PROCEEDINGS OF THE STATE ASSOCIATION

The 61st Annual Session of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists met October 14-16, 1969, at the Civic Center, Tulsa, Oklahoma. The theme of the meeting was "Exalting Christ," based on John 17:10.

Rev. Delbert Akin directed the opening song which was "Amazing Grace." After Richard Raiman led in prayer, the congregation joined in singing two other songs which were, "Jesus Saves," and "I Love to Tell the Story."

The meeting was officially called into session by the Clerk, Rev. Waldo Young, who then introduced the other officers. Rev. Bailey Thompson, the Moderator, brought the moderator's message, using John 3:14, John 17:10, and John 12:27-28, as his Scripture text.

Rev. Bob Ketchum, representing the Tulsa Free Will Baptist ministers, gave the welcome and led in the flag salute. The congregation sang "The Battle Hymn of Republic."

An offering for the expense of the association was received.

The choir from the Southeast Church, Tulsa, under the direction of Mr. Kenneth Beatty, sang "God so Loved the World," and "Christ has No Hands but Our Hands." Mr. David Parrish sang "Ship Ahoy."

Missionary Archie Mayhew was introduced to bring the message. His subject was "Exalting Christ through Soul Winning," and his text was John 15:8-16.

Following announcements the group was dismissed in prayer by Mr. Charlie Christian.

"Praise Him! Praise Him," and "Glory to His Name," were the songs used to open the Wednesday morning session. Rev. Ricky Duncan brought the devotion from Psalm 84, then called on Rev. Berton Perry to lead in prayer.

The Moderator opened the business session with his admonition. The clerk read a partial report of the General Board. That part was read which pertained to the letters from district associations and the delegates. A motion was made and carried to accept the letters and seat the delegates.

The petitionary letter was read from the Poteau River Valley Association. The body voted to accept the letter and seat the delegates.

Visiting ministers from out of state were recognized and welcomed to the meeting.

Since Rev. Homer Young had been elected as State Executive Secretary, which left the position of Assistant Moderator vacant, it was necessary to elect an Assistant Moderator. Rev. Ernest Harrison was elected to this position.

Rev. Albert Collier, Rev. Jack Richey, Rev. Lynn Wood, Rev. Ernest Harrison, and Rev. F. A. McCage were appointed to serve on the Resolution Committee.

Those who were appointed to serve on the Temperance Committee were Rev. Berton Perry, Rev. Allen Wood, Rev. James Franklin, Rev. Rick Duncan, and Rev. J. C. Morgan.

The moderator appointed Rev. O. T. Dixon, Rev. Sherman Webb,

Rev. Bob Ketchum, Rev. Carl Shivers, and Rev. Ed Cook to serve on the Placement Committee.

The Obituary Committee was made up of Rev. Floyd Vulgamore, Rev. Pete Butler, Rev. John West, Rev. James Cearley, and Rev. H. E. Staires.

A motion carried to adopt the program leaving the time flexible.

The rest of the report of the General Board was read by the clerk. A motion carried to adopt the report.

A motion was made and carried to have the report of the Study Commission read. This report was read by the clerk. A motion carried to table the report of the Study Commission.

The morning session was dismissed with prayer by Rev. Eugene Hawkins.

The eleven o'clock worship service opened with singing. The first song was "At the Cross," followed with prayer by Rev. Clarence Shepherd. The State Ministers Quartet sang "Let Me Touch Him," and "Palms of Victory."

Rev. Connie Cariker brought the message on "Exalting Christ Through Church Loyalty."

Rev. Homer Young led in the closing prayer.

The congregation sang "Tis So Sweet to Trust in Jesus," and "Stand up for Jesus," to open the afternoon session. Rev. Ed Cook brought the devotion, followed with prayer by Rev. Waldo Young.

The report of the Sunday School Board was given by Rev. Willard Day. A motion carried to accept the report.

Rev. N. R. Smith gave a report on the work of the National Sunday School Department.

The report of the Church Extension and Mission Board was given by Rev. Jack Richey. The report was accepted.

The moderator read a proposed amendment to Article VIII of the Constitution of the State Association. A motion carried to lay it on the table for a day.

Rev. J. Reford Wilson gave a report of the National Foreign Missions Department. Rev. Delbert Akin led in prayer in behalf of our Missionaries.

A report of the National Home Mission work was given by Rev. Bob Shockey. A letter from Rev. Roy Thomas, chairman of the National Home Mission Board, was read by the clerk.

The State Ministers Quartet sang, "In the Shelter of His Arms."

The report of the Executive Board was given by Rev. Clarence Shepherd. The report was accepted.

Rev. Homer Young gave the report of the Executive Secretary. A motion carried to accept this report.

Rev. Curtis Hogue gave the report of the book store. A motion carried to accept this report.

Rev. Rufus Coffey gave an informative report from the National Executive Secretary's office.

Rev. Francis Boyle represented Executive Church Bonds with a report.

The Church Training Service Board report was given by Rev. Jerry Dudley. A motion carried to accept the report.

The afternoon session was dismissed with prayer by Rev. James Robinson.

The congregation sang "Tis So Sweet To Trust in Jesus" to open the Wednesday evening service, Rev. James Murray led in prayer.

The songs, "Saved Saved," and "Lead on, O King Eternal" were sung by the congregation.

Since the service was dedicated to Christian Education, with emphasis on Oklahoma Bible College, personnel from that school was featured in the service. Dr. J. D. O'Donnell, president of the school was in charge of the service.

Awards were given to the churches which had successfully reached the \$1,000.00 in giving to Operation Participation.

Three special numbers in song were sung by the Oklahoma Bible College Choir. Slides were shown of the campus. The girls trio sang a special number.

Rev. Dan Farmer, Business manager of OBC, brought the evening message on, "Exalting Christ through Christian Education."

An offering was received for Oklahoma Bible College.

Rev. Ernest Harrison led the closing prayer.

The Thursday morning session opened with the congregation singing, "Tis so Sweet to Trust in Jesus," and "I Love to Tell the Story."

Rev. Lionel Cooksey brought the devotion and led in prayer.

Mr. Sam Johnson gave an informative report on the work of the National Church Training Service Department.

An oral report was given by Rev. E. E. Morris on the meeting in Nashville, Tennessee, which concerned the backslider question.

Rev. Herman Hersey gave a report on the National Retirement and Insurance program.

