MISSION BOARD REPORT

In making this report to the 50th session of the State Association of Free Will Baptist when convened at Ada, the members of the Mission Board do so with gratitude and praise to the Lord and to the people who have helped in any way to advance the cause of Christ in the establishing of new churches for Free Will Baptists in Oklahoma and cooperated in any of the phases of the work of our Board.

We have set a goal of 20 new organizations, which is to be reached by the close of this Golden Anniversary year of 1958-59. We are asking God to give us the means and also the workers to reach this goal. Our motto that we have adopted for the drive is "A Free Will Baptist Church in every town."

The greatest deterrent to our efforts in the past has been a lack of adequate and satisfactory personnel to work in new fields. With so many of the churches that are already established having difficulties in obtaining satisfactory pastors, the Board has seen fit to move only as the Lord has led our ministers. In as far as we have felt it was possible for us to do so, we have placed workers in new fields and

Since our report last year six (6) new churches have been established. These include Enid, Northwest Oklahoma City, Arkoma, Asher, Straight Street Church of Norman and Midwest City.

The church at Enid was organized last year just before our last state convention on October 17 with 11 charter members under the leadership of Rev. Fred Kirby. Since that time the church has continued to progress and has purchased property for worship services. The church first met and organized in the home of Bro. Kirby. The group united with the Union Association.

The Northwest Oklahoma City Church was organized on February 2, 1958, by Rev. E. E. Morris. The group was organized with 24 charter members and has purchased property and built a building located in the extreme northwest part of Oklahoma City on NW 36th Street. The church, which united with the First Oklahoma Association, has continued to progress under the leadership of Bro. Morris.

The Arkoma Church was organized on March 18, 1958, with 8 charter members under the leadership of Rev. Raymond Qualls. Arkoma is located just inside the Oklahoma state line just out of Fort Smith, Arkansas. Bro. Qualls has reported regularly and the progress of the group has been very pleasing. The new group united with Eureka Association.

The Asher Church was organized on June 12, 1958, under the leadership of Rev. Ira Smithey, with 12 charter members. The church has since purchased a building located on Highway 18 in Asher and is holding regular services each week. The church united with

Center Association.

The Straight Street Church of Norman was organized on July 20, 1958, and called Rev. Orville Carpenter as pastor. The organization was a result of a joint effort made by Bro. Carpenter and Rev. Wade Jernigan. There were 16 charter members. The church has since purchased property located on the west edge of Norman and is continuing to grow. The group united with the First Oklahoma Association. The Board negotiated a loan with the church in the amount of \$5500.00 with which a new building has been erected.

The Midwest City Church was organized on August 1, 1958, under the leadership of Rev. J. R. Hall. There were 20 members in the first meeting, and since then the charter membership has grown to over 35. The group is worshipping at SE 15th and Midwest Blvd. in Midwest City. The church united with Dibble Association.

Two of these churches, Enid and Midwest City, have been granted assistance through the New Church Membership Clubs. At the present time we only have two complete clubs which are being assessed for new organizations. It was hoped that 3 clubs could be completed, but due to the dropping out of some members and some moving, the individuals recruited for the 3rd Club have been added to clubs number 1 and 2. We wish to express our appreciation to those who are interested in helping these new organizations and are continuing to support this "New Church Membership Club" plan.

The efforts of the Board in the past year have been made chiefly in the field of survey and the laying of groundwork for churches in the larger cities where there are no Free Will Baptist organizations. These places include Elk City, Wagoner, Ponca City, Blackwell, Chandler, Altus, and Edmond. Prospective families and individuals have been contacted, and satisfactory places to meet to worship have been sought and investigated. Also interested ministers who are prospective mission workers have been interviewed and acquainted with the prospective fields of labor. Although some of these efforts have not resulted as yet, in new organizations, we feel that our efforts have not been in vain. With the blessings of the Lord they will finally result in new organizations for Free Will Baptists of Oklahoma.

