PROCEEDINGS OF THE STATE ASSOCIATION

The 60th Annual Session of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists met October 22-24, 1968, in Oklahoma City. The introductory service was held at the Southwest Free Will Baptist Church. The Convention Theme was, "Now is the Time," taken from II Cor. 6:2. Rev. Delbert Akin was music Director for the Convention.

The meeting opened with singing, "Jesus Saves," and Prayer led by Rev. Willard Day. Rev. Jack Richey was in charge of the service. "Tis so Sweet to Trust in Jesus," and "I Love to Tell the Story," were the next songs. The Clerk, Rev. Waldo Young, called the Association into official session and introduced the officers.

The Moderator, Rev. Lynn Wood, gave the Moderator's message and

introduced visiting brethren from other states.

Rev. Jerry Dudley, host pastor, was introduced.

Rev. Jerry Dudley, host pastor, was introduced and gave the welcome address. The evening offering was received before which Rev. Don Payne led in prayer.

A couple from the Pauls Valley church sang, "It's In Your Hands," The Men's Quartet from OBC sang two numbers, "Since I Have Been Redeemed," and "More Love To Thee."

The introductory message was delivered by Rev. O. T. Dixon, pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church, Norman. The text was Job 16:15-22, and the subject was "Now Is The Time to Reach Forward."

The closing prayer was led by Rev. Wayne Bookout.

The Wednesday morning session opened with congregational singing, "The Light of the World is Jesus," and "Heavenly Sunlight." The Moderator introduced Rev. Joe Braddy who brought the morning devotion from Psalm 91, and led in prayer. The Moderator's admonition was given.

A partial report of the General Board was read by the clerk. After corrections and additions in the list of delegates, a motion carried to accept the report and seat the delegates.

Guests were introduced by the Moderator. Motion carried to adopt

the program leaving the time flexible.

The Moderator appointed the following committees:

Resolution; James Murray, J. B. Chism, J. C. Morgan, Lonnie DaVoult, and Eugene Hawkins: Obituary Committee; Albert Collier, Ronnie Liles, J. D. Stepp, J. R. Hall, and E. E. Morris: Temperance Committee; Bill Ketchum, Wayne Bookout, Connie Cariker, James Cearley, and Louis Maxwell: Placement Committee; Ray Gwartney, Bob Ketchum, Clarence Shepherd, Doyle Cox, and Joe Grizzle.

The host pastor, Rev. Jerry Dudley again came and gave a welcome to the convention from Southern Oaks Church.

The report of the General Board was read by the clerk. Motion carried to accept the report.

Rev. Francis Boyles spoke, representing the Executive Church Bonds from Nashville, Tennessee.

The Sunday School Board report was given by Rev. Willard Day. Motion carried to accept the report.

Rev. James Murray gave the report of the Church Extension and Mission Board. Motion carried to adopt the report. The Wednesday morning business session was closed with prayer

led by Rev. H. E. Staires.

The worship service was opened with the congregation singing, "Higher Ground." Rev. James Cearley who was presiding, called on Rev. J. B. Fletcher to lead in prayer. The congregation then sang, "How Great Thou Art."

Special music was provided by the State Ministers Quartet. Rev. Ernest Harrison was introduced as the speaker. He read Psalm 119:42, and brought the message on the subject, "Now is the Time to Reach Down into the Word."

The morning service was dismissed in prayer by Rev. Berton Perry. "I Will Sing the Wondrous Story," was the opening hymn of the Wednesday afternoon session. Rev. Gene Hester was introduced to bring the devotional thoughts. He read Psalm 95:1-7.

Rev. Henry Van Kluyve gave a report from the National Foreign

Missions Department.

Rev. H. D. Harrison gave a report from the National Sunday School Department.

Rev. Bob Shockey gave a report from the National Home Missions and Church Extension Department.

Rev. Paul Ketteman gave a report from the Free Will Baptist Bible College, Nashville, Tennessee.

The report of the State Executive Board was given by Rev. Clarence Shepherd. Motion carried to adopt the report with the recommendations.

Rev. N. R. Smith gave the report of the State Executive Secretary and the Oklahoma Free Will Baptist Book Store. Motion carried to adopt the report and give Brother Smith a rising vote of thanks for his services.

The following resolution was given from the floor. Whereas the Superannuation Board was voted inactive during the 1967 session and its denominational function has ceased, we do hereby recommend that said board be permanently abolished and Article VII of the Constitution be amended by deleting the words, "Superannuation Board," and Article VII, Paragraph 7, be deleted from the Constitution.

Motion made and seconded to accept the resolution. Motion carried to table the resolution until tomorrow.

The clerk read a letter from the Texas State Association and a letter from the West Fork Association of Texas. Motion made to acknowledge the letters and explain that the request cannot be granted since the items concerned are now in the hands of the National Association.

The Wednesday afternoon session was dismissed in prayer by Rev. Allen Moore.

The Wednesday evening service was opened with singing. Rev. Berton Perry, presiding officer, called on Rev. Albert Collier to lead in prayer.

The special music included songs by the Southern Oaks Choir, Solo by Mr. Don Clark, and music by the State Ministers Quartet.

Rev. Eddie Payne, Missionary to Africa, was introduced to bring the evening message. He read John 4:35, and brought the message on, "Now is the Time to Reach Out into the Field." An offering for missions was received following the message. The service was dismissed with prayer by Rev. Jack Richey. The Thursday morning session opened with singing, Rev. Curtis Butler brought the devotion from Psalm 121. Rev. Don Payne led in prayer.

Rev. Jerry Dudley gave the report of the Church Training Service Board. Motion carried to adopt the report.

Mr. Sam Johnson gave a report from the National C. T. S. department.

