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NORTH CAROLINA ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS CONSTITUTION

THE PREAMBLE

The purpose of this organization shall be the establishment and maintenance of a voluntary association of autonomous Free Will Baptist churches, quarterly meetings (or any other meetings), district associations or conferences or any and all additional organizations - area, district or statewide that may be deemed essential to the prosecution and promotion of the general purpose and program of this Association. Included also in the purpose of this Association is affiliation with the National Association of Free Will Baptists, the adoption of The Treatise of the Faith and Practice of Free Will Baptists, and cooperation in its Association world-wide ministry. This unswerving loyalty to the inspired Word of God as our infallible rule of faith and practice.

Article I: Name

This Association shall be known as *The North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptists*. However, informally the term *"State Association"* may be used.

Article II: Composition

This Association shall be composed of its officers, of standing boards, ordained and licensed ministers who are in good standing with a conference or association affiliated with this body, together with three (3) delegates elected from each conference or association and one (1) delegate from every fifty members or fraction thereof from each local church which is in good standing with a conference or association affiliated with this body.

Article III: Meetings

Section 1: This association shall convene in regular annual session Monday and Tuesday after the first Sunday in June, and at a place determined by the Association in session.

Section 2: In the event of an emergency resulting from a cancellation of the place approved by the Association while in annual session, the Executive Board of the Association shall have the power to make a substitute choice of a suitable location for the annual meeting.

Section 3: Should a called session be deemed essential, the Executive Board shall have authority to issue and publicize a called session of the State Association: said call shall be publicized not less than two (2) weeks in advance of the session.

Section 4: The qualified members in attendance at any

regular or called session shall constitute a quorum.

Article IV: Officers

The officers of this Association shall consist of the members of the Executive Board, the Board of Trustees, the Board of Youth Ministry, the Board of Missions Ministry, the Board of Care for the Aged Ministry, and the Board of the Bible Book Store Ministry.

Article V: Boards

Section 1: This Association shall establish the following standing boards.

The Executive Board
The Board of Trustees
The Board of Youth Ministry
The Board of Missions Ministry
The Board of Care for the Aged Ministry
The Board of the Bible Book Store Ministry

Section 2: The Executive Board shall consist of Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Treasurer and three (3) members at large elected by the Association.

Section 3: The Board of Trustees shall consist of three (3) members elected by the Association.

Section 4: The following boards shall each be composed of five (5) members elected by the Association. The Board of Youth Ministry, the Board of Missions Ministry, the Board of Care for the Aged Ministry, and the Board of the Bible Book Store Ministry.

Article VI: Discipline

This association has no judicial or appellate powers conflicting with the independence of the local church or bodies constituting this Association.

Article VII: Amendments

This constitution may be amended by two-thirds Majority vote of the members present and voting at a session of the Association, provided the proposed amendment is presented to the body one day in advance.

Article VIII: Dissolution

In the event of the dissolution of this Association, any assets of the organization then remaining shall be conveyed to the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

NORTH CAROLINA ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST BY-LAWS

Article I: Membership

Section 1: Membership in this Association shall be through application of a duly constituted district association (or conference). A credentials committee shall examine the application and make other investigation it deems appropriate. A credentials committee shall make a recommendation to the association as to the action to take, regarding the application. The decision on the application shall be by majority vote of delegates present and voting.

<u>Section 2</u>: Each church holding membership in an affiliated association shall automatically be a member of this association.

Article II: Representation

Section 1: Each district association holding membership in the State Association shall send a report of statistics on a form provided by the Association to every annual session of the Association. Failure to report for two successive sessions of the association may be the basis for dismissal from the association by a majority vote of members present and voting.

Section 2: Seating of delegates shall be through recommendation of a credentials committee. Any potential delegate whose credentials are not recommended for approval by the Credentials Committee may be seated only by a majority vote of seated delegates who are present and voting.

