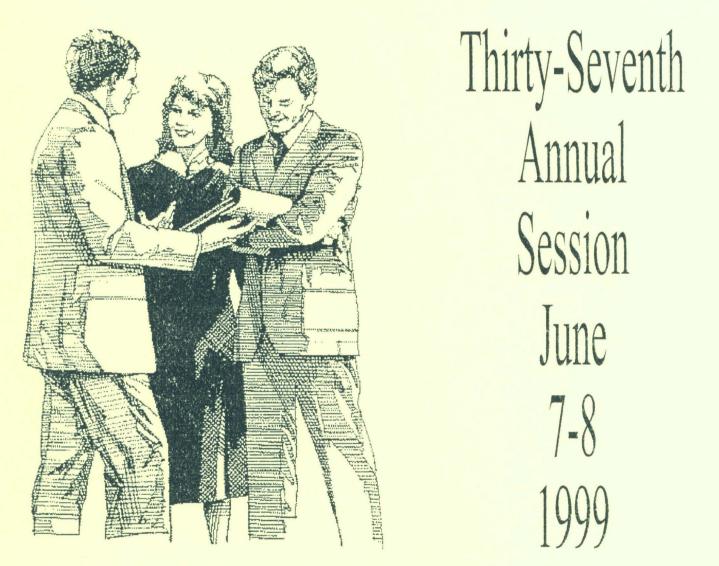

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Constitution of the North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptists



The Preamble

The purpose of this organization shall be the establishment and maintenance of a voluntary association of autonomous Free Will Baptist churches, quarterly neetings (or any other meetings), district associations or conferences or any and all additional organizations - area, district or statewide that may be deemed essential to the prosecution and promotion of the general purpose and program of this Association. Included also in the purpose of this Association is affiliation with the National Association of Free Will Baptists, the adoption of *The Treatise of the Faith and Practice of Free Will Baptists*, and cooperation in its world-wide ministry. This Association holds unswerving loyalty to the inspired Word of God as our infallible rule of faith and practice.

Article I: Name

This Association shall be known as *The North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptists*, however, informally the term "*State Association*" may be used.

Article II: Composition

This Association shall be composed of its officers, nembers of standing boards, ordained and licensed ministers who are in good standing with a conference or association affiliated with this body, together with three 3) delegates elected from each conference or association and one (1) delegate from every fifty members or fraction thereof from each local church which is in good standing with a conference or association affiliated with this body.

Article III: Meetings

Section 1

This association shall convene in regular annual session Monday and Tuesday after the first Sunday in June and at a place determined by the Association in ession.

Section 2

In the event of an emergency resulting from a ancellation of the place approved by the Association while in annual session, the Executive Board of the Association shall have the power to make a substitute hoice of a suitable location for the annual meeting.

Section 3

Should a called session be deemed essential, the executive Board shall have authority to issue and publicize not less than two (2) weeks in advance of the session.

Section 4

The qualified members in attendance at any regular or alled session shall constitute a quorum.

Article IV: Officers

The officers of this Association shall consist of the members of the Executive Board, the Board of Trustees, the Board of Youth Ministry, the Board of Missions Ministry, the Board of Care for the Aged Ministry, the Board of Retirement and Insurance Ministry, and the Board of the Bible Book Store Ministry.

Article V: Boards

Section 1

This Association shall establish the following standing boards.

The Executive Board

The Board of Trustees

The Board of Youth Ministry

The Board of Missions Ministry

The Board of Care for the Aged Ministry

The Board of Retirement and Insurance Ministry

The Board of the Bible Book Store Ministry

Section 2

The Executive Board shall consist of Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer and three (3) members at large elected by the Association.

Section 3

The Board of Trustees shall consist of three (3) members elected by the Association.

Section 4

The following boards shall each be composed of five (5) members elected by the Association.

The Board of Youth Ministry

The Board of Missions Ministry

The Board of Care for the Aged Ministry The Board of Retirement and Insurance Ministry

The Board of the Bible Book Store Ministry

Article VI: Discipline

This association has no judicial or appellate powers conflicting with the independence of the local church or bodies constituting this Association.

Article VII: Amendments

This constitution may be amended by two-thirds majority vote of the members present and voting at a session of the Association provided the proposed amendment is presented to the body one day in advance.

