THE NINETY-FIFTH ANNUAL CONFERENCE OF THE NORTHEAST OLD ORIGINAL FREE WILL BAPTIST OF OF AMERICA, MET WITH THE JUMPING RUN FREE WILL BAPTIST CHURCH IN GRIFTON, N. C., OCTOBER 17, 18, 19 AND 20, 1963.

THURSDAY MORNING 10:40

Services was opened by singing "Amazing Grace." Scripture lesson was read by Rev. R. H. G. Morris, Psalm 23. Prayer by Bro. Emmanuel Moore. Second hymn, "I Will Fly Away." Rev. R. H. G. Morris gave some encouraging remarks and presented to us Rev. G. D. Smith to preach the Introductory Sermon. Rev. Smith rose, took his text from Psalm 23. The Lord is my Shepherd. His subject, A Good Shepherd. In his soul stirring sermon he pointed out the following: The importance of being a good shepherd, the protection a good shepherd will give his sheep and the victory of being on the battlefield for God. A spiritual was them sung. Moderator, Rev. H. C. Randolph greeted the conference with some very inspiring remarks. The pastor, Rev. W. S. Saunders raised the offering, \$20.76. Closing by Rev. R. H. G. Morris.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON 2:10

The afternoon service was reassembled by singing, "Come to Jesus," by Rev. Luke Farmer. Scripture lesson was read by Rev. Farmer, St. John 10. Followed by prayer. After a spiritual "Well Done," the Moderator Rev. H. C. Randolph greeted the conference. He encouraged them to continue the good work and let God fight their battles. Second to keep the text of the morning in mind, "The Lord is My Shepherd." He then opened the house for business. It was motioned and passed that the inner boundary of the conference extend from the rostrum to the fourth window in the church, and the outer boundary extend one hundred and fifty yards from the building. This was ammended by Rev. J. W. Wilkins. The outer boundary to go to the hard surface or to the edge of the ditch.

The Rev. W. T. Barrow asked for someone to be appointed

to work with the Moderator. This was tabled.

Rev. R. H. G. Morris offered a motion to accept the programs which were \$8.00. There wasn't any badges.

The delegates and ministers were enrolled. (see roll). Rev. W. H. T. Bailey's name was discontinued from the roll. The Moderator asked Rev. W. T. Barrow, Rev. Dink Smith and Rev. B. T. Farrow to investigate New Jerusalem Church and the pastor, Rev. Priscilla Williams in Jacksonville, N. C. and report their findings to the church. Due to the poor condition of Rev. Dink Smith's car, Rev. George Chapman was asked to go and be back by the close of the night service. (Thursday). Brother Keys was appointed janitor.

THURSDAY NIGHT 7:05

Devotion was opened by Rev. H. Farmville. We had a series of prayers and songs by Sister Florence Harper and Brother Luke Farmer. Scripture lesson by Rev Naomi Jones. Ephesians 6:1-8. Prayer by Rev. Naomi Jones highlighted a wonderful praise service. Rev. D. Smith gave some timely remarks and turned the service over to Chapman Chapel. The first hymn, "Yield Not to Temptation," prayer by Rev. D. Smith. Second hymn, "What A Friend We Have in Jesus." Scripture, Saint John 15:1-14. Prayer by Bro. John Randolph with the choir chanting, "Sweet Hour of Prayer." Third hymn, "Down at the Cross." Rev. R. H. G. Morris then presented the speaker of the hour, Rev. F. A. Armstrong. After the spiritual, "I Love Thee Lord," Rev. F. A. Armstrong took a text from Isaiah 6:8 "also I heard the voice of the Lord, saying, Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" Subject: God wants a Man. Points on the sermon were, Someone needs to die so God can use them. God made a man, tested him, brought him back through Jesus Christ. God wants a man that can stand.

The invitation for joining the church was extended while the choir sang "Pilgrim's Journey." Remarks by the Moderator. Offering \$41.35.

Rev. W. S. Saunders called Sister Martha Moore for the appointing of homes. Closed by Rev. D. Smith.

