#### BYLAWS

- 1. The Moderator or Assistant Moderator, or in their absence, the oldest minister present, shall call Association into conference.
  - 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum. A less number may adjourn until such quorum is present.
- 4. Visiting brethren are invited to seat as advisory members.
- 5. Those who speak shall rise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken.
- 7. The Association may be called together by the Moderator, by giving the churches ten days notice of such meeting.
- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.
- 9. The Moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in the Christian spirit.
- 10. The ruling of the Moderator may be over ruled by a two-thirds majority of the members voting.
- 11. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has first been discussed in its own church.
- 12. At each Association session, arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons or their equivalent in devotional exercises each day.
- 13. This body shall be governed by the Roberts Rule of Order.

#### CONSTITUTION

From long experience we are convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches to perpetuate our nation and to maintain a correspondence among our churches.

Therefore, we have adopted the following constitution and bylaws for our government:

- 1. The association shall be called the Northeast Oklahoma Association.
- 2. This association shall be composed of such well regulated Free Will Baptist Churches maintaining gospel order, agreeing with the denomination in doctrine and practices, favoring the enterprises that have been endorsed by this association.
- 3. The acting members of this association shall be the ministers and their wives. Deacons and Church Clerks belonging to any church composing this body, also three delegates from each church chosen by the members of their respective churches.
- 4. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, a Clerk, and Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Board of five members. They shall be elected by and subject to the Association; they shall act as a committee to promote peace and harmony among the Ministers and Churches belonging to this Association; they shall also act between sessions of the Association to carry out the program of the Association. Also a Board of Trustees, consisting of five members. The Trustees shall be elected by and be subject to the Association. They shall act as custodians of all property belonging to the Association, and shall sign all legal papers when authorized by the Association to do so. All
- 5. The property of any church in this Association that should go down until they cannot transact business because they are disorganized, shall become the property of this Association.

officers shall hold office until their successors are elected.

6. This Association shall meet annually at such time and place as shall be decided upon by the Association, also meet in regular quarterly meetings and at such quarterly meetings, shall have power to transact all business of the Association except to change the Constitution.

#### FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance to evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and "provide things honest in the sight of men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works, endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinance of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of education and denominational enterprises, the support of Missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace santcify us wholly and preserve us blameless until the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Speaker, Brother Roy Bingham. Four Seasons — "Life is like a drop in the bucket — Text from Job"; "Spring 1-18, preparing"; "Summer 19-35, filling out"; "Fall 36-54, Harvest time, the most for God"; and "Winter 55-70, Golden years, wisdom". Closed with an invitation to those present.

Speaker for the 11 o'clock worship service, Dugian Mc-Donnell. Motion made and seconded to elect by acclamation.

(carried) Dismissed in prayer, Richard Rust.

Saturday morning, November 7, 1970

Opening by Brother Bingham, prayer by Brother McMillen. Song leader, Brother Rust, leading in songs: "Victory in Jesus," "Praise Him, Praise Him," and devotion by Brother

Melvin Tyson.

With sixteen churches reporting, the letters were called for and read. Motion made and seconded to accept the letters and seat the delegates. (Carried) Righthand of fellowship given to the delegates. Invitation given to visiting brethren to seats in council. Reading of Rules of Order by he moderator.

Resolution committee: Melvin Tyson, Floyd Ferguson, Raymond McMillen, appointed by the moderator and assistant moderator. Time given to Brother Lynn Wood, Trinity College, Oklahoma Bible College. Talked on the giving to the college as an association and the church individually presented the plan to the resolution committee. This plan was mailed to all the pastors of the churches.

Petitionary letters called for: none. Credential Board: Motion made and seconded for the board to fill their own vacancy. (carried) Unfinished business: none. Treasury report given by Jack Metcalf. Motion made and seconded to accept the report as read. (carried) Reports of committees

and boards.

Missionary Board: August 27, 1970, a member of the missionary board was informed of property for sale in Jay, Okla. This included a church parsonage and a ½ city block of property. The missionary board met and went to Jay to look the property over. We feel it would not be advisable to

go into Jay at this time.

The missionary board met at Claremore and drove to Catoosa to look for property. The reason for this was the possibility of buying property and in the future to build a church there. More work is being done to find out the price of property in this city. A substantial growth is expected in this city, with the opening of the Port of Catoosa. Pray

about this.

Executive board report: oral on the Bartlesville Church. Motion made and seconded to accept these reports. (carried) Motion made and seconded to adjourn business till 1 o'clock. (carried) Dismissed in prayer, Brother Hudson,

11 O'Clock Worship Service

Moderator opening the service. Brother Rust leading the congregation in singing "Joy Unspeakable". Special singing, "Thank You for the Valleys," Brother and Sister Brown. "I've been to Calvary," Brother Rust.

Speaker Rev. Dugian McDonald. Text John 18:38. "Perfect Lord Found no Fault in Jesus Christ". None found any. Truth, compassion expects to carry the Gospel to the people. Exodus 4:12, promises. Closed in prayer and invitation given. Closing prayer and blessing asked on the noon meal by Larry Williams.

1 O'Clock Business Session

Opened by the moderator, Brother Rust leading the service in singing "I am Thine O' Lord." Prayer by Brother Deere. Devotion by Rev. Lester Nutting, II Tim., fourth chapter. Charging all "for that hope in Jesus Christ." Closing prayer by Brother Nutting.

Motion made and seconded to give the Northside Church a standing vote of thanks for the fine meal; also to Brother Lynn Wood for his work done for the college and in our

association. (done).