Article VIII: Dissolution

In the event of the dissolution of this Association, any assets of the organization then remaining shall be conveyed to the National Association of Free Will Baptists.



By-Laws of the North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptists



Article I: Membership

Section 1

Membership in this Association shall be through application of a duly constituted district association (or conference). A credentials committee shall examine the application and make other investigation it deems appropriate. A credentials committee shall make a recommendation to the association as to the action to take regarding the application. The decision on the application shall be by majority vote of delegates present and voting.

Section 2

Each church holding membership in an affiliated association shall automatically be a member of this association.

Article II: Representation

Section 1

Each district association holding membership in the State Association shall send a report of statistics on a form provided by the Association to every annual session of the Association. Failure to report for two successive sessions of the association may be the basis for dismissal from the association by a majority vote of members present and voting.

Section 2

of delegates shall Seating be through recommendation of a credentials committee. Any potential delegate whose credentials are not recommended for approval by the Credentials Committee may be seated only by a majority vote of seated delegates who are present and voting.

Article III: Duties of Officers

Section 1

The Executive Board shall: (1) arrange the program for the annual sessions of the Association, (2) fill vacancies which may occur on any board between sessions of the Association, (the person duly elected by the Association), (3) promote the work of the Association, (4) review the annual reports and proposed budgets of all boards before they are presented to the State Association, (5) provide for and give general supervision to a church bond program and other similar service ministries and, (6) employ and supervise a promotional director, whose duties shall be as follows:

- A. <u>Administrative</u>. To administer the affairs of the Executive Board within the authority delegated by the board. He shall fulfill all duties commensurate with his office and present plans and procedure to the board which he feels would be effective in promoting the work within the Association.
 - B. <u>General Promotion</u>. To show through general promotion the correlation and interrelation of all the ministries of the State Association and National Association. It is expected that he will promote impartially the total program of work as devised by all standing boards.
 - C. <u>Public Relations</u>. To keep in close contact with pastors, district associations, and local church leaders. He shall represent the State Association to other bodies when in the interest of the Association.
 - D. <u>Publications</u>. To serve as editor-in-chief of the <u>Free Will Baptist Witness</u>. He shall direct the production of other promotional material as may be approved by the Executive Board.
 - E. <u>Stewardship</u>. To provide a stewardship education that will serve to produce increased support for the state ministries through the "State Program" and/or other methods of giving by Associations, churches, and individuals.
 - F. <u>Arranging Annual Association</u>. To expedite the planning of the annual Association program, arrange for the enrolling of ministers and delegates and distribute the printed minutes of the Association.
 - G. <u>Other Duties</u>. To perform other duties as may be assigned by the Executive Board. It is understood that the Promotional Director is to have no official or ex-officio status on any standing board or committee of the Association, except as may be specifically provided by action of the Association.
 - H. The Promotional Director shall serve as historian for the Association. It shall be his responsibility to gather articles and materials for the historical collection. He also shall publish a history of Free Will Baptists, especially as it relates to the history of the Free Will Baptists in North Carolina, and shall update the publication periodically.

The Executive Board may advise and assist other boards of the Association. The Executive Board is not authorized to act for the Association except as provided in the constitution and by-laws of the Association or as specifically directed by the Association.

Section 2

The Board of Trustees shall be legal custodian of all property belonging to to Association except in the case of the standing boards of the Association which by action of the association are authorized to incorporate.

Section 3

The Board of Missions Ministry, the Board of Care for the Aged Ministry, the Board of Youth Ministry, the Board of Retirement and Insurance Ministry and the Board of the Bible Book Store Ministry each shall promote the work within the State as would generally be recognized as coming within the purview of the respective board. Each board shall: (a) be responsible to the State Association for all their actions, (b) propose by-laws for the government of their respective work, (the by-laws of each board shall be presented to the Association for approval), (c) make an annual report of its accomplishments to the Association, and (d) prepare a budget of proposed expenditures which shall be presented to the Association for approval.

Section 4

The moderator shall, (1) preside at meetings of the State Association and Executive Board, (2) call meetings of the Executive Board of his own volition or upon request of at least three members of the Executive Board, (3) appoint such committees as are created without provision for their selection, (4) fulfill whatever responsibilities that may be commensurate with the bffice or that may be delegated by the Association.

Section 5

The assistant moderator shall preside at the request of, or in the absence of the moderator and assist the moderator in such manner as may be requested.