The Oklahoma Bible College Board of Trustees report was given by Rev. Jerry Rhoades. A motion carried to accept the report and adopt recommendation No. 1.

Rev. Paul Kettelman represented Free Will Baptist Bible College with a report.

The morning session was closed with prayer by the moderator.

"Amazing Grace" was the opening song for the worship service.

Rev. Jerry Dudley led in prayer. The State Ministers Quartet sang, "What a Savior."

Rev. James Murray brought the message on the subject, "Exalting Christ through World Outreach."

Rev. Lonnie DaVoult dismissed the group with prayer.

The opening song of the Thursday afternoon session was, "Blessed Assurance." Rev. Sherman Webb brought the devotion and called on Rev. James Robinson to lead in prayer.

A report of the Oklahoma Music Fellowship was given by Mr. Kenneth Beatty.

Rev. Homer Young gave the Coordinating Bond report. A motion was made to adopt the report. A motion to amend item No. 1, carried, It was amended to read, Sunday School 2%, C. T. S. 1%, Mission

Board 6%, OBC 17%, Executive Department 31%, and National Association 43%. Items 2 and 3 were adopted as recommended.

A motion carried to postpone electing OBC board members until after the constitutional changes were voted.

A motion was made that the men recommended by each of the district associations as members of the State General Board, be elected to make up this board. The motion carried.

A motion carried to accept the person recommended by Hopewell No. 1, as a General Board Member, if and when their letter is received.

Mrs. Marguerite Hinesley gave a report of the State Women's Auxiliary. It was accepted as information.

Mr. Wyman Straughn gave the report of the State Master's Men. This report was accepted.

The report of the State Ministers Conference was given by Rev. F. A. McCage. A motion carried to accept the report.

The report of the Placement Committee, which recommended that we go to Lawton in 1971, was accepted.

The report of the Resolution Committee was read by the clerk. The report, with its two items, was accepted.

The Temperance Committee report was read and accepted.

The report of the Obituary Committee was read and accepted. Rev. Gene Thomas led in prayer as the body paused in remembrance of those who passed away during the past year.

A motion carried to take from the table the report of the Study Commission. Articles V, VI, VIII, IX, X, and XI, were adopted as they were recommended. Article VII was accepted as amended.

A motion carried that Article VII be turned to the Executive Board who will get it legally worded by an attorney.

In the election of the Oklahoma Bible College Trustee Board, a motion was made and carried to retain the present six men. The top three men will serve two years, the next three will serve one year, and three will be elected to serve three year terms. Those elected for the three year terms are Rev. Jack Richey, Rev. O. T. Dixon, and Rev. Bailey Thompson.

Rev. Milburn Wilson was elected to the Sunday School Board for one year.

Rev. Odie Nunley was elected assistant clerk. Rev. Waldo Young was elected clerk. Rev. Ernest Harrison was elected assistant moderator, and Rev. Bailey Thompson was elected moderator.

Rev. Lynn Wood was elected to be placed in nomination at the National Association as General Board Member from Oklahoma. This is a two year term which begins in July, 1971.

A rising vote of thanks was given to the officers for their service. The association was dismissed in prayer by Rev. O. T. Dixon.

REPORT OF THE GENERAL BOARD

The General Board met October 13, at the West Tulsa Free Will Baptist Church. Albert Collier led in the opening prayer. The clerk read letters from fifteen associations. Motion carried to accept the letters and seat the delegates.

A petitionary letter was read from the Poteau River Valley Association. Motion carried to receive this association into the Oklahoma State Association.

The report of the Sunday School Board was given by Willard Day. Motion carried to accept the report.

Bob Duncan gave the report of the Church Extension and Mission Board. Motion carried to accept the report.

The reports of the Executive Board and the Executive Secretary were given. Motion carried to accept these reports.

The report of the Free Will Baptist Book Store was given by Curtis Hogue. Motion carried to accept the report.

Jerry Dudley gave the report of the Church Training Service Board. Motion carried to accept the report.

The report of the Oklahoma Bible College Trustee Board was given by Jerry Rhoades.

The General Board recommends that recommendations No. 2, of the Trustee Board report be amended as follows; the next to the (or second sentence) last sentence to read, "Six members of the board shall be elected, one each from the state associations of Arkansas, Kansas, Missouri, Colorado, Texas, and New Mexico, to serve concurrent terms of 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 years."

Motion carried to accept the Trustees Board report as amended.

The report of the Coordinating Board was given by Homer Young. A motion carried to accept the report.

The report of the Study Commission was given for consideration by Bailey Thompson, Chairman. The General Board recommends the following changes in the report of the Study Commission.

Article VIII, Section 1, paragraph 2, these words added, "exclusive of the College Board of Trustees and the Board of Church Extension, Missions and Evangelism."

Article VIII, section 3, following paragraph 2, these words be added, "This board shall be empowered to receive and convey title to real property in the area of its labors."

In section 8, Employees: number 5 to read, "He is to report to the association during each annual session."

Motion carried to accept the report of the Study Commission with the amendments.

A committee of Doyal Cox, Albert Collier, and Allen Wood was appointed to receive any late letter.

The meeting was adjourned, dismissed in prayer by N. R. Smith.

STATE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD REPORT

The Sunday School Board met six times during the past year. Three training institutes were conducted and approximately 70 certificates were awarded. The board sponsored one Sunday School Convention this past year and plans to host another before the meeting of the State Association.

Personal assistance was given to a number of churches by members of the Board in the area of Sunday School training and promotion. The State Sunday School Board adopted the project of co-sponsoring an

annual retreat to convene on the campus of Oklahoma Bible College during the fall of 1969.

We request 2% of the cooperative receipts to support our program for the next year.

STATE MISSION BOARD REPORT

The State Mission Board has met ten times during the past year. The regular meeting is on the second Tuesday of the month.

The Altus property has been sold. The Assembly of God group who rented the property last year purchased the building and property for \$10,000.00. The note on this property was paid and the balance was placed in savings in an Oklahoma City bank.

The board assumed liabilities and assets of the Plaza Towers Free Will Baptist Church in Moore. Presently (October) there is a balance of \$6,279.00 on the note. Monthly payments are \$97.56.

The Southeast Church in Tulsa has continued to grow under the leadership of Rev. Jerry Rhoades. The board discontinued financial support toward this work last year.

