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

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MINUTES OF THE THIRD ANNUAL SESSION OF THE NORTH CAROLINA ASSOCIATION OF ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTISTS

MEETING—Ruth's Chapel Free Will Baptist Church, New Bern, North Carolina—Date: May 3, 4, 5, 1965

MONDAY EVENING, MAY 4

The Monday evening services opened with Rev. Ronnie Peele presiding and leading the congregation in singing the hymn, "I'll Sing the Wondrous Story" and "Heavenly Sunlight". The opening prayer was by Rev. Bennie Turner. The host Pastor, Rev. A. L. Hines, gave the congregation a warm welcome. Rev. W. L. Kell of Marion, N. C. responded with a sincere appreciation for the hospitality extended to the Association for this session.

The Moderator appointed the credentials committee consisting of Rev. Ronald Creech, Rev. Wingate Hansley and Rev. Joe Hailey, Jr. He also appointed Rev. Roy Rikard and Rev. Billy Morris to the finance committee.

TUESDAY MORNING, MAY 4

Motion made and seconded that Mr. Williams, a representative of Blue Cross Insurance Company be permitted time to discuss a new hospital plan. Motion carried.

Motion made and seconded that the business session be suspended until the afternoon session. Motion carried.

The morning worship service was presided over by Rev. Ed Hill. The congregation sang the hymn, "All Hail The Power". Rev. Jack Paramore brought the message of the hour, using Isaiah 54:2-3 and I Corinthians 16:9 as his scripture. He stated that this was the "Golden Hour for the Free Will Baptists." The door is open—the greatest need is "effective pastors." Every phase of the denomination depends on the mar behind the pulpit. We need revival of allegiance. Victory will be ours if we have real revival. He closed with prayer.

TUESDAY AFTERNOON, MAY 4

Rev. Robert Hagler was in charge of the song service. The devotions were by Rev. Luther Reed, using Revelations 21:1-8 as his scripture.

Motion made and seconded that we adopt the partial report of the executive committee. Motion carried.

The Executive Committee minutes of May 3, 1965 were read and approved.

Rev. Ronald Creech, chairman of the Credentials Committee gave a partial report. Motion made and seconded to accept the partial report. Motion carried.

Mrs. Flora Morgan gave a report on the Woman's Auxiliary work. (See report) Motion made and seconded that the report be accepted. Motion carried.

Rev. Robert Crawford gave an oral report on the program of the Mission Church in Greenville, North Carolina. He reported great progress in this work.

Brother Bobby Abrams gave a report on the program of the Witness and the State Work. Motion made and seconded that we give Brother Abrams a rising vote of thanks for his untiring efforts with this department. Motion carried.

Rev. Rufus Coffee brought greetings from the Foreign Mission Department of the National Association of Free Will Baptists. He shared with us some of the progress which is being seen on the several foreign fields where we have Free Will Baptist workers. Many souls are being saved and many preaching points are being established. Brother Coffee urged continued support of the Free Will Baptist Bible College which is really the strong arm of our denomination.

TUESDAY NIGHT, MAY 4

Rev. Frank Davenport gave the Missions Board report.

The following ministers gave a brief testimony and news about their respective Mission Church. Rev. John C. Moran, Brevard, North Carolina. Rev. Owen Ganey, LaGrange, North Carolina and Rev. L. D. Creech, Fayetteville, North Carolina.

The offering was taken.

Rev. James Childers brought a picture of the Mountain Property at Burnsville, North Carolina before the people in an effort to sell some of the lots.

Rev. Eugene Hales announced the following Declamation Sword Drill Winners: Ronnie Whittington 14-18 age, Linda Baker 12-14 age, Stanley Thomas Sword Drill. Ronnie Whittington gave his declamation to the convention. Rev. Ken Riggs sang "Follow Me" accompanied by Rev. Herman Hersey. Rev. James Denton brought the message of the evening using Philippians 2:1-15 as his scripture. (We need a desire to be like Jesus). The hymn, "I Surrender All" was used followed by an altar call. Benediction was by Rev. Gene Outland.

WEDNESDAY MORNING, MAY 5

Rev. Adam Scott showed slides of a rest home in Burnsville, North Carolina. Motion made and seconded that the N. C. Association of Free Will Baptist purchase the property of Mrs. Brinkley, which is now being operated as a rest home, for \$23,000.00. Motion carried.

Motion made and seconded to dispose with the business until one o'clock. Motion carried.

