Minutes of the Northern Quarterly

The Northern Quarterly met in regular session July 13, 2019 at West End Free Will Baptist in Springfield, TN. We joined together in the fellowship hall for breakfast. Rev. Corey Minter welcomed the assembly and thanked Rev. Ronnie Smith for hosting. Rev. Minter named The Resolutions Committee as follows: Chair: Eddie Hodges, Brian Lewis, Paul Hopson.

The business session began with the seating of the ordained ministers, ordained deacons, and delegates. Visitors were recognized.

Rev. Jacob A. gave a welcome on behalf of the Hanna Project. Jacob is currently the most recent approved member of the Hanna Project. He is working on assembling funds and a team to go to a predominately muslim community in France. He would be happy to come to our churches to share more about his upcoming ministry.

Sis. Margaret Hampton came on behalf of Cumberland Camp. This year was a record-breaking year, they had 694 overnight-campers and 55 day-campers. The zipline opened this year and they had a wonderful time utilizing it. Flex cabins are close to be complete. There are 4 cabins that are being built. They have a booked calendar for the next couple months. Pray that the camp will continue to grow. Pray that the camp board will know how to best use the funds that have been placed in their hands. Please continue to pray for the workers and campers.

Rev. Todd Parrish gave a report on behalf of Welch College. He thanked the NQ for all of their support. The college has had a good close-out financially of their fiscal year. They finished the year in the black about \$175,000. Please pray as they go into the fall, for the new students that will be coming in the fall. Last year they broke a 34-year record in enrollment. They are excited about their new Masters of Education program and their Masters of Theology. He also shared about their pave-the-way program and the new torch-bearer club. Continue to pray for the president, staff, and faculty.

Rev. Jason Bell came and promoted the Men's State Retreat Sept 12-14. Great line-up of speakers. There is a \$99 registration fee for the weekend. You can register at www.parduechurch.org. All men and sons are invited.

Rev. David Womack came on behalf of Randall House.
