

BY-LAWS OF THE NORTH ALABAMA ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

- Section 1. The Moderator, Assistant Moderator, or in their absence, the senior minister in years shall call the Association to order.
- Section 2. No person shall be allowed to speak more than two (2) times on any one subject, or more than (5) five minutes without the permission of the moderator.
- Section 3. A Credentials committee shall be appointed at the beginning of each session who shall receive and examine the letters and list the delegates and turn them over to the Clerk with any recommendation they may wish to make, and omit the public reading of the letter.
- Section 4. The Moderator shall have the right to appoint all committees.
- Section 5. No person shall be ordained to the ministry nor shall the credentials of any minister be ratified until he is qualified to meet the conditions stated in the third chapter of I Timothy, "The husband of one wife." He must satisfactorily answer to the oral and/or written questions put to him by the ordaining council.
- Section 6. The business of this Association shall be governed by Robert's Rules or Order.
- Section 7. Only one person shall be allowed to speak at one time and he shall arise and address the Moderator. In case two arise at the same time, the first seen by the Moderator shall be allowed to speak.
- Section 8. No person shall absent himself from the association without permission of the Moderator.
- Section 9. This Association shall issue annually, cards of good standing to its ministers and deacons, whose church requests them.
- Section 10. This Association shall in all cases in the transaction of all business brought before it, be governed by a majority of all delegates present. Any church or delegate failing or refusing to vote is and shall be considered a party to the enforcement of same.
- Section 11. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular session of this Association by two-thirds vote of the members present.

GUIDELINES FOR ORDINATION

- I. This Association ordains no man that has more than one living wife; nor a man whose wife has more than one living husband.
- II. This Association ordains no one to preach the gospel until he carries a license for one year unless he is called to a pastorate.
- III. This Association ordains no one that does not believe fully the faith and practice of the Free Will Baptist Treatise.
- IV. This Association ordains no one that does not believe and practice tithing.
- V. This Association ordains no one that does not believe in the verbal inspiration of the Word of God.
- VI. This Association will not ordain a woman to preach the gospel.
- VII. This Association will not ordain or accept the ordination of anyone who is a homosexual.
- VIII. This Association will not ordain anyone with a bad character with them that are without.
- IX. This Association will not ordain anyone that does not believe and practice the ordnances of the church.
 - A. Baptism by immersion
 - B. Communion (open)
 - C. Feet Washing
- X. This Association will not ordain anyone that does not believe a person can apostatize and be lost.
- NOTE: If any church has a minister or deacon that needs to be questioned by the Presbytery Committee for licensing, ratification, or ordination, contact the Chairman of the Presbytery Committee at least one month before the Association meets. This will enable the committee and the candidate to be better prepared at the Association meeting. It will also eliminate a lot of wasted time at the Association by the people that are having to wait for the committee to finish their report.

MINISTERAL DISCIPLINE

Whereas,

The Bible teaches the manner in which a minister should be Disciplined; and

Whereas,

The Free Will Baptist Treatise clearly outlines the procedure for disciplinary action concerning one of our minister; and

Whereas,

Our churches and district associations tend to be lax in following the Biblical principles and the guidelines set forth in the Treatise in properly disciplining ministers whose character is called into question; and

Whereas,

This brings reproach on the name of Christ and our denomination,

Be it resolved:

That our churches be requested to follow the Scriptures and the Treatise when any need for discipline arises.

That churches exercise wisdom in calling a pastor by properly investigating him.

That the Associations carefully check the credentials of ministers who transfer from another Association before receiving a minister into fellowship.

That each District Association be requested to publish in the State Association paper the names of any ministers whose Credentials have been revoked.

GUIDELINES FOR THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD

- 1. The Christian Education Board shall consist of three men with at least one Pastor: the other two members could be ministers or laymen but at least one must be a Pastor. The committee shall be nominated and elected by the body of the Association during the annual meeting and would be elected on a three year term; one term expiring each year. The senior member serving as chairman. Each Pastor is to select a young person from his church to serve as youth representative to the Christian Education Board.
- 2. The Christian Education Board along with the youth representatives from each church and the host Pastor shall plan the program of the Youth Rally each month. Youth rallies are suggested to be held each month from September until May on the last Saturday of each month at 6:00 p.m. The Christian Education Board will work with the individual pastors to select sites for the monthly Youth Rallies.
- 3. The Associational Treasurer will serve as Treasurer for this board.
- 4. This board shall have approval to spend its monies without prior approval from the Associational body.
- 5. The Christian Education Board shall report to the Association during the Annual meeting as a matter of accounting and information.

