2. Be it resolved that we give a rising vote of thanks to the West End Church for hosting this quarterly meeting.

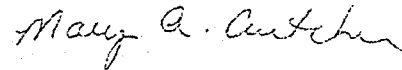

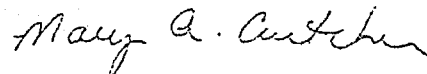