The Zion Hill Church finds it will be unable to serve the noon meal at the May quarterly meeting. Motion made and seconded that the people coming bring a covered dish to the third quarterly meeting (May). (carried)

Motion made and seconded to put the delegates fee into

the general fund (carried). Resolution Committee:

We the Resolution committee recommend that each pastor take this plan and present it to their church for prayerful consideration. (This plan mailed to all pastors). Motion made and seconded to accept this resolution. (carried) Credential Board Report:

We the credential board recommend Brother Larry

Williams and Brother Locke for ordaination as Deacon.

II. We recommend Brother John Mahan and Brother Mark Haley for license to preach the gospel.

III. We recommend that Brother Richard Rust be ac-

cepted into full fellowship in the Association.

Motions made and seconded to accept these recommendations. (carried)

We recommend Brother Larry Tuttle be issued lic-

ense in the Northeast Oklahoma Association.

Motion made and seconded to issue Brother Larry Tuttle a license in the Association. Question: Why not for ordaination? Reason: Motion duly placed on the books page 279. Question: Reading of the resolution: Resolution No. 3, page 279: Be it resolved that ministers not be ordained until the need arises, such as, pastoring a church or full time Christian service. (carried)

Motion made to modify the resolution to include the

term Associate Pastor. (lost) Died without a second.

Original motion duly made and seconded, passed and

carried

Motion made and seconded that our body be governed by the Roberts Rules of Order. (carried) This be added to the bylaws in the minutes number 13 at the next printing.

Motion made and seconded to adjourn. (carried) dismiss-

ed in prayer, Brother Huntley.

### SECOND QUARTERLY MEETING Nowata Free Will Baptist Church Friday night, February 12, 1971

Brother Bingham opened the service. Prayer by Brother Frauenberger. Song leader, Brother Rust; Pianist, Sister Spillers. Congregational songs, "He Lives", "I Am Thine O'

Lord". Prayer, Brother Wood.

Special singing: Nowata, Quartet, "Born to Serve the Lord"; Barnsdall, Rust, "I Want to See Jesus"; Vinita, Allen family, "I'm Longing for Home"; Claremore, Tuttle, "Go and Possess"; Dewey, Hester, "I'm Pressing on the Upward Way" and "He Could Have Called Ten Thousand Angels."

Guest speaker did not come; moderator, Brother Bingham preached. Fear nothing but God, fight nothing but sin. Text is taken from Psalms 23, reading and exhorting these passages; very good and inspiring to all present. Dr. O'Donnell from Oklahoma Bible College was the 11 o'clock speaker.

Dismissed in prayer.

#### Saturday morning, February 13, 1971

read and seat the delegates. (carried)

Invitation given to visiting brethren to seats in council.

Reading of the Rules of Order, moderator.

Resolution Committee, Raymond McMillen, Lyle Huntley, Melvin Tyson, appointed by the moderator and assistant

moderator.

Time given to Dugan McDonald from the State Sunday School Board speaking on the scripture material and the evangelization in the Sunday School. The planting of the seed for the people to be saved in the worship service. Placing this before your church. National Sunday School Contest Sunday School Workshop, February 26-27, Southern Oaks, Oklahoma City, Joe Ames.

Treasurer's report given by Jack Metcalf. Motion made

and seconded to accept as read. (carried) Credential Board, fill their own vacancy. Unfinished business: Question for the Credential Board clarifying the question, "Full Time Christian Service".

Vacancy, Trustee Board for three year man. Richard Rust nominated. Motion made and seconded to cease nomi-

nations and elect by acclamation. (carried)

Motion made and seconded for the Mission Board to become a standing board with 1, 2, and 3 year terms beginning at the Yearly Meeting, (carried)

Mission Board report read: January 7, 1971, the Mission Board met at Dewey with Brother Hester and the men from Dewey Free Will Baptist Mission at their meeting. We met with the Dewey Church of God and discussed buying their church building. They expressed their desire to reorganize into a church. January 15, unable to contact anyone in Dewey. January 17, Brother Hester contacted by phone. He said he would meet with us at the next meeting in Nowata.

We, the mission board, recommend that the Association support the Dewey Mission with \$100 a month until our yearly meeting in August. Motion made and seconded to accept the report as read and adopting this recommendation to support the mission. (carried)

Motion made and seconded to adjourn business till 1

o'clock. (carried)

#### 11 O'Clock Worship Service

Pianist, Sister Spillers. Song leader, Brother Rust leading in "Glory Land Way." • Specials: Goines Quartet, "When I Inherit My Mansion"; trio, Rust, Haynes and Wood, "Till You've Known the Love of God"; Boyd, "Had It Not Been".

Speaker, Dr. O'Donnell from Oklahoma Bible College. Bringing greetings from the Bible College. Text from Psalms 116, reading the entire book. Opening quote: "I love the Lord, because he heard my voice." Verse 12, "What shall I render unto the Lord for all His benefits toward me." What is our part? What are we to do? Verse 9, "I will walk before the Lord in the land of the living." To walk the way "For" God. You can win a person even without saying a word. Living the life before men. Northeast Women's Auxiliary president spoke on the need of supplying mission gifts for the missionaries — colored sheets, silverware, dishes, fitted twin and full size sheets, also flat sheets.

Brother Goines speaking on youth camp, the need for teachers, cooks, sponsors. Placing a challenge before each pastor for help.

Brother Floyd Ferguson read from Galatians, 6th chapter. He spoke about Brother Powell, who has had a heart attack and stroke and is very ill in the hospital. Offering was taken to help in the finance shortage due to the high cost as all know about. Amount \$134.00. Credential Board Report:
