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# MINUTES OF THE THIRITY-SECOND ANNUAL SESSION OF THE

NORTH CAROLINA ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST

CRAMERTON, NORTH CAROLINA

### MONDAY MORNING

The Thirty-Second Session opened with singing "Love Lifted Me" led by Daron Dwyer. Following the opening song, Jack Ward read from Revelation Twenty-one and then led the congregation in prayer.

The host pastor, Doug King, was introduced to the congregation. Brother King welcomed the North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptist to Cramerton and to Cramerton Free Will Baptist Church.

The clerk, Gerald Fowler, called the Thirty-Second Annual Session to order. After calling the session to order, he turned the session over to the moderator, William Calvert.

The moderator, William Calvert, addressed the session on, "Doing the "Will of God and Exalting Christ". After his address, moderator Calvert, recognized those visiting the session.

Those visiting from the National Departments in Nashville were Melvin Worthington (Executive Department), Bob Shockey (Free Will Baptist Bible College), Billy Brown (Randall House), and Richard Adams (Home Missions). Foreign Missionaries present were Jim and Vickie Sturgill (Brazil), and Mirial Gainer (Japan). Other visitors included James Wilhide (Children's Home - South Carolina), and Jack Lassiter (Southeastern Free Will Baptist College).

Brother Calvert brought the moderator's message from Revelation chapter two. He warned against relying on promotion, planning and organization. He emphasized we need to rely on anointed preaching, and praying. God's method, he stated, is using the message.

The moderator received a motion from the standing delegates to seat the lay delegates. The motion passed. following the motion the moderator appointed the following committees:

Marcum who sung "Feel The Nails".

Gene Hales introduced the morning speaker, Dr. Ed Hutchinson, pastor of Shelly Free Will Baptist Church, Shelly North Carolina.

Dr. Hutchinson's text was Acts 4:13. He spoke on four things Free Will Baptist Churches need. They were fervent prayer, fruitful life, fearless preaching, and a firm stand.

### MONDAY AFTERNOON

Gene Hales concluded the morning session by announcing the evening service would start a seven o'clock instead of seven-thirty.

Gene Hales opened the afternoon session. The congregation sung "Victory In Jesus" followed by prayer led by Talmadge Brown.

Daron Dwyer sung "People Need The Lord".

William Calvert called the session to order and then recognized Howard Messer to give a partial credentials report. He reported seventy-seven standing delegates, sixteen lay delegates and thirty visitors for a total of one hundred twenty-three.

Brother Calvert called for nominations for the nominating committee. Elected were W. L. Kell, Chairman, Henry Horne, Jim Marcum, Doug King, and Robert Durham.

The clerk was recognized to give the Executive Board report. A motion carried to receive this report.

Tom Lilly was recognized to give the promotion department. Bother Lilly made a motion to receive the financial report. The Motion carried.

Brother Lilly explained that the Benevolent Fund now has two types of members, fifty dollar members and twenty-five dollar members. Fifty dollars receive fifty dollars from each fifty dollar member and twenty-five dollar from each twenty-five dollar members receive twenty-five dollars from each twenty-five and fifty dollar member.

The clerk was recognized to present the 1994 proposed budget. The clerk moved the acceptance of this budget. The motion carried.

James Stancill brought the Book Store report. A motion carried to receive this report. Brother Stancill reported the Book Store made the largest profit it has made in the last several years.

Following his report, Jim Turnbough, presented James and Frances Stancill a check from the board for twelve years of faithful service.

Brother William Calvert presided over the first service and Brother Tim Stout presided over the second service. For both services there was wonderful congregational music led by Daron Dwyer. Special music was brought by the Cramerton Ladies Ensemble for the first service and the Cramerton Choir for the second service. Brother Harold Blankenship, Mount Holly, North Carolina spoke on "The All Time Great Book". Brother Dann Patrick, Goldsboro, North Carolina, spoke on "I Shall Return" during the second service. The worship service closed with a presentation of one thousand dollars each to the Promotional Department and Home Missions by the Book Store.

# Tuesday Morning June Seventh, Ninteen Ninety-Four

The Missions service began with singing led by Daron Dwyer. Talmadge Brown welcomed everyone and led in prayer asking God to bless the service.

Brother Brown introduced the Missions service and asked Dennis Wiggs from the Home Missions Board to introduce each of the missionaries.