A Free Will Baptist Church was organized at Atoka February 21, 1969. Rev. Arvil Arnold was called as pastor. They have a very good location in a new housing addition at the north side of town. The property was donated by a member of the Church. In June they had \$11,000 in their building fund to begin a new building. The building is now under construction and should be completed soon. The Church is a member of the Southeast Association. The board has given financial assistance to this work from its beginning.

A Free Will Baptist Church was organized at Skiatook on November 8, 1968. They called Rev. Jim Haas as pastor. A new building has recently been completed on their property west of town. Financial assistance was given to this work last year.

Representatives from the Gaines Creek Association met with the board in regard to the work in Hartshorn. We voted to assist in cooperation with the Association. A recent report shows attendance to have been from 19 to 28 for several weeks.

A request was received for assistance in starting a mission in Boise City. We are now supporting mission worker, Rev. Lionel Cooksey, in cooperation with the Union Association.

Rev. Albert Collier replaced Rev. Homer Young on the board for this year.

We fulfilled a request from the Locust Grove Free Will Baptist Church in December for a State Mission Service. We appreciate this invitation and welcome other such invitations.

December is State Missions Month and December 21 has been designated as State Missions Sunday. We urge all churches to receive an offering for State Missions and also include State Missions in your budget this year.

The board plans to employ a full time State Missions Worker and Evangelist this year. Please pray for God's leadership in sending the right man for this work.

Our total giving to Home and Foreign Missions declined slightly in 1968 for the first time in several years. The following information shows receipts recorded by the National Boards for the past five years:

EXECUTIVE BOARD

The Oklahoma State Executive Board held six meetings this year and are grateful to God for His blessings on our efforts. We would like to report that we have had a good year in His service. If you recall, during our last state meeting, Rev. N. R. Smith, our State Executive Secretary, had resigned and the responsibility of finding a replacement for this office was given to this board. We met on October 30, 1968, at the Bookstore, 4801 South Walker, Oklahoma City. After much prayer

and consideration, the board unanimously agreed to employ Rev. Homer Young to serve as our State Executive Secretary. He was to begin working immediately on a part-time basis and move to Oklahoma City and assume full responsibility by December 1, 1968.

We would like to express our deep appreciation to Brother Young for the dedication, deep concern, as well as the many hours of hard labor and miles traveled during these first few months in the office promoting the work for Free Will Baptists in the State of Oklahoma. We know the time of transition from the pastorate to this office has been a difficult time for the Youngs. We ask for your prayers in behalf of them as they further labor in this office in the service of our Lord.

We also would like to report our Bookstore reached another goal for gross sales of \$51,489.00. We want to commend our book store manager, Brother Curtis Hogue, and his wife for the increase in sales this year. We would like to urge the many Free Will Baptists across the State of Oklahoma to visit our book store, as well as to order your supplies.

We adopted a budget of \$19,000.00 for the Executive Office for the year of July 1, 1970, to June 30, 1971. We also adopted a budget of \$65,000.00 for the Free Will Baptist Book Store for this same period. We recommend them to you.

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY

Thank you for the opportunity to serve Free Will Baptists as Oklahoma's Executive Secretary. This has been an enjoyable year for me. I appreciate the good response Oklahoma Free Will Baptists have given me.

Promotion work has taken me to most of the sixteen associations in the state. There is a Quarterly Meeting almost every week. Several meet at the same time. Sunday mornings, Sunday evenings and a few week nights have been used to bring a message and promote the state work in 85 to 90 of the over 230 churches in Oklahoma. I would appreciate an opportunity to be with you in your church regardless of the size or location.

Revivals have been scheduled as invitations are received and time is available. Money received in revival work is turned in to the state office and travel money is collected. There is some financial gain for the state by doing this. However, it also causes the Executive Secretary's travel to appear high.

Rev. Rufus Coffey, National Executive Secretary, and Rev. J. Reford Wilson, General Director of our Foreign Missions Department, have each spent a week with me touring the state of Oklahoma. Rev. Jack Paramore, Director of the development program at Free Will Baptist Bible College will be in Oklahoma October 27-November 2 for a similar tour. Other departments will be represented as time is available. Services for missionaries Fred McCoy and Howard Gage have been scheduled in cooperation with the Foreign and Home Missions Departments and the State Mission Board.

Two trips have been made to Nashville this year. One for the special study committee last December and the other in January for the annual meeting of Promotional men.

Every state board has invited me, as ex-officio member, to meet with them. I have attended the majority of these meetings. This gives me a better view of the total state work.

My work with the Free Will Baptist Bookstore has been primarily in promotion. On several occasions I have taken a display with me to different meetings. Also, brother Hogue and I have visited together several times concerning future promotion and plans.

The number of Promoters mailed out each month has leveled off at approximately 6300. The Promoter has been used as a promotion instrument with a few brief happenings around the state and national. There is a possibility the Promoter can be used more effectively. I will do what I can to use it as effectively as possible.

There is no increase in the Hospitalization premiums this year. We now have 33 active members, four application cards being processed and four application cards requested that I have not received back.

The bookkeeping work continues to increase. The state office has handled \$154,044.27 this year. Cooperative receipts were \$43,853.95 of this amount. The insurance records also take some time. The receipts, disbursements, applications, claims, payments, etc., are handled by this office.

Correspondence work is heavy at times, especially in planning for the state convention. Normally I only write a few letters per day concerning some phase of the state work. I think it is possible to use correspondence as a valuable promotion instrument. So far, this has not been done. At the last meeting of the Executive Board secretarial help was approved as necessity demands. This should help us be more efficient in the future.

Our Oklahoma stewardship is improving. The per capita giving through the state office is \$8.00. The money sent direct would probably bring this figure to \$9.00 per member. Union Association leads the way in per capita giving with \$15.69 per member last year. First Oklahoma, South Grand River and Northeast are all giving above \$10.00 per member. For the 1969-1970 year we need \$10.00 per member to reach the needed \$200,000.00 for the operating budgets of all departments. Building programs at Free Will Baptist College and Oklahoma Bible College would be above this amount.

The Cooperative Program plays an important part in our giving. Many phases of our denominational work are almost completely supported by Cooperative money. All departments are undergirded with this system of giving.

C. T. S. BOARD REPORT

The Church Training Service Board has met several times during the past year to complete the work assigned. In the course of the year efforts have been put forth in some areas to establish Church Training Service in churches where such training is not currently conducted. The Board worked in conjunction with the State Sunday School Board in presenting a joint training institute in the Lewis Avenue Church in Tulsa on March 14-15, 1969. This Board sponsored the State CTS competitive activities on May 3, 1969, at the Lawnwood Church, Tulsa. The Board planned and conducted the State Youth Camp at Robbers Cave State Park June 9-13, 1969, and feel that it was a week of spiritual achievement for those in attendance. We wish to express our deepest appreciation to those who served as directors, nursing, teachers and sponsors who really made the camp what it proved to be.