Section 6

The clerk shall prepare minutes of the proceedings of all meetings of the Association or the Executive Board and preserve an accurate record of said proceedings in a book provided for this purpose and shall handle such official correspondence as may be directed by the Association. He shall, through the Executive Board, arrange for the printing of the minutes.

Section 7

The Treasurer shall hold in trust all money that elongs to the Executive Board of the Association and disburse same by order of the Association. The Executive Board, or any standing board or subordinate eneral organization invested with the authority to authorize the disbursement of funds. He shall keep an account of all funds received and disbursed and make an innual report to the Association.

Article IV: Election of Officers and Board Members

Section 1

No person shall hold membership on more than one standing board at the same time.

Section 2

All officers shall be elected by the body. A nominating committee shall be elected at the beginning of each session. After their report is presented, additional nominations for any office may be made from the floor. the General Officers shall be elected for a period of two (2) years. No person shall serve in more than one (1) elected position in the Association at the same time, and no one having served a full term shall be elected to succeed himself more than once.

Section 3

The officers of Moderator and Assistant Moderator shall be filled on an alternating basis, from the eastern and western part of the state; Durham shall be the dividing line. When the Moderator is elected from one section, his assistant shall be elected from the other.

Article V: Terms of Office

Section 1

The three (3) members at large elected to the board, shall each have a term of office of three (3) years with their terms arranged so that one (1) member's term expires annually.

Section 2

The members of the Board of Missions Ministry, the Board of Care for the Aged Ministry, the Board of Youth Ministry, the Board of Retirement and Insurance Ministry and the Board of the Bible Book Store Ministry shall each have a term of office of five (5) years with their terms arranged so that one (1) member's term expires annually.

Section 3

The members of the Board of Trustees shall each have a term of office of three (3) years with their terms arranged so that only one member's term expires annually.

Article VI: Committees

Section 1

Various committees shall be constituted when need arises, by the State Association or the Executive Board. The number of members of a committee shall be determined by the establishing body (State Association or Executive Board). Committee members shall be appointed by the moderator unless otherwise provided

by the action creating the committee. Committee members shall serve for the length of time provided, until their work has been completed, until they are released, or their successors chosen.

Section 2

The following committees shall be appointed annually to serve during the session of the State Association.

- A. <u>The credentials committee</u> of three (3) members. This committee shall examine all letters to the Association, applications for membership in the Association, and credentials of the various delegates. The committee shall make recommendations to the Association regarding the seating of delegates and the action to take on applications for membership in the Association.
- B. <u>The resolutions committee</u> whose duty it shall be to screen resolutions that are presented. Only resolutions determined by this committee to be worthy are to be presented to the Association by the committee.
- C. <u>The finance committee</u> which shall receive and account for all funds received with letters or through offerings during the Association.

Article VII: Honorarium and <u>Reimbursements</u>

Section 1

The Clerk shall receive as honorarium \$300.00 annually.

Section 2

Members of standing boards, or duly constituted committees, may be reimbursed for expenses in attending board meetings within the state, exclusive of the annual Association Meeting, at the rate of 20 cents per mile (may claim road distance if traveling by airplane). In addition if over-night travel is required, reimbursements may be made for actual meals and lodging expenses. No employee of any board may be reimbursed for any travel in excess of this amount.

Article VIII: Quorum

A simple majority of a board or committee shall constitute a quorum.

Article IX: Proxy

No voting shall be done by proxy in meetings for the State Association. Proxy representation shall be accepted for meetings of the Executive Board provided the proxy is designated in writing by the board member or by oral communication between the member and the moderator.

Article X: Parliamentary Authority

The meetings of the State Association shall be governed by the rules of parliamentary law as set forth in <u>Robert's Rules of Order</u> except in the case of those rules which are superseded by rule of this Association..

Article XI: Amendments

These by-laws may be amended by (1) majority vote of the members present and voting provided the amendment is presented on day prior to the vote, or (2) by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting if immediate action is to be taken as soon as debate has been completed.

MINUTES OF THE THIRTY-SIXTH ANNUAL SESSION OF THE NORTH CAROLINA ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST JUNE 8-9, 1998 TABERNACLE FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH KINSTON, NORTH CAROLINA

The session was opened by Sam Harris leading the congregation in the hymn, "Victory in Jesus." Rev. Reuben Cason read Ephesians 4:1-16 and led in prayer. Host pastor Jim Maddox extended a welcome from the host church after which the clerk called the session to order and introduced the moderator, Tim Stout. The moderator recognized the visitors who were attending our state association.

