## BY-LAWS OF THE NORTH ALABAMA ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

Section 1. The Moderator, Assistant Moderator, or in their absence, the senior minister in years shall call the Association to order.

Section 2. No person shall be allowed to speak more than two times on any one subject, or more than (5) five minutes without the permission of the Moderator.

#### **BY-LAWS (CONT'D)**

Section 3. A Credential Committee shall be appointed at the beginning of each session who shall receive and examine the letters and list the delegates and turn them over to the Clerk with any recommendation they may wish to make. and omit the public reading of the letter.

Section 4. The Moderator shall have the right to appoint all committees.

Section 5. No person shall be ordained to the ministry nor shall the credentials of any minister be ratified until he is qualified to meet the conditions stated in the third chapter of (I Timothy). "The husband of one wife". He must satisfactorily answer all the oral and / or written questions put to him by the ordaining council.

Section 6. The business of this Association shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.

Section 7. Only one person shall be allowed to speak at one time and he shall arise and address the Moderator. In case two arise at the same time, the first seen by the Moderator shall be allowed to speak.

Section 8. No person shall absent himself from the Association without permission of the Moderator.

Section 9. This Association shall issue annually, cards of good standing to its ministers and deacons, whose church requests them.

Section 10. This Association shall in all cases in the transaction of all business brought before it, be governed by a majority of all delegates present. Any church or delegate failing or refusing to vote, is and shall be considered a party to the enforcement of same.

Section 11. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular session of this Association by two-thirds vote of the members present.

## CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ and adopted the Work of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the sale and use of intoxicating beverages and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.

### CHURCH COVENANT (CONT'D)

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligation in reverence to the study of the scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to grow in grace and knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and observances of the ordinances of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principles sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on Earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the sucess of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

## **GUIDELINES FOR ORDINATION**

- I. This Association ordains no man that has more than one living wife; nor a man whose wife has more than one living husband.
- II. This Association ordains no one to preach the Gospel until he carries a license for one year unless he is called to a pastorate.
- III. This Association ordains no one that doesn't believe fully the faith and practice of the Free Will Baptist Treatise.
- IV. This Association ordains no one that doesn't believe and practice tithing.
- V. This Association ordains no one that doesn't believe in the verbal inspiration of the Word of God.

### **GUIDELINES FOR ORDINATION (cont'd)**

- VI. This Association will not ordain women to preach the Gospel.
- VII. This Association will not ordain anyone that is affiliated with the World Council of Churches.
- VIII. This Association will not ordain anyone with a bad character with them that are without.
- IX. This Association will not ordain anyone that doesn't believe and practice the ordinances of the Church.
  - A. Baptism by immersion.
  - B. Communion (open).
  - C. Feet Washing.
- X. This Association will not ordain anyone that doesn't believe a person can apostatize and be lost.

NOTE: If any church has a minister or deacon that needs to be questioned by the Presbytery Committee for licensing, ratification, or ordination, contact the Chairman of the Presbytery Committee at least one month before the Association meets. This will enable the committee and the candidate to be better prepared at the Association meeting. It will also eliminate a lot of wasted time at the Association by the people that are having to wait for the committee to get through with their report.

**GUIDELINES FOR THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD** 

1. The Christian Education Board shall consist of 3 men with at least one Pastor; the other two members could be ministers or laymen but at least one must be a Pastor. The committee shall be nominated and elected by the body of the Association during the annual meeting and would be elected on a three year term; one term expiring each year. The senior member serving as chairman. Each Pastor is to select a young person from his church to serve as youth representative to the Christian Education Board.

2. The Christian Education Board along with the youth representatives from each church and the host Pastor shall plan the program of the Youth Rally each month. Youth rallies are suggested to be held each month from September until May on the last Saturday of each month at 6:00 p.m. The site of each Youth Rally should be given on a 1st come basis during the Annual Association in October.

The Associational Treasurer will serve as treasurer for this board.

### **GUIDELINES FOR THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD (cont'd)**

4. This board shall have approval to spend its monies without prior approval from the Associational body.

The Christian Education Board shall work wuth all churches of our Association in getting them involved in the Youth Rally and other related projects. Activities that require special funding (i.e., crusades, trips, and banquets) should be planned in detail and presented to a special called meeting of all the Pastors of the Association for their approval.

The Christian Education Board shall report to the Association during the Annual Meeting as a matter of accounting and information.

**NOTE:** This Board should bear in mind that the role of the Pastors of our churches is the success of any programs they undertake. Their advice should be considered. The local Pastor should be the point of contact on any plans this board may conceive. All correspondence (by letter or phone) should be made to the Pastor in order to seek his wisdom as well as to honor this office. The youth representatives from each church should seek the advice of their Pastor on any plans made and should inform him on any decisions made by this board as a second line of communication.

**NOTE:** 1992 Motion to amend the Guidelines for the Christian Education Board, by replacing the last sentence of item 2 with the following: The Christian Education Board will work with the individual pastors to select sites for the monthly Youth Rallies.

### RALLIES

Youth Rallies were held the months of January, February, March, April, May and September, at Soul's Harbor, First F.W.B.; Decatur, First F.W.B.; Madison, Bethel F.W.B.; Decatur, Cedar Creek F.W.B.

At these rallies, the host Church planned the services especially for the Youth of our Association. These rallies were enjoyed by all who attended.

The average attendance was 134 per rally.