Much planning and research went into planning and conducting the camp. Questions were weighed as to whether we would benefit most from two (2) camps for one (1) week, or one (1) camp for two (2) weeks, two camps for two (2) weeks, attempting to secure three (3) camps, also as to whether we would benefit from a camp built and maintained by the state and other related studies. The Board concluded that inasmuch as many district associations conduct camps, many pastors and adult leaders could not attend split camps or make more than one trip, the safest course of action was to conduct two (2) camps for one (1) week. This year appears to have been a wise choice.

Tentative plans have been made to continue the plan for another year. Also, the securing and use of U. S. Government surplus commodities was discontinued. The requirements for the use of such has become so stringent that it was deemed wise to discontinue their use.

The Board received and accepted the resignation of Rev. Gayle Gardner from the Board in its August 25 meeting. No replacement was made.

OKLAHOMA BIBLE COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Board of Trustees of Oklahoma Bible College met eight times last year.

- August 16—Rev. Lynn Wood was employed as Director of Promotions.
Rev. Paul Inbody resigned from the Trustee Board.
- September 3—Rev. Teddy Wilbanks was employed as part time music instructor.
- October 17—The Board of Trustees voted to send to the General Board their statement concerning backsliding.
- October 24— The Board met at the close of the State Association and elected officers as follows:
Rev. Jerry Rhoades, Chairman
Rev. Ernest Harrison, Vice-Chairman
Mr. Charles Hinesley, Clerk
Rev. James Murray was elected to the board to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Rev. Paul Inbody.
He was elected at the State Association.
- November 22—There was much discussion concerning the extra long time it was taking the Douglas Const. Co. to build the dormitory.
Plans were discussed concerning the second dormitory.

February 17—Plans were discussed concerning faculty housing.

The board gave Dr. O'Donnell the authority to set up a Trust Fund to handle gifts and annuities dedicated to Oklahoma Bible College.

The Board of Trustees of Oklahoma Bible College makes the following recommendations:

1. That the board be authorized to hold up plans to construct a second large dormitory and instead to construct an activities building which will contain a gymnasium, a kitchen, and a dining hall. The gymnasium will be able to serve as an auditorium as well.

This building encompassing 10,300 square feet and costing around \$85,000.00 would be financed by the remainder of the bonds yet to be sold from the previous program and through funds raised in Operation Participation. Building would be begun as funds are available.

2. That Article Five of the Charter (or Articles of Incorporation) be amended to read as follows:

The general control of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of Trustees consisting of 15 members, 9 of which trustees shall be elected by the delegates to the annual Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists—each of which shall serve for a term of three years and until his successor is elected and qualified, and one member each shall be selected by the delegates to the annual meeting of the state association of Free Will Baptists of the States of Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico and Texas, each of which shall serve for a term of 6 years and until his successor is elected and qualified. Initially, the 9 trustees elected by said Oklahoma Association shall include 3 elected for three years, 3 elected for two years, and 3 elected for one year but their successors shall all be elected for a term of three years and until their successors are elected and qualified. Initially, said trustee elected by said Arkansas Association shall be elected for a term of six years, said trustee elected by said Colorado Association shall be elected for a term of five years, said trustee elected by said Kansas Association shall be elected for a term of four years, said trustee elected by said Missouri Association shall be elected for a term of three years, said trustee elected by said New Mexico Association shall be elected for a term of two years and said trustee elected by said Texas Association shall be elected for a term of one year but their successors shall be elected for a term of six years and until their successors are elected and qualified. The Chairman of said Corporation shall be one of the trustees elected by said Oklahoma Association.

3. That the opening statement of the By-Laws of the Oklahoma Bible College be amended to read:

SECTION I

The Board of Trustees of Oklahoma Bible College, Inc., an Oklahoma corporation, shall be composed of fifteen members, elected as provided in the Articles of Incorporation of said College, as amended:

OKLAHOMA BIBLE COLLEGE, INC.

BY-LAWS

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

SECTION I

The Board of Trustees of Oklahoma Bible College, Inc., an Oklahoma corporation, shall be composed of fifteen members, elected as provided in the Articles of Incorporation of said College, as amended:

ARTICLE A—OFFICERS: The officers of the board of Trustees shall be a Chairman, an Assistant Chairman, and a Secretary, each of whom shall be elected by the Board for a term of one year. They shall continue in office until their successors have been chosen:

Item 1—CHAIRMAN: The chairman of the Board of Trustees or his assistant shall preside at all meetings of the Board. He shall be an ex-officio member of the Executive Committee.

Item 2—SECRETARY: The Secretary shall record and preserve minutes of all meetings and acts of the Board of Trustees and countersign all deeds, conveyances, and other papers authorized by the Board. He shall have authority to call special meetings of the Trustees of the College upon the written request of two-thirds of the members of the Board; he shall mail notice of said meeting to the trustees ten (10) days in advance.

Item 3—EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE: The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, the Vice-Chairman of the Board, the Secretary of the Board. The Executive Committee shall have authority to consider and act upon all questions affecting the Bible College which may be brought before it between the stated meetings of the Board, or whenever it is deemed impractical to convene the entire Board, or a quorum of the Board fails to attend a called or regular meeting. It shall transact such business as may be committed to it by the Board and Shall act for the College on such matters as it may submit to it. The Committee shall meet at the call of the Chairman or the President of the College.

ARTICLE B—MEETINGS: The Board of Trustees shall meet each year at a time and place agreed upon by the Board. It shall, also, hold special meetings whenever called in accordance with the By-Laws of the Board. Such special meetings may be called by either the chairman of the Board, or the President of the College.

ARTICLE C—QUORUM: A majority of the members or the Board of Trustees of Oklahoma Bible College in attendance at any called or regular meeting, written notice of which has been mailed by the Secretary to each trustee, shall constitute a quorum. No proxy votes shall be permitted. No ex-officio member shall be entitled to vote at meetings of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE D—ELECTIONS: In all elections held by the Board of Trustees each member present except ex-officio members shall be entitled to one vote, and the result shall be determined by a majority of the votes cast. Due notice of any election must be personal notice to the members or a day on the minutes of the Board not less than one week preceding the election.

