"The Pulpit Committee has recommended that Bro. John McKown bring the 11:00 message.

The Publication, Education, and Temperance Committees report was read and received:

"The Publication, Education, and Temperance Committee ask that all members, if possible, support the Sem., either with individual subscription or the family plan. We suggest we read Free Will Baptists College Sunday School literature, that we support the Free Will Baptist College, the Missouri Youth Camp, and other fields of our denominational work. We strongly recommend that our members not use intoxicating beverages.

read and received.

read and received.

"We, the Mission Committee, recom-
mend that we give more support to our
home and foreign missions. We suggest

2000" we suggest that the Moderator
write to the Foreign Mission Board
requesting a missionary to visit our
churches during the coming year."

The Business Committee was read and
received.

"We suggest that our Northwest
Missouri Association set up a Memorial
in memory of Dr. and Mrs. E. J. House
at our Youth Camp. If any other
business, may be brought before
committee, feel free to make known."

After discussion, it was suggested
that we give money from the
Northwest Association as a memorial
to Brother and Sister House to the
youth camp. It was suggested

that Committee from each Church
be appointed to contact individuals.
These committees are to report to
the 5th Sunday meeting in August.
The Moderators suggested that we
take \$35.00 out of our Treasury and
apply to this memorial for Brother
and Sister House. Motion made
and seconded.

for donations.
