Minutes of the 1989 North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptist

#### EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

During the past year the Executive Board met on five occasions as authorized by the Constitution and By-laws or as directed by this body. We endeavored to transact the business of the North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptists.

On November 7th, 1989, Rev. Tom Lilly, State Promotional Director, called a telephone conference with the Executive Board to discuss the Bell Park property in Greenville, N.C. that is owned by the North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptists.

On November 20th, 1989, the Executive Board met at the Shady Grove Free Will Baptist Church in Durham, North Carolina. During that meeting the following items were acted upon: Rev. Tom Lilly, State Promotional Director, gave to the Board a financial statement. A motion was approved to allow the State Promotional Office to purchase or lease a computer for the state office with a \$1200 cap on the purchase or lease. Rev. Tom Lilly presented to the board several items of interest concerning the Greenville Land Project. Several considerations were discussed relative to the land. A motion was approved to authorize the State Promotional Director to pursue with meeting proper authorities concerning the rezoning and development of the Greenville land so that the Executive Board could review the options at its next meeting. A motion was approved authorizing the State Promotional Director to handle and sell the property located in Bessermer City, N.C., if the purchasing price was not less than \$60,000. The speakers for the 1990 state meeting were selected by the Executive Board.

On February 6th, 1990, the Executive Board met with the State Promotional Director, the Chairman of the Rest Home Board and the Rest Home Administrator, at the Western Free Will Baptist Rest Home in Candler, N.C. The purpose of the meeting was to offer assistance in helping the Rest Home concerning its financial matters. A financial statement (12/1/89 to 12/21/89) was reviewed by the Executive Board. The consensus determined that the Rest Home needed approximately \$200,000 to place it in a more stable financial situation. The following motion was approved: "That Rev. Jack Ward and the Rest Home Board be authorized to seek a lending institute or vehicle for the relief of the approximately \$200,000 needed to place the Rest Home in a more stable financial position. The Rest Home Board was authorized to procure a loan plan that would incorporate and consolidate the indebtedness of the Rest Home."

On March 8th, 1990, the Executive Board met in Greensboro, N.C. in a special called meeting to authorized the Western Free Will Baptist Rest Home to borrow money for the reorganization of finances in the amount of \$200,000.

On April 24th, 1990, the Executive Board and various state boards met at the Shady Grove Free Will Baptist Church, in Durham, N.C.

The following state board reports were received: Home Missions Board (Rev. Dean Dobbs); North Carolina Book Store (Rev. James Stancill); North Carolina Youth Board (Donnie Miles); Western Free Will Baptist Rest Home Board (Rev. Tom Lilly).

The Board discussed making a standardized form for financial reporting from the state boards and the possibility of forming an advisory board for financial assistance for the state boards and other ministries in the state of North Carolina that needed assistance.

Upon giving the report for the Western Free Will Baptist Rest Home, Rev. Tom Lilly stated that a new bond program was in the process to help liquidate indebtedness. It was stated that there was a need for the Executive Board to monitor financial reports quarterly. The following motion was approved by the Executive Board: "Be it resolved that the Executive Board amend the motion concerning the amount of money that the Rest Home may borrow from \$200,000 to \$210,000. Be it further resolved that the Executive Board continue to monitor the financial situation at the Rest Home with the understanding that quarterly financial reporting will be made to the Executive Board until such time as the Board deems it satisfactory to stop."

Rev. Tom Lilly reported on the Bessemer church property and stated that details were being negotiated with a group interested in purchasing the property.

The State Promotional Director presented the North Carolina State Promotional Office financial report and the budget was voted on to present to the state at the annual state meeting.

The following motion was approved: "The Executive Board and all state boards are to meet on the first Monday and Tuesday of October. The Executive Board and state board chairman to meet on the last Tuesday of April."

The agenda for the 1990 state meeting of the North Carolina State Association was completed.

#### REPORT OF THE PROMOTIONAL DIRECTOR

The Promotional Department's 1989 financial report is presented in part in this Digest, representing receipts and disbursements of the last three quarters of the most recent fiscal year, (April 1, through December 31, 1989), in accordance with the North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptist's recent action, to utilize the calendar fiscal year as a mode of periodic reporting to it's constituency, beginning with this 1990 session.