NOTE: This Board should bear in mind that the role of Pastors of our churches is the success of any program they undertake. Their advice should be considered. The local Pastor should be the point of contact on any plans this board may conceive. All correspondence (by letter or phone) should be made to the Pastor in order to seek his wisdom as well as to honor this office. They youth representatives from each church should seek the advice of the Pastor on any plans made and should inform him on any decisions made by the board as a second line of communication.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE 28TH BI-ANNUAL MEETING

APRIL 15, 2017

LAODICEA FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH

Hanceville Alabama

The meeting opened with song, "He Lives", led by Br Rodney Yerby. Welcome given by Br Dennis Reeves, pastor of Laodicea. Br Reeves asked for all to remember Br Benny and Sis Faye Moore today. Response given by Br Ron McCraney, who led the congregation in prayer.

Br Henry Shellman, moderator, introduced the devotion speaker, Dr. Paul Harrison of Madison FWB, who spoke on Matt. 4:23. "Gospel means-Good news". Preachers and speakers should speak of the Good news. Why is the message of Christ Good News?

- 1. God is good
- 2. God's Laws are good
- 3. God's son, Jesus is good
- 4. God's salvation is good
- 5. God's will is good

The meeting was called to order by Br Shellman. Only 4 letters from churches were read by the Credentials committee. Others are on the way to clerk.

Break

Song, "Christ Arose", opened the remainder of meeting, led by Br Rodney Yerby.

Minutes and Treasurer's reports read. MMS&C to approve.

Delegates seated and offering taken. Offering today was \$140.00 which was suggested to be rounded up to \$200 and given to our speaker for today. Approved by all. 29 present today with 6 churches represented.

Reports:

Br Rodney Yerby gave the State Report and Children's Home Report for Br Danny Williams. 19 children are currently at the home. No dependence or contract with DHR. There are limits to what can be done, by the home tries to help as much as possible. Average length of stay is 5-6 mos. The ministry is an extension of local FWB churches. Home is in solid financial shape at this time. The home is on FB and currently working on a website. 70th anniversary is June 17th. Father to the Fatherless campaign is in June. The annual Toy Run raised over \$100,000 in 2016.

AL State news: April 1, the Bay City FWB went self-supporting. April 2nd saw 123 in attendance! Eastside FWB in Dothan, who is partnered with the Revitalization program, lost their pastor, Br Billy Bevans, who passed away. Board is trying to decide what to do there. Also, the AL Mission Board is trying to decide where to go next with a new work.

A discussion was held on the possibility of changing annual and biannual meeting dates of the N AL Association but this discussion ended as this item is addressed in the N AL Constitution.

Br Kenneth Terry reported on the Souls Harbor ministries. He also reported on the Child Safety Act law in the Al State legislature which would require all day cares to be licensed. Br Terry strongly advocated against this and went to the Legislature to present opposition to the bill HB277.

Worship:

Br Thomas Lovett, a senior at Welch College, brought the morning message from Luke and Matthew. The Bible is a prescription for the same people then and now. He brought to mind how Jesus dealt with Caiaphas, Pilate and Herod. They all 3 knew, but did not want this man, Jesus, to be the Messiah. They all gave in to sin through power, lack of responsibility and desires of the people. Jesus knows it is not easy for us to follow God's word because of our sinful nature. All 3 of these men chose personal gain. Br Thomas challenged us to do our personal best to be different and follow Christ's example.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE 52nd ANNUAL MEETING OF THE NORTH ALABAMA ASSOCIATION OF

October 21, 2017

FREE WILL BAPTISTS

The meeting was held at the First Free Will Baptist Church of Decatur AL on October 21, 2017. Meeting opened with singing "Are You Washed in the Blood?" led by Br Durvan Clark. Pastor, Henry W Shellman gave the welcome and Rev Dennis Reeves led in Prayer after giving the response.

Dr. Richard Hendrix gave the morning devotion using Luke 18 for the text. "How to Pray for Yourself" and gave the following guidelines:

- 1) For God's Mercy
- 2) For God's Help
- 3) For God's Strength
- 4) For God's Blessings
- 5) For God's Will

Br Shellman called the meeting to order. The Credentials report was given and the delegates were seated.

BREAK

Meeting resumed with singing "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name". Rev Cliff Tomlinson led in prayer.

Minutes and Treasurer's report was given by the clerk and assistant clerk. MMS&C to receive.

<u>Presbytery Committee Report</u>: Dr. Paul Harrison, Chairman, made a motion to recommend Br Thomas Lovett for Ordination. MMS&C. A round of applause was given by all to encourage Br Thomas.

Motion was also made to adopt the National Association of FWB policy on Marriage, as that between 1 man and 1 woman, according to God's Word. MMS&C

The attendance today was 45 with Cedar Creek receiving the plaque.

Rev Kenneth Terry reported on HB277 in the AL Legislature. The proposal failed. Please continue to pray regarding the concerns put forth in this bill.

