

MINUTES OF THE NORTHERN QUARTERLY

The Northern Quarterly met in regular session January 8, 2011, at Oaklawn FWB church. The first song was *At Calvary* followed by prayer. The next song was *A Mighty Fortress*. The host pastor, Rev. Bob Lewis gave the welcome. Response was given by Bro. Roy Jensen who also brought the meeting to order. The Resolutions committee was named as follows: Jason Bell, Stanley Crutcher and Charley Carmack.

Bro. Jeremy Overstreet brought the morning devotion from Hebrews 1, entitled "Much More Than a Man." A look at the deity of Jesus. He's much more than a man because of His claim, creation, control, crucifixion, and crown.

The business session began with the seating of the ordained ministers, ordained deacons and the delegates. Motion made to receive delegates, seconded and carried. Visitors were recognized. Martha Davis read the minutes. A motion was made to accept the report as read, seconded and approved. The treasurer's report was given by Bro. Eddie Hodges. **NOTE: The dues changed in 2011 from \$235 to \$325 and are expected to change again in 2012.** Motion made to accept the report, seconded and approved.

The Executive Committee makes a recommendation to have a seminar for pastors with Bro. Robert Picirilli and Bro. Leroy Forlines and invite the other quarterly meetings in the Cumberland Association. This seminar pursued at a time and location to be determined and set aside \$400 from the budget to be used for Honorariums. Bro. Jensen will check with the Presbytery to see if others would want to be a part and help on the costs. A motion was made, seconded and approved.

The Resolution Committee met and made the following recommendations:

1. Be it resolved that the offering taken today be given to Bro. Glenn Poston for the state promotion office.
2. Be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given to Oaklawn FWB for its hospitality in hosting the quarterly today.

The resolutions were accepted by a motion, seconded and approved.

The Examining Committee recommended we send a letter of good standing for Bro. Mike Dankson to the Western Quarterly. Bro. Mike pastors the United FWB church in Dickson, TN. Also, a letter of good standing was approved and sent for Bro. Kevin Woolard to the Pamlico Association in North Carolina.

The Unity FWB Church, White House, TN had requested entrance in NQ, but they were not at the meeting. Bro. Jensen told them it would be deferred to the April 2011 meeting.

Bro. Larry Hampton from FWB Ministries gave his report. Dr. Kilgore is doing well. They extended appreciation to the NQ for being God's agent.

Bro. Bill Campbell from the Laverne FWB brought information about a men's retreat to be held Sept. 23-24, 2011 at the Cumberland Camp. Bro. David Crowe will be the speaker at all 3 services, cost of \$50, deadline is June 25. Asking pastors to get behind and support this endeavor. All the profit goes to the new building fund at the camp. Only cost is the camp and small honorarium. Checks are to be made payable Bill Campbell for a restricted account just for the event. Tax deductible receipts can be done by issuing checks to the church and then have the church send a check to Bill Campbell.

Bro. Stan Coker gave a report for the Cumberland Youth Camp. Jan 16 is Cumberland camp day. Pastors should get a packet of information about Light the Way campaign. Bro. Coker asked the pastors to have the churches show the DVD and participate with a donation. The cost is approximately \$350,000 to build a meeting facility. This doubles the ministry capacity, especially in the off season. Would like to break ground this fall and be ready by camp time 2012. Have \$50,000 already committed. Pastors' wives retreat is the end of January. Encourage the ladies to come. Bro. Coker gave out a schedule for the summer camps.

Bro. Philip Morgan, Heads FWB, CTS chair will be sending out a letter about the CTS competition. Tentatively it will be at New Hope FWB about the end of March. If a church needs someone to give information or come to the church, Philip will be glad to come and speak or give devotion, etc.

Brian Lewis or Ray Lewis—recently announced to be a part of the Dallas mission field to plant a church with the Wrights. He and his family will be going this summer. They are going to a large growth area; Collin Country has grown about 52% in the last 10 years. Please pray for a teaching job for Bro. Lewis. He will be scheduling services in the area to raise

funds. Two other lay families are seriously praying about going also. Pray for the persons in the area for God to be working on the hearts.

Bro. Eddie Hodges gave a report for a Word and Witness workshop, on March 26 at the FWBBC. There will be 2-2 hour sessions. Brother Woodard will be leading one session entitled "Bible Study Methods" and Rev. Terry Forest will be leading a workshop entitled "Soul Winning and Evangelism."

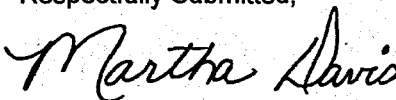
Bro. Glenn Poston stated that the state dues were raised. The dues have only been \$10 per year for as long as many could remember. \$10 per year will not print the minutes or the Echo. There's so many things the state offices would like to do, but cannot. The state office cannot be operated at a loss. Bro. Tim Osborne is a home missionary in West Tennessee near Memphis, recently found out he has cancer and had surgery, but the church is doing well. Please remember him and the church in prayers. April 28 and 29 is the state competition for CTS. Seniors retreat in March in Pigeon Forge. Brochures were mailed to the church address this week.