He introduced foreign missionaries Hemant Patel, India, and Mirial Gainer, Japan.

Following these he introduced, Gene Hales, Matthews, and Randy Stone, Fayetteville.

Gene Hales gave a report about the work in Matthews and then Randy Stone gave a report concerning the work in Fayetteville.

Before missionary appointee to Asheboro, Bob Edmondson, spoke on "The Roaring Lion", The Cramerton Ladies Trio brought special music. The wonderful message of Brother Edmondson concluded the Missions service.

The moderator opened the business meeting by recognizing Howard Messer to give the final credentials report. A motion carried to receive the following report:

that we determine to exercise serious, spiritual caution concerning

criticism of our brethren.

Resolution number two; subject: FELLOWSHIP OF ENCOURAGEMENT WHEREAS.

the Executive Secretary and the Executive Committee for the national Association of Free Will Baptists sent written notice to the  $\frac{\text{Fellowship}}{\text{of Encouragement}}$  (F.O.E.) and  $\frac{\text{Fellowship}}{\text{of Encouragement}}$  for the purpose of unity, asking them not to meet at the National convention, and

WHEREAS,

The F.O.E. group has continued to meet at each convention with disregard to the Secretary's and the Executive Committee's request for them to meet,

BE IT RESOLVED

we go on record as condemning this action and we send a resolution to the National Body to do the same.

Resolution number three; subject: Standard Publishing Company WHEREAS,

The Standard Publishing Company has taken a direction which they term as "culturally relevant and contemporary" in their youth publications, and WHEREAS.

Their recent literature offerings, particularly the Teen Vacation Bible School literature

(1) makes use of so-called Christian rap and Christian rock music and endorses several groups who perform this.

(2) presents "open-ended scenarios" featuring worldly performers such as Madonna, etc. with no clear teaching about the danger of such role models,

(3) features on its pages those with a worldly appearance, and

(4) generally provides very weak Scriptural teaching, and WHEREAS.

Our Bible book Store has corresponded with the representatives of Standard Publishing voicing our concern, and has for the time being removed Standard Publishing materials from their shelves.

BE IT RESOLVED

that the North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptist go on record as opposing this "new direction" as being unscriptural, worldly, and ultimately ineffective, as it does not call for repentance and transformation as Christ taught.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED

- (1) that the North Carolina State Association of Free Will Baptists officially communicate this resolution to Standard Publishing Company and
  - (2) that our pastors be encouraged to send personal letters voicing their concern to the following representatives: Robert W. Nealeigh Director Trade Sales Standard Publishing 8121 Hamilton Avenue Cincinnati, Ohio 45231

Resolution number four; Subject: National Youth Conference WHEREAS,

North Carolina Free Will Baptists have some of the finest youth pastors in the country whose heartbeat is for young people's salvation and growth in Christ, and WHEREAS.

there has been evident weakness in the area of Biblical, fervent preaching to our young people at our National Association by our National Youth Conference (NYC); therefore, BE IT RESOLVED

that we, the North Carolina State Association of Free will Baptists, petition the National Sunday School Board to include some of our North Carolina pastors in the NYC program at the National Association to re-emphasize the ministry of Biblical, fervent preaching to the needs of our young people.

A motion carried to adopt the following resolution from the floor.

### THE PROMOTION OF ROCK MUSIC

WHERE AS MANY PASTORS AND LAYMEN HAVE BEEN OFFENDED BY THE CONDONING OF "GOSPEL ROCK" MUSIC IN OUR DENOMINATION'S TEEN QUARTERLY,

BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE NORTH CAROLINA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST GO ON RECORD AS OPPOSING CHRISTIAN ROCK AND CHRISTIAN RAP AS AN ACCEPTABLE FORM OF CHURCH MUSIC,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT OUR STATE SEND A MESSAGE TO THE SUNDAY SCHOOL DEPARTMENT AND THE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD INFORMING THEM OF THIS OPPOSITION, AND EXPRESSING OUR DISAPPOINTMENT THAT KEVIN RIGGS WAS NOT TERMINATED AS TEEN WRITER WHEN IT WAS LEARNED HIS OF CHRISTIAN ROCK PHILOSOPHY,

AND BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED THAT THE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD AND SUNDAY SCHOOL EXECUTIVE DEPARTMENT INCLUDE AS A PART OF THEIR PROSPECTIVE EMPLOYEE INTERVIEW DISCUSSION CONCERNING THE PROSPECTIVE EMPLOYEE'S VIEWS ON CHRISTIAN ROCK MUSIC AND IF THEY ARE NOT AGAINST CHRISTIAN ROCK THAT THEY NOT BE EMPLOYED.