Rev. Jerry Rhoades gave the report of the Oklahoma Bible College of Trustees. He also read the doctrinal statement which was from the Trustees to the General Board. Motion carried that the report be adopted and the doctrinal statement be included in the report as printed in the minutes.

The congregation sang, "My Jesus I Love Thee." After announcements were made the congregation was dismissed for a brief recess.

Rev. Eugene Hawkins presided at the Thursday morning Worship service. Following congregational singing, Rev. J. C. Morgan led in prayer. Special music included a solo by Mrs. Fern Ray, and a song by the State Ministers Quartet.

Rev. Roma Stewart brought the morning message, using Esther 4:1-3 for the text. His subject was, "Now is the Time to Reach Up in Prayer." The moderator closed the worship service by leading in prayer.

Rev. Delbert Akin again led the congregation in singing to open the Thursday afternoon session. Rev. J. B. Chism brought the devotion using Psalm 147:1-6, for his thoughts. Rev. Murl Wilson from New Mexico was permitted to speak to the congregation. He gave a report of the work there and requested some Oklahoma Brethren to come to help organize the New Mexico State Association December 2.

Rev. N. R. Smith gave the report of the Coordinating Board. Motion carried to adopt the report with its recommendations.

A motion carried to take from the table the item pertaining to abolishing the Superannuation Board. Motion carried to accept the motion.

The election of Board members was held. Rev. Lonnie DaVoult was elected as the 7 year man to the Executive Board. Rev. Ed Cook was elected as the 7 year man to the C. T. S. Board. Rev. Homer Young was elected to the Mission Board for 7 years. Rev. Eugene Hawkins was elected as the 4 year man on the Mission Board.

Mr. Charles Hinesley was elected as the 7 year man on the College Board of Trustees. Rev. James Murray was elected as the 2 year man on the College Board of Trustees. Mr. Ed Warner was elected as 7 year man on the Sunday School Board. Rev. J. B. Chism was elected as the 3 year man on the Missions Board.

Each District Association sent a nomination from their district to serve on the General Board for 1969. Motion carried to elect these men as recommended by the District Association. (See General Board on page 2.)

Mrs. Marguerite Hinesley gave the report of the State Woman's Auxiliary. Motion carried to receive the report.

The report of the Master's Men was given by Mr. Wyman Straughan. Motion carried to receive this report.

The report of the Obituary Committee was read by the clerk. The report was accepted and the congregation stood for prayer.

The Temperance Committee report was read by the clerk. Motion carried to accept the report.

The report of the Placement Committee was given. The report was adopted recommending that the 1970 session be held in Muskogee.

The report of the Resolution Committee was given. Resolution #1 carried. Resolution #2, was postponed until after the committee called for in #1 has reported. Resolution #3 carried.

Motion carried that the study commission called for in resolution #1 be five members. Motion carried that the five men receiving the most votes be elected to this committee. Those elected were Jerry Dudley, J. D. O'Donnell, Don Payne, Lonnie DaVoult, and the Moderator who will serve as Chairman.

Motion carried that the expense of this committee be shared by each of the standing boards.

Rev. Lonnie DaVoult and Rev. E. E. Morris were elected to represent Oklahoma on the committee meeting in Nashville, Tennessee December 2, on the Treatise Revision question. Motion carried that the expense of these two men be paid from the Executive Department.

Motion carried that the third highest in votes be the alternate. Rev. Don Payne is this person.

Motion carried that the Executive Secretary also attend the above mentioned meeting with his expenses paid.

Motion carried that Sunday December 1, be a day of special prayer for this Committee meeting in Nashville, and that we pray for peace and unity in our denomination.

Motion carried that the Executive Board be authorized to employ the man who will serve as State Executive Secretary for two years.

Officers were elected as follows; Parliamentarian, Rev. Clarence Herron; Assistant Clerk, Rev. Odie Nunley; Clerk, Rev. Waldo Young; Assistant Moderator, Rev. Homer Young; and Moderator, Rev. Bailey Thompson.

Motion carried to give the outgoing Moderator a standing vote of thanks.

Motion carried that the Moderator and the Chairman of the Executive Board attend the organizational meeting of the New Mexico State Association. Motion carried to pay their expenses.

The clerk gave a statistical report.

Motion carried to adjourn. Rev. Bailey Thompson closed the meeting with prayer.

GENERAL BOARD REPORT

The General Board of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists met Monday, October 21, 1968, at the Southern Oaks Free Will Baptist Church, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma.

Rev. Clarence Shepherd, chairman, called the meeting to order. Rev. Bob Duncan led the group in prayer.

Motion carried to receive all Association letters and seat the delegates, except the Arkansas River Valley, whose delegate fee has not been received.

Motion carried to seat Arkansas River Valley upon the receipt of their delegate fee.

The Sunday School Board report was read by the clerk. Motion carried to receive the report and adopt the budget.

The Mission Board report was read by Rev. James Murray, Chair-

man. Motion carried to receive the report and adopt the budget.

It was brought to the attention of the General Board that Missionary Tom Willey Sr. has passed away. The board was led in prayer by James Murray as it paused in memory of "Pop" Willey.

The report of the Executive Board was read by the chairman, Rev. Clarence Shepherd. One recommendation was added to the report printed in the digest.

Motion made that the Executive Board pay the 1968 Social Security on the Book Store Manager.

Motion made and seconded to receive the Executive Board report and adopt the recommendation and the budget.

Motion carried to adjourn for lunch.

The afternoon session opened with prayer by Rev. Lynn Wood. The motion carried to receive the report of the Executive Board and adopt the recommendation and budget.

The report of the Executive Secretary and the Book Store was given

by Rev. N. R. Smith. Motion carried to accept the report.

The report of the C. T. S. Board was given by Rev. Jerry Dudley Motion carried to receive the report and adopt the budget.

