#### **BY-LAWS**

- 1. The Moderator or Assistant Moderator, or in their absence, the oldest ordained Free Will Baptist minister or deacon in good standing in the Northeast Association present, shall call Association into conference.
- 2. Each session shall be opened and closed with prayer.
- 3. Five members from two or more churches shall constitute a quorum. A lesser number may adjourn until such quorum is present.
- 4. Visiting brethren are invited to seat as advisory members.
- 5. Those who speak shall rise and address the moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member and a vote taken.
- 7. The Association may be called together by the Moderator by giving the churches ten days notice of such meeting.
- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.
- 9. The Moderator shall not allow discussion when not carried on in the Christian spirit.
- 10. The ruling of the Moderator may be overruled by a two-thirds majority of the members voting.
- 11. No question from any church shall come under the consideration of the Association unless it has first been discussed in its own church.
- 12. At each Association session, arrangements shall be made to insure two or more sermons or their equivalent in devotional exercises each day.
- 13. This body shall be governed by the Roberts Rule of Order.

#### CONSTITUTION

From long experience we are convinced of the necessity of a combination of churches to perpetuate our nation and to maintain a correspondence among our churches.

Therefore, we have adopted the following constitution and bylaws for our government:

- 1. The association shall be called the Northeast Oklahoma association
- 2. This association shall be composed of such well regulated Free Will Baptist Churches maintaining gospel order, agreeing with the denomination in doctrine and practices, favoring the enterprises that have been endorsed by this association.
- 3. The acting members of this association shall be the Ordained Ministers in good standing and their wives, Ordained Deacons, in good standing, and Church Clerks belonging to any church composing this body. Also, three (3) delegates from each church chosen by members of the respective churches.
- 4. The officers of this association shall be: a Moderator, an Assistant Moderator; a Clerk, an Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Board of five (5) members consisting of at least three (3) Ordained Ministers, the other two (2) being Ordained Deacons. They shall be elected by and subject to the association; they shall act as a committee to promote peace and harmony among the ministers and churches belonging to this association; they shall also act between sessions of the association to carry out the program of the association.

Also, a Board of Trustees, consisting of five (5) members. The Trustees shall be elected and subject to the association and sign all legal papers when authorized by the association to do so.

Also, a Christian Education Board. The Christian Education Board shall consist of at least five (5) members elected by the body of this association, the Moderator being an ex-officio member of the Board. Members of this Board shall rotate their term of service with one member being elected annually at the yearly meeting. This shall not be a standing Board. This Board shall be concerned with all areas of Christian Education that concerns the churches of the Northeast Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptists, such as: Sunday School conferences, workshops, seminars, revivals, etc. and youth camps, retreats, etc. This Board shall be responsible for: a) The selecting of the youth camp director and the

assistant director for the youth camp each year, and b) In cooperation with the camp director and assistant director, the selection and securing of the camp evangelist, the alternate evangelist, camp teachers, sponsors, cooks, workers, and all personnel necessary to operate an effective youth camp each year, and c) Assisting the youth camp director and the assistant director in the selection of camp literature and formulating of the camp program, goals, and activities each year. This Board shall be responsible for setting the amount of remuneration for the services of special speakers for all Christian Education programs or projects, camp evangelists, cooks, etc. that are normally or routinely remunerated by this Northeast Association. All officers shall hold office until their successors are elected.

 The property of any church in this Association that should go down until they cannot transact business because they are disorganized, shall become the property of this Association.

6. This Association shall meet annually at such time and place as shall be decided upon by the Association, also meet in regular quarterly meetings and at such quarterly meeting, shall have power to transact all business of the Association except to change the Constitution.

#### FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH COVENANT

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise by His grace to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and "provide things honest in the sight of all men".

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligation in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith and good works, endeavor to "grow in grace and the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ".

We will not forget the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinance of the Gospel, nor fail to pay according to our ability for the support of the church, of its poor and all its benevolent work. We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of spirit" in the bonds of peace, to be careful of one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme; counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society; constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in Heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of education and denominational enterprises, the support of Missions, the success of Sunday Schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly and preserve us blameless until the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH

Body declared into conference by Bro. Hermon Wood.

Letters read by Bro. Forrest Hanes. Motion made and properly sustained to accept the letters and to seat the delegates. Carried. Delegates asked to stand.

Visiting brethren invited to a seat as advisory council. Bros. Bob Thompson, Tim Gillispie and Charles and Mary Brazeal were present.

Rules of order read by Bro. Hermon Wood.

Prayer by Bro. Bruce Thurman.

Appointment of Resolution Committee: Bros. J. R. Shade (chr), Ivan Long and Don Thomason.

Petitionary letter from the First Free Will Baptist Church of Miami, Ok. Motion made and properly sustained to accept them into full fellowship. Carried.

