The 63rd annual session of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists met in the McMahon auditorium, Lawton, Oklahoma, October 19-21, 1971. Ted Wilbanks served as music director, and Debbie Dudley served as pianist for the convention.

The opening song was "All Hail the Power," after which Charlie

Christian led in the opening prayer.

The New Life Singers from Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College sang two

songs. The congregation then sang "Stand Up for Jesus."

The clerk called the association into official session and introduced the officers.

Bailey Thompson brought the moderator's message from I Corinthians 4:1.

Ronnie Lyles, pastor of the Brockland Free Will Baptist Church, Lawton, welcomed the congregation to Dibble Association and to the city of Lawton.

N. R. Smith, representing the National Sunday School Department, presented a plaque and a gift certificate to John H. West in honor of 25 years of service on the National Sunday School Board.

An offering was received to help with the expense of the convention.

The New Life Singers came back to sing two other songs.

Carl Hembree, Locust Grove pastor, was introduced to bring the message of the evening. The title of the message was "Faithful Stewards of our Abilities." The scripture reading was from Luke 19:11-27.

Item 3, of the General Board report was read which recommended the acceptance of the Tulsa Metropolitan Association into the State Association. This item was adopted.

Item 4, of the General Board report was read and accepted. This item recommended a Credential Committee to meet with the newly formed Fellowship Association. (See General Board report.)

A motion carried to adopt the program leaving the time element flexible.

The following committees were appointed: Resolution Committee; Delbert Akin, Rick Duncan, Ernest Harrison Jr., O. T. Dixon, and F. A. McCage: Temperance Committee; John H. West, Ronnie Lyles, Lewis Maxwell, Jess Stepp, and James Robertson: Placement Committee; Jerry Dudley, Dugan McDonald, Buddy Drake, James Murray, and Ray Gwartney; Obituary Committee; Roma Stewart, Sherman Webb, Richard Rust, Carl Hembree, and Carl Shivers.

Milburn Wilson gave the report of the Sunday School Board. A motion carried to accept the report. Wyman Straughn was elected as the 7 year member of the Sunday School Board.

A motion carried to adjourn for the worship service and then the lunch

A motion carried to declare the 5 year position vacant on the Mission Board since Gayle Gardner, who filled this position, has had his credentials revoked.

David Sutton was elected as the 5 year member of the Mission Board. James Murray, board member, gave the report of the National Foreign Missions Department.

Roy Thomas spoke in behalf of the National Home Missions

Department.

Clarence Shepherd gave the report of the Executive Board. A motion

carried to adopt the report.

Item No. 8 of the General Board report was read. A motion was made and seconded to adopt this item. A motion was made and seconded to amend Item No. 8 by making this a permanent way of selecting an Executive Secretary. The amendmane and The main motion carried as amended.

John H. West was elected as the 7 year member of the Executive Board.

Homer Young gave the report of the Executive Secretary. A motion carried to accept the report along with Item No. 11 of the General Board report which recommended giving commendation to Homer Young for his faithful service as Executive Secretary.

The Book Store report was given by Homer Young. A motion carried to adopt the report.

Ray Martin, new manager of the book store, brought greetings to the body.

Rufus Coffey, National Executive Secretary, brought a report from the National Executive Department.

Paul Ketteman was introduced to bring a report of Hillsdale Free Will

Baptist College.

Items No. 1 and No. 2 of the Resolution Committee report were read. A motion carried to table these items.

After announcements were made, the meeting adjourned. Allen Wood

led in the closing prayer.

Wednesday night was Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College night. Ernest Harrison presided. The congregation sang, "Jesus Saves," after which Rue Dell Smith led in prayer.

Derrell Clark, student body president, presented plaques to Mr. and Mrs. Dan Farmer and Mrs. and Mrs. Eugene Workman for their faithful service to the school. A standing ovation was given Mr. Farmer. The Workmans were not present so this plaque was given to Rufus Coffey who would present it to the Workmans.

The congregation sang "Amazing Grace."

The Hillsdale College choir sang "Now Sing We Joyfully Unto God," "There's a Sweet Sweet Spirit in this Place," "The Lion of Judah," and "The Saviour is Waiting."

An offering was received for the general fund of Hillsdale College. Charles Bigger led in prayer. After announcements, the service was closed with prayer by James Murray.

A report of the Credential Committee from the General Board was read recommending that the Fellowship Association be accepted into the State Association. A motion carried to accept the report.

Roma Stewart was elected as the 7 year member of the CTS Board.

A motion carried to accept the resignation of David Sutton from the CTS board.

Gary Dodson was elected as the 2 year member of the CTS Board.

Buddy Drake was elected as the 3 year member of the CTS Board.

Ernest Harrison Sr. gave the report of the National Retirement and Insurance Department.

James Murray gave the report of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. Rick Young, student from Hillsdale, gave a testimony. Bill Jones, president of Hillsdale, added to the report by discussing the future building plans. A motion carried to accept the report.

Members were elected to the College Board of Trustees. Three year members elected were Ernest Harrison Sr., Howard Gwartney, and Wesley Jarman. Rue Dell Smith was elected to replace Jerry Rhoades who has accepted a position with the school.

The members of the General Board were elected as nominated by their respective associations, (See General Board listed in front of minutes.)

The meeting was adjourned for the morning worship service.

The congregation sang "To God be the Glory," and "Onward Christian Soldiers," to open the worship service, Debbie Dudley sang a special song.

Dugan McDonald was introduced to bring the message on "Stewardship of our Time." He read John 9:4 as his text.

After announcements were made, the benediction was prayed by Odie

The Thursday afternoon session opened with a devotion by Gerald Mangham, Chaplain stationed at Ft. Sill. He read Psalm 37:3-7, and led in prayer.