Brother Dave Thomas brought up the increase in the dues. In October a check will need to be written to the State from the Northern Quarterly. All the different entities are not on the same calendar. The dues will increase from \$10 to \$150 over the next 2 years for the State. The total for 2011 is \$325 per year, in a couple of years will be \$425. If the churches are reported to the state and the money is not there, they are not recognized. If the dues are not paid, the churches could have problems with tax exemption if not part of the National Association. Moderator, assistant moderator and treasurer are to contact the churches who have not paid.

The worship service began with the songs: *Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus* and *I am Thine O Lord*. Prayer was given and an Offering was taken. Special Music was presented a capella by Corey Minter, "I Then Shall Live." Bro. Glenn Poston gave the morning message from Ephesians 4:17-32, with a title of "Calling of Being a Christian".

We had prayer and were dismissed for lunch. The next NQ meeting in April 2011 would be at Oakwood FWB, Oaklawn, TN.

Churches would be welcome to come and have a work day, painting, cleaning, etc. PVCS needs a bus and they have a bus fund. May 4 is mission day, every year the school adopts a missionary and Shannon Little will be at the school.

Bro. Philip Morgan gave a report of the CTS competition held at the end of March. There were 53 competitors from 5 churches in the NQ. Forty-one moved on to the state competition.

Bro. Wallace Hayes gave a report for the Cumberland Youth Camp and the Light the Way campaign on behalf of the board of directors. The camp will not start building until they have commitments for the funds to build.

Bro. Stan Coker brought information about summer camp and the new activity of paintball. There are lots of creative ways for raising the funds for the Light the Way campaign. Please see Bro. Stan to schedule a camp day soon.

Bro. Clayton Hampton brought a report on Two Rivers FWB. There have been many challenges in building and they have decided to downsize the building. Due to some moves of members out of the area, they are in need some mature Christians ready to help the church.

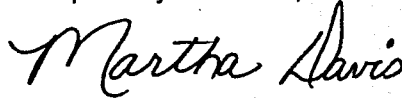

Bro. David Outlaw brought greetings from International Missions. The WMO offering is on target for \$500,000, the goal was \$600,000. Several international missionaries will be back in the States by the FWB National. The International Mission office is in serious financial shape, but so far have not had to lay off field missionaries. Cuts have been made in the office. Other denominations have also had serious economic problems. Baptists start more churches than any other mission agencies in Central Asia.

David Outlaw encouraged churches to work with the Hanna Project which has 8 projects going on throughout the summer and fall, in Panama and Japan, Cuba and Kazakhstan. There are a lot of projects the churches can get involved with. Lay persons with skills can help construct children's centers, etc. The mission project David Outlaw will be with this fall will be constructing showers and restrooms at an underprivileged children's center.

He extended appreciation to the NQ for their giving and all other things that have been done. Schaffer is doing well, went to camp, and riding his bike again. The Outlaw family appreciated all the prayers for their family during that time.

Pray for the India church that was destroyed. They were warned by the extremist group not to rebuild. At this time, they are not sure what they are going to do.

Bro. Wallace Hayes gave a report for the Cumberland Youth Camp behalf of the board of directors. This year they had an increase in registration for camp and there were at least 20 professions of faith. They had a great summer in camp, with more than 450 campers. The Light the Way Campaign has raised a lot of funds, but nowhere near the amount needed. Someone has given a \$10,000 gift and they have been challenged to find 10 others to match that gift. They are getting close to the \$70,000 mark at this time. He encouraged the NQ to pick up the prayer cards and take to churches. They want to set a date for groundbreaking, but it will probably not be until next spring.

Bro. Bill Campbell organized a men's retreat September 23-24 at the Cumberland Youth Camp and encourages everyone to attend. If they get the attendance to 100, the camp will get \$1,800. He requested prayers for he and his wife Roberta as they will be back on the road to raise money to go to Arizona.

Bro. Randy Riggs brought a report from the Tennessee Promotional office and Bro. Glenn Poston. Please pray for Bro. Poston. In 2012 the state of TN will be hosting the National in Memphis. A part of the responsibility of the host state is to give \$40,000 to help with the cost. \$250 was requested from each of the TN churches to host the national and many churches have not given anything. As a goal in Nov 2011 they would like to give the full amount to the National. There will be a Golf Tournament in October to help raise the funds and there are many wonderful prizes. All monies raised will go to the National Association. The national began webstreaming the evening services last year and will again this year. Good Springs will be streaming the services at their church on Sunday evening, July 17 and everyone is welcome.

Rev. Dave Thomas made a motion to sponsor a hole from the NQ at the golf tournament, seconded and carried.

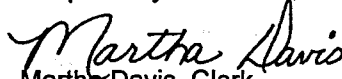

We had prayer and were dismissed for lunch. The next NQ meeting in January 2012 would be at Pardue Memorial FWB, Clarksville, TN.
