

MINUTES OF THE NORTHERN QUARTERLY

The Northern Quarterly met in regular session January 14, 2012, at Pardue Memorial FWB church. The first song was *Jesus Saves* and *Love Lifted Me* followed by prayer. The host pastor, Rev. Len Scott gave the welcome. Response was given by Bro. Roy Jensen. Bro. Roy Jensen brought the meeting to order. The Resolutions Committee was named as follows: Cecil Boswell, Danny Hayes, and Philip Morgan.

Bro. Wally Jones brought the morning devotion from Zephaniah 3:17. He talked about the mighty God we serve.

The business session began with the seating of the ordained ministers, ordained deacons and delegates. Motion made to receive delegates, seconded and carried. Visitors were recognized. Martha Davis read the minutes and told the pastors about the mistake on the report form sent at the end of year for dues for 2012. The amount of \$325 in 2011 has been increased to \$425 in 2012. The state dues increased from \$50 to \$150 in 2012. A correction was made on the minutes to delete the dollar amounts next to the Proposed Disbursement of the Unified Giving Fund. A motion was made to accept the report with corrections, seconded and approved. The treasurer's report was given by Bro. Eddie Hodges. Motion made to accept the report, seconded and approved.

Philip Morgan announced that the CTS competition would be March 3 at 9 AM at Bethlehem FWB.

Bro. Clayton Hampton acknowledged the support and prayers of NQ. This year has seen a bigger turnover for the church than in any year and income in 2011 was about \$20,000 less than in 2010. They are trying to be self supporting and want to develop the land they have, please continue to pray.

Bro. Stan Coker gave the report of the Cumberland Youth Camp. The camp is progressing in the capital campaign and passed the mark of \$50,000 cash in hand in December. Bro. Hayes also talked about the capital campaign. If there were 6 people committed to raising \$10,000 and the camp knew it now, they would break ground this spring. They are starting a "difference makers club." They really need the new building and request prayers for this endeavor.

The theme will be "Under Construction" for the youth camps this year based on the book of Nehemiah. They are asking for every church to commit and send children and funds. Camps begin May 27 and continue the following 5 weeks.

The pastors' wives retreat is to be held January 27-29, 2012. They would love to have all pastors' wives, youth pastors' wives, and denominational leaders' wives. Please encourage them to come. The camp does not want to turn anyone away because of finances, please let them know if someone needs help.

Please schedule a service for Bro. Coker to come and speak to the churches about camp.

The Resolution Committee met and made the following recommendations:

1. Be it resolved that the offering taken today be given to Two Rivers FWB Church.
2. Be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given to Pardue Memorial FWB for its hospitality in hosting the quarterly today.

The resolutions were voted on one by one. Motion made to accept all resolutions, seconded and approved.

Bro. Steve Riggs brought a report from FWB International Missions. He gave thanks for the support of the NQ for FWB International Missions. The intent of going to a global fund was never to prohibit people from giving to designated missionaries. Designated giving tends to create competition between missionaries. Please pray for the missionaries and the leaders. Steve and Becky are still planning to go back to France this summer. If you would like for them to come and share in your church, please let them know.

Bro. Glenn Poston brought a report on behalf of Tennessee State Association of FWB. In 2011 there was an increase of 24.88% in undesignated gifts. Designated gifts were also up 25.02%. Five percent of whatever is sent to the unified plan goes to the pastor's retirement fund established with the board of retirement at the end of each year.

If a church gives 5% of general offerings to the undesignated fund, they will receive a \$400 scholarship for each student from that church to go to FWBBC.

The state needs to provide volunteers to work the National. They need hospitality workers, ushers, judges, etc. Pray for the steering committee for the National Meeting in Memphis, TN. Only about 60 churches out of 210 in Tennessee gave the \$250 needed for the national, however, the state was able to give the national \$42,000 and hope to give the remaining

\$3,000 by July. The national is usually in Tennessee once every 10 years and they've set a fund aside in the unified giving fund to fund this in the future.

