

BY-LAWS OF THE NORTH ALABAMA ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS

- Section 1. The Moderator, Assistant Moderator, or in their absence, the senior minister in years shall call the Association to order.
- Section 2. No person shall be allowed to speak more than two (2) times on any one subject, or more than (5) five minutes without the permission of the moderator.
- Section 3. A Credentials committee shall be appointed at the beginning of each session who shall receive and examine the letters and list the delegates and turn them over to the Clerk with any recommendation they may wish to make, and omit the public reading of the letter.
- Section 4. The Moderator shall have the right to appoint all committees.
- Section 5. No person shall be ordained to the ministry nor shall the credentials of any minister be ratified until he is qualified to meet the conditions stated in the third chapter of I Timothy, "The husband of one wife." He must satisfactorily answer to the oral and/or written questions put to him by the ordaining council.
- Section 6. The business of this Association shall be governed by Robert's Rules or Order.
- Section 7. Only one person shall be allowed to speak at one time and he shall arise and address the Moderator. In case two arise at the same time, the first seen by the Moderator shall be allowed to speak.
- Section 8. No person shall absent himself from the association without permission of the Moderator.
- Section 9. This Association shall issue annually, cards of good standing to its ministers and deacons, whose church requests them.
- Section 10. This Association shall in all cases in the transaction of all business brought before it, be governed by a majority of all delegates present. Any church or delegate failing or refusing to vote is and shall be considered a party to the enforcement of same.
- Section 11. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular session of this Association by two-thirds vote of the members present.

GUIDELINES FOR ORDINATION

- I. This Association ordains no man that has more than one living wife; nor a man whose wife has more than one living husband.
- **II.** This Association ordains no one to preach the gospel until he carries a license for one year unless he is called to a pastorate.
- **III.** This Association ordains no one that does not believe fully the faith and practice of the Free Will Baptist Treatise.
- IV. This Association ordains no one that does not believe and practice tithing.
- V. This Association ordains no one that does not believe in the verbal inspiration of the Word of God.
- VI. This Association will not ordain a woman to preach the gospel.
- **VII.** This Association will not ordain or accept the ordination of anyone who is a homosexual.
- VIII. This Association will not ordain anyone with a bad character with them that are without.
- **IX.** This Association will not ordain anyone that does not believe and practice the ordnances of the church.
 - A. Baptism by immersion
 - B. Communion (open)
 - C. Feet Washing
- **X.** This Association will not ordain anyone that does not believe a person can apostatize and be lost.
- **NOTE:** If any church has a minister or deacon that needs to be questioned by the Presbytery Committee for licensing, ratification, or ordination, contact the Chairman of the Presbytery Committee at least one month before the Association meets. This will enable the committee and the candidate to be better prepared at the Association meeting. It will also eliminate a lot of wasted time at the Association by the people that are having to wait for the committee to finish their report.

MINISTERAL DISCIPLINE

Whereas,

The Bible teaches the manner in which a minister should be Disciplined; and

Whereas,

The Free Will Baptist Treatise clearly outlines the procedure for disciplinary action concerning one of our minister; and

Whereas,

Our churches and district associations tend to be lax in following the Biblical principles and the guidelines set forth in the Treatise in properly disciplining ministers whose character is called into question; and

Whereas,

This brings reproach on the name of Christ and our denomination,

Be it resolved:

That our churches be requested to follow the Scriptures and the Treatise when any need for discipline arises.

That churches exercise wisdom in calling a pastor by properly investigating him.

That the Associations carefully check the credentials of ministers who transfer from another Association before receiving a minister into fellowship.

That each District Association be requested to publish in the State Association paper the names of any ministers whose Credentials have been revoked.

GUIDELINES FOR THE CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD

- The Christian Education Board shall consist of three men with at least one Pastor: the other two members could be ministers or laymen but at least one must be a Pastor. The committee shall be nominated and elected by the body of the Association during the annual meeting and would be elected on a three year term; one term expiring each year. The senior member serving as chairman. Each Pastor is to select a young person from his church to serve as youth representative to the Christian Education Board.
- 2. The Christian Education Board along with the youth representatives from each church and the host Pastor shall plan the program of the Youth Rally each month. Youth rallies are suggested to be held each month from September until May on the last Saturday of each month at 6:00 p.m. The Christian Education Board will work with the individual pastors to select sites for the monthly Youth Rallies.
- 3. The Associational Treasurer will serve as Treasurer for this board.
- 4. This board shall have approval to spend its monies without prior approval from the Associational body.
- 5. The Christian Education Board shall report to the Association during the Annual meeting as a matter of accounting and information.

NOTE: This Board should bear in mind that the role of Pastors of our churches is the success of any program they undertake. Their advice should be considered. The local Pastor should be the point of contact on any plans this board may conceive. All correspondence (by letter or phone) should be made to the Pastor in order to seek his wisdom as well as to honor this office. They youth representatives from each church should seek the advice of the Pastor on any plans made and should inform him on any decisions made by the board as a second line of communication.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE 28th BI-ANNUAL MEETING OF THE NORTH ALABAMA ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS APRIL 21, 2018

The meeting was held at the Madison Free Will Baptist Church on April 21, 2018. Rodney Yerby led the congregation in singing, "There's a New Name Written Down in Glory" and the "Family of God" with Carolyn Michael playing the piano. Bro. Paul Harrison, Pastor of Madison, gave the Welcome and Bro. Kenneth Terry, the Response. Bro. Henry Shellman led in prayer.

The devotion was given by Bro. Cliff Tomlinson using the text Proverbs 25:28. "The Spirit Within Us" was his topic. We are to

- 1. Guard your heart or take care of the spirit inside.
- 2. Have the right spirit.
- 3. Have a spirit of obedience.
- 4. Have a teachable spirit.

