BY LAWS

- 1. The Moderator or Assistant Moderator, or in their absence, the oldest minister present, shall call Association into conference.
 - 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a cucrum. A less unmber may adjourn until such quorum is present.
 - 4. Visiting brethern are invited to seat as advisory members.
- 5. Those who speak shall rise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
- in fany proposition or motion under debine contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken.
- 7. The Association may be called together by the Moderator, by giving the churches ten day notice of such meeting.
- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.
 - 79. The Moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in the Christian spirit.
- 10. The ruling of the Moderator may be over ruled by a two-thirds majority of the members voting.
- 11. No question fro many church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has first been discussed in its own church.
- 12. At each Association session, Arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons or their equivalent in devotional exercises each day.

CONSTITUTION

From long experience we are convinced of the necesity of a combination of churches to perpetuate our union and to maintain a correspondence among our churches.

Therefore, we have adopted the following constitution and bylaws for our government:

- 1. The association shall be called the Northeast Oklahoma Association.
- 2. This association shall be composed of such well regulated Free Will Baptist Churches maintaining gospel order, agreeing with the denomination in doctrine and practices, favoring the enterprises that have been endorsed by this association.
- 3. The acting members of this association shall be the ministers and their wives. Deacons and Church Clerks belonging to any church composing this body, also three delegates from each church chosen by the members of their respective churches.
- 4. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, and an Executive Board of five members. They shall be elected by and subject to the Association; they shall act as a committee to produce peace and harmony among the Ministers and Churches belonging to this Association; they shall also act between sessions of the Association to carry out the program of the Association. Also a Board of Trustees, consisting of five members. The Trustees shall be elected by and be subject to the Association. They shall act as custodians of all property belonging to the Association, and shall sign all legal papers when authorized by the Association to do so. All officers shall hold office until their successors are elected.
- 5. The property of any church in this Association that should go down until they cannot transact business because they are disorganized, shall become the property of this Association.
- 6. This Association shall meet annually at such time and place as shall be decided upon by the Association, also meet in regular quarterly meetings and as such quarterly meetings, shall have power to transact all business of the Association except to change the Constitution.

F. W. B. CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance to evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and "provide things honest in the sight of men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works, endeaver to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinance of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability of the support of the church, of its poor and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of education and denominational enterprises, the support of Missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelist efforts for the salvation of the world. And may God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blamless until the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Rules of the Youth Camp. Motion made and seconded that we vote on the rules without discussion. (Accepted)

Youth Camp Rules

- 1—Each boy or girl and his or her parents must understand clearly and agree to abide by the rules approved by the Association.
- 2-Anyone too sick to attend classes or worship services must be taken home.
- 3—Everyone must be in the dormitory for the devotional period (unless sick in bed) beginning one hour after services are over. Failure to abide by this rule will result in suspension.
- 4—Everyone must be out of bed each morning by 7:00. First bell will be sounded at 6:30, and a warning bell at 6:45.
- 5-Everyone must be fully clothed at all meals. No brunch coats, house coats or bath robes will be allowed at any meal
- 6—Girls dresses must come no higher than center of knee-cap. No low necked dresses allowed.
- 7—Everyone must be on time for all camp activities. These are, classes, meals, and devotional services, etc.
- 8—Dormitory occupants, under supervision of sponsors, must see each section is cleaned and bunks made.
- 9-There is to be no smoking on the camp grounds.
- 10-No one is to leave the camp ground without permission of the Camp Director.
- 11—All must be in their dormitories, lights out and quiet, one hour and fifteen minutes after evening service, unless otherwise announced.
- 12-Regular inspection will be made daily during class period by camp Director.
- 13-Girls will not be allowed to wear slacks, jeans, or shorts.
- 14—Boys must have shirts on while on the camp grounds.
- 15-No water fighting, no pranks with clothes or bedding, no rock throwing.
- 16—It shall be the duty of the Dormitory Sponsors, teachers, camp director, and asst. to see that these rules are carried out.
- 17—WE RESERVE THE RIGHT TO SEND HOME ANYONE WHO MISBEHAVES TO THE EXTENT OF DISRUPTING CAMP ACTIVITIES.

All rules accepted.

Reading of rules of Camp Sponsors and workers. Motion made and seconded that we vote on these also without discussion. (Accepted)

Rules For Youth Camp Workers . . .

- 1-They must be a member, in good standing, with a Free Will Baptist Church.
- 2-They must tithe into their local church.
- 3—They cannot use Alcohol or tobacco in any form.

- 4-Anyone who wears shorts will not be permitted to teach or help in the camp.
- 5-Anyone who practices mixed bathing, wears swim suits in public pools or public places will not be eligible to serve as a sponsor, teacher, camp director, or any other office in the Youth Camp.
- 6-They must be Free Will Baptist in Doctrine.
- 7-They must not attend movie theatres or dance halls.

No. 4 — Lost.