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REPORT OF THE BOARD OF CARE FOR CHILDREN AND THE AGED

The board of "Care for Children and the Aged" met Tuesday morning at 8:00, May 19, 1964 at the home of Brother Jack Green. All members of the board were present and worked throughout the day resuming their work on Wednesday morning at 7:00 and working until noon. We elected the following persons as officers of the board; Chairman, Rev. Sherman Branch, Secretary, Rev. Gene Outland, Treasurer, Rev. William Calvert. As a result of the work of the board we thought it wise to suggest to the Executive Committee of the State Association of Free Will Baptists to call a special meeting of the State Association in order that we might consider the proposals which follow. These motions which were passed by the board are to be considered as recommendations or proposals.

MSC. That we propose to develop all the area on our mountain below the road to Blankingship Creek and from lower line up to the shack above the road. This area is to be called "The Blankingship Creek Area". We also propose to dispose of the 25 acres on the Pennicola side of the mountain, this area is to be sold as one tract if possible.

MSC. That Brother Woody and Brother Green be responsible for the supervision of the maintenance of the present road on the mountain.

MSC. That Brother Woody and Brother Green form a twoman committee to act under the direction of the board in developing of the Blankingship Creek Area.

MSC. That Flat Ridge section of Laurel Gap be reserved for the Free Will Baptists, to be used for cabins, reservoir, possible Youth Camp, Minister's Retreat and etc.

MSC. We propose that the Home for the Aged be purchased or constructed in Yancy County if at all possible.

MSC. That Brother Woody and Brother Green investigate the possibilities for property for the Home for the Aged and bring a proposal to the next meeting of the board which will be held prior to the special called session of the State Association.

MSC. That we ask Mrs. Brinkley to hold property which she is offering to sell to the State Association of Free Will Baptist until the called meeting of the State Association. MSC. That we request the Executive Committee of State Association to call a special meeting of the State Association of Free Will Baptists on June 30, 1964 at 10:00 A. M. at Garner, N. C. (The request due to the fact that the owner of the property, which is available for the Home for the Aged, must have an answer as to whether we want the property by July 1, 1964. Meeting closed with prayer.

The board of Care for the Children and the Aged, met June 30, 1964 prior to the meeting of the Special called Session of the State Association in Garner Free Will Baptist Church. Meeting opened with prayer.

MSC. That we propose the purchasing of the Brinkley property in the town of Burnsville, N. C. at the price of \$23,000. Board adjourned until afternoon.

Following the Associational meeting the board met again; all members were present.

MSC. That Brother Woody, Brother Branch, and Brother Calvert, as a committee act in behalf of the board to confirm decision of the Association to buy the Brinkley property and to pay money to hold the property for two months, after which final transaction would take place giving us possession of the property; Reason for the two months delay being, to give us time to raise all the money possible before we obtained a loan to purchase the property. Meeting closed with prayer.

The Board of Care for the Children and the Aged met August 25, 1964 at the Rest Home in Burnsville, N. C. All members present. Meeting opened with prayer. A committee from Jack's Creek Association met with us and discussed with us the plans of operation of the Rest Home and other phases of the work. We discussed the responsibilities that would be ours after the purchasing of the Home. We discussed the matter of in-cooperation the Board. We met with bank officials concerning obtaining a loan to buy property. Meeting closed with prayer.

The board of Care for Children and the Aged met September 22, 1964 in Durham, N. C. We met jointly with the Executive Committee. All members were present. Our meeting was opened with prayer. Information was given concerning necessary statement from the Association in order for us to be able to obtain a loan. The proper action was taken that loan might be arranged to purchase property.

The Board of Care for the Children and the Aged met March 4, 1965. Meeting opened with prayer. All members of the board were present. M.S.C. That we purchase dime folders to be sent to churches through office in Goldsboro, N. C. A vry encouraging report of the Home was given by Mrs. Brinkley.

MSC. That Brother Branch, Brother Calvert and Brother Childers work as a committee to present to the State Association a proposed budget for the coming year's operation.

MSC. That sign in front of Rest Home be changed to read Free Will Baptist, Burnsville Rest Home.