The report of the Oklahoma Bible College Board of Trustees was given by Rev. Jerry Rhoades. Motion carried to accept the report, adopt the budget, and accept the doctrinal statement from the Board of Trustees to the General Board.

The report of the Coordinating Board was read by the clerk. Motion carried to adopt the report with its recommendations.

Letters were read from the Texas State Association and from the West Fork Association of Texas. Motion carried that we acknowledge these letters.

Motion carried to adjourn.

STATE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD REPORT

The State Sunday School Board met seven times during the past year. The needs of the Sunday Schools of the State of Oklahoma rests heavily upon the heart of each board member. We are endeavoring by God's help to find the most effective means of meeting these needs.

This Board has conducted four Sunday School Institutes, assisted in two study courses and sponsored an area-wide Sunday School Leadership Conference during the past year. STATE MISSION BOARD REPORT

The State Mission Board meets each month on the 2nd Tuesday of the month and at such other times as is necessary to take care of business. The Board has met at least once a month in the past year. The Board has continued to support the Southeast Church in Tulsa the past year in cooperation with the First Mission Association. A new building has been constructed on the property. New people have been added to the congregation. Rev. Jerry Rhoades now serves the church as pastor. We believe this area offers a good opportunity for Free Will Baptists.

The Altus Church was closed last year after the remaining members moved away, and the Board assumed the financial obligations of the group and obtained control of the property. The building was rented in January of 1968 to an Assembly of God group which has met in the building since that time. At the present time negotiations are in progress to sell the building and property to the group.

The Yukon Mission which was a joint effort with the First Oklahoma Association was organized on November 12, 1967 with 28 charter members. Property has been purchased in a very good location in the western edge of Yukon near I-40. Our Board gave \$1,500.00 from the New Church Club to help on the purchase of this property. Rev. Clarence Bruce continues to serve the church as pastor.

The Board has given assistance to a new mission work at Skiatook, near Tulsa, through the Northeast Association. A meeting was held at Northside Church in Tulsa with the prospective members and the mission worker, Rev. Jim Haas. A check for \$500.00 was sent to the Northeast Association for this Skiatook work. The group is presently meeting in a building which was erected on property purchased by the Association. The property is located in a very good area just west of the town.

The Board met with Rev. Louis Wickham, a representative of the Plasa Towers Free Will Baptist Church in Moore and discussed a request by this church for the Board to assume the liabilities and assets of the church which has disbanded. The arrangements are in process to transfer the title of the property to the Board. A note of \$7,500.00 (payments are \$97.56 per month) has also been assumed by the Board. The property consists of 2 acres of choice land and a building.

A missionary conference with the Locust Grove Free Will Baptist Church is scheduled for December of this year. The invitation to participate in the conference is greatly appreciated and other churches in the State are encouraged to plan such programs in the future using this Board.

The Board investigated the possibilities of a new work in Vinita, Oklahoma but it seemed inadvisable to begin a mission there at the present time. An ad in the local newspaper brought no response and other interest is not sufficient to start a program.

A new plan has been adopted to secure funds for the New Church Club. Instead of sending letters to individual members a notice will be placed in the PROMOTER seeking funds from any interested individuals. Those who wish to help should send the annual \$10.00 pledge to: OKLAHOMA STATE MISSION BOARD, 4801 South Walker, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma 73109. Money sent in 1968 will go for the Yukon Church. A check for \$1,500.00 was advanced the Yukon Church from funds already in the New Church Club treasury. Any amount received above this advance will be given to the Yukon group.

State Missions month is set for December. December 15, has been designated as State Missions Sunday. Every church is encouraged to receive an offering for State Missions on that Sunday or some other in December. All money received will go to help organize new churches in Oklahoma.

Giving to missions has continued to increase the past year, however gifts for National Home Missions have declined in the period. The following chart shows mission receipts recorded by the Boards from Oklahoma for the years shown;

EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

The Oklahoma State Executive Board held four meetings in this past year and are grateful to God for a good year in His service. We do regret the resignation of Rev. N. R. Smith our Executive Secretary, August 29, 1968 to become Director of Literature of our National work in Nashville, Tennessee. We would like to take this opportunity to commend him for a job well done in the six years of his services in this position. Through his efforts we feel that the work of Free Will Baptists, has been extended throughout the state of Oklahoma, our National work as well as our Missionaries on the field. He has promoted the Cooperative plan of support as well as the Designated giving to the different departments.

We pray that God shall continue to bless him and his good family as they continue to give themselves into the work of the Lord and our denomination of Free Will Baptists.

The Free Will Baptist Book Store at 4801 S. Walker, Oklahoma City has been expanded as the Executive Board was directed by this body one year ago. We were able through the Capitol Hill State Bank of Oklahoma City to increase our loan from \$16,124.62 to \$33,000.00 on a fifteen year basis at 7% interest. Our payment is \$296.62 per month. The total cost of expanding the Book Store and parking lot was \$18,003.72.

Although we went through a period of construction our Book Store reached another goal for gross sales of \$45,509.26. We commend our Bookstore manager for this.

We do urge all other boards as our Executive Secretary is an ex-officio member of all boards to notify him of all board meetings. We also urge you to call upon him for any promotional activities. We of the Executive Board are interested in the total program of Oklahoma Free Will Baptists.

We adopted a budget of \$65,000.00 for the Book Store for the year of July 1, 1969—June 30, 1970.

We also adopted a budget of \$17,760.00 for the Executive Office for the same year. These we recommend to you.

Clarence Shepherd, Chairman James Cearley, Clerk We recommend that the 1968-1969 budget of the Free Will Baptist Book Store, page 14 of the 1967 minutes, be changed as follows; Under equipment purchases, the figure be changed from \$2,000.00 to \$1,435.00. Also the addition of two items; Hospitalization Insurance \$340.00, and Social Security \$225.00.