Bro. Randy Corn gave the examining committee report and had 3 recommendations:

1. Having met with Brother Seldon Buck we do recommend his acceptance as a minister in good standing in the Northern Quarterly pending his letter from the South Carolina Conference.
2. We recommend the approval for ordination of Bro. John Lee
3. We recommend the approval for ordination of Bro. Ben Ryan

The recommendations were voted on one by one. Motion made to accept all recommendations, seconded and approved.

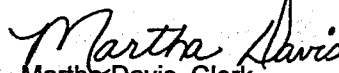

MINUTES OF THE NORTHERN QUARTERLY

The Northern Quarterly met in regular session April 14, 2012, at Shady Grove FWB church. The first song was *Doxology* and *Come Thou Fount* followed by prayer. The host pastor, Rev. Charley Carmack gave the welcome. Response was given by Bro. Roy Jensen. Bro. Roy Jensen brought the meeting to order. The Resolutions Committee was named as follows: Dave Thomas, David Blades, and Cecil Boswell. Philip Morgan read a scripture and led the congregation in *A Mighty Fortress is Our God*.

Bro. Phill Easley brought the morning devotion from II Kings 2:11-18. He spoke about Christian leadership and "May all who come behind us find us faithful."

The business session began with the seating of the ordained ministers, ordained deacons and delegates. Motion made to receive delegates, seconded and carried. Visitors were recognized. Martha Davis read the minutes. Correction was made that the ICE Institute was held at New Hope, not Good Springs. Motion made to receive the report with corrections, seconded and approved. The treasurer's report was given by Bro. Eddie Hodges. Motion made to accept the report, seconded and approved.

Bro. Glenn Poston brought a written report on behalf of Tennessee State Association of FWB. He acknowledged appreciation for state and national ministries. He encouraged the churches to support the unified giving plan for all things FWB. Giving in your church is like having a budget in your home, if you are not intentional in spending, you will not know where your money goes. If the churches would give at least 5% to the unified giving plan and another 5% to the other offerings, it would help.

The national convention requested for \$45,000 for the Tennessee churches over a 10 year period, less than \$250 per church. Now the state has a plan and has a convention fund in the budget. The TN FWB will give more than the \$45,000 needed by July 1.

Dawn Sweeney gave a report in the form of a request for prayer warriors for FWB Children's Ministries. In 2011, there were 122 children saved. Prayer for house parents, foster care program, Hope Crisis Pregnancy Center, abstinence classes, parenting classes and post abortion counseling, and Oaks Retreat Center. They began a "bucket brigade campaign" for prayer and financial support by getting younger children and put loose change in the little buckets and fill up the big bucket. Dr. James Kilgore is stepping down from the ministry in June. Pray that the right person will be sent for the ministry.

Dr. Seldon Buck gave a report from PVCS. He expressed his appreciation. Please come by and visit them, pray for them, send your children. They are enrolling now and have over 200 for next year.

Bro. Bob Lewis brought a report for the Two Rivers FWB church ministry. Bro. Clayton and Tammy Hampton have given their all for that ministry. Please visit the property if you get a chance. Home Missions has hired Chad Kevitt to come and replace Bro. Clayton. They will be in Florida until June and then begin itinerant. Bro. Lewis and his wife will be there to keep the ministry going until Bro. Kevitt can get there. Bro. Clayton has done a great job of preparing the church for them to come.

Brian Lewis will be going to help the work in McKinney, TX. His wife had an illness and derailed them going a year ago. She is now doing better and they will be able to go this summer. They are in the process of raising funds and about half way there.

Bro. Wallace Hayes brought greetings and appreciation from the camp. He mentioned the ground breaking on April 21. Ministry of Cumberland Association and board members are chosen every year at the association meeting. In December they surpassed \$100,000 in gifts and commitments. If they can duplicate it in 2012 and 2013 will be very near the goal to build the building. There are several fund raising campaigns for the camp this summer and fall. There will be a work day May 12. More than 20 conversions recorded at the Cumberland Youth Camp in 2011.

David Outlaw brought the report from International Ministries, "we are not an institution, we are a ministry." April 29 is the date for the World Mission offering. The Amazing Race fund raising event will be at PVCS today, April 14 from 2-4. In Central Asia are churches are having problems and having to reregister churches, mosques, etc. Pray for the work in central Asia and what the brothers and sisters are going through. Pray for the brothers and sisters in India who have lost homes. Pray for the Pooles, for Mrs; Geneva's health and the Hanna project.