The current efforts of the Board are being centered in Stillwater where Rev. Homer Young is now employed as a Mission worker. Rev. Young moved to Stillwater the 1st of September and is now living at 524 W. 9th Street; he is holding worship services regularly in his home. Plans are to conduct an organizational revival and organize on October 3. We are very thankful for these developments in the work at Stillwater where a great amount of effort has been exerted to establish a Free Will Baptist Church.

The Board also participated in the past year in the arrangements of a very successful Foreign Mission itinerate held during the month of May. Sis. Laura Belle Barnard, returned missionary to India, and Rev. Bonito Rodriguez and Sis. Willey, both from Cuba, conducted services in a great number of our State churches. We are grateful to the churches who cooperated in any way to make this a successful itinerate.

We received, as was voted at the last convention, a very good amount of money from the proceeds of the sale of the Children's

Home. We hope to use this money that has been entrusted to our Board wisely and where it will do the greatest amount of good. Our plans are to use it to establish new churches in new fields, and also to help new organizations in their plans for growth.

We have had 12 meetings and travelled a total of 9688 miles in the past year. This includes travel to Board meetings, to organizational meetings, and trips to make survey work.

We are recommending a budget of \$3000.00 for the coming year. We also recommend that Rev. Harry Staires be re-elected to serve on the Board for another term.

STATE EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

The State Executive Board has met four times the past Association year.

1. The Board met at the State Minister's conference in Duncan, Oklahoma. At this meeting the board organized, Rev. E. S. Sunday was elected as chairman and Rev. Robert Duncan as clerk of the board.

2. The board transferred all money left in its treasurer from the sale of the Children's Home to a reserve fund for an educational program in the amount of \$9000.00 and the remainder of \$6,028.08 was transferred to the Home Mission Department, of the State Association.

3. The board met at the Checotah Free Will Baptist Church with the deacons of the Keefton Free Will Baptist church being the church affiliated with the Eureka Association. The board served in an advisory capacity and recommended to the church that they pursue means through the State Association to decide the ownership of the church property.

4. The board met at the Norman Free Will Baptist Church in Norman with the State Executive Sec. and the State Moderator. The board authorized the State Executive Sec. to recommend to the National Association that the services of any employee who are opposed to the National Program be terminated.

Resolutions

1. Be it resolved: that the State Executive Sec. buy 200 song books to be used in the State Association at Ada, then sold at said meeting if possible.

2. Be it resolved: That we the State Executive Board recommend that the State Association pay out of its General Fund, \$250.00 to the United Drys to help retire \$24,000.00 indebtedness incurred during the recent United Dry campaign.

Report of Auditing Committee (Executive Board Acting as Such)

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

We, the State Executive Board, do hereby declare the following books in order as far as we can determine: The Sunday School Board's Books, The Executive Secretary's Books, and the Home Mission Board's Books. After examining them we found them in order.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN:

We, the State Executive Board, do hereby authorize Rev. J. H. West to appoint seven delegates (from our denomination) to represent us in the annual Assembly of the United Drys of Oklahoma.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE SECRETARY

Year Ending Sept. 15, 1958

TO THE FIFTIETH ANNUAL SESSION OF THE OKLAHOMA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS, GREETINGS:

Another year has passed so swiftly. This year has brought many blessings, I don't have time or space to share all of them with you. I have been in seventeen revivals, institutes, and music schools. I have gone every weekend and filled in for some church most of them.

This has been an outstanding year in many ways, more cooperation than I have known in the past. Better revivals have been reported from the efforts. I traveled over the State with Sister Willey, Sister Barnard, and Bro. Rodriguez on a missionary tour, and found our people more concerned for missions than ever in the past. Many new facilities continue to be built throughout the State.

The Promoter subscriptions continue to climb, with more than 1600 now being sent out.

We failed to reach our goal of 2000 subscriptions by the Association, but many have done a great work in progressing our subscription list.

The office is becoming a greater problem each year, the work has increased and my time in the office has been less for this year.

I'm praying that the needed finance will continue to increase until I can spend at least one half of my time in the office.

All of our "Standing Boards" are to be commended on their fine accomplishments for the year, the Home Mission Board has done an excellent work, the Sunday School Board continues to help the Sunday cause in our State. Our Christian Education Board gave us a real treat at the "Retreat" in July.