FRIDAY MORNING 9:00

Service was opened by singing, "Amazing Grace." Prayer by Rev. B. T. Farrior, Titus 2:1-6. Second hymn, "Jesus Keep Me Near the Cross." A spiritual, "In My Father's House," was soul lifting.

The Moderator Rev. H. C. Randolph gave some remarks and urged the conference to pray. He then declared the house open for business and charged, that no one speak over twice on one subject.

The Minutes for Thursday's work was read and motion by Rev. R. H. G. Morris that the minutes be adopted with the necessary corrections if there be any. Motion carried. Roll call of Ministers. It was accepted that all committees pay would start Friday. Committees were appointed. Finence Committee, Bro. Sim Chapman, Sis. Beadie Dixon and Sis. Minnie Foust. They were charged to make two copies of the finance report and give the secretary one copy. Sunday Watkins. Union Meeting, Brother Dept. Sis. Georgia Marsh, Janitor, Reverend F. A. Armstrong. Rev. J. W. Wilkins was reminded that the conference had only exempted him from superannuate and educational dues. Rev. Luke Farmer was complainted because he failed to attend the Sunday School Convention.

Rev. Priscilla Williams was absent. The investigating committee that was sent out to investigate she and the church in Jacksonville, N. C. gave the following report: She nor the church were not with the conference any longer. They were undenominational. It was motioned and carried that they be taken off the roll. The resolution committee was asked to bring in a report on the Y. P. C. L. Union made their report. Home Mission next meeting at St. John F. W. B. Church in Blounts Creek, N. C. Roll of churches (see roll). It was motion and passed, that the widows of the late Rev. A. H. Graham, Bro. Lewis Wilson and Deacon Elijah Moore be paid the superannuate money due them. Weeping Rachel ask for the next Annual Conference. Paused for ten minute recess.

MID-DAY SERVICE

Service reassembled by singing, "Amazing Grace." Scripture was read by Rev. Luke Farmer, I Corinthians, 13:1-6, then prayer. Rev. G. H. Hunter was presented to preach. He spoke from St. John 3:14. Subject, "The Two Must." The doors of the church were opened for membership and invitation was extended while the choir sang, "None But the Righteous." Rev. H. C. Randolph and Rev. Luke Farmer gave remarks. The offering, \$22.17 was raised by Bro. Leo Garris, Rev. R. H. G. Morris, Rev. W. S. Saunders and Bro. David Ward. Adjourn.

FRIDAY AFTERNOON 2:30

Devotion was opened by Rev. R. H. G. Morris. The house was opened for business. Church roll continued (see roll). The Field Workers Report. Sis. Thigpen's report would be made Saturday. The secretary was asked to figure out the superannuate money that was due the various widows. Sis. Graham

was supposed to give the conference \$7.50 which was the amt. that was given her late husband for compiling the minutes and his superannuate money from 1951-61. Mrs. Lewis Wilson money was given to Bro. Sharp and Bro. Elijah Moore's was given to Bro. Emmanuel Moore.

The Moderator asked the secretary to give Rev. Booker T. Farrior new license because his name was incorrect. He was asked to turn in his previous license.

It was motioned and carried that the conference purchase a seal immedately and all ministers license stamped with said seal.

Lilly of The Valley Church, sent a request, asking that their budget be lowered. The conference motioned and passed to give the Lilly of The Valley Church some consideration.

FRIDAY NIGHT 7:30

Praise service was conducted by Sis. Dora Robbins, Sis. Beadie Dixon, Sis. Mattie Roscoe, Sis. Jessie Watkins, Sis. Beatrice Moore, Sis. Lucy Crandel and Bro. John Randolph. Scripture, John 4:1-8 by Rev. Naomi Jones followed a series of songs and prayers which was truly uplifting. Jumping Run's choir opened service by singing, "What a Fellowship." Prayer by Rev. W. T. Barrow. Scripture St. John 14:1-9, Rev. J. W. Wilkins. Prayer by Rev. Ottie May. Second hymn, "Pass Me Not." Rev. J. W. Wilkins turned the service over to the Moderator, Rev. H. C. Randolph. He greeted the visitors, Rev. Steven Jones, Rev. I. T. Williams and Rev. Ottie May. The Moderator presented Rev. I. T. Williams to deliver the messare. After the spiritual, "Deep Down in My Heart," Rev. I. T. Williams came forward and led the song, "The Lord Will Make A Way Somehow." His text was taken from Matthew 18:20. Subject, Two or Three, high lights of the sermon were, work together and there isn't anything impossible with Jesus if there are only two or three. The invitation was extended for membership.