Article III: Duties of Officers

Section 1: The Executive Board shall: (1) arrange the program for the annual sessions of the Association, (2) fill vacancies which may occur on any board between sessions of the Association, (the person duly elected by the Association), (3) promote the work of the Association, (4) review the annual reports and proposed budgets of all boards before they are presented to the Association, (5) provide for and give general supervision to a church bond program and other similar service ministries and, (6) employ and supervise a Promotional Director, whose duties shall be as follows: A. Administrative. To administer the affairs of the Executive Board within the authority delegated by the board. He shall fulfill all duties commensurate with his office and present plans and procedure to the board which he feels would be effective in promoting the work within the Association.

- **B. General Promotion.** To show through general promotion the correlation and interrelation of all the ministries of the State Association and National Association. It is expected that he will promote impartially the total program of work as devised by all standing boards.
- C. Public Relations. To keep in close contact with pastors, district associations, and local church leaders. He shall represent the State Association to other bodies when in the interest of the Association.
- **D. Publications.** To serve as editor-in-chief of *The Witness*. He shall direct the production of other promotional material as may be approved by the Executive Board.
- E. Stewardship. To provide a stewardship education that will serve to produce increased support for the state ministries through the "State Program" and/or other methods of giving by Associations, churches, and individuals.
- **F.** Arranging the Annual Association. To expedite the planning of the annual Association program, arrange for the enrolling of ministers and delegates and distribute the printed minutes of the Association.
- **G. Other Duties.** To perform other duties as may be assigned by the Executive Board. It is understood that the Promotional Director is to have no official or exofficio status on any standing board or committee of the Association, except as may be specifically provided by action of the Association.
- H. The Promotional Director shall serve as historian for the Association. It shall be his responsibility to gather articles and materials for the historical collection. He also shall publish a history of Free Will Baptists, especially as it relates to the history of the Free Will Baptists in North Carolina, and shall update the publication periodically.

The Executive Board may advise and assist other boards of the Association. The Executive Board is not authorized to act for the Association except as provided by the Constitution and By-Laws of the Association, or as specifically directed by the Association.

NORTH CAROLINA ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST BY-LAWS

Section 2: The Board of Trustees shall be legal custodian of all property belonging to the Association, except in the case of the standing boards of the Association, which by action of the association are authorized to incorporate.

Section 3 The Board of Missions Ministry, the Board of Care for the Aged Ministry, the Board of Youth Ministry, the Board of Retirement and Insurance Ministry and the Board of the Bible Book Store Ministry each shall promote the work within the State as would generally be recognized as coming within the purview of the respective board. Each board shall: (a) be responsible to the State Association for all their actions, (b) propose by-laws for the government of their respective work, (the by-laws of each board shall be presented to the Association for approval), (c) make an annual report of its accomplishments to the Association, and (d) prepare a budget of proposed expenditures which shall be presented to the Association for approval.

Section 4: The moderator shall, (1) preside at meetings of the Association and Executive Board, (2) call meetings of the Executive Board of his own volition or upon request of at least three members of the Executive Board, (3) appoint such committees as are created without provision for their selection, (4) fulfill whatever responsibilities that may be commensurate with the office or that may be delegated by the Association.

Section 5: The assistant moderator shall preside at the request of, or in the absence of the moderator, and assist the moderator in such manner as may be requested.

Section 6: The clerk shall prepare minutes of the proceedings of all meetings of the Association or the Executive Board and preserve an accurate record of said proceedings in a book provided for this purpose, and shall handle such official correspondence as may be directed by the Association. He shall, through the Executive Board, arrange for the printing of the minutes.

Section 7: The Treasurer shall hold in trust all money that belongs to the Executive Board of the Association and same by order of the Association, the Executive Board, or any standing board or subordinate general organization invested with the authority to authorize the disbursement of funds. He shall keep an account of all funds received and disbursed and make an annual report

to the Association.

Article IV: Election of Officers and Board Members

Section 1: No person shall hold membership on more than one standing board at the same time.

Section 2: All officers shall be elected by the body. A nominating committee shall be elected at the beginning of each session. After their report is presented, additional nominations for any office may be made from the floor. The general officers shall be elected for a period of two (2) years. No person shall serve in more than one (1) elected position in the Association at the same time, and no one having served a full term shall be elected to succeed himself more than once.