# Executive Board Meeting Carolina Duke Motor Inn October 24, 1994

The Executive Board held a special session with the chairman of all the boards at the Carolina Duke Motor Inn in Durham.

The meeting began at seven-thirty p.m. with Tom Lilly, Tim Stout, Talmadge Brown, Howard Messer, Jack Ward, Dean Dobbs, William Calvert, Mance Cason, A. B. Brown, Dann Patrick and Gerald Fowler were present.

Much discussion was held concerning the directions our state and national are headed in.

A motion passed for Tom Lilly to come up with a financial plan to present to the churches that would support our state office.

A motion carried for Tom Lilly to select two men to work with him on the plan. Mance Cason and Gerald Fowler were selected.

A motion carried to select Dann Patrick, Dean Dobbs, and Talmadge Brown to serve as a steering committee for suggestions for nominations for the National Association and to write a loose mission's statement defining the conservative stance.

A motion carried to adjourn at eleven-thirty.

# Executive Board Meeting October 25, 1995 Shady Grove, Durham

After the opening session of the All Boards Meeting, the Executive Board continued in session.

A motion carried for Dann Patrick to contact the Associations who haven't given five hundred dollars for the copier for the State Office.

A motion carried to change the Monday afternoon starting time from one-thirty to one o'clock and the evening service from seven-thirty to seven o'clock.

A motion carried for the steering committee consisting of Dean Dobbs, Talmadge Brown, and Dann Patrick be called Committee for Denomination Conservatism and their duties be

- 1. Research which offices will be open for election at this year's National Convention;
- 2. Make suggestions of names we, as a State body, can vote for as a block;
  - 3. Write a missions statement detailing the ultimate goal and purpose of this committee.

A motion carried to change the semiannual meetings to the last Tuesday of February and September.

A motion carried to call a special All Boards meting for November twenty-ninth for the Committee for Denomination Conservatism and the Financial Committee to report at.

# Special All Boards Meeting November 29, 1994 Oak Grove, Durham

Moderator William Calvert opened the session with a welcome of each one.

Brother Calvert recognized Tom Lilly to summarized the purpose of this special session. Brother Lilly recapped the October meetings and stated the Financial Committee had designed a plan of equitable distribution of resources.

Brother Calvert then recognized Dann Patrick to give a report from the Committee for Denomination Conservatism. Brother Patrick reported the committee had talked by phone but have not been able to meet and formulate a plan.

Brother Calvert then recognized Brother Lilly to present the "Sixty - Forty Plan" from the Financial Committee.

It was agreed upon to meet February the twenty-eight to present the plan to all pastors. It was agreed that the Committee for Denomination Conservatism would report at this meeting. The place chosen for the meeting was Oak Grove in Durham.

The Executive Board met following this meeting to discuss the Annual State Meeting program. Suggestions for speakers were Jerry Rackley (alternate - Fred McCracken) for Monday morning, Talmadge Brown (alternate - Jim Marcum) for first evening service and Roy Thomas for the second service.

# Special State meeting of Pastors February 28, 1995 Oak Grove, Durham

Asisstant Moderator, Tim Stout, welcomed the assembly. Moderator William Calvert read from Ephesians chapter four and Dennis Wiggs led in a special prayer for the session. Brother Tom Lilly summarized the events and reasons leading to the meeting. Gerald Fowler spoke on our motives and goals.

Dann Patrick was recognized to give a report from the Committee for Denomination Conservatism. He recapped the elements that have led to the existence of the committee:

- 1. The snubbing of North Carolina.
- 2. All major boards are voted on west of the Mississippi,
- 3. Resolutions from the states were not sent to the floor,
- 4. We as a state give 10% of all the national budgets.

He then addressed the question, "What can we do?" and gave these two answers:

- 1. Get mad and go our separate ways.
- 2. Join together in our state and join with other states
- of like mind to vote on the contract as the National.

Brother Patrick stated a missions statement could not be achieved but they were offering a contract dealing with seven areas of concern. The seven areas of concern were music, Sunday School, Bible preaching, separation, Foreign missions, National Association offices, and the National Association of Evngelicals.