The moderator recognized the standing delegates and then spoke from Acts 2:36-38 on "The Need to Preach the Word. His points were: 1. Preaching should be Spirit blessed; 2. Preaching should be Scripturally based; 3. Preaching should be Sin blasting.

The moderator appointed the following to serve on committees:

The business session was recessed and the morning worship service began. Sam Harris led the congregation in "Leaning on the Everlasting Arms". The special music was provided by Todd Harris. Tim Stout introduced Jim Marcum who preached the morning message. He preached from John 12:23-32 on "Lifting Jesus Up."

After the morning message, the following ministries of our National Association of Free Will Baptist presented their reports:

National Executive Department — Melvin Worthington National Sunday School Department — Dennis Wiggs

National Free Will Baptist Foreign Missions Department — Fred Warner Free Will Baptist Bible College — Roy Harris

Following these reports, the meeting was recessed for lunch.

Monday Afternoon

The afternoon business session began by Sam Harris leading the congregation in "Saved, Saved." After opening prayer, Lawrence Taylor provided the special music. A partial report of the Credentials Committee was presented. Motion was made and seconded to receive the report. It passed.

Moderator recognized the lay delegates and they were seated. Nominations were received for the Nominating Committee. The following were nominated:

Jim Turnbough, Chairman Jerry Rackley Milton Hollifield Tim Rabon A. C. Morgan

Lorenza Stox gave the report of the Executive Committee. Two items were presented to be voted on:

- That we acknowledge the letter coming from the Blue Ridge Association and the Resolution from the Randall Association and since they both referred to the same issue, that they be given to the Resolution Committee. A motion was made to refer this to the resolution committee and it carried.
- 2. That we continue to rent office space in Goldsboro, NC while we continue to build a base of support for the Promotional Office.

That we send a comprehensive questionnaire to all the pastors of the state regarding the Promotional Office location.

Suggested Questions:

- A. As a pastor, would your church pledge support for the Promotional Office if it was in Goldsboro, or in the Central part of the State?
- B. Do you feel like the Promotional Office is needed in our State to promote our specific ministries and to represent our State at the National

Association of Free Will Baptists? (Briefly explain why you feel this way.)

- C. Where do you think the location of the State Office would best benefit the State? (Briefly explain why you feel this way.)
- 3. That the funds from the sale of the Bell Forks property, along with the interest, be allocated in the following ways:
 - A. Reserve \$250,000 in a 3-year Certificate of Deposit for the building of a permanent Promotional Office building.
 - B. Loan \$100,000, interest free, to the Western North Carolina Rest Home to be paid back over a three year period. As this money is returned, it will be placed in a "Land Fund."
 - C. \$66,000 be designated as unrestricted funds, to pay-off the State owned vehicle, and the balance to be placed in the "Land Fund."

A motion was made and seconded that we adopt the recommendation. It carried with an amendment to change the pay-back period to 5 years with the money being loaned to the Rest Home.

Jim Marcum gave the Promotional Department Report and a motion was made and seconded to receive the report. It carried. Brother Marcum then presented the report of the Benevolent Fund. A motion was made and seconded to adopt the report and budget. It carried.

Tom Lilly gave a financial report of his last six months in office. It was received as information.

The reports of the State boards and auxiliaries were given by the following and the reports were received and their budgets were adopted:

Book Store: James Stancil WNAC: Betty Hill Leah Waddell Scholarship Fund: Betty Hill Rest Home: Doug McGee Youth Board: Christian Powell North Carolina Home Missions Ministry: Tim Rabon

Billy Bevan was recognized to give a report from Southeastern Free Will Baptist College.

Other reports from National Association of Free Will Baptist Ministries:

National Home Mission: David Crowe (Dr. Paul Park from Orange County, California, a Korean FWB pastor, brought words of greeting giving his burden for the Korean people in America.) Board of Retirement: Ray Lewis.

Following these reports, the business session was recessed for the day.

Monday Evening

Henry Horne presided during the first service that was opened with the congregation singing "There is Power in the Blood" led by Sam Harris followed by a combined choir singing two numbers.

