PROCEEDINGS

The 4th Semi-Annual Association April 30, 1994

The 4th Semi-Annual Association meeting convened on Saturday April 30, 1994 at First Free Will Baptist Church, Decatur, Alabama. The Association meeting was held in conjunction with the Old Time Camp meeting. The meeting opened with Bro. Paul Jones leading the congregation in "Heaven Came Down". Two more congregational songs were sung. Rev. Kenneth Terry prayed the opening prayer. The Welcome was given by Rev. Steve Petty. Rev. Richard Hendrix gave the response to the Welcome.

Bro. Mike Corley gave the devotion from I Peter 2:9. He spoke on "Reasons to Praise God".

Rev. Mike Rogers, Moderator, called the meeting to order. He appointed the Credentials Committee. Those appointed were: (1) Bro. Billy Vest, Chairman; (2) Bro. Dean West; and (3) Bro. Bradley Hendrix.

After a short intermission, Bro. Jones led the congregation in "Just a Little Talk With Jesus" and Rev. Dennis Reeves led in prayer.

Bro. Vest gave the Credentials Committee Report. All letters were examined and found in order except Midway, which did not report. The minutes were read and accepted. The delegates were seated.

Rev. Roy Thomas gave a National Home Mission Report as information. The Presbytery Committee did not have a report. Rev. Steve Petty gave the Christian Education Board report. This was also received as information.

Rev. Dennis Reeves gave a report on the Crusade. It is to be called the "North Alabama Crusade of Hope". The date has been set for October 16-19, 1994 starting at 7:00 p.m. at the Hartselle Civic Center. Rent will be \$700.00. The Association voted to accept financial responsibilities of this crusade. There was a motion to accept this report by Rev. Dennis Reeves and a second made by Rev. Len Blanchard.

Rev. Richard Hendrix gave a report for information on the Mission Fund Raiser. Each church is asked to raise money in some way and turn in at the next Youth Rally. The goal of \$4000.00 was set.

Rev. Walter Jaggers made a motion that the Association appoint the moderator as a contact person to go to the other churches to try to encourage them to join and fellowship with us. There was a second to this motion. It was voted for and passed. The Association will pay traveling expenses for the moderator to do this.

Decatur had the largest attendance today. William Peppers prayed the offertory prayer before an offering was received.

The congregation then sang "Come Unto Me", "I Am Thine, O Lord", and "Revive Us Again" led by Bro. Paul Jones. Rev. Steve Petty led in prayer before the special music, "Had It Not Been" sang by Adam Carnes.

The morning message was brought by Bro. Trymon Messer using Acts 12:1-12 as his text. His subject was "When the Church Prays". We were dismissed for lunch by Rev. Michael Rogers. The meeting adjourned. During lunch Rev. Walter Jaggers made a motion that we give the Decatur Church a rising vote of thanks for hospitality and food. This was done.

PROCEEDINGS

The 29th Annual Association October 22, 1994

The 29th Annual Association convened on Saturday, October 22, 1994. The congregation sang "Heaven's Jubilee". Bro. Ken Michael led in prayer. Rev. Melvin Hunter opened the meeting in the absence of Rev. Mike Rogers by welcoming everyone to Cedar Creek. Rev. Walter Jaggers gave the response and extended the welcome to Rev. Milton Fields the speaker for the day. The devotion was given by Rev. Jerel Reeves. He gave encouragement for Christians using Romans 10:14-17 as his scripture.

Rev. Hunter appointed the credentials committee after calling the meeting to order. Those appointed were:

After a short intermission Rev. Terry gave the credentials committee report. All letters were examined and found in order except Faith, which did not report. Two requests were made. First Free Will Baptist of Decatur requested that Rev. Terry Drinkwater's credentials be ratified. Huntsville requested that the association accept their Pastor Brian Atwood as a member in good standing. The delegates were seated and visitors welcomed. The visitors were Rev. Milton Fields and Bro. and Sister Raphael Yerby. Rev. Kenneth Terry gave the Christian Education Board report. They recommended that the Youth Rallies be changed to the 1st Saturday in the month instead of the last Saturday. This is to start in January. There was a move and second to do this. It carried.

The minutes were read and accepted. Rev. Terry was put on the Presbytery Committee for today to conduct business. Bro. Raphael Yerby spoke representing Home Missions for Benjamin Randall Day, November 20th. His report was accepted as information. Rev. CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD REPORT

Seven youth rallies were held the months of October and November, 1993 and January through May 1994. There was no rally the month of September 1994. The host churches planned the programs for these meetings which were enjoyed by all who attended.

The average attendance for each rally was 101 (May not available). The average youth attendance (24 years old and under) was 45.

CTS COMPETITION

The CTS Competition was held Saturday, May 14, 1994 at the Madison FWB Church in Madison.

There were 45 entries in the competition from five churches in the association. These entries covered 39 categories. Many of the entrants advanced on to state and national competitions. The youth of the North Alabama Association have been and we trust will continue to be, strong in number and performance in state and national youth competitions.

The Youth competition expenses are met by member churches giving a monthly offering of at least \$25.00 or more each month a youth rally was held. The clerk will give a detailed account of monies received and spent. Due to holding one less rally, and less money being received from the supporting churches, the competition expenses exceeded the money received by \$155.44. This deficit was paid out of the general treasury. We believe this amount will be recovered in the next two rallies. We need each church to be faithful in monthly support to avoid changing the way we meet the expenses (such as a fee for entries in local and state competitions).