Section 3: The officers of Moderator and Assistant Moderator shall be filled on an alternating basis, from the eastern and western part of the state: Durham shall be the dividing line. When the Moderator is elected from one section, his assistant shall be elected from the other.

Article V: Terms of Office

Section 1: The three (3) members at large elected to the board, shall each have a term of office of three (3) years with their terms arranged so that one (1) member's term expires annually.

Section 2: The members of the Board of Missions Ministry, the Board of Care for the Aged Ministry, the Board of Youth Ministry, and the Board of the Bible Book Store Ministry shall each have a term of office of five (5) years with their terms arranged so that one (1) member's term expires annually.

Section 3: The members of the Board of Trustees shall each have a term of office of three (3) years with their terms arranged so that only one member's term expires annually.

Article VI: Committees

Section 1: Various committees shall be constituted when need arises, by the State Association or the Executive Board. The number of members of a committee shall be determined by the establishing body (State Association or Executive Board). Committee members shall be appointed by the moderator unless otherwise provided by the action creating the committee. Committee members shall serve for the length of time provided, until their work has been completed, until they are released, or their successors are chosen.

NORTH CAROLINA ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTIST BY-LAWS

Section 2: The following committees shall be appointed annually to serve during the session of the State Association.

A. The credentials committee of three (3) members. This committee shall examine all letters to the Association, applications for membership in the Association, and credentials of the various delegates. The committee shall make recommendations to the Association regarding the seating of delegates and the action to take on applications for membership in the Association.

B <u>The resolutions committee</u> whose duty it shall be to screen resolutions that are presented. Only resolutions determined by this committee to be worthy are to be presented to the Association by the committee.

C. <u>The finance committee</u> which shall receive and account for all funds received with letters or through offerings during the Association.

Article VII: Honorarium and Reimbursements

Section 1: The Clerk shall receive as honorarium \$300.00 annually.

Section 2: Members of standing boards, or duly constituted committees, may be reimbursed for expenses in attending board meetings within the state, exclusive of the annual Association Meeting, at the rate of 31 cents per mile (may claim road distance if traveling by airplane). In addition if over-night travel is required, reimbursements may be made for actual meals and lodging expenses. No employee of any board may be reimbursed for any travel in excess of this amount.

Article VIII: Quorum

A simple majority of a board or committee shall constitute a quorum.

Article IX: Proxy

No voting shall be done by proxy in meetings of the State Association. Proxy representation shall be accepted for meetings of the Executive Board provided the proxy is designated in writing by the board member or by oral communication between the member and the moderator.

Article X: Parliamentary Authority

The meeting of the State Association shall be governed by the rules of parliamentary law as set forth in *Robert's Rules of Order*, except in the case of those rules which are superseded by rule of this Association.

Article XI: Amendments

These By-Laws may be amended by, (1) majority vote of the members present and voting, provided the amendment is presented on day prior to the vote, (2) by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting if immediate action is to be taken as soon as debate has been completed.

MINUTES OF THE THIRTY-SEVENTH ANNUAL SESSION OF THE

Be it Further Resolved that the State of N. C. let the various denominational agencies know that we will look with disdain on a continual taxation without representation.

Motion made and passed to table.

Whereas the "Concern" document is to give direction in the selection of speakers and Board members

EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORTS

Executive Board Meeting Best Western Motel & Shady Grove FWB Church November 22-23, 1999

The Board met to hear the report of the Promotional Department and the reports from the other boards. Brother Jim Marcum gave his report and reported on the income for flood victims.

The following motions were passed:

- 1. That we let the interest generated by the land fund, minus the rate of inflation, be used to support the Promotional Director's Office expense. This interest money will be taken out of the money market account.
- 2. That we change the By-laws under Article III, Section 1 to read "The Executive Board shall: (1) arrange the program and location for the annual sessions of the Associations......"
- 3. That the Moderator and Promotional Director meet with the Rest Home Director and Chairman of their Board to ascertain why the Rest Home is barely breaking even and report their finding back to the Executive Committee.