Henry Horne then introduced Rev. Guy Owens to bring the evening message. He preached from Exodus 12:1-8 a message entitled "Feeding on the Lamb." The message covered (1.) Why we need to feed on the Lamb and (2) When do we feed on the Lamb.

Wendell Wally presided during the second service. Following a congregational song "Mended Wings" quartet brought the special music. Brother Wally then introduced Rev. Ronnie Adkins to bring the evening message. He preached a message entitled "Reaching the X Generation" using as a text Ephesians 1:7. He gave five (5) characteristics of the X generation and then spoke on how to reach this generation. The service closed with an invitation and prayer.

Tuesday Morning

This session was opened by Sam Harris leading the congregation in "To God Be the Glory." Dennis Ray Jones then provided the special music.

Tim Rabon, chairman of the State Mission Board presented Rev. Dennis Wiggs and Rev. Talmadge Brown plaques for their faithful years of service on the State Home Mission Board.

Talmadge Brown introduced our state missionaries—Eugene Hales and Bob Edmondson, who gave reports of their work.

Jeff Jones then presented our missionary to Wilmington, Pat Hall, who brought the morning message. He preached from Romans 4:17-25.

After the message Moderator Tim Stout resumed the business session. He recognized our State Promotional Director, Jim Marcum. Brother Marcum suggested

that we set aside October as North Carolina Month.

The Moderator then recognized the chairman of the Credentials Committee, David Young for the final report of that committee. He reported:

Greetings in the Name of our Lord, from the North Carolina Free Will Baptist Promotional Office. It is my pleasure to report to you on our progress. The Lord has been good, and, as usual has supplied all of our needs from traveling mercies to financing the office.

Once again, we have covered many miles to be among our Free Will Baptist preachers and people, since we met in the Tabernacle Free Will Baptist Church in Kinston, North Carolina last year. Since that meeting the state vehicle has logged @ 40,000 miles, and we have still not been in all of our churches. Even at a slower pace we preached for 50 different Free Will Baptist Churches.

Two things that slowed the office down in getting to all of our churches (and doing *The Witness*), has been the unanticipated but appreciated invitations to do Couple's Retreats and revivals for our North Carolina churches. From January 22nd through April 28th alone, the Promotional Office was responsible for speaking at <u>2 Couples Retreats</u>, <u>1 Association Retreat</u>, and <u>7 Revivals</u>. Include in those 14 weeks a trip to Nashville, Tennessee for the FWBBC Bible Conference and a trip to Ohio to visit my grandmother, and it was full to say the least. However, in the end of it all 9 people have come to know Christ and many others have come to the altar to make decisions for the Lord. That is what our Free Will Baptist work is all about; making our local churches stronger.

Before commenting on our financial record, let me apologize to our brethren for two things. First of all, as stated in the January - February issue of **The Witness**, my priorities for working are to Preach in our Churches, Attend our Association Meetings, and Publish **The Witness** on a regular basis. Preaching in our churches has been easy, but getting to Association meetings has not been good because of my scheduling errors. Likewise, **The Witness** is getting more difficult to finish regularly because of the many meetings, and not having a secretary. Though the budget has a place for a secretary, the incoming funds are not enough to provide for the same. The funds, I cannot do anything about. 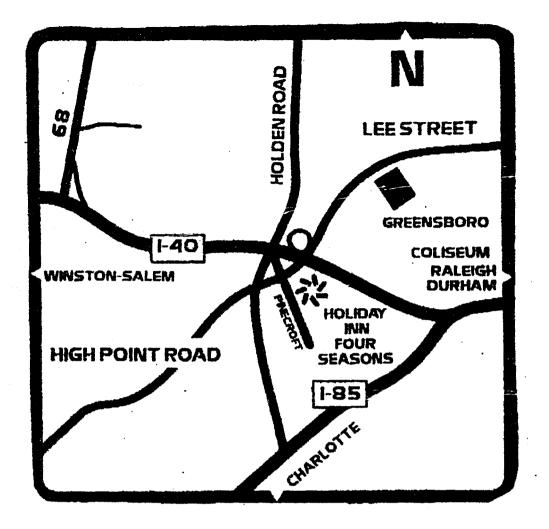

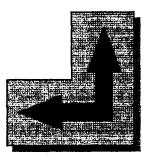