SECTION II

OFFICERS OF THE BIBLE COLLEGE

The officers of Oklahoma Bible College shall be a President, Vice-President, Dean, and a Business Manager, each of whom shall be elected by the Board of Trustees to hold office for two years exclusive of the President whose term of office shall be indefinite. It is provided, however, that retirement of any one of the officers herein named may occur at any time upon the resignation of the officer or the request of the Board. In either case, notice shall be given six weeks before the date of the proposed retirement unless otherwise agreed upon by the concerned parties.

ITEM ONE—PRESIDENT: The President shall be executive officer of the Board of Trustees and shall have general control of the College including its officers, teachers, students, and business. He shall render to the Board complete annual reports and to its chairman, Executive Committee or other committees such information as may be deemed essential to a thorough knowledge of the operation of the College and its promotion. He shall be a member of the Board of Trustees ex-officio and the Executive Committee ex-officio and shall have the rights and privileges of a member of the Board except voting. The President shall execute all documents, instruments, and conveyances on behalf of the College. Duties of the president and working relationship shall be further detailed in a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

ITEM TWO—VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice-President shall perform all the duties of the President in the absence of the latter.

ITEM THREE—DEAN: The Academic Dean of the Bible College shall, under the President, fix the hours of recitation, govern, control, and regulate the conduct of the students, have general oversight of curriculum, student's records, and such other internal details and administrative duties as may be delegated to him by the President of the College.

ITEM FOUR—BUSINESS MANAGER: The Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of all accounts of the College and shall receive and expend as directed by the Board of Trustees and President, all money for the expenses of the institution. He shall make an annual report to the Board and furnish the Executive Committee with such information pertaining to his office as may be requested. He shall provide bond in whatever amount the Board may require. Until such times as the Board of Trustees may deem different the Treasurer's office shall be contained within the Business Manager's Office. The Business Manager may at the direction of the administration designate this duty to a subordinate officer. The Business Manager shall have general supervision of the financial business of the College, and shall, at the direction of the President, be responsible for the upkeep of all

the physical facilities and premises of the College. His detailed duties are directed in a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

SECTION III

FACULTY

The faculty shall consist of the President, the Dean, and all teachers of Oklahoma Bible College. Instructors and assistant teachers shall have the privilege of sitting with the faculty in stated meetings but shall not have the right of voting.

It shall be the policy of the Oklahoma Bible College to employ on its faculty those who are members of Free Will Baptist churches that are affiliated with the National Association. Emergencies, however arising from the resignation, illness, death, or approved leaves of absence of faculty members may be relieved by the temporary employment of instructors who are affiliated with any evangelical denomination. Part-time or short-term instructors, deemed essential to the successful prosecution of a consistent education program, may be employed at the discretion of the President without respect of denominational affiliation.

The faculty, under the authority and jurisdiction of the President, shall have general charge of instruction, attendance of students, examinations, administration of curriculum, discipline, and all matters involving the spiritual, physical, and social welfare of the Bible College. The faculty shall be hired upon recommendation of the President.

In the selection of the faculty qualitative factors shall be kept in mind. All faculty members shall be urged to pursue graduate programs in their respective fields. Except in special cases no faculty member will be required to teach courses outside of his field.

SECTION IV

ACADEMIC COUNCIL

The Academic Council shall consist of the President, the Dean and the heads of the departments of Oklahoma Bible College: It shall determine the curriculum and academic policy of the College, prescribe requirements for admission, certificates, diplomas, and degrees, and supervise the courses of instruction offered by the various departments of the College.

SECTION V

CONTRACTS

The Board of Trustees shall establish the College policy involving the execution of contracts, deeds of conveyance, the determination of salaries, and employment of all officers, representatives, faculty members and essential domestic and maintenance employees. The President of the College shall negotiate agreements, executive contracts, employ representatives, and supply vacancies incurred by the termination of contracts, resignations, or death of any essential employees. All contracts for building

construction shall be let only to persons or corporations posting a valid performance bond and recording the same in the Office of the County Clerk of Cleveland County, Oklahoma.

SECTION VI

ADVISORY COUNCIL

An advisory council shall be formed which is to be composed of interested, qualified persons in the various fields which will be of value in building and maintaining a strong academic program to carry out the educational program stated in the charter.

SECTION VII

AMENDMENT

These By-Laws may be amended by a favorable vote of two-thirds of the qualified members of the Board of Trustees of Oklahoma Bible College at any meeting of the Board, provided that the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing to each Trustee one month in advance. This change to be subject to the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.

SECTION VIII

ADMINISTRATIVE FUNCTIONS

The President of the Oklahoma Bible College shall be elected by the Board of Trustees, and he shall act for and on behalf of the Board in the Conduct and management of the institution. He shall also be a member of the Board of Trustees ex-officio and of the Executive committee ex-officio, and his duties, powers and term of office shall be prescribed in the by-laws of the College and a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE

OKLAHOMA BIBLE COLLEGE INC.

Know all men by these presents, that, we whose names are hereunto subscribed, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the provisions of the corporation laws of the State of Oklahoma, and for that purpose state:

ARTICLE ONE

The name of this corporation shall be OKLAHOMA BIBLE COLLEGE, INC.

ARTICLE TWO

The purpose of this corporation shall be the creation, establishment and maintenance of a college and institution of higher learning devoted to the promotion and impartation of higher learning, Christian education and such other education, instruction, learning, training and research as may be

deemed essential for the cause of Christ and to that end prescribe courses of study and grant degrees. The doctrinal and theological position of this institution shall be that of the sponsoring denomination, Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and the treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptist as endorsed by the state body, and in connection therewith, in accordance with the stipulation of the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

(a.) To prescribe courses of study for both resident and correspondence students, which shall include general education in the arts, Christian Ministries of Service and Biblical studies for wisdom; said courses to be taught in both a Junior College Division and a Bible College Division, and to award degrees, either graduate or post-graduate, to those persons satisfactorily completing the prescribed courses of study and to grant such other literary honors, including honorary degrees, as shall be deemed advisable.

(b.) To charge and collect tuition as determined by the Board of Trustees and to create scholarships.

(c.) To employ professors, instructors and other subordinate employees as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the college under the direction and control of the President of the College, with the advice and consent of the majority of the Board of Trustees.

(d.) To institute and carry on missions and commissions for missionary purposes and investigations.

