CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS OF THE NORTHEAST MISSISSIPPI ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS AND MORGANWOOD YOUTH CAMP

Revised and adopted October 8, 1977

ARTICLE I Name

This organization shall be known as the Northeast Mississippi Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE II Purpose

The purpose of this association shall be to bring together our churches throughout North Central Mississippi for a closer union among our people and to harmonize the efforts of individual churches as we seek to fulfill the Great Commission.

ARTICLE III Treatise of Faith and Practice

The body adopts the Treatise of Faith and Practice of the National Assocaition of Free Will Baptists and the accompanying Articles of Faith. However, this association grants no judicial authority to the National Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE IV Membership

Section 1

This Association shall be composed of churches in the general area of North Mississippi.

- (1) The church must be recommended for membership by a member church of the Northeast Association.
- (2) The church shall be examined on matters of faith and practice by the Executive Committee of this Association and, if found to be sound, recommended to the Association for membership.

(3) The church shall be received under the watch care of this Association for the period of one (1) year; after which upon maintenance of sound doctrine and practice, it shall be received by vote into full fellowship of the Association and voting privileges.

Section 2 - Representation

Each church shall be allowed five (5) delegated representatives and they must be duly appointed by their church while in conference and bear credentials from the same to this body.

The deacons and ministers of each church in good standing with this association shall be standing delegates along with the officers of this association.

Section 3

This association shall not usurp any judicial authority over any of its member churches.

ARTICLE V Officers

The officers of this association shall consists of Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk-Treasurer, and Assistant Clerk-Treasurer, the same being elected at the close of each annual session by a majority vote of the delegates present and shall hold office until their successors are elected and installed. Officers of this association shall be members of local churches in good standing with this association.

ARTICLE VI Boards and Committees

Section 1

The Executive Committee is a standing committee composed of five (5) members. One member is the Moderator of the Association who serves as chairman. The other four (4) members are elected y this Association and serve terms up to four (4) years each, with a member going off each year.

Section 2

Morganwood Camp Board is a standing board composed of five (5) members to be elected by the Northeast Association in annual session for the terms of one (1) to five (5) years. This board shall operate under the camp Constitution and Bv-Laws approved by the association.

Section 3

The ordination of men into the gospel-ministry is basically the function of the local church. However, this association shall elect a standing credentials committee comprised of five (5) ministers serving up to five (5) years each with one (1) member going off each year.

Section 4

The Resolutions Committee is a standing committee comprised of three (3) members serving a three (3) year term with a member going off each year.

Section 5

All boards and committees, appointed or elected, that fails to perform their duties or make reports as directed by this Association, shall automatically be terminated and another board or committee shall be appointed or elected. The Chairman of the terminated committee shall not be re-elected to this committee for at least one (1) year: the other members may succeed themselves.

Section 6

This Association shall elect such boards and committees as are necessary to effectively fulfill its purpose.

ARTICLE VII Meetings

The Association shall meet on Saturday before the second (2nd) Sunday in January, April, July, and October. The October meeting will constitute the annual session. The Executive Committee shall have the right to alter meetings in case of a conflict.

ARTICLE VIII Relationship to Other Bodies

This Association shall be a member of the Mississippi State Association of Free Will Baptists and shall be entitled to representation in that body.

ARTICLE IX Amendments

This Constitution may be altered or amended by a two-thirds majority vote of the delegates present at any session: Notice of such intended alterations having been given in writing at the morning session to be voted on—in the afternoon session.

BY-LAWS

1. The Executive Committee shall act on behalf of the Association when the Association is not in session and shall report its actions to the Association. The Executive Committee may call a special session of the Association if deemed necessary. The Executive Committee shall serve as the Examining Committee of churches desiring membership as set forth in Article IV, Section 1, Paragraph 2 of the Constitution.

Duties of Officers

Section 1

The duties of the Moderator shall include presiding at the meeting of the Association, serving as Chairman of the Executive Committee and appointing other committees not covered by the Constitution.

Section 2

The duties of Assistant Moderator shall including presiding at the request of the Moderator or in his absence and assisting the Moderator in such ways as may be covered by the Constitution.

Section 3*

The duties of the Clerk-Treasurer shall be to record and publish the minutes of the Association and handle and dispurse monies belonging to the Association. He shall issue a financial statement at each meeting.

* The Treasurer shall receive an honoraium at the annual meeting, the amount to be determined by the Association.

Section 4

The duties of the Assistant Clerk-Treasurer shall be to assist the Clerk-Treasurer at his request.

Section 5

The officers of Section One (1) through Four (4) shall serve as the Program Planning Committee for the Association.

Duties of Standing Committees

Section 1

The Resolutions Committee shall present to the Association any resolutions they deem necessary for the Association to vote on. These resolutions shall be submitted in writing.

Section 2*

The Credentials Committee shall serve as an Examining Committee for licensing and ordaining of ministers and deacons upon the request of the local church. Also, examine all ministers who wish to become a member of this association. The Credentials Committee shall expedite all correspondence regarding credentials. When requested, this committee may serve as an ordaining committee.

