BYLAWS

- 1. The Moderator or Assistant Moderator, or in their absence, the oldest minister present, shall call Association into conference.
 - 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum. A less number may adjourn until such quorum is present.
- 4. Visiting brethren are invited to seat as advisory members.
- 5. Those who speak shall rise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken.
- 7. The Association may be called together by the Moderator, by giving the churches ten days notice of such meeting.
- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.
- 9. The Moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in the Christian spirit.
- 10. The ruling of the Moderator may be over ruled by a two-thirds majority of the members voting.
- 11. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has first been discussed in its own church.
- 12. At each Association session, arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons or their equivalent in devotional exercises each day.

CONSTITUTION

From long experience we are convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches to perpetuate our nation and to maintain a correspondence among our churches.

Therefore, we have adopted the following constitution and bylaws for our government:

- 1. The association shall be called the Northeast Oklahoma Association.
- 2. This association shall be composed of such well regulated Free Will Baptist Churches maintaining gospel order, agreeing with the denomination in doctrine and practices, favoring the enterprises that have been endorsed by this association.
- 3. The acting members of this association shall be the ministers and their wives. Deacons and Church Clerks belonging to any church composing this body, also three delegates from each church chosen by the members of their respective churches.
- 4. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, and Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Board of five members. They shall be elected by and subject to the Association; they shall act as a committee to promote peace and harmony among the Ministers and Churches belonging to this Association; they shall also act between sessions of the Association to carry out the program of the Association. Also a Board of Trustees, consisting of five members. The Trustees shall be elected by and be subject to the Association. They shall act as custodians of all property belonging to the Association, and shall sign all legal papers when authorized by the Association to do so. All officers shall hold office until their successors are elected.
- 5. The property of any church in this Association that should go down until they cannot transact business because they are disorganized, shall become the property of this Association.
- 6. This Association shall meet annually at such time and place as shall be decided upon by the Association, also meet in regular quarterly meetings and at such quarterly meetings, shall have power to transact all business of the Association except to change the Constitution.

FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance to evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and "provide things honest in the sight of men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works, endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinance of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof, with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of spirit," in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of education and denominational enterprises, the support of Missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace santcify us wholly and preserve us blameless until the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Friday night service opened by Brother Jim Haas. Prayer, Brother Bob Herd. Song leader, Brother S. O. Johnson. Pianist, Sister Johnson. Hymns "Send the Light," "Redeemed," "Jesus Hold My Hand," "Come Unto Me." Special singing, Sister Prentice and Sister Pittman, "Getting Ready to Leave This World," "In the Shelter of His Arms." Brother Jim Haas, "He Lifted Me Out." Sister Hensley, pianist. Altar of prayer. Speaker, Rev. Richard Shade, 'Doctrine of Heartfelt Talvation." I Samuel 10 chapter, verses 6 through 9, "God gave him another heart." Nomination for the 11 o'clock speaker, Rev. Raymond Allen, elected.

Saturday, November 9, 1968

Meeting called to order by Moderator, Brother Haas. Prayer, Brother Floyd Hudson. Pianist, Sister Hensley. Brother Sample leading the singing of hymns, "Count Your Blessings." Devotion, Brother Spencer, 1 Cor. 13 chapter. Prayer, Brother Boyd. Motion made and seconded to receive the letters as read and seat the delegates. (Carried). A petitionary letter from the Skiatook Mission read. Accepted and seat the delegates.

Right hand of fellowship given to the delegates by the Assistant Moderator. Invitation given to visiting brethren to seats in council. The reading of rules of order by Moderator. Motion made and seconded to appoint the committee by the Moderator. (Carried). Resolution Committee: Brother Spencer, Brother Prentice, Brother Peace, Brother Gray, Brother Jones.

Petitionary letter called for. Motion made and seconded to accept the Skiatook Free Will Baptist Church ino the Association and seat the delegates by giving the right hand of fellowship to them. (Carried).

Brother Roades given time to speak on the new buildings at Oklahoma Bible College. Program, November 22, 23, 1968, \$214,000 dormitory to start in coming January; \$12,000 a month expenses. Speaking on the operation participation, the need of 2,000 persons to give \$100 to pay for the balance of the building fund. Advertisement for the year book at \$40 per page. Motion made and seconded to adjourn business until 1 o'clock. (Carried).