We, the CE Board have studied our Youth Rally Monthly Meeting time after having several Associational meetings come at the same time of the month. We recommend that the Association please consider changing the youth rallies to the first Saturday of the month in which rallies are held.

We, the CE Board wish to thank all of our churches for your support and participation in our rallies and competitions.

BY-LAWS OF THE NORTH ALABAMA ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

- Section 1. The Moderator, Assistant Moderator, or in their absence, the senior minister in years shall call the Association to order.
- Section 2. No person shall be allowed to speak more than two times on any one subject, or more than (5) five minutes without the permission of the moderator.
- Section 3. A Credential Committee shall be appointed at the beginning of each session who shall receive and examine the letters and list the delegates and turn them over to the Clerk with any recommendation they may wish to make, and omit the public reading of the letter.
- Section 4. The Moderator shall have the right to appoint all committees.
- Section 5. No person shall be ordained to the ministry nor shall the credentials of any minister be ratified until he is qualified to meet the conditions stated in the third chapter of 1 Timothy. "The husband of one wife." He must satisfactorily answer all the oral and/or written questions put to him by the ordaining council.
- Section 6. The business of this Association shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order.
- Section 7. Only one person shall be allowed to speak at one time and he shall arise and address the Moderator. In case two arise at the same time, the first seen by the Moderator shall be allowed to speak.
- Section 8. No person shall absent himself from the Association without permission of the Moderator.
- Section 9. This Association shall issue annually, cards of good standing to its ministers and deacons, whose church requests them.
- Section 10. This Association shall in all cases in the transaction of all business brought before it, be governed by a majority of all delegates present. Any church or delegate failing or refusing to vote, is and shall be considered a party to the enforcement of same.
- Section 11. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular session of this Association by two-thirds vote of the members present.

GUIDELINES FOR ORDINATION

- This Association ordains no man that has more than one living wife; nor a man whose wife has more than one living husband.
- II. This Association ordains no one to preach the gospel until he carries a license for one year unless he is called to a pastorate.
- III. This Association ordains no one that doesn't believe fully the faith and practice of the Free Will Baptist Treatise.
- IV. This Association ordains no one that doesn't believe and practice tithing.
- V. This Association ordains no one that doesn't believe in the verbal inspiration of the Word of God.
- VI. This Association will not ordain women to preach the gospel.
- VII. This Association will not ordain anyone that is affiliated with the World Council of Churches.
- VIII. This Association will not ordain anyone with a bad character with them that are without.
- IX. This Association will not ordain anyone that doesn't believe and practice the ordinances of the church.
 - A. Baptism by immersion
 - B. Communion (open)
 - C. Feet Washing
- X. This Association will not ordain anyone that doesn't believe a person can apostatize and be lost.

NOTE: If any church has a minister or deacon that needs to be questioned by the Presbytery Committee for licensing, ratification, or ordination, contact the Chairman of the Presbytery Committee at least one month before the Association meets. This will enable the committee and the candidate to be better prepared at the Association meeting. It will also climinate a lot of wasted time at the Association by the people that are having to wait for the committee to finish their report.

MINISTERIAL DISCIPLINE

Whereas,

The Bible teaches the manner in which a minister should be disciplined; and

Whereas,

The Free Will Baptist Treatise clearly outlines the procedure for disciplinary action concerning one of our ministers; and

Whereas,

Our churches and district association tend to be lax in following the Biblical principles and the guidelines set forth in the Treatise in properly disciplining ministers whose character is called into question; and

Whereas,

This brings reproach on the name of Christ and our denomination Be it resolved:

- 1. That our churches be requested to follow the Scriptures and the Treatise when any need for discipline arises.
- 2. That churches exercise wisdom in calling a pastor by properly investigating him.
- 3. That Associations carefully check the credentials of ministers who transfer from another Association before receiving a minister into fellowship.
- 4. That each district Association be requested to publish in their State Association paper the names of any ministers whose credentials have been revoked.

GUIDELINES FOR THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD

- 1. The Christian Education Board shall consist of 3 men with at least one Pastor; the other two members could be ministers or laymen but at least one must be a Pastor. The committee shall be nominated and elected by the body of the Association during the annual meeting and would be elected on a three year term; one term expiring each year. The senior member serving as chairman. Each Pastor is to select a young person from his church to serve as youth representative to the Christian Education Board.
- The Christian Education Board along with the youth representatives from each church and the host Pastor shall plan the program of the Youth Rally each month. Youth rallies are suggested to be held each month from September until May on the last Saturday of each month at 6:00 p.m. The Christian Education Board will work with the individual pastors to select sites for the monthly Youth Rallies.
- 3. The Associational Treasurer will serve as treasurer for this board.
- 4. This board shall have approval to spend its monies without prior approval from the Associational body.

The Christian Education Board shall work with all churches of our Association in getting them involved in the Youth Rally and other related projects. Activities that require special funding (i.e., crusades, trips, and banquets) should be planned in detail and presented to a special called meeting of all the Pastors of the Association for their approval.

The Christian Education Board shall report tot he Association during the Annual Meeting as matter of accounting and information.

NOTE: This Board should bear in mind that the role of the Pastors of our churches is the success of any programs they undertake. Their advice should be considered. The local Pastor should be the point of contact on any plans this board may conceive. All correspondence (by letter or phone) should be made to the Pastor in order to seek his wisdom as well as to honor this office. The youth representatives from each church should seek the advice of their Pastor on any plans made and should inform him on any decisions made by this board as a second line of communication.