(e.) To publish and distribute such pamphlets, literature or books as may be required in the conduct of such work and the general promotion of the Bible College.

(f.) To sue and be sued in its corporate name and to enter into contracts of every type and nature.

(g.) To solicit support, receive, collect, hold and receive by gift or bequest personal property in any amount, money or other thing of value; to purchase real estate, to receive real estate that may be given, or devised to the college for achieving the legitimate ends of the college and to sell or mortgage the same as the need arises.

(h.) To borrow money in payment of property for erecting buildings and making improvements and for any other purpose germane to the objectives and purposes of the college.

(i.) To issue notes, bonds, debentures and other evidences of indebtedness and execute mortgages, liens and other incumbrances upon the property of the corporation, real or otherwise, to secure the payment of any such evidences of indebtedness.

(j.) To transact any and all business connected with said College as may be necessary to achieve the purposes of said College.

(k.) To obtain under Internal Revenue Laws of the United States and of the Revenue Laws of the State of Oklahoma exemption from income property and other forms of taxation.

ARTICLE THREE

The location of this corporation shall be in Norman, Oklahoma.

ARTICLE FOUR

The duration of this corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE FIVE

The general control of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of Trustees consisting of 15 members, 9 of which trustees shall be elected by the delegates to the annual Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists—each of which shall serve for a term of three years and until his successor is elected and qualified, and one member each shall be elected by the delegates to the annual meeting of the state association of Free Will Baptists of the States of Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico and Texas, each of which shall serve for a term of six years and until his successor is elected and qualified. Initially, the 9 trustees elected by said Oklahoma Association shall include 3 elected for three years, three elected for two years, and 3 elected for one year but their successors shall all be elected for a term of three years and until their successors are elected and qualified. Initially, said trustee elected by said Arkansas Association shall be elected for a term of six years, said trustee elected by said Colorado Association shall be elected for a term of five years, said trustee elected by said Kansas Association shall be elected for a term of four years, said trustee elected by said Missouri Association shall be elected for a term of three years, said trustee elected by said New Mexico Association shall be elected for a term of two years, and said trustee elected by said Texas Association shall be elected for a term of one year but their successors shall be elected for a term of six years. The Chairman of said Corporation shall be one of the trustees elected by said Oklahoma Association.

ARTICLE SIX

An executive committee consisting of the Chairman, Vice Chairman, and Secretary of the Board of Trustees shall possess all powers of the Board of Trustees between the stated meetings of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE SEVEN

All contracts for building construction shall be let only to persons or corporations posting a valid performance bond and recording the same in the office of the County Clerk of Cleveland, Oklahoma.

SECTION IX

AMENDMENTS

This charter may be hereafter amended subject to the provisions contained herein and the laws of the State of Oklahoma. It is provided, however, that the Trustees of the Bible College shall not propose or apply for any amendment which has not been previously authorized by an act of the Oklahoma State Association.

CONSTITUTION OF MINISTER'S CONFERENCE

ARTICLE 1

This Minister's Conference shall be called the Oklahoma State Free Will Baptist Minister's Conference, and shall be composed of Ordained Free Will Baptist Ministers who are regular members of some Orthodox Free Will Baptist church in the State of Oklahoma who have paid their \$1.00 dues.

ARTICLE 2

The officers for this conference shall be President, Vice-President, Clerk, Assist. Clerk and Treasurer, who shall be elected annually.

ARTICLE 3

This conference shall have the power to discipline its members.

ARTICLE 4

Members of this organization shall be all ordained ministers who participate in the benefits and activities of this body, and associate members who become members by payment of the \$1.00 annual dues.

ARTICLE 5

This conference shall meet Semi-Annually.

ARTICLE 6

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular session.

BY-LAWS OF MINISTER'S CONFERENCE

ARTICLE 1

The clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence the senior minister in years shall call the ministers into conference. If a quorum is present the President or in his absence the Vice-President shall moderate the meeting. If neither of these are present, the senior minister in years shall be in charge.

ARTICLE 2

It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the ministers of the conference. Ministers shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the conference. In case of questionable representation the case under question shall be referred to the Credential Committee.

ARTICLE 3

It shall be the duty of each minister belonging to this conference, to be active in pastoral or evangelistic services (disabled or retired ministers excepted). Any minister belonging to this conference shall report in each session in person or by letter, and failing to do so for two successive sessions shall be subject to discipline.

ARTICLE 4

Each conference shall be opened by reading a portion of God's word and prayer, and each session shall be closed with prayer.

ARTICLE 5

By a two-thirds vote of the members present ruling of the President may be overruled.

ARTICLE 6

This conference shall sit with open doors, except when it shall go into a committee as a whole.

ARTICLE 7

No member shall absent himself from the conference during its meeting without permission from the President.

ARTICLE 8

No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of a committee, unless person nominated is not elected.

ARTICLE 9

The President shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian Spirit, or when he thinks it will cause discord.

ARTICLE 10

Anyone desiring to speak shall rise and address the President by the appellation "Brother President," But shall not speak further until recognized.

ARTICLE 11

No member of this conference shall be allowed to speak more than five minutes, nor twice on the same subject without permission from the President.

ARTICLE 12

These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this conference by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

MINISTER'S CONFERENCE REPORT

The Oklahoma State Ministers Conference convened May 13, 1969 at the First Free Will Baptist Church Bristow, Oklahoma.

The Theme was: "O Come, let us worship and bow down" Psalm 95:6. The Meeting was called to order by Rev. F. A. McCage. Singing was led by Rev. Milburn Wilson. Devotion from Gen. 22:5 by Rev. Floyd Vulgamore. Welcome by the host Pastor Rev. Roma Stewart. There was two heart stirring messages by Rev. Albert Collier and Rev. Jerry Dudley and a 30-Minute Forum on Evangelism by Rev. Bailey Thompson. During the business session motion carried to request the Executive Secretary to register all Ministers at the State Meeting each year.

The Annual Meeting of the Oklahoma Ministers Conference convened at the West Tulsa Free Will Baptist Church in Tulsa October 14, 1969. The Theme was: "The Charge to the Ministry" 2 Tim. 4:1-4. The Meeting was called to order by Rev. F. A. McCage. Singing was led by Rev. Berton Perry. Devotion was given by Rev. Robert Shockey. The 10:00 o'clock message was by Rev. J. C. Morgan taken from 2 Tim. 4:1-4. Services were dismissed at 11 o'clock for the Ladies Auxiliary service at the Civic Center.