A motion carried to receive the report for consideration.

A vote was taken to see how the body felt about the spirit of the report. A favorable vote of 103 out of the 108 pastors present was received.

A motion carried for the Committee for Denomination Conservatism and the Executive Board to bring back a finalized report and steps to take to achieve the objectives at our state meeting in June.

# Executive Board Meeting Shady Grove, Durham April 25, 1995

Dann Patrick led in prayer to open the session. Tom Lilly gave a financial report to the board and reported on the Greenville property.

Discussion concerning the program for the state meeting was held. Everyone agreed for Trymon Messer to preach the Monday evening for the second service in the place of Roy Thomas and for Mance Cason to preside over the morning service and Christian Powell to read scripture and lead in prayer. (Later in a phone conference, Loenza Stox was selected to fill this position.)

A motion carried to meet with Virginia and South Carolina about the

"Seven Areas of Concern" on May sixteen.

A motion carried to raise the state fees from twenty-five to thirty-five to go in effect for the 1995 1996 year.

A motion carried to raise Tom's salary thirty dollars a week and Loretta's ten dollars per week.

A motion carried to title the budget when it is printed in the digest "1995 Budget" to show it is retroactive to January 1995.

A motion carried to give Tom Lilly a \$400 bonus from miscellaneous. Three hundred and fifty is to be used for a new suit and \$50.00 is to be used as a gift to Loretta for secretaries' week.

A motion carried to print the "Seven Area of Concern" in the Witness. A motion carried to adjoun.

Greetings from the Promotional Department:

The report of the Promotional Department which follows is somewhat more extensive than former reports, with financial information delineating our history of giving to ministries beyond the North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptists during the past few years.

Seventy-one churches contributed \$61,332.00 to or through the Promotional Department during 1994, with ten Associations and Auxiliaries giving an additional \$10,124.00. Individuals also supported the Department as well, with gifts that amounted to over \$5,000.00 in 1994. Supplementary revenue was received from Sheperd's Grove Holiness Church in the amount of \$16,500.00, resulting from the sale of the Bessemer City property. Payments are received which amounts to \$450.00 per month, with \$5,000.00 in principal payments due on the 20th of December each year. The balance owed by the Association on the property is \$14,794.93 as of June 1, 1995.

The giving of North Carolina churches to National ministries is presented in this report by percentages for comparison, along with their giving to North Carolina ministries during the fiscal years ending 1993, 1992, and 1991 as well.

The 60/40 plan of resource distribution which the Association has adopted is intended to achieve a more equitable distribution of all resources, to sustain and project our state ministries into the future. It is imperative that our constituency accept the challenge and responsibility to build our work stronger by their financial support in years to come.

Thank you for all you have done during 1994 for the cause of Christ, as it relates to North Carolina Free Will Baptists.

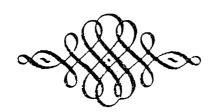

# THE 60/40 PLAN OF RESOURCE DISTRIBUTION

# I. WHAT IT IS NOT!

- 1. It is not the <u>CO-OP PLAN</u> of support. The CO-OP is a national plan of suggested support that divides funds to all departments of the National Association of Free Will Baptists, and is both received and disbursed by the Executive Department in Antioch, Tennessee.
- 2. It is not a <u>COMPETETIVE PLAN</u> in origin or nature to contest with any other worthy ministry for support by trying to "get in first", or out do another department by "special appeal" in fund raising for our work.
- 3. It is not a <u>CONTROL PLAN</u> to decide for any church what it will or will not support in the state or national ministries. Every church can designate in the future as in the past, where it wants its' money to go and it will be dispersed accordingly.
- 4. It is not a <u>COMPULSORY PLAN</u> that any church has to participate in or is compelled to accept in any way. The involvement of churches in the plan is altogether voluntary.
- 5. It is not a CONTRADICTORY PLAN of the North Carolina Promotional Department or any department to deter the continued support of our national and world wide ministries, tending to focus on North Carolina alone. In fact, the idea of the "60/40 Plan" came out of a co-ordinating committee meeting consisting of the Executive Board, the chairman of all Department Boards, and the District Moderators of all Quarterly Conferences. This co-ordinating committee was installed at the Twenty-Second Annual Session of the North Carolina Association when it convened at Swannanoa, North Carolina in June of 1983.