Call to worship by Moderator. Planist, Sister Hensley. Brother Boyd leading the congregation in singing, "Way Down in My Soul," "Oh I Want to See Him," 'Bound For That City," "Love to Tell the Story." Special singing, Brother

Boyd, Brother and Sister Johnson, "Need no Mansions Here Below." Prayer, Brother Deere. Brother Goines, "Follow Me." Speaker, Rev. Raymond Allen sang "Will It Do." Prayer, text, Amos 8:12-18, Proverbs 13. A message to the saved and others such as pastors as well as the laymen of the church. The power from God will help each one of us do their job as God will see fit for you to do. Invitation given while singing. Prayer for those to have a vision. "Nothing But the Blood of Jesus" urging all to have the vision of Jesus. Dismissed in prayer. Blessing asked on the noon meal by Brother Ferguson.

1 o'clock Business Session

Opening by Brother Haas. Pianist, Shayl Stracener. Song leader, Brother Sample, leading the congregation in singing "I'll Live on," "The Glory Land Way." Prayer, Brother Goines. Devotion, Brother Ferguson, I Cor. 13-13 verse. Then reading the chapter, closing with prayer.

Election of officers: The resignation of Waldo Young from the Assistant Moderator, Christian Education Board, Youth Camp director, District C. T. S. director. (Carried); Assistant Moderator, Robert Spencer; Christian Education, Bob Herd; Youth Camp Director, Cliff Goines; District C. T. S. director, T. T. Deere. Motions duly made and seconded, all carried.

Unfinished business: Report on the mission in Vinita, Brother Johnson. Average 19 people, 6 to 29 in church, report on the work there. Brother Wheeler help and support the mission. Motion made and seconded to accept the information. (Carried). Report on the Skiatook work. Brother Haas and Sister Haas and their vision about the work in Skiatook.

Mission Board Report: Motion made and seconded to recommend to the association that we send the \$75 to the Vinita mission that previously went to the Skiatook mission a month from the association. (Carried). Amendment: Motion made and seconded to send Brother Raymond Allen to the work in Vinita until God sends someone else. (Carried).

Credential Board Report: (1) Recommend that Brother Floyd Ferguson be accepted into the association as an ordained minister. Motion made and seconded to accept. (Carried). (2) Recommend that Brother Cliff Goines be accepted as an ordained deacon. Motion made and seconded to accept. (Carried). (3) Recommend that Brother Bill Herron be ordained as a deacon. Motion made and seconded to ordain Brother Herron. (Carried). (4) Recommend that Brother Amos Peace be ordained as a minister. Motion made and seconded that he be ordained. (Carried). (5) Recommended that the Credential Board draw up a new set of questions for deacons and ministers. Amendment, that these questions be brought back before this body. Motion made and seconded, both carried.

Motion made and seconded to give the maintenance committee power to spend \$50 to have the house cleaned and painted. (Carried). SECOND QUARTERLY CONFERENCE

Convened at Northside Free Will Baptist Church Tulsa, Okla., Feb. 8 and 9, 1969

Friday night services opened by Moderator with congregation singing, "Just Over the Stars," "My Sins are Gone," "We Shall See the King," "T'will be Glory by and by." Held a united prayer with the congregation. Speaker for the night, Rev. Cecil Bowen text from Acts 1, verses 1 to 9, John 3-17, John 15-16 and from 15th chapter of the Treaties. He who came to seek and to save them that was lost. Other scripture references, Proverbs 17, Mathew 10, Hebrews 1:1-9. Closing with prayer and invitation given to the lost in the service.

Reading of the rules of order by Moderator. Appointment of the resolution committee—Motion made and seconded that the Moderator and Assistant appoint them. (Carried). They are T. T. Speaker, Dick Shade, asking a prayer request for his work, a full time evangelist. Text from Galatians 66:7-8, "what a man soweth, so shall he reap." Need to preach the word of God admonishing all to be soul winners for Christ. Help each of us to be concerned of the "souls" being lost. To see the condition of the "world." Invitation given while singing "Just as I am" given to all to be soul winners and to the sinners lost without God. Dismissed in prayer and blessing asked on the noon meal by Brother Connie Caraker.

1 o'clock Business Session