We recommend that each pastor seriously re-evaluate the teaching and training program in his church to determine: 1. Does it protect his young people? 2. REPORT OF THE RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE:

No. 1 WHEREAS, there is a bill now pending before our North Carolina Assembly in session in Raleigh, North Carolina to permit the establishing and operating of a distillery in North Carolina;

> And whereas this will lead to the increased use and abuse of beverage alcohol in our State;

And whereas the Bible plainly forbids the use of intoxicating beverages in any form;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED:

That we, the North Carolina Association of Original Free Will Baptist in session this the 5th day of May, 1966, respectfully petition the members of the General Assembly to retain the present statute which forbids the manufacture of whiskey in North Carolina;

That we commend our Governor, the Honorable Dan K. Moore, for his stand opposing the establishing of distilleries and the sale of liquor by the drink.

No. 2 WHEREAS, the National Association of Free Will Baptist is coming to hold the 29th annual session in Raleigh, N. C. this July; and

> WHEREAS, our State Association extended their invitation to the National Association to meet with us at this session in Raleigh. Therefore be it resolved that we request our churches to receive a special offering for the expenses of entertaining the National Association on May 30. This offering should be sent to the treasurer of this Association who is the chairman of the entertainment committee, Rev. Billy Walker, P. O. Box 11173, Raleigh, N. C.; That we respectfully request the conferences and associations of our State to send a special offering for this purpose. It is understood that any surplus money received will be applied toward the indebtedness of the Free Will Baptist Witness.

No. 3 WHEREAS, there is a present effort to unite all religious bodies into an organic super world church under the guise of Christian unity known as the ecumenical movement.

> WHEREAS, this attempt to unite all religious faiths into an organic entity ignores the N.T. teaching of the church as the mystical body of Christ and the spiritual bond of Christ's Kingdom, and

WHEREAS, the historic doctrines of Fundamental Christianity are comprised in attaining this unscriptural unity, and

WHEREAS, the Roman Catholic Church is fostering cooperation and merger as a scheme to bring all Christendom under the control of Rome; and WHEREAS, the Bible plainly forbids us to "Be unequally yoked together with unbelievers" (II Corinthians 6:14) and that we are to "come out from among them and be ye separate saith the Lord" (II Corinthians 6:17), and that we are commanded plainly in II John 10-11 "If there come any unto you, and bring not this doctrine, receive hi mnot into your house, neither bid him God speed: For he that biddeth him God speed is partaker of his evil deeds;", and

WHEREAS, these plain Scriptural commands have been misinterpreted in evangelical Christian circles today in so-called "Co-operative evangelism" which allows any and all churchmen regardless of their doctrinal position or attitude to Christ and the Bible to take active parts in such evangelistic efforts; and

WHEREAS, this tendency is contrary to the historic position of Free Will Baptists;

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that we, the North Carolina Association of Original Free Will Baptists, in session this the 5th day of May, 1965, do call upon the churches and agencies of our denomination to be on guard of any and all evidences of ecumenicalism in our ranks and to expose it in the light of the Word of God: That we encourage our Pastors to inform their congregations as to the serious errors in the ecumenical movement through preaching and teaching of the Word of God.

That we respectfully urge our churches and pastors to refuse to sponsor, co-operate or promote any interchurch endeavor, such as evangelistic campaigns, forums etc. which are endorsed, sponsored or promoted by those who are not Bible believing Fundamental Christians.

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CONSTITUTION

of the

North Carolina Association of Original Free Will Baptists

Article I-Name and Purpose

This organization shall be known as the North Carolina Association of Original Free Will Baptists.

The purpose of this organization shall be the establishment and maintenance of a voluntary association of autonomous Original Free Will Baptist churches, quarterly meetings (or any other meetings) district association or conferences—or any and all additional organizations—areal, district or state-wide that may be deemed essential to the prosecution and promotion of the general purpose and program of this association. Included, also in the purpose of this association is affiliation with the National Association of Original Free Will Baptists and cooperation in its world wide ministry. This association holds unswerving loyalty to the inspired word of God as our infallable rule of faith and practice.

Article II Composition

This association shall be composed of its officers; members of standing boards; ordained and licensed ministers who are in good standing with a conference or an association affiliated with this body; together with three (3) delegates elected from each conference or Association; and one (1) delegate for every fifty (50) members or fraction thereof from each local church. (Note: this also includes any other church who wishes to be affiliated with the National Association).

Article III. Meetings

This Association shall meet annually at seven-thirty o'clock (7:30 P. M.) on the first Monday of May and will adjourn at the option of the body.