The idea of the plan came out of an Executive Board meeting in Durham on May 14, 1984, and was discussed with intent to ultimately benefit all our ministries — both at home and abroad, and the plan has already been adopted by some of our churches and is being used by them now.

# II. WHAT IT IS

- 1. It is a <u>RECOGNITION</u> of the existing gross imbalance in North Carolina funding of its' state ministries which in 1981-82 reached proportion of 88% percent going outside the state, while only 12% percent was kept for North Carolina ministries, (a percentage far lower than any other state that is a part of our movement).
- 2. It is a <u>RESPONSE</u> to the fiscal dilema which has beset North Carolina in the past, bringing the State Office to the point of near closing at the Ninetenth Annual Session held in Jacksonville, North Carolina in June of 1981, and sending the Executive Board, The Book Store Board, and the Mission Board shortly thereafter to make loans to settle accounts in arrears and pay salaries.

- 3. It is a <u>RECOVERY</u> initiative to bring our work in North Carolina back on solid footing with a strong emphasis on missions and church planting—the focus of our work being spread more throughout the local church constituency so the burden may be shared by all our people.
- 4. It is a <u>RESOURCE</u> distribution plan that is fair and equitable, intended to incorporate support for our state work into the pattern of church budgeting and giving, so that North Carolina will not face again the near tragedy of the past and we can carry out our commitments both at home and abroad.
- 5. It is a <u>REMEDY</u> in part, to the weakness of North Carolina's fiscal structure that is so dependent upon "special appeal" in fund raising. North Carolina must have a regular, consistent and unsolicited support plan that can be relied upon in the future if we are to meet the challenge that is before us, in both building and establishing oure work.

# III. HOW IT WORKS

- 1. Churches are ask to evalute their record of support for North Carolina ministries and seek to bring their budgeting to designate 40% percent to North Carolina and 60% percent to national ministries under the 60/40 Plan.
- 2. No faith promise pledges would be affected, but should be made a part of the percentages counted for determining support.

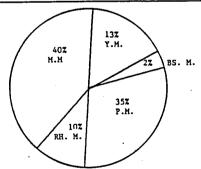

# BIBLE BOOK STORE MANAGER'S REPORT

In considering the deficit in our 1994 financial report, I felt an accompanying statement appropriate. According to the financial statement, the Book Store had a \$4757.41 deficit for the 1994 fiscal year. In actuality the Book Store sustained a true loss of \$1707.67 for 1994. \$3049.74 was depreciation on new office equipment purchased in 1994. This shows up as a loss when recorded as an expense in our financial statement. The \$1707.67 was basically a reduction in inventory. All of our bills were paid as of December 31, 1994, with the exception of sales and payroll taxes which normally come due in mid-January.

It was a challenging year for the Book Store. Total sales were up from the previous year, but not enough to offset the loss incurred. The deficit occurred in light of the following factors:

- (1) The Book Store lost VBS sales as a result of our boycott of Standard Publishing. I am pleased that Standard Publishing received our message of concern and has changed its policy and upgraded its standards. As a result, our VBS sales are already on the rise for this fiscal year. We trust this will continue.
- (2) A loss was further incurred when some of our FWB Churches felt it necessary to boycott the teen Sunday School materials from Randall House. Again, I'm pleased to say that appropriate changes and improvements have been made in this area as well. Our churches are again purchasing our youth materials.
- (3) Normally the Book Store hosts 1 or 2 book fairs for ladies' retreats each year. These retreats normally produce approximately 3 to 5 thousand dollars in revenue. Our ladies enjoy shopping and believe in purchasing good books for themselves and their families. In 1994, the Book Store did not host a ladies retreat. I'm pleased to announce that the Book Store will be hosting a retreat this fall. Also, we have supplied books for a Christian school book fair in May.
- (4) The Book Store made two major purchases in 1994: a Minolta copier and a Kingsley hot stamping machine. Together these cost the Book Store \$7386.48. Depreciation in the same year of purchase for this equipment added \$3049.74 to our deficit. This depreciation is accounted for in our financial statement as a loss.

(5) As the Book Store grows in volume and services rendered, so does the amount of workers needed to support the growth. In May of 1994, the Book Store added a third full-time employee to help with the work load. I'm pleased to introduce to you Mr. Paul Perreault as our newest sales counselor. I might add he's also my son-in-law. Paul is a hard worker and is very good with the public. He has already proved an asset for the Book Store.

