Minutes of the Northern Quarterly

The Northern Quarterly met in regular session April 9, 2022, at Goodsprings Free Will Baptist Church in Pleasant View, TN. Moderator Daniel Webster opened the meeting. Rev. Mike Hollis gave a response of welcome from Goodsprings Church. Moderator Webster named The Resolutions Committee as follows: Chair: Rev. Randy Riggs, Rev. Eric Sims, and Rev. Dwayne James.

Moderator Webster opened the meeting with reading from Philippians. The business session began with the seating of the ordained ministers, ordained deacons, and delegates. Visitors were recognized.

Sis. Megan Morgan presented the minutes, and a motion was made to accept them, seconded, and approved.

Sis. Morgan then gave the treasurer's report for both Quarter 4 2021-Quarter 1 2022 and Quarter 2 of the 2022 fiscal year. Motion was made to accept the report, seconded, and approved.

Sis. Morgan gave a report on behalf of the Executive Committee. No official report. The board did meet in September to plan the 2022 year.

Administrator Rusty Campbell gave a report on behalf of Pleasant View Christian School. He emphasized the number of hours that students are taught a Biblical worldview formation. The school currently has 348 students. He shared current events and the need to increase their capacity to better serve the community. Motion to accept report as official record, seconded, and approved.

Sis. Pam Buck presented a report of behalf of the CTS Board report. See attached report. Motion to accept report as official record, seconded, and approved.

Examining Committee Report given by Rev. Eddie Hodges:

Motion to accept the report and vote on each item individually, seconded, and approved.

The Northern Quarterly met in regular session July 9, 2022, at Friendship Free Will Baptist Church in Ashland City, TN. Moderator Daniel Webster opened the meeting. Rev. Dwayne James gave a response of welcome from Friendship Church. Moderator Webster named The Resolutions Committee as follows: Chair: Dr. Matthew Pinson, Rev. Jesse Owens, and Rev. Corey Minter. Rev. James led us in an opening prayer followed by breakfast.

Moderator Webster opened the meeting with reading from Ephesians 4:1-6. The business session began with the seating of the ordained ministers, ordained deacons, and delegates. Visitors were recognized.

Sis. Megan Morgan presented the minutes from the April meeting, and a motion was made to accept them, seconded, and approved.

Sis. Morgan then gave the treasurer's report for Quarter 3 of the 2022 fiscal year. Motion was made to accept the report, seconded, and approved.

Announcements:

Welch College's Rejoice ministry team will be at Heads July 21 at 7:00pm. All are invited to attend.

Cumberland Christian Education Board will be hosting a Lock-in at Cumberland Camp August 5-6. See flier for full details.

Rev. Webster encouraged our churches to help get our laity involved in the association. He has a flier to post so that people can get on the contact list.

Sis. Megan Morgan shared that the Cumberland District Women's Ministry is hosting a brunch on September 1 for the young ladies of Welch College. All women are invited and encouraged to attend.

Visitors were recognized:

Sis. Elizabeth Hodges came and gave a report on behalf of the TN IM Board. 19 students were supported for various programs offered for missions: ETEAM, College Mission Program, and Overseas Apprentice. 11 out of 19 were from the Cumberland area. 6 of those are from the Northern Quarterly. There have been several Go Global events. Currently TN missionary accounts are stable. To God be the glory!

Sis. Shannon Little came and gave greetings from Japan. She shared that for the first time in 20 years she came back to the states for furlough fully funded. Donny and Ruth MacDonald are transitioning off the field, so there will be lots of changes back at their church in Japan. So pray for the church and ministry in Japan.

Rev. Chris Dotson came and gave a report on behalf of the State office. Encouraged us to find ways to evangelize. Our State Meeting will be Nov. 7-9 at Cookeville FWB Church.

Business adjourned.

Rev. Corey Minter led the congregation in singing "Grace Greater Than Our Sin." An offering was taken on behalf of the Hope Center in Greenville. Rev. Minter led the congregation in singing "And Can It Be?"

Rev. Judson Phenicie opened his message "The Church of 2022" from Lamentations 1 by noting that in order to reach out to the lost, we need to practice repentance. Israel's grievous sin had begun generations before the Babylonian Exile, and their leaders played an important role in that decline. Our churches today have declined in attendance, in part, because our people have not grown in spiritual depth. The leaders of these churches also bear some responsibility for this decline. Further, our churches are increasingly isolated from each other and our members from one another. Association with one another is essential for church health. The church should also be a place of comfort, compassion, and fervent worship where the gospel is preached with clarity and conviction. Rev. Phenicie closed in prayer.

Rev. Webster gave a benediction. The next Northern Quarterly meeting will be held on January 14, 2023, at Harper Road Free Will Baptist Church in Joelton, TN.

NORTHERN QUARTERLY CTS BOARD REPORT

2022

We had 10 churches participate in our 2022 NQ District CTS competition with 65 entries in 43 different categories. We had 51 entries advancing to the State competition. Our entries continue to be down a little from previous years but we did have a slight increase in 2022. (Pre-Covid we had 11 churches participating with 100+ entries).

Attached is 2022 financial report. For your information, the entry fees for all advancing entries is sent to the State competition, with their entry forms. The District keeps the fees for any non-advancing entries as well as the \$35.00 annual church fee. We collected \$2820.00 in fees, \$1940.00 was sent to the State and the remaining was used to purchase competition materials, medals and supplies, pay the MC's/Judges, compensate the host church for any expenses/cleaning involved.

Board Member Amber Houske resigned and turned in her debit card and all checking account records in April, 2022.

2023 District Competition dates are: March 3rd & 4th at New Hope FWB Church in Joelton. All competition entry forms and fees are due by February 1st. These forms must be sent to Mrs. Heather Parker at 3061 Lylewood Road, Woodlawn, TN. 37191. There will be a \$20.00 late fee for forms postmarked after February 1st. Each church is required to pay an annual fee of \$35.00 to the District in addition to entry fees.