The Conference was highly entertained with a wonderful program by the Y. P. C. L. of Jumping Run Church. The mission offering \$10.61. Then Rev. W. S. Saunders presented a painting of Christ given to Jumping Run Church by Rev. Lillian Harris. Adjourned.

SATURDAY MORNING 9:30

Service opened by singing, "Near the Cross." Reverend E. L. Rivers called Rev. G. W. Chapman to lead in the morning prayer. Scripture St. Matthew 7:7. Second hymn, "Must Jesus Bear the Cross Alone." Service was turned over to the Moderator, Rev. H. C. Randolph. After a few encouraging remarks he declared the house open for business. The minutes were read and received. Paused for field worker's report. Sister Thigpen reported \$6.50 and the conference gave her \$1.50 for traveling expense. Ministers roll call. Absent, Reverend R. E. Worrell, Rev. H. K. Farrior, Rev. E. D. Bryant, Rev. Lillian Harris and Rev. D. G. Smith.

The Union anniversary shall be held in April at St. Peter's I'. W. Baptist Church. The following ministers wives will report \$100.00 and act as captains, Rev. H. C. Randolph, Rev. D. Smith, Rev. E. D. Bryant, Rev. G. W. Chapman and Rev. E. L. Rivers. The Moderator appointed an arrangement committee. Lis. Lucy Moore, Rev. M. S. Windley, Brother John Randolph, Sis. L. Harris, Rev. W. S. Saunders and Sis. Georgia Marsh. The Supervisor made his report. These were the findings:

- 1. Few ministers are working whole heartedly.
- 2. Some churches are having minor troubles.
- 3. Some churches and ministers are fine for the public and some for themselves.

He humbly submitted his report to the conference and had them to know how pleasant and enjoyable his work had been. He urged them to work more in mission and Sunday school and above all, cooperate. (See Supervisors Report). Recognition of visiting ministers from the Western Conference. They were Rev. George Fitzpatrick, Rev. A. D. Harring and Rev. E. Newkirk. The Condolence and Credentials Committees made their report. (See report). Reports were accepted. Rev. W. S. Saunders was appointed to take charge of the memorial service.

Resolutions received were sections one, two and three for 1964.

MID-DAY SERVICE

Service was called to order by Rev. E. L. Rivers singing, "I Will Trust in the Lord." Prayer by Rev. B. T. Farrior Scripture Mark 8:1-10. Second hymn, "Pass me Not," by the conference choir. Remarks by Rev. R. H. G. Morris in observance of the Memorial Service. Spiritual, "Well Done." Reverend

W. S. Saunders text, Job 23:10. He preached a powerful sermon, leaving this thought; God knows and understands his children, therefore he will stand by them regardless of the circumstance. The invitation was extended for membership by Rev. E. L. Rivers. Spiritual, "The Lord Will Make A Way Somehow." Rev. R. H. G. Morris gave some timely remarks. Clozed by Rev. E. L. Rivers.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON 2:30

Service reassembled by singing, "Down at the Cross." The Moderator declared the house open for business. Roll call of Churches and Deacons were continued. (see roll).

Deed of Trust for Pilgrim Rest Church was before the house and agreed upon. Lilly of The Valley paid \$100.00 for 1962, \$300.00 for 1963, making a total of \$400.00 on conference debt.

The Union anniversary reported \$100.00. Found in Education treasure \$286.70 and gave the committee \$12.00. Superantuated treasure found \$126.50 and collected \$360.93, total \$487.43. Mission and Candle Light Service reported \$81.61. The Sunday School sent \$32.00 by Bro. Sim Chapman to Bro. E. L. Scott. (see report).