Mrs. Kennedy has kept close to the office all the year, so that you might reach me anytime you need me. Mrs. Nadine Borden has helped in the typing. Were it not for each member of the State doing their part to help, the work would be an impossibility, but God has inspired you to help.

Our Golden Anniversary is here, the year ahead holds many possibilities; I would like for us to purpose to reach every city in our State with some program, this coming year.

I have traveled a total of 25,200 miles in behalf of the State work. Given much of my time to helping the smaller churches when ask to come with them. Many loans have been secured to help churches build. Pray that God will continue our efforts.

INSURANCE REPORT

I have had a total premium of \$10,451.54 for the year, with a total of \$2,207.06 returned premiums, giving a total of \$1,394.78 income from the sale of insurance. Of this amount I have turned into the office; \$853.30 leaving a difference of \$541.48. My accounts receivable: \$466.50, past due: \$545.99, lost from failure to pay: \$26.96, making a total of \$1,139.45 on the books. I have a total of \$597.97 of my own money invested in the insurance business, due to no allocation being set aside for the business.

BOOK SALES REPORT

Our invoice shows in stock at present (wholesale) \$598.56. Accounts receivable \$76.09. I have \$402.24 invested in this business. The same reason as for Insurance.

The following recommendations were passed on by the Coordinating Board:

1. I recommend a fund of \$1000.00 be set up to operate the insurance business.

2. I recommend that we set up a book sales, and that \$1000.00 be allocated for stock alone.

(If the cooperative plan money comes into the office as it should, this could soon be set up out of the profits, use being made of balance that is now in the office.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

PREAMBLE

The purpose of THE OKLAHOMA STATE CONVENTION OF THE MASTER'S MEN is to provide a means of Christian fellowship among the men of the churches of the districts in the State; to deepen the spiritual life of the men and to promote efficiently and effectively all of the practical projects as recommended and sponsored by the Oklahoma State Convention of The Master's Men and the denomination.

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of this organization shall be known as THE OKLAHOMA STATE CONVENTION OF THE MASTER'S MEN.

ARTICLE II

Membership

Section 1. The membership of this organization shall be composed of district conventions within the State; And all local chapters in Free Will Baptist Churches.

Section 2. Every male who is a member in good standing of an affiliated district convention or an affiliated local chapter is entitled to the full benefit of membership.

ARTICLE III

Officers

The officers of this organization shall consist of a president, vice-president and secretary-treasurer.

ARTICLE IV

Executive Committee

The executive committee shall consist of the elected officers of the organization, the Moderator and assistant Moderator of THE OKLAHOMA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS. The executive committee shall serve as the program committee for each annual convention.

ARTICLE V

Meetings

This organization shall meet annually on the Monday night before the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists convenes.

ARTICLE VI

Amendments

This constitution may be amended by a three-fourths vote of any regular meeting.

BY-LAWS

Section 1. Every member of each affiliated district convention and affiliated local chapter is eligible to vote on all questions and matters that might come before The Oklahoma State Convention of The Master's Men.

OFFICERS

Section 2. The officers of this organization shall be elected annually.

Section 3. No officer shall succeed himself directly, But he may become a candidate for another office.

COMMITTEES

Section 4. The president shall appoint all committees subject to the approval of the body.

Section 5. The executive committee shall transact all routine business and shall act for the organization in the interim between meetings.

Section 6. The executive committee shall meet at the call of the president.

FINANCE

Section 7. This organization shall be financed on the basis of offerings and these taken as the need arises.

QUORUM

Section 8. One-tenth of the members of this organization shall constitute a quorum at any regular meeting.

AMENDMENTS

Section 9. These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

ARTICLES OF FAITH

1. **THE BIBLE**—The Scriptures of the Old and New Testament were given by the inspiration of God, and are our infallible rule of faith and practice.

2. **GOD**—There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver and Righteous Governor of the Universe, and in the Scriptures as the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.

