
## Gift Bond Program Gives Double Benefit

It stands without apology for the old time gospel which views man as a sinner whose only hope is in the shed blood of Jesus Christ. It believes that the revelation of this salvation was given through the Old and New Testaments and that these are the inspired Word of God.

You as an individual need to determine your attitude toward these truths. Then you must decide your responsibility to your College which is set up to perpetuate these truths through the College age young people who will be our leaders tomorrow. After prayer I'm sure that God will impress you to support this cause.

#### LIBRARY RECEIVES MEMORIALS

Memorial gifts of books presented in memory of departed Christians are among the recent gifts to the Oklahoma Bible College Library.

The family of Mabel N. (Gitt) Altis presented the OBC Library with the 40 volume Yale University edition of the complete works of William Shakespeare as a memorial to this departed loved one. Librarian Eddie Altis, a grandson of the honoree, was pleased that this Missouri family chose this lasting, worthwhile memorial to honor a devoted Christian life. The addition of this set of books will be of considerable value to the library and the literature classes of the College.

The Reverend and Mrs. Eugene Workman presented Bruce Catton's three volume set of The Centennial History of Civil War in memory of Mrs. Workman's sister, Miss Juanita Hinton. Miss Hinton was a senior at Free Will Baptist Bible College, Nashville, Tennessee, at the time of her death December 5, 1968.

The Workmans also presented The Treasury of Religious Verse, compiled by Donald T. Kauffman, in memory of Mr. Workman's aunt, Mrs. Amber Perry, who worked faithfully in educating young people throughout Missouri, Kansas, and Colorado during her thirty-five years in the teaching profession.

Thinking others may wish to honor departed family or friends by dedicating a book to their memory, the Librarian suggests that money be sent to the OBC Business Office designated for that purpose. This procedure is suggested for two reasons. Unnecessary duplication of titles will be avoided. The size of our student body requires very little duplication, so two books of the same title on the shelf is a waste of one book. Also, the volume buying of the library makes it possible to buy \$7.50 worth of books for each \$5.00 donated or \$15.00 worth of books for a \$10.00 donation.

A memorial of this kind lives forever, because it influences all the students who attend the College. A book plate will be placed in each book donated.