Article IV Officers and Board

The officers of this Association shall be Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer, Executive Board, Board of Trustees, Board of Missions, Board of Care for Children and Aged, Board of Superannuation, and Board of Youth Relations. Section 1. ELECTIONS

All officers shall be elected by the body. A nominating committee shall be elected at the beginning of each session. After their report is presented, additional nominations for any office may be made from the floor. The General officers shall be elected for a period of two (2) years. No person shall serve in more than one (1) elected position in the Association at the same time, and no one having served a full term shall be elected to succeed himself.

Section 2. DUTIES.

A. The duties of the moderator shall be to preside, according to accepted parliamentary procedure, over the sessions of the association; to appoint temporary committees; and the moderator shall serve as an advisor to all standing boards and as chairman of the Executive Board.

B. The duties of the Assistant Moderator shall be those of the moderator when the latter shall so direct or when he is absent.

C. The clerk shall record the proceedings of all sessions of the Association and preserve an accurate record of said proceedings in a book provided for this purpose. He shall prepare and cause to be published the minutes of the annual session of the association; hold in trust all documents not otherwise preserved, and surrender same at the direction of the association; and conduct the official correspondence and sign such documents and instruments as require his signature. He shall also serve as secretary of the Executive Board.

D. The Treasurer shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the Association and disburse same by order of the association, the executive board, or any standing board or subordinate general organization invested with the authority to authorize the disbursement of funds. He shall keep an accurate account of all funds received and disbursed and make an annual report to the association.

Section 3. EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Executive Board shall be composed of the general officers and three (3) members elected at large. The members

elected at large shall hold office for three (3) years, the term of one expiring each year. The Executive Board shall arrange the program for the annual sessions of the Association. They shall fill vacancies which may occur in any office until the session of the association. It shall be their duty to promote the work of the association. They shall direct the work of the Free Will Baptist Witness. They shall employ an Editor and Director of Information whose salary shall be approved by the association in its budget. They may appoint such other assistants as may be necessary.

The Executive Board may advise and assist other boards of the Association.

The Executive Board is not authorized to act as the Association when it is not in session except as provided for in this Constitution and by-laws or specifically directed by this Association.

Section 4 BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Board of Trustees shall consist of three (3) men elected for three (3) years, the term of one expiring each year. They shall hold in trust all real and personal property of the Association and shall convey such property as the Association may direct.

Section 5. BOARD OF MISSIONS.

The Board of Missions shall be composed of five (5) members elected for five (5) years, the term of one expiring each year. They shall make an annual report of their accomplishments to the Association.

BY-LAWS:

Article I

Purpose: The purpose of the Mission Board is to solicit funds from established churches and to organize churches in communities in North Carolina that has no Free Will Bapist Church. It shall also be the duty of the Board to help weak churches when it is advisable.

Article II

Choosing the Location for a Mission: It is the duty of churches and pastors throughout the state to advise the board of possible mission points. It shall be the duty of the mission board to make surveys and investigations as to the probability of starting a church in these areas. If the board thinks it advisable to start a church in an area, it shall solicit funds, secure the services of a preacher and start a mission.

Article III

Relationship to organized churches receiving assistance from the Board: Any organized church receiving support from the mission board must accept counsel from the board. The pastor must make a weekly report to the board of his activities.

Article IV

Revision: These articles may be revised when recommended by the board and approved by the state association.

Section 6-BOARD OF CARE FOR CHILDREN AND THE AGED

The Board of Care for Children and the Aged shall be composed of six (6) members elected for three (3) years the term of two (2) expiring each year. Each member must be a member of a conference of association of Free Will Baptist and the Board shall consist of at least one member from each conference of association belonging to the state association.

BY-LAWS:

1. This board shall be composed of six members as provided in the constitution of the Association.

2 The board shall meet at such times and places as directed by the chairman.

3. The work of the Home (Rest Home) such as. Maintaining of the property, directing the workers and soliciting of money shall be directed by the board or their appointees.

4. The board shall present to the Association along with their annual report a proposed budget for the coming year.

5. The board shall receive all request for information and applications for admittance into the Rest Home.

6. The board shall receive all information concerning the Child Care Program. (Board plans to make information available about this work.)

7. A permanent and complete records of all board meetings shall be recorded.

This board also shall provide the minister's and full 3. time Christian workers with other benefits which can be received only through group participation, namely, the Free Will Baptist Superannuation Association of North Carolina. which constitution is listed with these by-laws.

4. Assistance through the Superannuation Association of North Carolina can be received by complying with the Constitution and By-Laws of said association. GOVERNMENT—The government of this organization shall be vested in the Superannuation Board of the N. C. Association of F.W.B., However, Counsel from the membership will be respected.