3. **CHRIST**—Christ is God manifest in the flesh: in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified. He is now risen and glorified and is our ever-present Saviour and Lord.

4. **THE HOLY SPIRIT**—The Scriptures assign to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of men.

5. **THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD**—God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of Grace, not otherwise provided for as highest welfare of man requires.

6. **THE SINFULNESS OF MAN**—Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore, inherited a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before

God.

7. **THE WORK OF CHRIST**—The Son of God, by His incarnation, life, sufferings, death and resurrection affected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.

8. **THE TERMS OF SALVATION**—The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and the hearty renunciation of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviours and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit, freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

9. **ELECTION**—God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ, men become His elect.

10. **FREEDOM OF WILL**—The Human will is free and self controlled, having power to yield the influence of the truth and the Spirit and live, or to resist them and perish.

11. **SALVATION FREE**—God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of Life freely.

12. **PERSEVERANCE**—All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.

13. **GOSPEL ORDINANCES**—Baptist, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel; Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be administered to all true believers.

14. **TITHING**—God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament: Jesus Christ endorsed it in the Gospel (Matt. 23:33) and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." I Cor. 16:2.

15. **THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH**—The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from secular employment and amusements for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God.

16. **RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT AND FINAL RETRIBUTION**—The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation; then the wicked shall "go-away into eternal punishment, but the righteous into eternal life."

RULES OF ORDER

1. At every sitting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded by prayer by the Moderator or whomsoever he may request.

2. Ministers and deacons present are invited to seats, allowed to take part in debates on all subjects, and to vote.

3. Those who speak shall arise and address the Moderator. Personal

reflections shall be avoided in all debates.

4. No motion shall be discussed without a second.

5. When a motion has been made and seconded, and a member opposes its discussion, the Moderator shall put the question, "Shall it be discussed?" If negative, the question shall not be discussed.

6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member, and the vote taken separately.

7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.

8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.

9. All questions shall be decided by a majority vote of all members present.

BY-LAWS

1. The clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence, the senior ministers in years shall call the Association into conference, and if a quorum is present the moderator, or in his absence, the assistant moderator shall take charge; and if neither of them is present the senior minister in years shall act as Moderator.

2. It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the delegates to the Association, who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the Association.

3. It shall be the duty of everybody belonging to this Association to send a letter to every annual session of this Association, reporting in the same its spiritual condition, benevolent work, and its statistics. Anybody belonging to this Association, which shall fail to report itself for two successive sessions, may be dismissed from the Association by a two-thirds vote of all members present.

4. Each meeting shall be opened by reading a portion of the Bible and with prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.

5. By a two-thirds vote of all members present, a ruling of the moderator can be overruled.

6. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.

7. This Association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.

8. Any person not a member of this Association may be allowed to take part in its discussions by obtaining permission from the moderator.

9. It shall be the duty of all the Association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting, and anyone wishing to retire shall first obtain leave of the moderator.

10. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee, provided the person nominated be elected.

11. The moderator shall not allow discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.

12. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise to his feet and address the

moderator by the appellation, "Brother Moderator," but shall not speak further until recognized by the moderator.

13. No member of this association shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes nor twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator.

14. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

CONSTITUTION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we, the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, being regularly baptised upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a church: and to preserve and maintain correspondence and co-ordination with us, do therefore ordain this Constitution for our better denominational government.

Article I

Name: This organization shall be known as the OKLAHOMA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS.

Article II

PURPOSE: the object and purpose of this organization shall be to unify the work of the various bodies composing this State Association, and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in connection with the various bodies in the Association, or that may hereafter be represented therein.

Article III

REPRESENTATION: Section 1: This Association shall be composed of all ordained ministers and deacons with membership in some local church which is a member of a district association with membership in the State Association.

Section 2: Each District Association shall be entitled to a number of elected delegates equal with the number of churches composing said association. These delegates may be recommended by the local churches and shall be endorsed by their district association.

Article IV

FINANCE: Each association shall send Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each elected delegate.

