


The President's Paragraphs

Brisk Start Of Bond Sales See February Slack

Bond sales started out very briskly in January but slackened somewhat in February, according to OBC President J. D. O'Donnell. To date around \$125,000 of the bonds have been sold or reserved for buyers. This is very good and a praiseworthy item since it took a full year to sell only \$140,000 worthin the previous bond program.

With approximately \$175,000 worth yet to sell, the bond salesmen need the help of every Free Will Baptist in making contacts. Sales have been made where pastors and other interested individuals have given us the names of those who were interested. This is a big task and demands the aid of everyone.

Bonds of each denomination (\$250, \$500,

and \$1,000) yet remain. Friends of the school have invested amounts as high as \$20,000. All of these are appreciated. However, it is hoped that everyone who can make any type investment will do so. Bonds may be purchased on credit with a payment of ten percent down and a stipulated amount each month. This is a good savings plan for buyers, and the money becomes a vailable immediately for the College.

Attention All Seniors!

Saturday, April 6, has been designated as Senior Day on the campus of Oklahoma Bible College. The event, which was inaugurated last year as an annual event, is expected to attract high school seniors from across the Midwest. The day is planned to better acquaint these honored guests with the College, its curriculum, faculty, students, and facilities, and to emphasize the value and need for education based upon Biblical principles and obtained in a Christian atmosphere.

Plans are presently being formulated to include a special speaker with a message of timely interest to young people, a period of entertainment and fellowship, a question and answer session, and tours of the present campus facilities and the construction site of the new men's dormitory which is scheduled to be underway at that time. OBC students will be assisting with the events of the day.

Last year's response was gratifying and it is hoped that the pastors and youth leaders will again urge their graduating seniors to attend this day planned in their honor.

Full-Time Enrollment Shows 37 Per Cent Gain

Full-time enrollment for the spring semester at Oklahoma Bible College shows a gain of 37 per cent over the 1967 spring total of full-time students, according to Registrar Eugene Workman.

Enrollment for the 1968 spring semester now stands at 78 with a full-time-equivalent enrollment of 61 compared with last spring's head count of 60 and full-time-equivalent enrollment of 38.

The campus total includes 47 men and 31 women. Enrollment by classes is 45 freshmen, 21 sophomores, and 12 special students.

FIELD REPRESENTATIVE ADDED TO OBC STAFF

The Rev. Lynn Wood, moderator of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists, has been added to the staff of Oklahoma Bible College in the position of Field Representative. The Rev. Wood, who will fulfill this capacity on a part-time basis, will represent the College at both quarterly and associational meetings. He is also an authorized agent of the College for the sale of bonds in the current investment program.

The official approval of the Rev. Wood's appointment to this position was made by the College Board of Trustees in their January meeting. He will continue to serve as the minister of the Ada Free Will Baptist Church.