Afternoon session: Devotion by Rev. Herchel Hickman. National Insurance program was explained by Herman Hershey. Message by Rev. Clarence Shepherd "Why Preach" 1 Cor. 17:21.

At the business session a three-man committee was appointed to release a statement regarding the preaching of the everlasting Gospel. Rev. E. E. Morris, Rev. Jerry Dudley and Rev. Ray Gwartney were placed on this committee.

New Officers for the coming year: President—O. T. Dixon; Vice President—James Murray; Secretary-Treasure—Berton Perry; Asst. Sec. Treasure, J. B. Chism. The next meeting will be at the Clinton F. W. B. Church May 11, 1970.

ARTICLES OF FAITH OF STATE ASSOCIATION

1. THE BIBLE—The Scriptures of the Old and New Testament were given by the inspiration of God, and are our infallible rules of faith and practice.

2. GOD—There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver and Righteous Governor of the Universe, and in the Scriptures as the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.

3. CHRIST—Christ is God manifest in the flesh: in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified. He is now risen and glorified is our ever-present Saviour and Lord.

4. **THE HOLY SPIRIT**—The Scriptures assigns to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of all men.

5. **THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD**—God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of Grace, not otherwise provided for as highest welfare of man requires.

6. **THE SINFULNESS OF MAN**—Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore inherited a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.

7. **THE WORK OF CHRIST**—The Son of God, by His incarnation, life, suffering, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.

8. **THE WORK OF SALVATION**—The conditions of salvation are:
1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and the hearty renunciations of it.
2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit; freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God.
3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

9. **ELECTION**—God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ, men become His elect.

10. **FREEDOM OF WILL**—The Human will is free and self controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit and live, or to resist them and perish.

11. **SALVATION FREE**—God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

12. **PERSEVERENCE**—All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.

13. **BACKSLIDING AND APOSTASY**—A person who has been regenerated or born again and is living in unconfessed, unforgiven sin, is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and therefore is a backslider in a lost condition who must repent and be restored to the right relationship with God or be eternally lost.

We recognize, according to Hebrews 6: 4-6, that it is possible for a person to get in the condition that he could never return to Christ. This, we believe, is Apostasy. However, we also recognize that a regenerate person can fall into sin, be in a lost condition and still not be an Apostate. This person, through repentance, can be reconciled to God.

14. **GOSPEL ORDINANCES**—Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel: Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be administered to all true believers.

15. **TITHING**—God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament: Jesus Christ endorsed in the Gospel (Matt. 23: 23), and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." I Cor. 16: 2.

16. **THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH**—The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from the secular employment and amusements for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God.

17. **RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT, AND FINAL RETRIBUTION** — The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation: then the wicked shall "Go away into eternal punishment but the righteous into eternal life."

RULES OF ORDER

1. At every sitting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded by prayer by the Moderator or whomever he may request.

2. Ministers and deacons present are invited to seats, allowed to take part in debates on all subjects, and to vote.

3. Those who speak shall rise and address the Moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.

4. No motion may be discussed until made and seconded.

5. When a motion has been made and seconded, and a member opposes its discussion, the Moderator shall put the question. "Shall it be discussed?" if negative, the question shall not be discussed.

6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member, and the vote taken separately.

7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.

8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.

9. All questions shall be decided by a majority vote of all Members present.

BY LAWS OF STATE ASSOCIATION

1. The Clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence, the senior minister in years shall call the Association into conference, and if a quorum is present the moderator, or in his absence, the assistant moderator shall take charge; and if neither of them is present the senior minister in years shall act as Moderator.

2. It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the delegates to the Association, who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the Association.

3. It shall be the duty of every District belonging to this Association to send a letter to every annual session of this Association reporting in the same, spiritual condition, benevolent work, and its statistics. Any District belonging to this Association, which shall fail to report itself for two successive sessions, may be dismissed from the Association by a two thirds vote of all members present.

4. Each meeting shall be opened by reading a portion of the Bible and with prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.

5. By a two-thirds vote of members present, a ruling of the moderator can be overruled.

6. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.

7. This Association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.

8. Any person not a member of this Association may be allowed to take part in its discussions by obtaining permission from the moderator.

9. It shall be the duty of all the Association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting, and anyone wishing to retire shall first obtain leave of the moderator.

10. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee, provided the person nominated be elected.

11. The moderator shall not allow discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.

12. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise to his feet and address the moderator by the appellation "Brother Moderator," but shall not speak further until recognized by the moderator.

13. No member of this association shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes nor twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator.

14. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

CONSTITUTION OF STATE ASSOCIATION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptists denomination, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a church; and to preserve and maintain correspondence and co-ordination with us, do therefore ordain this Constitution for our better denomination government.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This organization shall be known as the OKLAHOMA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE: The object and purpose of this organization shall be to unify the work of the various bodies composing this State Association, and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in connection with the various bodies in the Association, or that may hereafter be represented therein.

ARTICLE III

REPRESENTATION: Section 1. This Association shall be composed of all ordained ministers and deacons with membership in some local church which is a member of a district Association with membership in the State Association.

Section 2: Each District Association shall be entitled to a number of elected delegates equal with the number of churches composing said Association. These delegates may be recommended by the local churches and shall be endorsed by their district association.

ARTICLE IV

FINANCE: Each elected delegate shall be represented with a fee of ten dollars.

ARTICLE V

DISCIPLINE: This State Association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine or practices that may properly come before it from any of the bodies composing said organization; furthermore, if there be any question of discipline, doctrine or practices on the part of an affiliated association, delegates of that association shall not be seated until these questions have been settled to the satisfaction of the General Board.

Section 2: Decisions of the General Board may be appealed in this manner. All appeals shall come before the State Association when sitting in a committee as a whole.

ARTICLE VI

OFFICERS: The officers of the State Association shall consist of a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary. Each of these shall be elected at the close of each regular session except the Executive Secretary, who shall be elected every two years. These officers shall serve as the program committee for the State Association.

Section 2. **COMMITTEES:** Committees as necessary shall be appointed by the moderator, unless otherwise provided for, and shall hold office until their work is completed or until their successors are elected.

