Motion to remove Section on Examination of Candidates for the ministry of the Gospel in the Free Will Baptist Denomination as given in minutes of Thirty-Fifth Annual Session Oct. 10, 1969 and replace with the following procedures.

#### SUGGESTIONS FOR ORDINATION PROCEDURES

- I. When a candidate comes to be licensed, a file should be set up for the candidate by the Ordination Council. This should include:
  - A. Candidate's name
  - B. Address
  - C. Names of people who will give testimonies concerning the candidate's character
  - D. A credit reference which will show the candidate's business relationships

- E. A synopsis to show his ministerial activities; where he is preaching, etc.
- F. Candidate's marital status
- G. What he is doing toward his education
- H. An oral examination be given as to his Biblical knowledge which should cover:
  - 1. General facts
  - 2. Ability to explain basic Biblical concepts
- I. A statement concerning the doctrinal position which should include:
  - 1. The candidate holds a sound, clean-cut position in agreement with the basic fundamentals of Christianity
  - 2. The candidate holds a sound, clear-cut position in agreement with the distinctive doctrines of the Free Will Baptists Denomination
- J. That a candidate be set aside for a period of one year before ordination.
- II. Candidate who comes for ordination after one year should be given a written examination of which a copy is included.

#### SUGGESTED WRITTEN EXAMINATION

This examination should be written in ink or typed on  $8\frac{1}{2}$  x 11 line paper. Please be neat and sign each page. Feel free to use your Bible, other books, or whatever you need to help you express yourself in answering these questions. Each member of the Ordaining Council will read your examination and if they have any further questions, they will ask them of you when you appear before the Ordaining Council.