Article V

MEETINGS: Meetings may be called at the discretion of the Superannuation Board of the North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptists.

Article VI

DUES: Each member shall pay dues monthly. The minimum dues shall be 25 cents, the maximum dues shall not exceed 50 cents according to the numerical status. These funds shall be used for the promotion and maintenance of the Superannuation Association.

Article VII

AMENDMENT—These by-laws may be amended after 30 days notification to all members by a vote of 3/5ths of the members of the Suparannuation Board.

Section 8. BOARD OF YOUTH RELATIONS.

The Board of Youth Relations shall be composed of five (5) members elected for five (5) years, the term of one expiring each year. They shall make an annual report of their accomplishments to the Association.

BY-LAWS:

Article I

NAME—The name of this Board shall be the Board of Youth Relations of the North Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptists of North Carolina.

Article II

PURPOSE—The purpose of the Board of Youth Relatoins is to promote Christian Youth activity among Free Will Baptist youth in the State of North Carolina. This activity shall be on the local, district, state or national level and shall consist of Youth Rallies and Revivals, Bible memory work, Youth Camps and any other such Bible related and competitive activity which will be conducive to wholesome and dedicated Free Will Baptist Christian Youth.

Article III

OFFICERS—The Board shall elect a chairman whose duty shall be to call and preside over meetings. The Board shall use the secretary of the State Program as its Secretary-Treasurer.

Article IV

MEETINGS—The Board shall call meetings at its own discretion whenever necessary and as funds permit reimburse each member at the rate of up to five (5) cents per mile as travel expense to and from the meetings.

MONIES—The Board shall receive and disburse such funds as are received through solicitation, allotments, gifts, etc. for the purpose of inacting the promotion of Christian Youth Activity.

Article VI

AMENDMENTS—These By-Laws may be amended by a 3/5 majority vote of the Board members only after a thirty (30) day notification of such amendment be given to each Board Member.

Article V Independence of the Local Church

This Association has no judicial or appelate powers conflicting with the independence of the local church.

Article VI Amendments

This Constitution may be amended by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote providing such amendment be read to the body and laid on the table until the following day.

BY-LAWS

1. All meetings shall be opened by singing, reading a portion of God's Word and Prayer; and shall be closed with prayer.

2. All business, except routine, shall be brought before the body by committee, but should a committee fail or refuse to present a matter of business, the business shall be brought from the floor.

3. In parliamentary procedure, Robert's Rule of Order shall be used as a guide.

4. The offices of Moderator and Assistant Moderator shall be filled on an alternating basis, from the eastern and western part of the state; Durham shall be the dividing line, When the Moderator is elected from one section, his assistant shall be elected from the other.

5. All officers, board members, and employees of this Association shall be reimbursed at the rate of 6c per mile when traveling to duly called board meetings or attending to the business of any board.

Since the National Association in its 1963 session at Detroit, Michigan, voted to set up a new Youth Program, which includes the Youth Programs that have been under the sponsorship and direction of the Youth Auxiliary Chairman in the Woman's Auxiliary, a need no longer exists for the office of Youth Auxiliary Chairman; therefore, we recommend that our Constitution and By-Laws be ammended as follows:

ARTICLE III Officers & Executives Commtitee: The officers of this convention shall be a President; Vice-President, who shall serve as Enlistment Chairman; Recording Secretary; Assistant Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary; Treasurer; Field Secretary; Study Course Chairman; Stewardship-Prayer Chairman; Personal Service Chairman. These shall con-

stitute the State Executive Committee, five of whom shall be a quorum for the transaction of business.

Under By-Laws delete Section 7 of Article I and re-number all succeeding sections so that Section 8 becomes Section 7, Section 9 becomes Section 8, Section 10 becomes Section 9, Section 11 becomes Section 10.

3. We recommend that the State Association be contacted to see if our minutes this year and future years can be printed with the minutes of the State Association, and that we pay our part of the expense each year.

4. We recommend that a Nominating Committee be chosen at this session to bring a suggested slate of officers at the State Annual Meeting next year, 1966, to fill existing vacancies. We further recommend that this Nominating Committee be composed of 1 member from each district convention, to be nominated from the floor and elected by the body at this annual meeting.

5. We recommend that each District in our Association give four copies of their District Officers and local auxiliaries in their District for promotional purposes to the State Recording Secretary and that this be done yearly.