Currently the Book Store is sound financially. The Book Store staff will make every effort to increase the volume of sales and save expenses wherever possible to assure a good financial statement for 1995. Please keep in mind that the Book Store operates by faith and sound judgment. The Book Store operates on a cash basis from month to month. This means that inventory for resale is purchased in advance on credit with the hope that resale of materials will be swift to allow vendor payment on schedule. The Book Store is current with all its financial dealings.

I thank our Book Store Board for their interest, imput, and support.

Mrs. Stancill and I appreciate the confidence you have placed in us and are thankful we can serve the cause of Christ while serving our state association.

# THE BIBLE BOOK STORE OF DURHAM, INC. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 1994 AND 1993

### NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF UNIT

The accompanying financial statements include the accounts of The Bible Book Store of Durham, Inc., a subordinate member organization of the North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptists. The corporation is exempt from federal income taxes under the Internal Revenue Code Section 501 (c) (3). The primary function of the corporation is supplying Sunday School and other Christian literature to the Free Will Baptist Churches in the southeastern states. The corporation also maintains an inventory of Christian literature for sale to the general public. The offices of The Bible Book Store of Durham, Inc. are located in the North Duke Mall in Durham, North Carolina.

### NOTE 2 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

### Basis of Presentation - Fund Accounting

The accounts of The Bible Book Store of Durham, Inc. are organized and maintained on a fund basis. A fund is an independent fiscal and accounting entity with a self-balancing set of accounts recording its assets, liabilities, fund balance, revenues, and expenses. The Bible Book Store of Durham, Inc. maintains only one fund which is used to account for all transactions.

### Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the corporation are maintained on the accrual method. Under this method revenues are recognized when earned rather than when collected and expenses are recognized when the obligation is incurred rather than when it is paid.

### Bad Debts

Bad Debts are written off suing the direct write-off method. Therefore, these financial statements do not include any allowance for doubtful accounts.

### Inventory

Inventory consists of bibles, Sunday school literature, supplies, cards, musical cassettes, books and other Christian literature, and is valued at cost under the first-in, first-out method. Inventory is taken annually on December 31 of each year.

### Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include all petty cash funds of the corporation and cash deposited with banks in the form of checking accounts, savings accounts, money market accounts and short-term certificates of deposits.

### Property and Equipment

Fixed assets are recorded at original cost. Items that do not substantially improve or extend the life of an asset are expensed when paid. Items which do substantially extend the life of an asset and major improvements are capitalized and depreciated over the estimated useful life of an asset. Fixed asset are depreciated using statutory percentages under the modified accelerated cost recovery system over the following estimated useful lives:

Furniture and Fixtures	5 - 7	years
Office Equipment	5 - 7	years
Leasehold Improvements	5 - 10	years

### NOTE 3 - LEASE OF BUILDING

The corporation has an operating lease agreement for the store premises expiring in December, 1999. In addition to the minimum rent, the lease provides for contingent rentals of 3.5% of gross sales in excess of amounts specified in the lease agreement. No additional rent was required for the lease year ending September 30, 1994 and 1993. The lease requires specified payments for maintenance, property taxes and insurance. Rent expense amounted to \$9,203.27 and \$18,420.96 for the years ending December 31, 1994 and 1993, respectively.

Future minimum lease payments, including common area maintenance and taxes, under the noncancellable operating lease at December 31, 1994, excluding contingent rentals and executory costs, are as follows:

### NOTE 4 - EXEMPTION FROM INCOME TAXES

The Bible Book Store of Durham, Inc., a subordinate member organization of the North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptists, is a non-profit corporation exempt from federal and state income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501 (c) (3). Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been made in these financial statements.

NOTE 5 - HOUSING, SOCIAL SECURITY, TRAVEL AND RETIREMENT ALLOWANCES

The manager of The Bible Book Store of Durham, Inc. receives an allowance for housing of \$230.00 per week and \$100.00 each month in addition to his salary. The total housing allowance paid to the manager for the years ending December 31, 1994 and 1993 was \$13,390.00 and \$10,050.00, respectively. Payroll taxes, including social security and medicare taxes, for the manager are paid by the Bookstore and recorded as social security allowance.