Article V

DISCIPLINE: This State Association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine or practices that may properly come before it from any of the bodies composing said organization, furthermore if there be any question of discipline, doctrine or practices on the part of a subordinate association, delegates of that association

shall not be seated until these questions have been settled to the satisfaction of the Credential Committee.

Section 2: Decisions of the Credential Committee may be appealed. All Appeals coming before the State Association when sitting in a Committee as a whole. (2) By a special committee whose report shall be voted on without discussion.

Article VI

OFFICERS: The officers of the state association shall consist of a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk, Parliamentarian, and an Executive Secretary, each of whom shall be elected at the close of each regular session, except the Executive Secretary, who shall be elected every two years.

Section 2: Committees, as necessary, shall be appointed by the moderator, unless otherwise provided for, and shall hold office until their work is completed, or until their successors are elected.

Article VII

BOARDS: All standing boards shall be composed of Five (5) members who shall serve terms of 5, 3, 3, 2, 1 year, exclusive of the General Board which shall be composed of one member from each subordinate association and the chairman of each standing board. The standing board shall include the Executive Board, Mission board, Sunday School Board, and the League Board. The Co-ordinating Board which shall be composed of the Executive Secretary and the Chairman from each standing board.

Article VIII

DUTIES AND RULES OF STANDING BOARDS: 1. Executive Board. To this board is delegated the power to act in behalf of and for the State Association from one meeting to another for said Association, and shall have power and authority to select such officers as might be deemed best for its own government and to carry out the plans and undertakings of the State Association. The board shall have power to fill vacancies that may occur in its own body. To this Executive Board is further designated power to collect funds and employ and superintend such work for the field as may seem best, and the means on hand may warrant. They shall deliver Oil and Gas leases upon any real property owned by the association, for such bonuses and rentals as in the discretion of the said board.

This Executive Board shall keep a record of all work done, money raised, meetings held, and make a full and complete report to the regular meeting of the association and shall further receive, hold, manage, use, control, and convey any property entrusted to said State Association.

The chairman and secretary of said Executive Board shall sign all deeds and bonds, notes, etc., and any other papers by which the state association is to become legally held.

The board shall have the power to call the association in conference by notifying each subordinate association at least ten (10) days prior

to conference.

2. General Board: It shall be the duty of this board to meet with the executive board one day preceeding the State Association to hear the reports of the standing boards and to make recommendations to the state associations. They shall also serve as credential committee.

3. Mission Board: It shall be the duty of this board to work in connection with the national foreign and home mission boards, and to promote an active missionary program in and for the state of Oklahoma. They shall elect a treasurer who shall handle all mission money.

It will also be their responsibility to investigate and assist, if necessary any new church. This board should thoroughly investigate the ability of a church to support an organization before assistance is pledged.

4. Christian Education Board: It shall be the duty of this Board to promote and encourage and plan Workers' Institutes. They shall be charged with the responsibility of raising funds to promote Christian Education.

5. League Board: It shall be the duty of the state league board to plan and assist in every way possible the League work throughout the state. It will also be their responsibility to promote an active league work in each subordinate association and to encourage League Rallies.

6. Sunday School Board: Their duties shall include the planning and operation of the State Sunday School Conventions, and the encouragement of the organization of district conventions. They may carry through any plans they think wise to actively promote Sunday school work in the State.

7. Superannuation Board: This board, working in cooperation with the National superannuation board and district boards, shall provide a definite program of support for retired ministers.

8. Publication Board: This board shall have under their direction the printing of tracts, papers, books, pamphlets, etc., and shall encourage proper advertising in the local church.

9. Co-ordinating Board: This board shall be charged with the responsibility of co-ordinating and promoting the work of the other standing boards. The Executive Secretary shall serve as chairman and the board shall meet at his discretion.

10. Working agreement between the state association and the Executive Secretary of the State association: That the Executive Secretary be paid a set salary and mileage and a two week paid vacation and all money received by him for speaking engagements, revivals and etc., shall be turned in by him to the Executive Office for the support of this office.

Article IX

This constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session of the State Association by a two-thirds vote of members present, provided proposed amendment or alteration be present in writing to the body one day in advance.
