This feast was to be a time of great joy in Israel as they gathered in the labor of the field (Exodus 23:16), the grain from the threshingfloor, the wine of the wine press (Deuteronomy 16:13), and the fruit of the earth (Leviticus 23:39). At this time of joy they dwelled in specially built booths or tabernacles to remind them of the fatherly care and protection of the Lordas He brought them from Egypt to the promised land. All the males of the people were expected to appear before the

HARVEST DAY DRIVE SEEKS TO UNDERWRITE CURRENT BUDGET

Employing the theme, 'Keep the LIGHT shining forth, "Oklahoma Bible College is again attempting to underwrite the yearly budget through the annual Harvest Day Drive. Sunday, October 20, has been designated as the 1968 Harvest Day in keeping with the tradition that the drive be climaxed on the Sunday prior to the opening of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.

OBC President Dr. J. D. O'Donnell, in a recent letter to over three hundred pastors urging their full support of this annual drive, noted that Harvest Day has been one of the keys to the basic support of the College. During the 1967 drive. \$4,222.34 was received for the underwriting of the budget. Many churches are realizing the need to contribute systematically to the financial success of the College and are including OBC in their regular

The final registration figures for the fall semester at Oklahoma Bible College show that the full-time enrollment increased seventy-six per cent over the previous fall semester. Registrar Eugene Workman stated that although

church budget. This action has been most gratifying to members of the OBC administration. However, the unifying effort of Harvest Day is expected to continue to play an important role in raising funds for the general budget.

According to Business Manager Dan Farmer, the current drive is an attempt to underwrite in cash gifts or pledges the \$138, 800, 00 budget approved by the State Association in their 1967 meeting. The Business Manager emphasized that without the assistance of the pastors in presenting the needs and the goals of OBC to their congregations, the people would not respond as readily. Pastors have been mailed posters for display in their churches. Gift and pledge envelopes also have been sent to the pastors for distribution to their people since members of the local congregations are not being sent individual Harvest Day letters this year. It is hoped that many will find the pledge envelopes a desirable way to give systematically to OBC for a period of one year.

Pastors or key personnel of the churches are asked to report the amount of their Harvest Day offering to the College booth at the state meeting when it convenes with the Southern Oaks Church in Oklahoma City October 22.

the actual head count of students enrolled now stands at eighty-six, only a seven per cent increase over last year's head count, the large increase in full-time students can be attributed to the fact that almost all of the students enrolled are carrying a full academic load. This is in keeping with the enrollment predictions of last summer; however, the number of part-time students was not as great as expected.