* See Appendage

RULES OF DECORUM

- (A) It is recommended that any member leaving the body secure permission from the Moderator, except by adjournment.
- (B) All motions made and seconded shall be oped shall be open for discussion but debate may be shut off any time by a majority of the members of the Association.

- (C) If any proposition or motion under debate contain two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and the vote taken separately.
- (D) Motions made and lost shall be recorded on the minutes unless so ordered at the time.
- (E) No one shall be allowed to speak more than twice on the same subject and for no more than ten minutes at a time without special leave from the body.
 - (F) All questions shall be decided by a majority of the members present.
- (G)i) Matters not covered in the above statements shall be decided according to Robert's Rules of Order or another written parliamentary authority.
- (H)I) These By-Laws may be altered or amended by a two-thirds majority vote of delegates present at any session; notice of such intended alterations having been given tin in writing at the morning session to be voted on in the afternoon session.
- * Appendage A person desiring ordination into the Gospel ministry and to become a member of this association must present a letter of request for a license from the church of which he is a member. Following an oral examination, a candidate must serve one (1) year as a licentiate. After one (1) year the candidate may apply for ordination when requested by the candidate's home church. He must take and pass a written examination—provided by the Credentials Committee. The candidate may be ordained in his home church or at an Associational meeting using the Credentials Committee as the Ordination Council for the service if he so desires.

A person desiring membership in this Association must present a letter of request from his local church and a letter of good standing from his previous Association. Upon reception of the letter in good standing, the minister shall have full privileges of the Association.

The following outline for licensing and ordaining ministers shall be followed:

SUGGESTIONS FOR ORDINATION PROCEDURES

- When a candidate comes to be licensed, a file should be set up for the candidate by the Ordination Council. This should include:
 - A. Candidate's name
 - B. Address
 - C. Names of people who will give testimonies concerning the candidate's character.
 - D. A credit reference which will show the candidate's business relationships.
 - E. A synopsis to show his ministerial activities; where he is preaching, etc.
 - F. Candidate's marital status
 - G. What he is doing toward his education
 - H. An oral examination be given as to his Biblical knowledge which should cover:
 - 1. General facts
 - 2. Ability to explain the basic Biblical concepts.
 - I. A statement concerning the doctrinal position which should include:
 - 1. The candidate holds a sound, clean-cut position in agreement with the basic fundamentals of Christianity.
 - 2. The candidate holds a sound, clear-cut position in agreement with the distinctive doctrines of the Free Will Baptist Denomination.
 - J. That a candidate be set aside for a period of one (1) year before ordination.
- II. Candidate who comes for ordination after one (1) year should be given a written examination of which a copy is included.

SUGGESTED WRITTEN EXAMINATION

This examination should be written in ink or typed on 8½ x 11 paper. Please be neat and sign each page. Feel free to use your Bible, other books, or whatever you need to help you express yourself in answering these questions. Each member of the Ordaining Council will read your examination and if they have any further questions, they will ask them of you when you appear before the Ordaining Council.

PROPOSED CONSTITUITION FOR MORGANWOOD YOUTH CAMP

ARTICLE I Name

The camp shall be known as Morganwood Youth Camp of the Northeast Mississippi Free Will Baptist Association

ARTICLE II Purpose

Morganwood Youth Camp was conceived and constructed by Christian men and women for the purpose of challenging young people through Bible teaching and Christian recreation in a camp atmosphere.

ARTICLE III Board Member

Section 1 - Members

This board is a standing board comprised of five (5) members elected by the Northeast Association in annual session for the term of one (1) to five (5) years. This board shall be under the supervision of the Northeast Mississippi Association of Free Will Baptist. This board shall meet bi-monthly.

Section 2 - Duties

The board shall be responsible for the:

- Election of the Camp Director and Assistant Camp Director at their November meeting.
- 2. Securing and supervision of Custodian and his duties
- 3. Election of a Secretary-Treasurer, Chairman, and Vice-Chariman.
- 4. Pre-camp preparation of camp facilities
- 5. Maintenance and camp imporvements
- 6. All members shall be required to sign all deeds, notes, contracts, etc.
- 7. Rental of camp facilities

Section 3 - Secretary-Treasurer

- 1. The Secretary-Treasurer shall be elected by the camp board.
- 2. It shall be his responsibility to pay all bills, when presented and signed by authorized camp personnel, also all bills for lights, notes, as approved by the board. All bills accounts to be paid by check.
- 3. He shall present an annual financial statement to the Northeast Mississippi Association of Free Will Baptist.
- 4. He shall be present on camp opening day to receive registration funds for deposit.

Section 4 - Camp Director

- 1. Be responsible for setting up camp calendar
- 2. Be responsible for camp program and personnel
- 3. Be responsible for all disciplinary action during the camping session
- 4. He will authorize the printing and mailing of applications forms and advertising materials at the discretion of the board.
- 5. Attend all board meetings.