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY

We are thankful again this year that our giving through the State Office set a new record this year with \$140,235.48 given to the World Wide cause of Christ. \$133,594.49 was given in the previous year. Cooperative giving set a new record this year with \$43,211.20 compared with \$39,151.47 the previous year. This is a \$4,059.73 increase in Cooperative giving and sets a new record. Designated giving for this year was \$97,024.28 compared with \$94,443.02 for the previous year.

We were able to get our Ministers Hospitalization program going with Hartford Insurance Company. We have 27 who are participating in the program. May I urge every church to pay your pastor's hospitalization so that it might help him qualify for this program.

Every church should contact the Executive Secretary and have him in your church as soon as possible. I am asking every pastor and church to help the new Executive Secretary in promoting the World Wide cause of Christ. May we see our work continue to grow.

REPORT OF OKLAHOMA BIBLE COLLEGE TRUSTEE BOARD

The Trustee Board of OBC has met 8 times this year. At the close of the State Association in October, 1967, we met and organized with the following officers and members: Chairman, Rev. Jerry Rhoades; Vice Chairman, Howard Gwartney; Secretary, Charles Hinesley; and Members; Rev. Ernest Harrison, Rev. J. B. Fletcher, Rev. Paul Inbody, and Mr. Bill Barber.

At this meeting the Building and grounds committee were empowered to proceed with the bond program and the hiring of architects.

November 27, 1967, a bond program of \$300,000.00 was voted to finance phase A of the building program and Executive Church Bonds of Nashville, Tenn. was employed to issue the bonds and guide us in this program.

December 29, 1967, structural design of Boys' rooms was approved and architects were authorized to proceed with construction drawings.

January 12, 1968, Approval of following prices per semester; Tuition, \$115.00; Room, \$100.00; Board, \$200.00 for full time students. Part time students, \$10.00 per semester hour.

March 19, 1968, Bids were opened and since the low bid was over the budget, the plans were turned to architects to cut the cost.

April 11, 1968, Douglas Construction Company was awarded contract for building of Boys' Dorm at a cost of \$214,289.00

August 16, 1968, Employed Rev. Lynn Wood as full time Director of Promotion.

September 3, 1968, Employed Rev. Teddy Wilbanks as music instructor on part time basis.

TO: GENERAL BOARD, OKLAHOMA STATE ASSOCIATION FROM: BOARD OF TRUSTEES, OKLAHOMA BIBLE COLLEGE

Whereas much discussion has been generated on the backslider question as a result of the statement adopted by the Oklahoma State Association in session last year, and

Whereas many have had questions regarding the position of the officials of the Oklahoma Bible College which is supported by the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Therefore, the Board of Trustees of the Oklahoma Bible College has felt it necessary to inquire of the officials of the College their stand on the definition of the backslider as passed by the State Association.

We would like to report the following to this General Board:

- that the administration of Oklahoma Bible College is made up of dedicated Free Will Baptists who are in full agreement with the traditional doctrines of Free Will Baptists as stated in the Treatise of the faith and practices of Free Will Baptists and its articles of faith as subscribed to by the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.
- 2. that they, the administrative officers of Oklahoma Bible College, accept in its intent and purpose the statement on the backslider as adopted by the Oklahoma State Association and they not only agree to teach but do believe:
 - a. that no man who "is living in unconfessed, unforgiven sin (and who) is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God" has any promise of eternal life in the Scriptures.
 - b. that a backslider in the condition described in the statement "must repent and be restored to the right relationship with God or be eternally lost."
 - c. that any person dying in rebellion to the principles of the kingdom of God with unconfessed, unforgiven sins in his life will be forever lost.
 - d. that Free Will Baptists should take a strong stand against any teachings which would tolerate sin or any moral laxness in believers' lives.

The Board of Trustees has found no reason to further question the doctrines of these men and do hereby give them our full endorsement.

OKLAHOMA BIBLE COLLEGE, INC. BY-LAWS

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Board of Trustees of Oklahoma Bible College shall be composed of nine members, as provided in the charter of the College;

ARTICLE A—OFFICERS: The officers of the board of Trustees shall be a Chairman, an Assistant Chairman, and a Secretary, each of whom shall be elected by the Board for a term of one year. They shall continue in office until their successors have been chosen:

Item 1—CHAIRMAN: The chairman of the Board of Trustees or his assistant shall preside at all meetings of the Board. He shall be an exofficio member of the Executive Committee.

Item 2—SECRETARY: The Secretary shall record and preserve minutes of all meetings and acts of the Board of Trustees and countersign all deeds, conveyances, and other papers authorized by the Board. He shall have authority to call special meetings of the Trustees of the College upon the written request of two-thirds of the members of the Board; he shall mail notice of said meeting to the trustees ten (10) days in advance.

Item 3—EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE: The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, the Vice-Chairman of the Board, the Secretary of the Board. The Executive Committee shall have authority to consider and act upon all questions affecting the Bible College which may be brought before it between the stated meetings of the Board, or whenever it is deemed impractical to convene the entire Board, or a quorum of the Board fails to attend a called or regular meeting. It shall transact such business as may be committed to it by the Board and Shall

act for the College on such matters as it may submit to it. The Committee shall meet at the call of the Chairman or the President of the College.

ARTICLE B—MEETINGS: The Board of Trustees shall meet each year at a time and place agreed upon by the Board. It shall, also, hold special meetings whenever called in accordance with the By-Laws of the Board. Such special meetings may be called by either the chairman of the Board, or the President of the College.