The following speakers were selected for the state meeting: Henry Potter, Joe Haas, Sr., Karl Sexton.

February 7, 2000

The Board met in a special called meeting to meet with the Rest Home Board to discuss new regulations by the state and what should be done about additional personnel and money to meet these regulations.

Brother Jack Ward informed us that the new regulations, which went in force July 1999 would require them to hire five additional workers at a combined additional yearly salary of \$128,000.

The Board recommended to the Executive Committee that we lease the Rest Home. This would allow us to retain ownership and would provide residual income for the state.

The following motions were passed:

- 1. That we accept the recommendation of the Rest Home Board and proceed to find someone who would lease the Rest Home.
- 2. That we instruct the Rest Home Board that they use wisdom and great sensitivity in obtaining a clear title to the property.
- 3. That the remaining funds in the flood Relief Account be used in our Promotional Office (with the consent of the original committee which met to determine the needs and distribution of funds) for time and expense it incurred in distributing the flood money.

Total amount distributed was \$421,000.

Dear Members and Friends of our State:

It is with great joy and thanksgiving that I greet you at this meeting of the Thirty-Eighth Annual Session of the North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptists. This is my third year to report and I am just as pleased to do it this year as in the first.

As is typical of my office, there have been many miles (40,000 plus) spent on the road. As a representative of our state it was my privilege to be in 28 new Free Will Baptist Churches. It is taking a longer than I thought to get into all of the churches that make up our association. A couple of reasons for this, is that some churches have me back each year, and churches that have become familiar with me schedule me for revivals. Both of these factors slow the process of getting into all of the churches of our State Association.

During this past year I have not only had the opportunity to preach in 28 new Free Will Baptist churches, but in 2 Association meetings, the National Association Leadership Conference, one camp meeting, one local church conference, and 8 revival meetings. During this time I have been blessed to see 5 people saved and many others make various decisions for Christ.

After last year, a greater effort was made to attend association meetings. It is a joy and not a task to be a part of these meetings. My heart has been blessed by God's Word and the good fellowship in all of these meetings. A couple of our association meetings conflict because of time and distance, therefore I have to rotate being in attendance with them. But in each conference I am well received and given the opportunity to report.

This year was significantly marked by the disaster of Hurricane Floyd. Seventeen of our churches were affected and approximately 140 of our people suffered different degrees of loss, from minor damage to the total loss of home and business. A great deal of time was spent on organizing a disaster relief plan, and once in place our people and churches responded from all parts of our nation. To all of our amazement, we received over \$421,000 in cash. Plus, there is no telling how much the dollar value would be on all of the material that was sent for clothing, health and hygiene, and the reconstruction of buildings. We are indeed grateful for all of the help that came our way. However, families are still rebuilding and we need to keep them in our prayers. Further, my hat is off to our faithful pastors, their wives and families who have carried the heart-wrenching burden of so many.

Now, once again I come with an apology. *The Witness* has been a priority since I came into this office and I have put a great deal of time into designing a paper that would be informative, encouraging and helpful. However, when Hurricane Floyd devastated eastern Carolina in late September, it demanded all my attention up through the month of February. It not only demanded all of my attention, we (the Executive Board and myself) think that it was responsible for my office losing about two or three thousand dollars of support. Thus you will note in our financial report that the office did not finish the year in the black. Since the beginning of March I have been on the road, in meetings and organizing the State Association Meeting and have not been able to put *The Witness* together for publication. I apologize for that and again reiterate what I have said in the past; I do not have the funds for a secretary, therefore all correspondence, calls, accounting, etc., are my task without help. Writing and publishing *The Witness* is important and necessary and it is a joy for me to do that kind of work. But time and money play a big factor in its process and progress. More churches supporting the office and some churches increasing their support would help beyond measure. I am grateful for the new support and long term support of individuals, churches, and the men's and women's associations and organizations of our state. Without their support the office would not exist at all. Thank you from the bottom of my heart and from those who see the value of the Promotional Office.

Please keep me and my family in your prayers as we travel, preach and work for the honor of our Savior and for the growth and success of our North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptist churches.

