BYLAWS

- 1. The Moderator or Assistant Moderator, or in their absence, the oldest minister present, shall call Association into conference.
 - 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum. A less number may adjourn until such quorum is present.
- 4. Visiting brethren are invited to seat as advisory members.
- 5. Those who speak shall rise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken.
- 7. The Association may be called together by the Moderator, by giving the churches ten days notice of such meeting.
- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.
- 9. The Moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in the Christian spirit.
- 10. The ruling of the Moderator may be over ruled by a two-thirds majority of the members voting.
- 11. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has first been discussed in its own church.
- 12. At each Association session, arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons or their equivalent in devotional exercises each day.

CONSTITUTION

From long experience we are convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches to perpetuate our nation and to maintain a correspondence among our churches.

Therefore, we have adopted the following constitution and bylaws for our government:

- 1. The association shall be called the Northeast Oklahoma Association.
- 2. This association shall be composed of such well regulated Free Will Baptist Churches maintaining gospel order, agreeing with the denomination in doctrine and practices, favoring the enterprises that have been endorsed by this association.

FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance to evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and "provide things honest in the sight of men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works, endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinance of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of education and denominational enterprises, the support of Missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace santcify us wholly and preserve us blameless until the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

FIRST QUARTERLY MEETING

November 7, 8, 1969, Bartlesville, Okla,

Friday night

Moderator opened the service. Prayer, Brother Spencer. Pianist, Sister Frauburger. Song leader, Brother Sample leading the congregation in hymns "The Rock That is Higher Than I," "Count Your Blessings," "No Not One." Prayer, Brother Allen Wood. Special singing, Brother Rust, "Remind Me Dear Lord." Allen family, "I've Changed My Mind." Prayer, Brother Powell. Speaker of the hour, Rev. Hermon Wood speaking on the doc-trine subject from the fourth and the last paragraphs of the covenant. Text from James 4:1-4, Eph. 4:18 and from Malachi. Preaching on giving, working. Ten per cent over and above this amount our service as we are able. Use what God has given us first, before asking for more. Reading verse four in closing. Invitation given singing the hymn "Footprints of Jesus."

Two items of business: Speaker for the 11 o'clock worship service. Brother Allen was elected. Credential Board, motion made and seconded that the moderator have the power to appoint the two men to fill the vacancies tonight. (Carried). Letters called for and read with the following churches reporting: Zion Hill, New Hope, Collinsville, Skiatook, Inola, Bart-lesville, Claremore, East Tulsa, First Miami, Nowata, Northside, Barnsdall, Vinita Mission, First Pitcher, Dawson in December. Motion made and seconded to accept the letters as read and seat the delegates. (Carried). Right hand of fellowship given to the delegates by the Moderator.

Invitation given to visiting brethren to seats in council. Read-

ing of the rules of order by the Assistant Moderator.

Motion made and seconded, the Moderator and Assistant Moderator appoint the resolution committee. (Carried). Frank Johnson, Raymond Allen, Orville Nail.

Petitionary letters called for, none. Report on the Vinita Mission Brother, Raymond Allen, on the building and the organization meeting Nov. 11, 1969 at 7 p. m.

Unfinished business: Finances of the Vinita Mission discussed. Motion made and seconded that business be adjourned till 1:30 p. m. (Carried).

11 o'clock Worship Service

Opening, Brother Hermon Wood. Prayer, Brother Clyde Shade. Pianist, Sister Ames with Brother Patton, song leader. Hymns "He Keeps Me Singing," "Victory in Jesus," "He Lives." Special singing, Brother Rust and Brother Johnson, "Not My

Will." The Allen family, "At the Crossing," "What Heaven

Means to Me."

Speaker, Brother Allen. Prayer, Brother Homer Young. His text from II Tim. 4:6, Paul took a downward, a backward, an a upward look. His time was up. I Sam. 20:3, Job 14:1-2, Phil. 1:1, II Cor. 5:6-9, I Cor. 15:51-57. Invitation given singing "Blessed Assurance" and "Amazing Grace." Prayer and blessing asked on the noon meal by Brother Jim Haas.

1 o'clock Business Session

Opened by the Moderator. Devotion by Brother Robert Spencer from Psalms 23 included in prayer with special prayer for

the Rubble family whose brother had passed away.

Time given to Brother Homer Young, Oklahoma state secretary. Talked on the state minister quartet. They have made a new recording. Information given on the condition of Dr. O'-Donnell who was injured in a plane wreck. Thanks to the association for their giving through the coop. Brother Young is available for services at your church. You should contact him if you want him to come to your church.

Confirmation: Brother Lynn Wood sends word that he will

be here for our Youth Camp. He is our evangelist. Credential Board reports: We, the Credential Board, recommend that Orivlle Nail, Dale Brown, Bill McCloud, Ed Wood, be ordained as deacons. We the Credential Board recommend that Brother Lester Nutting, being of sound doctrine, be accepted into full fellowship into the Association.