ARTICLE C—QUORUM: A majority of the members or the Board of Trustees of Oklahoma Bible College in attendance at any called or regular meeting, written notice of which has been mailed by the Secretary to each trustee, shall constitute a quorum. No proxy votes shall be permitted. No ex-officio member shall be entitled to vote at meetings of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE D—ELECTIONS: In all elections held by the Board of Trustees each member present except ex-officio members shall be entitled to one vote, and the result shall be determined by a majority of the votes cast. Due notice of any election must be personal notice to the members or a day on the minutes of the Board not less than one week preceding the election.

SECTION II. OFFICERS OF THE BIBLE COLLEGE

The officers of Oklahoma Bible College shall be a President, Vice-President, Dean, and a Business Manager, each of whom shall be elected by the Board of Trustees to hold office for two years exclusive of the President whose term of office shall be indefinite. It is provided, however, that retirement of any one of the officers herein named may occur at any time upon the resignation of the officer or the request of the Board. In either case, notice shall be given six weeks before the date of the proposed retirement unless otherwise agreed upon by the concerned parties.

ITEM ONE—PRESIDENT: The President shall be executive officer of the Board of Trustees and shall have general control of the College including its officers, teachers, sudents, and business. He shall render to the Board complete annual reports and to its chairman, Executive Committee or other committees such information as may be deemed essential to a thorough knowledge of the operation of the College and its promotion. He shall be a member of the Board of Trustees ex-officio and the Executive Committee ex-officio and shall have the rights and privileges of a member of the Board except voting. The President shall execute all documents, instruments, and conveyances on behalf of the College. Duties of the president and working relationship shall be further detailed in a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

ITEM TWO—VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice-President shall perform all the duties of the President in the absence of the latter.

ITEM THREE—DEAN: The Academic Dean of the Bible College shall, under the President, fix the hours of recitation, govern, control, and regulate the conduct of the students, have general oversight of curriculum, student's records, and such other internal details and administrative duties as may be delegated to him by the President of the College.

ITEM FOUR—BUSINESS MANAGER: The Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of all accounts of the College and shall receive and expend as directed by the Board of Trustees and President, all money for the expenses of the institution. He shall make an annual report to the Board and furnish the Executive Committee with such information pertaining to his office as may be requested. He shall provide bond in whatever amount the Board may require. Until such times as the Board of Trustees may deem different the Treasurer's office shall be contained within the Business Manager's Office. The Business Manager may at the direction of the administration designate this duty to a subordinate officer. The Business Manager shall have general supervision of the financial business of the College, and shall, at the direction of the President, be responsible for the upkeep of all the physical facilities and premises of the College. His detailed duties are directed in a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

SECTION III FACULTY

The faculty shall consist of the President, the Dean, and all teachers of Oklahoma Bible College. Instructors and assistant teachers shall have the privilege of sitting with the faculty in stated meetings but shall not have the right of voting.

It shall be the policy of the Oklahoma Bible College to employ on its faculty those who are members of Free Will Baptist churches that are affiliated with the National Association. Emergencies, however arising from the resignation, illness, death, or approved leaves of absence of faculty members may be relieved by the temporary employment of instructors who are affiliated with any evangelical denomination. Part-time or short-term instructors, deemed essential to the successful prosecution of a consistent education program, may be employed at the discretion of the President without respect of denominational affiliation.

The faculty, under the authority and jurisdiction of the President, shall have general charge of instruction, attendance of students, examinations, administration of curriculum, discipline, and all matters involving the spiritual, physical, and social welfare of the Bible College. The faculty shall be hired upon recommendation of the President.

In the selection of the faculty qualitative factors shall be kept in mind. All faculty members shall be urged to pursue graduate programs in their respective fields. Except in special cases no faculty member will be required to teach courses outside of his field.

SECTION IV ACADEMIC COUNCIL

The Academic Council shall consist of the President, the Dean and the heads of the departments of Oklahoma Bible College: It shall determine the curriculum and academic policy of the College, prescribe requirements for admission, certificates, diplomas, and degrees, and supervise the courses of instruction offered by the various departments of the College.

SECTION V CONTRACTS

The Board of Trustees shall establish the College policy involving the execution of contracts, deeds of conveyance, the determination of salaries,

and employment of all officers, representatives, faculty members and essential domestic and maintenance employees. The President of the College shall negotiate agreements, executive contracts, employ representatives, and supply vacancies incurred by the termination of contracts, resignations, or death of any essential employees. All contracts for building construction shall be let only to persons or corporations posting a valid performance bond and recording the same in the Office of the County Clerk of Cleveland County, Oklahoma.

SECTION VI ADVISORY COUNCIL

An advisory council shall be formed which is to be composed of interested, qualified persons in the various fields which will be of value in building and maintaining a strong academic program to carry out the educational program stated in the charter.

SECTION VII AMENDMENT

These By-Laws may be amended by a favorable vote of two-thirds of the qualified members of the Board of Trustees of Oklahoma Bible College at any meeting of the Board, provided that the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing to each Trustee one month in advance. This change to be subject to the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.

SECTION VIII ADMINISTRATIVE FUNCTIONS

The President of the Oklahoma Bible College shall be elected by the Board of Trustees, and he shall act for and on behalf of the Board in the Conduct and management of the institution. He shall also be a member of the Board of Trustees ex-officio and of the Executive committee ex-officio, and his duties, powers and term of office shall be prescribed in the by-laws of the College and a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE OKLAHOMA BIBLE COLLEGE INC.

Know all men by these presents, that, we whose names are hereunto subscribed, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the provisions of the corporation laws of the State of Oklahoma, and for that purpose state:

ARTICLE ONE

The name of this corporation shall be OKLAHOMA BIBLE COLLEGE, INC.