Now it was time to find a place for the next annual conference. The churches and the votes received; Weeping Rachel 4; Piney Grove 23; Holly Hill 20; White Plain 5. Votes for the Introductory Sermon, Rev. B. T. Farrior 12; Rev. Luke Farmer 7;.

The Annual Conference in 1964 will convene at Piney Grove Free Will Baptist Church, Bolivia, N. C. Rev. B. T. Farrior will preach the Introductory Sermon. Missionary Convention will convene Saturday before the third Sunday in September at St. John F. W. Baptist Church, Blounts Creek, N. C. Rev. H. C. Randolph to preach and Rev. J. W. Wilkins to open. (see report).

The next Sunday School Convention will convene at St. Peter F. W. B. Church, Vanceboro, N. C. Saturday before the third Sunday in August. (see report).

SATURDAY NIGHT 7:30

Service was called to order by singing, "Jesus Keep Me Near the Cross." First hymn "Yield not to Temptation," by the Chapman Chapel Choir. Prayer by Rev. F. A. Armstrong. Second hymn, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus." Scripture Roman 10:1-11. Prayer by Rev. E. Newkirk from the Western

Conference. Song, "Just Jesus" was highly inspiring. Third hymn by the choir, "Down at the Cross." The Moderator presented and introduced to some, the speaker for the hour; Rev. George Fitzpatrick from the Western Conference. He took his text from Genesis 19:17, "Escape for thou Life." Subject: "Run for your Life."

After the powerful sermon, the invitation was extended for membership by Rev. F. A. Armstrong, while the choir sang, "It's Amazing." One person came to join the church. She was accepted by the pastor Rev. W. S. Saunders. Offering \$62.40. Closing by Rev. F. A. Armstrong and congregation singing, "You Just Hold On."

SUNDAY MORNING SERVICE

11:10 a.m. Rev. J. W. Wilkins came forward and conducted the Devotional with the Gospel Chorus of Selvia Chapel F.W. B. Church of Greenville, N. C. Processional, "I'll Reach My Home Some Day."

Rev. Wilkins led the morning prayer. First hymn, "O Soul of Salvation." Scripture lesson was by Rev. Wilkins, he read 9 verses of the 8th chapter of Romans, followed by prayer by Rev. F. A. Armstrong. Chant by the choir, "Only a Look." Spiritual by the choir.

The ushers came forward and raised for the Poor offering, the amount of \$28.78.

The Vice-Moderator, Rev. R. H. G. Morris asked that the when and where of the next Union Meeting will convene to be announced.

The Vice then came forward and presented the Moderator in the person of Rev. H. C. Randolph. The chorus then gave a spiritual entitled, "Jesus Weave a Fence Around Me." The Moderator then came forward to deliver the message. He chose hs text from the 81st Psalm 8-10, verses. Subject, "The Great Tragedy that comes, When God gives you up." It was a glorious sermon. The choir then sang a spiritual, "Carry your Burdens to the Lord and Leave them There."

Rev W. S. Saunders came forward and asked Rev. W. T. Barrow, Bro. J. C. Keyes, Bro. J. T. Barnes and Bro. C. A. Dixon, to help raise the collection. They raised the amount in the public collection to \$84.38. Sunday School \$16.19. Sick \$15.60. Blind man \$7.76. School equipment \$11.79. After some remarks by the Vice-Moderator, the service was closed by the chorus singing, "Hold on to Jesus. Dismissed by Reverend J. W. Wilkins.

SUNDAY AFTERNOON 2:15

Service was opened by a mixed choir singing, "Jesus Keep me near the Cross." Assisted by the Rev. R. H. G. Morris.

Rev. Morris then read the 123rd Psalm. Prayer by the Rev. McArthur Florence. Selection by the choir. The acting Moderator then came forward and called the collector to come and raise the offering which was in the amount of \$35.30. The Moderator then made some brief remarks and presented the speaker of the hour in the person of Rev. Sis. Lillian Harris. She came forward and chose her text from the 8th chapter of St. John, verse 12, words: "I am the light of the world." Subject, "Walking in the light." After a soul stirring sermon, the choir sang a spiritual, "Walk in the Light." The doors of the church were opened for membership, but no one came. Then some remarks concerning the message. The Supervisor asked the Conference to rise and thank the people for such a joyous and welcoming that we had all received here at the Jumping Run Free Will Baptist Church.