ARTICLE VII

BOARDS: All standing boards shall be composed of seven (7) elected members who shall serve terms of 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1 years with such ex-officio members as may be provided elsewhere, except: (1) the General Board which shall be composed of one (1) member from each affiliated association, the chairman of each standing board, and the current general officers of this association, and (2) the College Board of Trustees which shall be composed as provided for in the Articles of Incorporation of Oklahoma Bible College, Inc.

The standing boards of this association shall be: Executive Board; Board of Church Extension, Missions and Evangelism; Sunday School Board; Church Training Service Board; and College Board of Trustees.

No standing board shall meet in a functional meeting during the session of this association.

ARTICLE VIII

DUTIES, SCOPE OF ENDEAVOR AND QUALIFICATIONS OF STANDING BOARDS

Section 1. **EXECUTIVE BOARD:** The Executive Board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of an affiliated association and in good standing with the association of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

It shall be the duty of this board to act in behalf of the association when it is not in session. It shall be bound to carry out the directions of the association and shall hold itself bound by every consideration of morality

and honor to carry out the wishes of this association and to act under its instructions in whatever technical rights, civil laws and the decisions of courts may give it in certain emergencies. It shall be the duty of this board to sign their signatures to any and all papers concerning properties, indebtedness, bonds, or other legal documents pertaining to the execution of the will of this association, exclusive of the College Board of Trustees and the Board of Church Extension, Missions and Evangelism.

This board shall have the oversight of the Executive Department of this association. The members shall assist and direct such work for the general promotion of this association as is deemed needful or necessary as the means available shall permit. The Executive Department shall serve as the coordinating agency of this association to correlate the work of all standing boards and agencies.

This board shall have the oversight of Free Will Baptist Book Store and shall endeavor to serve affiliated associations and churches and the community with literature and church supplies. Merchandising procedures shall be those accepted as normal retail procedures with the board being cognizant of the spiritual contribution of the store in distributing Christian literature.

All decisions of this board shall be governed by the general tenets of this association and shall not violate this constitution.

This board shall not incur indebtedness, sell or convey real property without the express direction of this association. This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, and work done and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Whereas this board represents the association when not in session, it and it alone shall have the power to call the association into special conference provided each affiliated association shall be given notice at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting of such special conference.

Section 2. GENERAL BOARD: This board shall be composed of one (1) member from each affiliated association, the chairman of each standing board, and the current general officers of this association. Each member must be a member of an affiliated association and in good standing with the association of which he is a member. The members shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to meet one (1) day preceeding the annual session of this association. This board shall serve as the credential committee with the duties and responsibilities assigned by Article V of this constitution. This board shall hear reports of all standing boards. It shall serve as budget committee and shall make such recommendations as deemed pertinent to this association. A complete and accurate record shall be kept of meetings of this board and a report shall be made in writing to this association in its annual session.

The moderator of the association shall serve as chairman of this board, and the clerk of the association shall serve as its clerk.

Section 3. BOARD OF CHURCH EXTENSION, MISSIONS AND EVANGELISM: This board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

It shall be the duty of this board to labor to further the Gospel of Jesus Christ into the uttermost parts of the earth. In accomplishing this, they are to endeavor to establish missions and churches in communities within the bounds of this association with whatever moral and financial assistance that may be theirs. In cases of small churches failing to function, whatever assistance deemed appropriate shall be rendered to maintain the effective witness of that church by either direct labor with the church or with an associational board in instances where the affiliated association has a functional board or agency.

This board shall be empowered to receive and convey title to real property in the area of its labors.

The promotion of missionary endeavors from a local, state or national level shall come within the scope of endeavor of this board. This board shall assist in maintaining prayer and financial support of missionary enterprises through whatever channels available.

Whereas missionary and evangelistic labors are so intimately related, this board shall assist through participation or assistance in maintaining a strong evangelistic thrust in the life of affiliated association.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Section 4. COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES: The College Board of Trustees shall be composed as provided for in the Articles of Incorporation of Oklahoma Bible College.

Oklahoma Bible College is an agency of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and is incorporated under the corporate laws of the State of Oklahoma. The articles of incorporation are a part of this association's record and delineate the purpose, duty and scope of endeavor of the members of this board.

Section 5. CHURCH TRAINING SERVICE BOARD: This board shall be composed of seven members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to plan and assist in organizing and sustaining a strong Church Training Service in every church in each association affiliated with this association with every means of promotion and assistance available to them. This board shall plan, coordinate and conduct state-wide youth camps or camp.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to

the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Section 6. SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD: This board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to plan and promote Sunday schools in every church in each association affiliated with this association. This board shall use every available means to promote Sunday school clinics, seminars, institutes and conventions on local, district and state-wide basis, working with local agencies to distribute and employ all effective methods and material available.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Section 7. VACANCIES: Vacancies shall occur when a member moves from the territorial bounds of this association, by death, by resignation or by removal from office by this association. In the event of disciplinary action where charges concerning misconduct, doctrine or practice shall have been lodged against a member of any board, his office shall be held in abeyance until such charges shall be concluded or as determined by this association.

All boards shall have power to fill vacancies arising between sessions of this association. Such appointment shall terminate at the next session of the association and shall be filled by this association.

Section 8. EMPLOYEES: All employees of boards or agencies of this association shall be employed by agreement or contract with employing board or agency upon approval of this association except those elected by this association and the conditions of their employment shall be those approved by this association.

The duties of the Executive Secretary of this association shall be:

- (1) He is to represent, or cause to be represented, the association at all affairs of interest to the association.
- (2) He is to promote the work of the association in such a manner so as to unify the efforts of the association.
- (3) He is to serve with all standing boards and committees of the association in an ex-officio capacity.
- (4) He is to aid in planning the work of the association by relating the activities and plans of one board to another.
- (5) He is to report to the association during each annual session.

- (6) He is to communicate to the affiliated members of this association the pressing causes and events before the association. This can be in person, or by means of a periodical bulletin or both.
- (7) He shall serve as treasurer of this association. An accurate and complete record of all funds received and disbursed shall be kept and a written report shall be included in his report to this association in its annual session.
- (8) The conditions of employment shall be determined by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE IX

DISSOLUTION: Should this association cease to function, all properties and holdings shall go to the National Association of Free Will Baptists after all creditors are satisfied and indebtedness cleared.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS: This constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session of the association by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of members present and voting, provided proposed amendment or alteration be presented in writing to the body one (1) day in advance.

ARTICLE XI

SPECIAL SESSIONS: Elected delegates to the last session of this association shall be retained as standing delegates for special called sessions.