ARTICLE TWO

The purpose of this corporation shall be the creation, establishment and maintenance of a college and institution of higher learning devoted to the promotion and impartation of higher learning, Christian education and such other education, instruction, learning, training and research as may be deemed essential for the cause of Christ and to that end prescribe courses

of study and grant degrees. The doctrinal and theological position of this institution shall be that of the sponsoring denomination, Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and the treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptist as endorsed by the state body, and in connection therewith, in accordance with the stipulation of the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

(a.) To prescribe courses of study for both resident and correspondence students, which shall include general education in the arts, Christian Ministries of Service and Biblical studies for wisdom; said courses to be taught in both a Junior College Division and a Bible College Division, and to award degrees, either graduate or post-graduate, to those persons satisfactorily completing the prescribed courses of study and to grant such other literary honors, including honorary degrees, as shall be deemed advisable.

(b.) To charge and collect tuition as determined by the Board of

Trustees and to create scholarships.

(c.) To employ professors, instructors and other subordinate employees as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the college under the direction and control of the President of the College, with the advice and consent of the majority of the Board of Trustees.

(d.) To institute and carry on missions and commissions for missionary

purposes and investigations.

(e.) To publish and distribute such pamphlets, literature or books as may be required in the conduct of such work and the general promotion of the Bible College.

(f.) To sue and be sued in its corporate name and to enter into con-

tracts of every type and nature.

(g.) To solicit support, receive, collect, hold and receive by gift or bequest personal property in any amount, money or other thing of value; to purchase real estate, to receive real estate that may be given, or devised to the college for achieving the legitimate ends of the college and to sell or mortgage the same as the need arises.

(h.) To borrow money in payment of property for erecting buildings and making improvements and for any other purpose germane to the

objectives and purposes of the college.

(i.) To issue notes, bonds, debentures and other evidences of indebtedness and execute mortgages, liens and other incumbrances upon the property of the corporation, real or otherwise, to secure the payment of any such evidences of indebtedness.

(j.) To transact any and all business connected with said College as

may be necessary to achieve the purposes of said College.

(k.) To obtain under Internal Revenue Laws of the United States and of the Revenue Laws of the State of Oklahoma exemption from income property and other forms of taxation.

ARTICLE THREE

The location of this corporation shall be in Norman, Oklahoma.

ARTICLE FOUR

The duration of this corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE FIVE

The general control of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of

Trustees consisting of nine members, seven of which shall be elected by the delegates to the annual association of the Oklahoma Free Will Baptists: the elected members of said Board shall be elected to terms of seven years, six, five, four, three, two and one year respectively, provided that each elected Trustee shall be a resident of a regular Free Will Baptist church that is in good standing with the state association. The remaining two members, which are ex-officio, shall be the president of the College and the Executive Secretary of the State Association of Free Will Baptist of Oklahoma.

ARTICLE SIX

An executive committee consisting of the Chairman, Vice Chairman, and Secretary of the Board of Trustees shall possess all powers of the Board of Trustees between the stated meetings of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE SEVEN

All contracts for building construction shall be let only to persons or corporations posting a valid performance bond and recording the same in the office of the County Clerk of Cleveland, Oklahoma.

ARTICLE EIGHT

The College Board of Trustees shall be empowered to call special or extraordinary meetings of the State Association of Free Will Baptists of Oklahoma by mailing written notice to each delegate to the previous meeting of said Association or to the delegate's sponsoring church. Such notice shall be mailed not less than ten (10) days prior to the date of said meetings. At such meetings, any matter stipulated in the notice, concerning the welfare of the College may be considered, including, but not limited to, finances, new bond issues, vacancies on the Board of Trustees and approval of new construction.

SECTION IX AMENDMENTS

This charter may be hereafter amended subject to the provisions contained herein and the laws of the State of Oklahoma. It is provided, however, that the Trustees of the Bible College shall not propose or apply for any amendment which has not been previously authorized by an act of the Oklahoma State Association.

CONSTITUTION OF MINISTER'S CONFERENCE

ARTICLE 1

This Minister's Conference shall be called the Oklahoma State Free Will Baptist Minister's Conference, and shall be composed of Ordained Free Will Baptist Ministers who are regular members of some Orthodox Free Will Baptist church in the State of Oklahoma who have paid their \$1.00 dues.

ARTICLE 2

The officers for this conference shall be President, Vice-President, Clerk, Assist. Clerk and Treasurer, who shall be elected annually.

ARTICLE 3

This conference shall have the power to discipline its members.

ARTICLE 4

Members of this organization shall be all ordained ministers who participate in the benefits and activities of this body, and associate members who become members by payment of the \$1.00 annual dues.

ARTICLE 5

This conference shall meet Semi-Annually.

ARTICLE 6

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular session.

BY-LAWS OF MINISTER'S CONFERENCE

ARTICLE I

The clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence the senior minister in years shall call the ministers into conference. If a quorum is present the President or in his absence the Vice-President shall moderate the meeting. If neither of these are present, the senior minister in years shall be in charge.

ARTICLE 2

It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the ministers of the conference. Ministers shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the conference. In case of questionable representation the case under question shall be referred to the Credential Committee.

ARTICLE 3

It shall be the duty of each minister belonging to this conference, to be active in pastoral or evangelistic services (disabled or retired ministers excepted). Any minister belonging to this conference shall report in each session in person or by letter, and failing to do so for two successive sessions shall be subject to discipline.

ARTICLE 4

Each conference shall be opened by reading a portion of God's word and prayer, and each session shall be closed with prayer.

ARTICLE 5

By a two-thirds vote of the members present ruling of the President may be overruled.

ARTICLE 6

This conference shall sit with open doors, except when it shall go into a committee as a whole.

ARTICLE 7

No member shall absent himself from the conference during its meeting without permission from the President.

ARTICLE 8

No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of a committee, unless person nominated is not elected.

ARTICLE 9

The President shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian Spirit, or when he thinks it will cause discord.

ARTICLE 10

Anyone desiring to speak shall rise and address the President by the appelation "Brother President," But shall not speak further until recognized.