Report from the Credential Board. "We, the Credential Board, having examined Bro. Bruce Thurman and Bro. Jack Mercer and finding them sound in doctrine do hereby recommend they be accepted into the Northeast Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptists as ordained officials of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Miami, Ok. Bro. Bruce Thurman as an ordained minister and Bro. Mercer as an ordained deacon. Motion made and properly sustained to accept this report. Carried.

The Miami church sends Sis. Angie Ward and Bro. Steve Hallet as delegates. Motion made and properly sustained to seat these delegates. Carried.

Service turned to Bro. Bob Thompson. The need is still great at Hillsdale. He thanked the Association for our faithful support, both

prayer and financial. His closing words were "Give, give, give and pray, pray, pray!"

Service turned to Bro. Charles Brazeal, representing the state executive department. He spoke about how important it is to support the Cooperative Plan. He also urged the churches to send their pastors to the Minister's Retreat.

Service turned to Bro. Tim Gillispie. He spoke concerning the state lottery proposed by our new governor. Bro. Tim represents the state association in the fight against the lottery.

Motion made and properly sustained to declare the one (1) year position on the Executive Board open due to the fact that Bro. Kenneth Stephens has moved to Tennessee. Carried. Nominations for the one (1) year position on the Executive Board. Bro. Bruce Thurman is nominated. Motion made and properly sustained nominations cease and to elect by acclamation. Carried.

Motion made and properly sustained to give Bro. RueDell Smith \$1,000.00 as his account is in the red. Carried.

Treasurer's report given by Sis. Bonita Hanes. Motion made and properly sustained to accept the report as given. Carried.

Motion made and properly sustained to adopt the following resolution as made by the state committee of the fight against the lottery. Carried.

WHEREAS, The entire enterprise of gambling and specifically a statesponsored lottery are completely opposed to principles in God's Word, revealing a dissatisfaction with God's provision, as well as encouraging a desire to gain something for nothing therefore contribution to the moral demise of society; and,

WHEREAS, Gambling, by definition, earns its revenues from those who lose, thus causing the state to become a predator of its people rather than a protector; and,

WHEREAS, For every \$1 the gambling industry brings into a state it will cost the residents between \$3 and \$7 in hidden costs through increased need for criminal justice and social welfare programs, etc. (Kindt, University of Ill., (http://www.ncalg.org/ncalg01.htm); and

WHEREAS, State sponsored gambling is a regressive form of taxation, the revenues of which come disproportionately from lower income residents (The Executive Office of the Governor, Gambling in Florida: An Analysis of the Economic and Social Impacts; (http://ncalg.org/quotes.htm); and,

WHEREAS, Researchers now call gambling the fastest growing

teenage addiction, with the rate of pathological gambling among high school and college-age youth about twice that of adults; and according to Dr. Howard Shaffer, Director of Harvard medical School Center for Addictions Studies, "Today, there are more children experiencing adverse symptoms from gambling than from drugs...and the problem is grooving: (http://ncalg.org/case.htm); and,

WHEREAS, A federal commission comprised of both supporters and opponents of gambling (The National Gambling Impact Study Commission) has recommended a moratorium on the expansion of legalized gambling; and,

WHEREAS, The long-term consequences of gambling have mainly been ignored in favor of the empty promise of almost instant prosperity for both individuals and state governments, thus destroying any work ethic; and

WHEREAS, The lives of children are significantly damaged by the loss of household income needed for food, clothing and shelter due to gambling; and,

WHEREAS, Oftentimes throughout American history the tide of gambling has been turned by God's people who knelt in confession and stood in conviction; now, therefore,

BE IT RESOLVED, That the members of the NEOA of Free Will Baptists in conference in Dewey, OK on February 8, 2003, commit to pray mightily and work actively to return Oklahoma to a gambling free state; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we call upon all parents, grandparents, and others who are concerned about the future of our children to actively seek to educate themselves and their children about the dangers of gambling and do everything within their power to resist the expansion of any form of legalized gambling into Oklahoma; and, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That we go on record as opposing a state-sponsored lottery and call upon Governor Brad Henry and our state government officials to find ways to strengthen our state's economy and provide fair and equitable educational opportunities based upon sound principles of responsible budgeting combined with creative and innovative industrial, educational, and technological development rather than on the false hopes of gambling; and,

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, That we call upon all Oklahomans to reflect biblical standards and personal lifestyles that would make it unnecessary and undesirable to resort to gambling as a recreation, an escape or a means of producing public revenue for the support of government.

Motion made and properly sustained to buy two (2) tables for the Hillsdale auction. Carried.

Dismissed for a ten-minute recess.

Prayer by Bro. Jack Metcalf.

Business reconvened.

Recommendation from the Credential Board. We, the Credential Board, recommend that one of our board members meet with Bro. David Priest concerning his Free Will Baptist credentials and any other preachers or deacons who are carrying Free Will Baptist credentials. They need to surrender those papers and their tax-exempt number, as they are no longer Free Will Baptists. Motion made and properly sustained to accept this recommendation. Carried.

Motion made and properly sustained to adjourn the business session. Carried.