Motion made and seconded to accept these reports and

vote them individually. (Carried). All passed.

Be it resolved that the Association clerk send the salary check to the Vinita Church clerk instead of directly to Brother Shade. (Carried).

Be it resolved that the name Vinita Mission found be chang-

ed to Mission Fund. (Carried).

Be it resolved that a special offering be taken up for this

mission fund once a month in each local church. (Lost).

Motion made and seconded that we accept these and vote item by item. (Carried).

Executive Board report read by Brother Haas and entered into the minutes. Motion made and seconded to accept this report. (Carried).

The Executive Board met Aug. 30, 1969 at the camp grounds to discuss a building program at Vinita, Okla. We, as a board, endorsed a loan in the amount of \$12,000.00 to purchase a lot and

buy material for the building.

The Executive Board met on Oct. 7, 1969 and agreed to write a letter to the State Missions Board requesting financial support in the Vinita work. The following is a copy of the letter. "The Executive Board of the Northeast Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptists met Oct. 7, 1969 and would like to meet with the State Mission Board to discuss financial support for the Free Will Baptist Mission in Vinita. The Northeast Association has sponsored this mission since its start and the mission with the association has borrowed monies to buy property and to build a church building. July 1, 1969, the association pledged full support to Brother Richard Shade and since that time the mission has showed a very marked increase in attendance and finances. We would like to meet with the State Mission Board at your earliest convenience."

The Executive Board met on Oct. 15, 1969 at which time Brother Shade requested that the mission be organized into a church, the same time we had meeting with the State Mission Board. The State Mission Board will meet with us on Nov. 11, 1969 at 12 noon to discuss support of the mission and an organizational meeting is scheduled for Nov. 11, 1969 in the p. m. Mission Board reported on a possibility of a work in Paw-

Mission Board reported on a possibility of a work in Pawhuska, Okla. They sought a church building which was to sell out, but they have backed out. There is a possibility of a work there for the Lord and the Free Will Bortist

there, for the Lord and the Free Will Baptist.
Resignation: Brother Hermon Wood resigned from the Dis-

Resignation: Brother Hermon Wood resigned from the District C.T.S. director. Motion made and seconded to accept the resignation. (Carried).

Vacancy: Brother Ed Wood elected to District C.T.S. direc-

tor post.

Miscellaneous business: The fulfilling of the obligation to the pledge that was made to the college and to pay to this pledge in full.

Motion made and seconded to have the number saved and the average of the Sunday school be included on the church

letter. (Carried).

Motion made and seconded to adjourn. (Carried). Dismissed in prayer by Brother Rust.

February 7, 1970, Barnsdall, Okla.

Opening of service, Brother Jim Haas. Prayer, Dick Shade. Pianist, Sister Allen. Song leader, Brother Allen. Hymns, "Nearer My God to Thee," "I Would Not be Denied." Prayer, Brother Floyd Hudson. Devotion, Brother Roy Bingham. Text: 1 Chapter Hebrew, verses 1-2, Running the Christian race.

Letters called for and read. With 15 churches reporting, motion made and seconded to accept the letters as read and

seat the delegats. (Carried).

Right hand of fellowship given to the delegates by the Assistant Moderator Hermon Wood reading of the rules of order and the bylaws by the Moderator.

Invitation given to visiting brethren to seats in council.

Appointment of committees: Motion made and seconded that the Moderator and the Assistant Moderator appoint this committee. (Carried).

Resolution Committee: Eddie Miller, Floyd Ferguson, Otto

Bryan.

Petitionary letters called for Vinita Church. Motion made and seconded to accept. (Carried). Vacancy on the Credential Board for today only, Brother T. T. Deere elected. Recommend that the churches in the association be responsible for a building at the camp grounds. Materials will be purchased by the camp maintenance committee, buildings to be appointed by them. Motion made and seconded to accept this recommendation. (Carried).

Motion made and seconded to adjourn business till 1 o'clock. (Carried).

Opened by singing "Jesus There," with Sister Allen, pianist. Brother Allen, song leader. Hymns "I'd Rather Have Jesus." Frayer, Brother Ferguson. Special singing, Allen family, "Thank God I'm Free." Prayer, Brother Crouch. Speaker of the hour, Brother Wood, Oklahoma Bible College promotional secretary.

Speaking of the greatest time on earth is "Now." The denomination of Free Will Baptist. For us to identify ourselves. We need GLUE—Growth, Loyalty, Unity, Enthusiasm. Very inspiring message. Invitation given by Brother Haas. Prayer and blessing asked on the noon meal.

1 o'clock Business Session

Opening by the Moderator. Pianist, Sister Allen. Song leader, Brother Allen. Hymns, "Blood Stained the Old Rugged Cross," 'Where He Leads I Will Follow." Devotion, Brother Haas from Hebrew 12, also the prayer.

Motion made and seconded to receive and seat the delegates and the right hand of fellowship given to the delegates by the Moderator. (Carried).