ARTICLE 11

No member of this conference shall be allowed to speak more than five minutes, nor twice on the same subject without permission from the President.

ARTICLE 12

These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this conference by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

MINISTER'S CONFERENCE REPORT

The Semi-annual Oklahoma Ministers Conference convened Tuesday, May 14, 1968 at the Lewis Avenue Free Will Baptist Church in Tulsa, Oklahoma. Meeting called to order by the president Rev. F. A. McCage at 9.30 a.m. There were 68 ministers registered at this meeting.

In the business session:

Motion and seconded to adopt plan as presented by the Executive Secretary on hospital insurance for the ministers of Oklahoma. Ministers to be members and all other ministers are associate members (the ministers who participate in the insurance program).

Motion to amend the constitution to read, members in this organization shall be all ordained ministers who participate in the benefits and activities of this body, and associate members who become members by payment of the \$1.00 annual dues. Motion to adjourn.

The 60th Annual Oklahoma Minister's Conference convened Tuesday, October 22, at 9:00 a.m. 1968 at the Southwest Free Will Baptist Church, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. There was a registration of 57 ministers with ten visitors.

9:00 a.m. meeting called by the president. Congregational singing by Rev. Bailey Thompson. Devotion Rev. Jack Richey. I Cor. 13: 1-13 and prayer.

10:00 a.m. message by Rev. Lynn Wood, "Educational Outlook For Oklahoma Free Will Baptist." "The Denominational Outlook For Free Will Baptist," by Rev. Robert Shockey. Adjourn for the 11:00 a.m. Ladies Auxiliary message.

1:00 p.m. called to order by Rev. F. A. McCage, president. Motion made and seconded to give a fifty dollar scholarship to a student at Oklahoma Bible College. The Student to be picked by the officers of the Ministers Conference. The May semi-annual meeting will be at the Bristow Free Will Baptist Church May 13, 1969.

The 1969 officers elected were Rev. F. A. McCage, president, Rev. Roma Stewart, Vice President, Rev. Charles A. Bigger, Secretary Treasurer and Rev. Willard C. Day, Assistant Secretary Treasurer.

ARTICLES OF FAITH OF STATE ASSOCIATION

- 1. THE BIBLE—The Scriptures of the Old and New Testament were given by the inspiration of God, and are our infallible rules of faith and practice.
- 2. GOD—There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver and Righteous Governor of the Universe, and in the Scriptures as the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.
- 3. CHRIST—Christ is God manifest in the flesh: in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified. He is now risen and glorified is our ever-present Saviour and Lord.
- 4. THE HOLY SPIRIT—The Scriptures assigns to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of all men.
- 5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD—God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitu-

tion and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of Grace, not otherwise provided for as highest welfare of man requires.

- 6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN—Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore inherited a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. THE WORK OF CHRIST—The Son of God, by His incarnation, life, suffering, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.
- 8. THE WORK OF SALVATION—The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and the hearty renunciations of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit; freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. ELECTION—God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ, men become His elect.
- 10. FREEDOM OF WILL—The Human will is free and self controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit and live, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. SALVATION FREE—God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.
- 12. PERSEVERENCE—All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. BACKSLIDING AND APOSTASY—A person who has been regenerated or born again and is living in unconfessed, unforgiven sin, is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and therefore is a backslider in a lost condition who must repent and be restored to the right relationship with God or be eternally lost.
- We recognize, according to Hebrews 6: 4-6, that it is possible for a person to get in the condition that he could never return to Christ. This, we believe, is Apostasy. However, we also recognize that a regenerate person can fall into sin, be in a lost condition and still not be an Apostate. This person, through repentance, can be reconciled to God.
- 14. GOSPEL ORDINANCES—Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel: Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be administered to all true believers.
- 15. TITHING—God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament: Jesus Christ endorsed in the Gospel (Matt. 23: 23), and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." I Cor. 16: 2.
- 16. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH—The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from the secular employment and amusements for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 17. RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT, AND FINAL RETRIBUTION The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that

have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation: then the wicked shall "Go away into eternal punishment but the righteous into eternal life."

RULES OF ORDER

- 1. At every sitting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded by prayer by the Moderator or whomever he may request.
- 2. Ministers and deacons present are invited to seats, allowed to take part in debates on all subjects, and to vote.
- 3. Those who speak shall rise and address the Moderator, Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
 - 4. No motion may be discussed until made and seconded.
- 5. When a motion has been made and seconded, and a member opposes its discussion, the Moderator shall put the question. "Shall it be discussed?" if negative, the question shall not be discussed.
- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member, and the vote taken separately.
 - 7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.
- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.
- 9. All questions shall be decided by a majority vote of all Members present.

BY LAWS OF STATE ASSOCIATION

- 1. The Clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence, the senior minister in years shall call the Association into conference, and if a quorum is present the moderator, or in his absence, the assistant moderator shall take charge; and if neither of them is present the senior minister in years shall act as Moderator.
- 2. It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the delegates to the Association, who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the Association.
- 3. It shall be the duty of every District belonging to this Association to send a letter to every annual session of this Association reporting in the same, spiritual condition, benevolent work, and its statistics. Any District belonging to this Association, which shall fail to report itself for two successive sessions, may be dismissed from the Association by a two thirds vote of all members present.
- 4. Each meeting shall be opened by reading a portion of the Bible and with prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.
- 5. By a two-thirds vote of members present, a ruling of the moderator can be overruled.
- 6. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- 7. This Association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.
- 8. Any person not a member of this Association may be allowed to take part in its discussions by obtaining permission from the moderator.

9. It shall be the duty of all the Association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting, and anyone wishing to retire shall first obtain leave of the moderator.

10. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of

any committee, provided the person nominated be elected.