Bro. Shellman called the Association to order. The Credentials report was given with six churches reporting along with their dues sent in. The delegates were seated.

BREAK

The meeting was resumed with Rodney Yerby leading "We Will Know We Are Christians" and "Oh, Happy Day".

The minutes were read and accepted with no corrections and the Treasurer's Report was given. MMS&C to receive.

Presbytery Committee Report was given by Bro. Paul Harrison, Chairman. The committee examined Bro. Joel Franks and Bro. B. J. Eaton and made recommendation to ratify their credentials. They could not be here today due to other commitments. MMS&C

Attendance today was 28 with Cedar Creek winning the plaque. They had 9 of their group in attendance.

Bro. Henry appointed the Nominating Committee for next year. It consists of Ken Michael, Chairman, Bro. Dana Booth, and Bro. Kenneth Terry.

The offering today was \$126.21 and it was decided to send to the WMO. Bro. Paul led in prayer.

Bro. Danny Williams gave the Children's Home Report stating that there are 23 children on campus, 3 staff members' children, and 7 sibling groups out of the 23. Pray for the House Parents and the Camp Schedules for the summer. They will have an Open House on July 14 for an old renovated house on campus. Everyone is invited to attend. They have hired a full-time counselor to be on campus starting May 1.

Bro. Danny then gave the Promotional Office Report.

- 1.) WMO is the last Sunday in April. This is given to different projects around the world. There are envelopes available for this.
- 2.) Bro. Jerry Smith who is the Pastor at Eastside, Dothan for the Revitalization Project is doing a great job. The numbers are good, having new people join the church, having baptisms, and a new WAC group formed. We are thankful for this work.
- 3.) The Athens Project plans to have a launch service in August or September. They have located a building at 100 31 North with a 3 year lease. Pray for an introductory service maybe in June or July.
- 4.) The Mid-South Bible Conference is scheduled for April 25, 26, 27 at the Hamilton Free Will Baptist church.
- 5.) ACTS 1:8 started 20 years ago to help fund our missionaries and state work in Alabama. North Alabama gave \$9,713 to ACTS 1:8 this past year. For the first two months of this year, our Association has given \$4,800.
- 6.) A prayer request was given asking God to strengthen churches. There were some training sessions entitled "Ministry Excellency Training" given last August and last April. The speakers were from Alabama Free Will Baptists. They would like to have more of these for maybe the Birmingham area and the Dothan area.

BUSINESS:

Suggestions made by Bro. Henry:

- 1.) Rotate our churches for Association Meetings
- 2.) Minutes printed and passed out each meeting instead of reading
- 3.) Minutes should be printed and handed out each year at Annual Meeting

These can be discussed the next meeting.

Bro. Henry thanked Madison church and Bro. Rodney for doing the music.

The special music was given by Bro. Rodney. He sang "Oh, Mighty God" before the message by Bro. Dana Booth. He used the text Matthew 25:14-30 with his subject, "Faithfulness". We are to use the Bible as the guide for all times. We expect faithfulness from certain areas in life. God expects faithfulness in many areas. The characteristics of a faithful man or woman.

CONSTITUTION OF THE NORTH ALABAMA FREE WILL BAPTIST ASSOCIATION

ARTICLE I

This body shall be known as the North Alabama Association of Free Will Baptists

ARTICLE II

This Association shall be composed of Ministers, Deacons, Clerks, and Delegates from the different churches forming the same. All having full power to vote on all questions which come before the Association. Each church being entitled to (5) delegates, with an appropriate representation fee as specified.

ARTICLE III

This body adopts the Treatise of Faith and Practice of the National Association of Free Will Baptist.

ARTICLE IV

This body shall be composed of churches of the above named Association, together with like bodies of same faith and practice which may be hereafter admitted.

ARTICLE V

The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, and Clerk-Treasurer, who shall be chosen by the nomination and majority of votes by-annually (every two years). Officers thus elected shall hold their positions until their successors are elected. The Moderator and Assistant Moderator shall not serve more than two consecutive terms.

ARTICLE VI

Section 1. It is understood that the North Alabama Association of Free Will Baptists have no judicial authority over any local church.

ARTICLE VI

Section 2. The North Alabama Association of Free Will Baptists and its member local churches do not grant any judicial authority to any representative body to which they may belong.

ARTICLE VII

There shall be an ordaining council elected by the Association to inquire into and examine each applicant for ordination to preach the Gospel of the Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, and make recommendation to the Association for the ordination of said applicant. This council shall be composed of five (5) ordained men.

ARTICLE VIII

The Association shall meet on the third Saturday in April and October.

ARTICLE IX

Section 1. When a church desires that one of its members should be licensed or ordained to preach the Gospel, it requests the Association to examine, by council, such member. The examination for license should refer to the piety, doctrine and convictions respecting the work of the ministry, and the reputation for character and ability of the candidate.

Section 2. The examination for ordination should include all that is required for license and also satisfactory examination respecting the life and labors of the candidate.

Section 3. No preacher shall be accepted or ordained in this Association as a preacher who has more than one living wife.

Section 4. No one shall be ordained as a deacon until he is put on trial by his church for one (1) year.

ARTICLE X

This constitution may be amended at any regular session of the Association by a two-thirds (2/3) vote of the members present, provided the change is recommended in writing and tabled in the morning session and voted on during the afternoon session.

NOTES





CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Jesus Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by his grace to live and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to provide things honest in the sight of all men.

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions and social worship, and by self-denial, faith and good works endeavor to grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and observance of the ordinances of the gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end, we agree to labor for the promotion of education and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.
