible that which we enjoy today.

The exact date and place of the organization of the New Hope Association has not been determined. Let us thank God for our heritage and pray for both spiritual and numerical growth through the next century or until time shall be no more.

Through the century, at least thirty churches have been organized. Many of the country churches ceased to exist due mostly to the migration of people from these areas to more populated areas.

The following churches were organized as member churches of the New Hope Association, but are no longer in existence. These are: McAnear, Harrison Chapel, Union Hill, New Hope, Oak Grove, Bailey's Chapel, Sidon, Shady Grove, Brannon, and Beckett Mountain.

Two other churches are still in existence as community churches, that is, Center Point #1 and Cross Roads.

Four churches have united with other Free Will Baptist Associations. Oakland Church, near Bradford, united with the Polk Bayou Association. The First Free Will Baptist Church of North Little Rock, the Capitol City Church of Little Rock, and the First Free Will Baptist Church of Conway united with the Central Association.

Fourteen churches compose the New Hope Association in 1985. These are: Mt. Bethel at Rose Bud, Friendship at Rose Bud, New Hart at Rose Bud, Liberty Hill at Rose Bud, Center Point #2 at Vilonia, First Church at Searcy, South Heights at Searcy, Mt. Calvary at Conway, 18th Street at North Little Rock, Bethel at Romance, Sharon at Naylor, Mt. Carmal at Vilonia, Greenbrier at Greenbrier, and Soda Valley at Greenbrier.

BRIEF HISTORY OF INDIVIDUAL CHURCHES

PLEASANT GROVE CHURCH (Greenbrier) was organized by Rev. J. W. Phelps in 1890. Charter members were T. R. Gray, Susie Gray, C.S. Tucker, T. Tucker, J. A. Tucker, Mary Tucker, William Cates & wife, W. W. Glover, Dora Glover, N. C. Craig, D. L. Tucker, Arnnie Tucker, Amanda Tyler, J. D. Craig, and Agnes Craig. Resident membership is now 49 with non-resident being 33. Pastors from the time of organization until the present were: J. W. Phelps, Jim Moore, Jim Stephens, E. C. Stkins, John Moore, Emmitt Wilson, Walter Maddox, J. H. Hartsell, T. H. Dixon, R. G. Lane, W. S. Pritchett, Burl Brakebill, Raymond Patrick, Roy Moore, Roy Thompson, Ronnie Blanks, Charles Biggers, A. E. Coffman, Roy Bingham, Roy Wilson, Jim Baker, Leland Horton, George Harvey.