Children's Home report was also given by Br Terry. Over 1000 children have been ministered to since 1947 at the home. 22 currently living there now. DHR children are accepted now and the home receives benefits of kids receiving Soc Sec benefits under DHR. Toy Run will be on Dec 2. Director Mandy Mitchell would like to have another residence building built. Skip Sutton has been hired as a Promotional director for the home.

Alabama State Report given by Br Shellman, for Br Danny Williams. Mission projects going through changes. Br Jerry Smith of Northport will assume the pastorate at Eastside in Dothan as part of the Revitalization program. The Athens Project needs our support and encouragement. These are funded through Acts 1:8. This budget is \$570,000. Every church is encouraged to fund 1 day each of \$1,600. Budget is behind by \$27,500 for 2017. Dr. Matt Pinson and Br Jeff Jones are to be speakers for the AL State Association meeting. \$10,000 has been received to assist in Hurricane relief for victims in St Croix Virgin Islands and Puerto Rico.

The Executive Comm made a recommendation to send \$200 to the Virgin Islands to help with the school and church there.

Thanksgiving Supper will be held at Cedar Creek on Nov 21.

Athens Project:

Sis Melanie Franks was our musician for the meeting today.

Br BJ Eaton reported on the project. Exciting that a deaf interpreter and a hospitality director have already agreed to help with the project due to their burden to see the Lord work in this area. Acts 26:16-18 is the mission statement. Minister and witness and bringing folks to Christ. Br Eaton challenged all churches and individuals to give monthly to Acts 1:8 and to pray for the project.

Bro and Sis Terry gave the special music: "The Old Ship of Zion"

Message:

Rev Joel Franks, of the Athens Project brought the message from Acts 10:9-21, 34, 43&44.

"We don't like Change". We are comfortable in the way things are because we are creatures of habit. We need to move out of our comfort zones. We need to Change! God wants to change us! In these scriptures we see:

- 1) A profound correction -God says "do it" and corrects Peter because even though he had never preached to the Gentiles, He should have known they needed to be preached too.
- 2) A plain command- "Go" and tell the people about Jesus
- 3) A phenomenal conversion-When God changes anyone it is phenomenal, but we all have to change to become what God wants us to be. "Go and Tell someone about Jesus"! It is sin if we do not do this.

Br Dana Booth announced a Launch service at New Day, the former First FWB of Huntsville.

Br Dennis Reeves thanked all for their prayers for Sis Dot and son, Terry Reeves.

CONSTITUTION OF THE NORTH ALABAMA FREE WILL BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I

This body shall be known as the North Alabama Association of Free Will Baptists

ARTICLE II

This Association shall be composed of Ministers, Deacons, Clerks, and Delegates from the different churches forming the same. All having full power to vote on all questions which come before the Association. Each church being entitled to (5) delegates, with an appropriate representation fee as specified.

ARTICLE III

This body adopts the Treatise of Faith and Practice of the National Association of Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE IV

This body shall be composed of churches of the above named Association, together with like bodies of same faith and practice which may be hereafter admitted.

ARTICLE V

The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, and Clerk-Treasurer, who shall be chosen by the nomination and majority of votes by-annually (every two years). Officers thus elected shall hold their positions until their successors are elected. The Moderator and Assistant Moderator shall not serve more than two consecutive terms.

ARTICLE VI

Section 1. It is understood that the North Alabama Association of Free Will Baptists have no judicial authority over any local church.

ARTICLE VI

Section 2. The North Alabama Association of Free Will Baptists and its member local churches do not grant any judicial authority to any representative body to which they may belong.

ARTICLE VII

There shall be an ordaining council elected by the Association to inquire into and examine each applicant for ordination to preach the Gospel of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, and make recommendation to the Association for the ordination of said applicant. This council shall be composed of five (5) ordained men.

ARTICLE VIII

The Association shall meet on the third Saturday in April and October.

ARTICLE IX

- Section 1. When a church desires that one of its members should be licensed or ordained to preach the Gospel, it requests the Association to examine, by council, such member. The examination for license should refer to the piety, doctrine and convictions respecting the work of the ministry, and the reputation for character and ability of the candidate.
- Section 2. The examination for ordination should include all that is required for license and also satisfactory examination respecting the life and labors of the candidate.
- Section 3. No preacher shall be accepted or ordained in this Association as a preacher who has more than one living wife.
- Section 4. No one shall be ordained as a deacon until he is put on trial by his church for one (1) year.

ARTICLE X

This constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Association by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present, provided the change is recommended in writing and tabled in the morning session and voted on during the afternoon session.

CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Jesus Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by his grace to live and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions and social worship, and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and observance of the ordinances of the gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end, we agree to labor for the promotion of education and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