In connection with the audit of the financial statements of The Bible Book Store, Inc. for the year ended December 31, 1999, I would like to share my thoughts with the Board of Directors and Management of the Bible Book Store, Inc.

The December 31, 1999 balance sheet indicates working capital of \$223,715. Cash increased \$11,237 over the prior year. Day sales in accounts receivable were 7.5 days. This was an improvement of 2.5 days over the prior year on increased sales.

The Statement of Revenue, Expenses and Change in Fund Equity was also very positive. Net income was up \$6,583 over 1998. Actual net income of \$24,391 was better than the budgeted net income of \$18,985 by \$5,406.

In spite of the floods resulting from Hurricane Floyd in the eastern part of North Carolina and the impact on business, the Management and Staff of The Bible Book Store, Inc. managed to improve its profitability and still serve the needs of the customers. NOTE 1 - DESCRIPTION OF UNIT

The accompanying financial statements include the accounts of The Bible Store of Durham, Inc., a subordinate member organization of the North Carolina Association of Free Will Baptists. The corporation is exempt from federal income taxes under the Internal Revenue Code Section 501 (c)(3). The primary function of the corporation is supplying Sunday School and other Christian literature to the Free Will Baptist Churches in the southeastern states. The corporation also maintains an inventory of Christian literature for sale to the general public. The offices of The Bible Book Store of Durham, Inc. are located in the North Duke Mall in Durham, North Carolina.

NOTE 2 – SUMMARY OF SIGNICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of Presentation - Fund Accounting

Basis of Accounting

The financial statements of the corporation are maintained on the accrual method. Under this method, revenues are recognized when earned rather than when collected and expenses are recognized when the obligation is incurred rather than when it is paid.

Bad Debts

Bad Debts are written off using the direct write-off method. Therefore, these financial statements do not include any allowance for doubtful accounts.

Contributions

All contributions are considered to be available for unrestricted use unless specifically restricted by the donor. Amounts received that are designated for future periods or restricted by the donor for specific purposes are reported as temporarily restricted or permanently restricted support that increases those net asset classes. When a temporary restriction expires, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions. At this time, the Corporation does not have any temporarily or permanently restricted net assets.

Estimates

The preparation of the financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

THE BIBLE BOOK STORE OF DURHAM, INC. NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEARS ENDED DECEMBER 31, 1999

<u>Inventory</u>

Inventory consists of Bibles, Sunday School literature, supplies, cards, musical cassettes, books and other Christian Literature and is valued at cost under the first-in, first-out method. Inventory is taken annually on December 31 of each year.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents include all petty cash funds of the corporation and cash deposited with banks in the form of checking accounts, savings accounts, money market accounts and short-term certificates of deposits.

Property and Equipment

Fixed assets are recorded at original cost. Items that do not substantially improve or extend the life of an asset are expensed when paid. Items which do substantially extend the life of an asset and major improvements are capitalized and depreciated recovery system over the estimated useful life of an asset. Fixed asset are depreciated under the Straight Line Method over the following estimated useful lives:

Furniture and Fixtures	5-7 Years
Office Equipment	5-7 Years
Leasehold Improvements	5 – 10 Years

NOTE 3 – LEASE OF BUILDING

The corporation has an operating lease agreement for the store premises expiring in December 2004. In addition to the minimum rent, the lease provides for contingent rentals of 3.5 % of gross sales in excess of amounts specified in the lease agreement. No additional rent was required for the lease year ending December 31, 1999. The lease requires specified payments for maintenance, property taxes and insurance. Rent expense amounted to \$23,085 for the year ending December 31, 1999.

Therefore, no provision for income taxes has been made in these financial statements.

NOTE 5 – HOUSING, SOCIAL SECURITY, TRAVEL AND RETIREMENT ALLOWANCES

The manager of the Bible Book Store of Durham, Inc. receives an allowance for housing of \$230.00 per week and retirement of \$100.00 each month in addition to his salary. The total housing allowance paid to the manager for the year ending December 31, 1999 was \$12,190.