Announcements was then made by the Clerk:

The total amount raised during this session of the Annual Conference was \$2,279.61.

Closing song by the choir, "May God be with You till we Meet Again."

Dismissed by Rev. R. H. G. Morris.

1964 RESOLUTIONS

We your Committee on Resolutions humbly submit the following report:

- Sec. 1—Be it resolved that this Conference shall be known as Northeast Old Original Free Will Baptist Conference of America.
- Sec. 2—Be it resolved, no preacher shall preside over more than four churches in any pastoral year, except in case of an emergency.
- Sec. 3—Be it resolved that the Moderator shall call the conference in an extra session in case of an emergency by first giving each church and preacher due notice.
- Sec. 4—Amended to read as follows:—Be it resolved that the Conference shall give each church that the conference convenes with \$50.00.
- Sec. 5—Be it resolved that all churches that belong in this conference shall sign the agreement contract. That is to say a member of the Northeast Old Original F.W.B. Conference.
- Sec. 6—Be it resolved that the clerk shall not be any later than December 25th in putting the minutes in print without a lawful excuse.
- Sec. 7—Be it resolved that each deacon of the local church shall pay \$2.00 each year in the superannuate fund for the old and infirm deacons.
- Sec. 8—Be it resolved that each deacon shall be paid the same amount that the preachers receive if they have paid their superannuate money of \$2.00 per year.
- Sec. 9—Be it resolved that the Moderator and Trustees shall have the power over all money in the treasury for the benefit of the conference.
- Sec. 10—Be it resolved that the Moderator and Secretary shall be in charge of the conference badges and programs and all badges be sold for \$1.00 each.
- Sec. 11—Be it resolved that no preacher or elder be exempt from paying his Conference Tax until he retires from all his church pulpits.
- Sec. 12—Be it resolved that no money be paid out of the treasure only by orders of the Conference, properly signed.
- Sec. 13—Be it resolved that money raised in the conference shall show in the minutes and after expenses have been paid, the balance turned to the conference treasurer and the same shall show in the minutes.

- Sec. 14—Be it resolved that if any preacher or elder fail to pay their conference tax or claims, it shall be taken out of his public funds and turned over to the conference treasurer.
- Sec. 15—Be it resolved that the conference meet at 10 a.m. on Thursday before the third Sunday in October each year, to discuss plans for the betterment of the Annual Conference.
- Sec. 16—Be it resolved that if any member be found working against the conference shall be tried by the Conference Board.
- Sec. 17—Be it resolved that each member of the local church shall pay 10ϕ or more 4 times a year to the Brother Union and 5ϕ or more to the Sisters Union 4 times a year.
- Sec. 18—Be it resolved that the executive board be composed of the present officers of the conference.
- Sec. 19—Be it resolved that all committees that serve in the conference be paid \$2.00 per day, for services rendered, and the Resolution Committee \$2.50 per day and the Finance Committee \$3.00 per day.
- Sec. 20—Be it resolved that each Brother Union shall pay to the conference \$20.00 each year and Sister Union \$10.00 each year.
- Sec. 21—Be it resolved that if any member or elder fail to belong to one of the union meetings, shall pay the union fee and be called in and questioned by the committee.
- Sec. 22—Amended to read as follows:—Be it resolved that the Woman's Home Mission and the Sunday School Convention shall pay to the Annual Conference \$10.00 each per year.
- Sec. 23—Amended to read as follows:—Be it resolved that all money raised from the public collection be turned over to the Conference Finance Committee and the Conference donate to each preacher who attends the conference from the first day to the last day \$15.00 who pays in the public collection. The maximum the other brothers pay.
- Sec. 24—Be it resolved that the Y. P. C. L. Convene on Thursday night.
- Sec. 25—Be it resolved that the Trustee Board properly investigate all deeds and titles before any loan is made to any church.
- Sec. 26—Be it resolved that no money will be paid out of the conference without the knowledge of the Trustees.