The first quarter of 1989 (January 1 through March 31, 1989), was inherent in the 1988-89 report, submitted in the previous years Digest. The first quarter of 1990 will be consolidated into the fiscal reporting period for next year in 1991, to provide a complete fiscal years accounting of the Promotional Department's financial activity. Accordingly, the partial report of the Promotional Department's financial activity in this Digest, represents approximately three-fourths of the period reported during preceeding years, or the years to follow.

By comparison this year's quarterly receipts indicate approximately ten percent increase in contributions, with a one percent increase in the funds transferred, from North Carolina ministries, on to national ministries through the Promotional Department. Those percentages were increased from twenty-four percent last year to twenty-five percent this year, with eighty-two churches disbursing funds to the state office.

I express my deepest gratitude toward all the pastors, churches and individuals, who have been instrumental in helping me build our North Carolina ministries stronger during the past year. The interest and cooperation of everyone is encouraging, even though there are numerous churches which have yet to contribute faithfully to the cause. I desire your prayers for the cause of Christ as it relates to the ministry of Free Will Baptists in North Carolina, and my efforts in the Promotional Department to fulfill His will in service to all of you.

#### NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS DECEMBER 31, 1989 AND 1988

#### NOTE #1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

<u>Organization</u> - The accompanying financial statements include the accounts of The Bible Book Store of Durham, Inc., a subordinate member organization of the North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptists. The corporation is exempt from federal income taxes under the Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3). The primary function of the corporation is supplying Sunday School and other Christian literature to the Free Will Baptist Churches in the southeastern states. The corporation also maintains an inventory of Christian literature for sale to the general public. The corporation accounts for sales and expenses on the accrual method.

Inventory - Inventory consists of bibles, sunday school literature, supplies and other Christian literature, and is valued at cost.

<u>Property and Equipment</u> - Property and equipment is stated at cost. Depreciation is calculated primarily using accelerated methods over estimated useful lives of 5 to 10 years.

#### NOTE #2 - LEASE

The corporation has an operating lease agreement for the store premises expiring April, 1994. In addition to the minimum rent, the lease provides for contingent rentals of 3-1/2% of gross sales in excess of amounts specified in the lease agreement. No additional rent was required for the lease year ending April 30, 1989. The lease requires specified payments for maintenance, property taxes and insurance. Rent expense amounted to \$15,817 and \$15,019 for the years ending December 31, 1989 and 1988, respectively.

The N. C. State Youth Board met twice during 1989. The first meeting was on April 25, at the Shady Grove F.W.B. Church in Durham in connection with our other state boards. Our second meeting was by means of a conference phone call on October 30.

At our April meeting we discussed our preparations for the 1989 State Youth Competition held in Gastonia. We also talked about the annual 'Weekend at the Wilds' sponsored by our board. The attendance for the retreat has been declining in recent years. We felt we needed to consider making some changes which we would think about and discuss at our next meeting.

It was also noted that we need a location in the eastern part of the state for our 1990 State Youth Conference.

Our financial report was examined and approved.

The October meeting began with a brief financial report. We discussed the 1990 S.Y.C. to be held May 4 and 5. The First F.W.B. Church in Beaufort has invited us to meet there. Because of some question we noted that churches must come through their local district association to compete at the State Youth Competition.

The rest of this meeting was spent on the Wilds retreat. We felt there were possibly two factors that have contributed to a decrease in attendance, which we have little control over - cost and the date, both of which are set by the Wilds. It was pointed out that some may be tired of going to the same place year after year. We agreed to try scheduling the Wilds every other year and consider another location during the in between years.

We have the Wilds retreat scheduled for April 5-7, 1991. The cost will be \$54 per person.

Our 1991 State Youth Conference is planned for May 3 and 4 at the First F.W.B. Church in Garner. We need invitations for the 1992 conference (western part of the state) and 1993 conference (eastern part of the state).

Finally, we want to express our appreciation to those who support this ministry with their prayers and finances. Young people from several different churches from the mountains to the coast are scheduled to represent our state at the National Youth Conference in Phoenix. To my knowledge, we can be proud of the way North Carolina youth have presented themselves at past Nationals. They have abided by the standards, competed by the rules and studied hard to please the Master. All have not won first place medals - though many have - but all are winners. No one who spends hundreds of hours studing the Scriptures or developing talents for God's glory can be considered losers. A lot of money is needed to help the 25 or so North Carolina young people get to Phoenix. Our board doesn't have much to offer. With 200 churches in our state, if we all did something it could amount to a lot. We certainly would be grateful for any offering you could give. Remember these in your prayers. Thank You.