The Executive Committee report was given by Martha Davis which basically consisted of the suggested speakers for the rest of the year and January 2013 meeting. A motion was made to receive the report, seconded and approved.

The Resolution Committee met and made the following recommendations:

1. Be it resolved that the offering taken today be given to the WMO campaign
2. Be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given to Shady Grove FWB for its hospitality in hosting the quarterly today.

The resolutions were voted on one by one. Motion made to accept all resolutions, seconded and approved.

Bro. Jon Justice gave the examining committee report and had the following recommendation:

1. Having met with Brother Mark Milling, presently attending Harper Road, we do recommend ratification of his credentials, pending letter of recommendation from the North Mississippi Association.

The recommendations were voted on one by one. Motion made to accept all recommendations, seconded and approved.

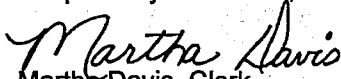

MINUTES OF THE NORTHERN QUARTERLY

The Northern Quarterly met in regular session July 7, 2012, at Trinity FWB church. The congregation was led in song by Corey Minter: *To God Be the Glory* and *Worthy is the Lamb* followed by prayer. The host lay member, Larry Satterfield gave the welcome. Response was given by Bro. David Davis. Bro. Roy Jensen brought the meeting to order. The Resolutions Committee was named as follows: Dwayne James, chair, John Lee and Gene Parton.

Bro. Billy Bowers brought the morning devotion from Luke 22. He spoke about Jesus in Gethsemane.

The business session began with the seating of the ordained ministers, ordained deacons and delegates. Motion made to receive delegates, seconded and carried. Visitors were recognized. Martha Davis presented the minutes. Motion made to receive the written report, seconded and approved. The treasurer's report was given by Bro. Eddie Hodges. The 2013 budget was presented also. Motion made to adopt the budget, seconded and Bro. Eddie Hodges made a motion to amend the budget to increase the amount given to Bobby Poole to \$240 like the other missionaries. A motion was made to accept the amendment, seconded and approved. Motion made to approve the budget and report, seconded and approved.

Bro. Wallace Hayes brought greetings and appreciation to the NQ from the camp. The camp had 405 in attendance for the 2012 summer with several decisions made. More than 2 dozen received Christ. Several were felt led to the mission field, Bible College and to preach. The campaign is going well and they have received more than \$70,000 toward the campaign and commitments have passed \$120,000. There have been several commitments for inkind gifts. Their hope is to get enough funds to have the building dried in and have ready for camp next year. Cumberland Camp will have a booth at the National this year. There will also be some other fund raising events. On September 8, they will host a 5k run and walk. Weekend of Aug 18 will have a flashback retreat. Check out the website for further information.

Bro. Earl Langley brought the report for FWBBC and his appreciation to the NQ. FWBBC is our national school and the message and mission has never changed. There are some exciting things happening. The cost of the online educational programs will be reduced in the near future. Work is continuing for plans for a graduate school. Pray for the National and the request for the name change, the men who are traveling and representing the school, for the sale of the buildings on campus, and the parents and students who may be contemplating attending.

Dr. Seldon Buck brought the promotional video for PVCS, which was shown at the beginning of the business session. DVDs are available to all the churches at no charge. There will be many new teachers and staff for the new school year. PVCS will be having a work day July 14. A fall festival and car show will be sometime around October. They had an anonymous donor to match up to \$10K for the summer makeover of the school. There is a need for Christian schools more than ever, please continue to pray.

The Resolution Committee met and made the following recommendations:

1. Be it resolved that a rising vote of thanks be given to Trinity FWB for its hospitality in hosting the quarterly today.
2. Be it resolved that the offering taken today be given to Bryan Lewis who is going to Texas as home missionary.

The resolutions were voted on one by one. Motion made to accept all resolutions, seconded and approved.

Bro. Jon Justice gave the examining committee report and had the following recommendations and information:

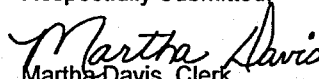
A motion was made to adjourn the business meeting, seconded and approved.