11. The moderator shall not allow discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.

- 12. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise to his feet and address the moderator by the appelation "Brother Moderator," but shall not speak further until recognized by the moderator.
- 13. No member of this association shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes nor twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator.
- 14. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

CONSTITUTION OF STATE ASSOCIATION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptists denomination, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a church; and to preserve and maintain correspondence and co-ordination with us, do therefore ordain this Constitution for our better denomination government.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This organization shall be known as the OKLAHOMA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE: The object and purpose of this organization shall be to unify the work of the various bodies composing this State Association, and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in connection with the various bodies in the Association, or that may hereafter be represented therein.

ARTICLE III

REPRESENTATION: Section 1. This Association shall be composed of all ordained ministers and deacons with membership in some local church which is a member of a district Association with membership in the State Association.

Section 2: Each District Association shall be entitled to a number of elected delegates equal with the number of churches composing said Association. These delegates may be recommended by the local churches and shall be endorsed by their district association.

ARTICLE IV

FINANCE: Each elected delegate shall be represented with a fee of ten dollars.

ARTICLE V

DISCIPLINE: This State Association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine or practices that may properly come before

it from any of the bodies composing said organization, furthermore if there be any question of discipline, doctrine or practices on the part of a subordinate association, delegates of that association shall not be seated until these questions have been settled to the satisfaction of the Credential Committee.

Section 2: Decisions of the Credential Committee may be appealed. (1) All appeals coming before the State Association when sitting in a Committee as a whole. (2) by special committee whose report shall be voted on without discussion.

ARTICLE VI

OFFICERS: The officers of the State Association shall consist of a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk and Assistant Clerk, Parliamentarian and an Executive Secretary, each of whom shall be elected at the close of each regular session, except the Executive Secretary, who shall be elected every two years.

Section 2: Committees as necessary, shall be appointed by the moderator, unless otherwise provided for, and shall hold office until their work is completed or until their successors are elected.

ARTICLE VII

BOARDS. All standing boards shall be composed of seven elected members who shall serve terms of 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 years, and any ex-officio members provided for elsewhere. Ex-officio members shall not have vote. The general board shall be composed of one member from each subordinate association, chairman of each standing board and the state officers. The standing boards shall include the Executive Board, the Church Extension and Mission Board, College Board of Trustees, Sunday School Board, and Church Training Service Board. Each board shall elect a chairman and clerk-treasurer to act for one year and to be elected at the close of each annual state association. The Co-ordinating Board shall be composed of the executive secretary and the chairman from each standing board.

ARTICLE VIII

DUTIES AND RULES OF STANDING BOARDS. The Executive Board is elected at the discretion of the State Association of Free Will Baptists and shall act in behalf of the association when not in session, and shall have power and authority to elect such officers as might be deemed best for its own government and to carry out the plan and undertakings of the state association. To this Executive Board is further delegated power to collect funds and report and superintend such work for the field as may seem best and the means on hand may warrant, exclusive of College Board of Trustees.

This Executive Board shall keep a record of all work done, money raised, meetings held and make a full and complete report to the regular meeting of the association and shall further receive and convey any property entrusted to said state association. They shall not have the power to purchase or sell any real estate property without the voice of the association.

The chairman and the secretary of said Executive Board shall sign all deeds, bonds, and notes, etc., and other papers by which the State Associa-

tion is to become legally responsible, exclusive of College Board of Trustees.

The board shall have power to call the association in conference by notifying each Subordinate Association at least ten (10) days prior to conference.

- (2) GENERAL BOARD: It shall be the duty of this board to meet with the Executive Board one day preceding the State Association to hear reports of the standing boards and to make recommendations to the State Association. They shall also serve as Credential Committee.
- (3) CHURCH EXTENSION AND MISSION BOARD: It shall be the duty of this board to work to promote an active missionary program in and for the State of Oklahoma.

It will also be their responsibility to investigate and assist, if necessary, any new church and, or, a church that cannot maintain itself. This board should thoroughly investigate the ability of a church to support an organization before assistance is pledged.

- (4) COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES: It shall be the duty of this board to supervise and promote Oklahoma Bible College, Inc. and the function of this board shall be governed by the Articles of Incorporation and By-laws as adopted by the State Association of Free Will Baptists, adopted at the 1965 session.
- (5) CHURCH TRAINING SERVICE BOARD: It shall be the duty of this board to plan and assist in every way possible the C.T.S work throughout the state. It will also be their responsibility to promote an active C.T.S. work in each Subordinate Association and to encourage C.T.S. institutes. It shall also be the duty of this board to plan and direct a State Youth Camp or Camps.
- (6) SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD: Their duties shall include the planning and operation of the State Sunday School Conventions, Institutes, and the encouragement of the organization of district conventions. They may carry through plans they think wise to actively promote Sunday School work in the state, and the publishing of literature deemed advisable by the State Association of Free Will Baptists.
- (7) CO-ORDINATING BOARD: This board shall be charged with the responsibility of co-ordinating the work of the standing boards, and shall also act as Budget Committee. The Executive Secretary shall serve as chairman and the board shall meet at his discretion.
- (8) FILLING OF VACANCIES: All boards shall have power to fill vacancies that may arise between sessions of the association. Such appointment valid only until next session of association.
- (9) Working agreement between the state association and the Executive Secretary of the State Association: That the Executive Secretary be paid a set salary and mileage and a two week paid vacation and all money received by him for speaking engagements, revivals and etc. shall be turned in by him to the Executive Office for the support of this office. He shall be ex-officio member of all standing boards.

ARTICLE IX

This constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session of the State Association by a two-thirds vote of members present, provided proposed amendment or alteration be presented in writing to the body one day in advance.

ARTICLE X

Elected delegates to State Assosiation shall be retained as standing delegates for special called meetings.