Items No. 9 and No. 10 of the General Board report were read. A motion was made and seconded to adopt these item by item. Item No. 9 was adopted.

A motion to amend No. 10 by substituting last year's percentages as the percentages of dividing the cooperative receipts for the year 1972-73. The

substitute motion carried.

Items No. 1 and No. 2 of the resolution committee report were read. Item No. 1 was adopted. It was ruled that the moderator would have a vote only on the board to which he was elected, and be ex-officio member on all boards, but without a vote. This ruling was sustained by the body.

Resolution No. 2 was adopted. The committee that resolution No. 2 called for to revise Article VI of the constitution consists of Homer

Young, Clarence Shepherd, and Jerry Dudley.

Resolution No. 3 was adopted. The moderator ruled that this resolution pertains to only out of state business when the moderator is representing the state.

A motion carried that if the moderator attends meetings of the state boards as an ex-officio member, that the board whose meeting he attends pay his expense.

Resolutions No. 4, No. 5, and No. 6 were adopted.

The report of the placement committee recommending that we meet in McAlester in 1973, was read and adopted.

The report of the temperance committee was read and adopted.

The obituary committee report was read and adopted.

A motion carried to take from the table item No. 7, of the General Board report. The item was adopted.

A motion carried to give the state officers a rising vote of thanks for

their faithful service.

The following officers were elected: Odie Nunley, assistant clerk; Waldo Young, clerk; Ernest Harrison Sr., assistant moderator; and Bailey Thompson, moderator.

A motion carried to adjourn. Clarence Shepherd led in the closing

prayer.

The Ministers Quartet sang "When God Dips His Love In My Heart."

Clarence Shepherd, pastor of the Clinton church, brought the message based on Acts 1:12-14.

# REPORT OF THE STATE MISSION BOARD TO THE CALLED SESSION OF OKLAHOMA STATE ASSOCIATION, April 17, 1971

The State Mission Board presents the following resolutions:

1. BE IT RESOLVED: That the officers of Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc. be and they are hereby authorized to purchase the following described real property situated in Oklahoma County, State of Oklahoma:

The NE1/4 of the SE1/4 of the SE1/4 of Section 17, Township 13, North, Range 3 West of the I.B. & M. in Oklahoma County, Oklahoma, EXCEPT the W 20 feet of the South 310 feet of the North 330 feet of the NE1/4 of the SE1/4 of the SE1/4 and EXCEPT 16 feet of the North side thereof, which has been conveyed for road purposes.

and they are further authorized to borrow the sum of Twenty-six Thousand and Five Hundred Dollars (\$26,500.00) repayable with interest of Ten (10) per cent per annum in equal monthly installments of Three Hundred Dollars (\$300.00) commencing one month after the date of said loan is completed, and said officers be and they are hereby authorized to execute a first real estate mortgage in said amount in favor of the payee of said note covering the following described property:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That all actions heretofore taken by the said officers in obtaining credit in behalf of Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., in the exercise of the authority and power herein granted are hereby ratified and adopted and confirmed.

- 2. BE IT RESOLVED: That the officers of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc., be and they are hereby authorized to purchase two portable buildings to be used for worship services on property purchased on Western Avenue in Oklahoma City, and they are further authorized to borrow the sum of Fifty-seven Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$5,750.00) from the Capitol Hill State Bank and Trust of Oklahoma City to be repaid with interest in equal installments of \$130.00 per month.
- 3. The following budget was adopted for the above project:
  - \$11,230.00 Mission Worker (Salary, Travel, and Benefits).

3,600.00 Payment on loan on the land.

1,800.00 Miscellaneous Expense (Board travel, Evangelism Conference, etc.)

1,800.00 Payment on buildings.

\$18,430.00 Total Budget

## GENERAL BOARD REPORT

The General Board of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists met Monday, October 18, 1971, in the McMahon Auditorium, Lawton, and as a result of this meeting we offer the following items for your consideration.

- 1. Letters were read from the fifteen district associations that make up this state association and found to be in order. We recommend that these letters be received, the delegates seated, and the requests for the 1973 session of the state association be given to the placement committee.
- 2. A petitionary letter was read from the Green Country Association of Free Will Baptists. We recommend that this association be received into the Oklahoma State Association and their delegates seated.
- A petitionary letter was read from the Tulsa Metropolitan Area Association of Free Will Baptists. We recommend that this association be received into the Oklahoma State Association and their delegates seated
- 4. A petitionary letter was read from the Fellowship Association of Free Will Baptists. Whereas the State Executive Board was not a part of their organizational meeting as was the case in the other two, therefore a Credentials Committee was appointed from the General Board to meet with representatives from this association and bring a recommendation to this state convention. The committee was Clarence Shepherd, James Murray, E. E. Morris, Delbert Akin, and John H. West,
- 5. The reports of the Sunday School Board, the Executive Board, the Executive Secretary, the Book Store, the CTS Board, and the Board of Trustees of the Hillsdale College were heard, and we recommend their adoption as they are given.

 The report of the State Mission Board was read. Item No. 1 will be dealt with in the report of the budget. We recommend that item No. 2 be postponed indefinitely. We recommend that item No. 3 be adopted. 7. We recommend that the constitution of the state association be amended in Article VIII, Section 1, by deleting from the second paragraph the words "and the Board of Church Extension, Missions and Evangelism;" and by deleting from the sixth paragraph the words "This board shall not incur indebtedness, sell or convey real property without the express direction of this association."

8. We recommend that the Executive Board secure a man to serve as Executive Secretary, and that this be a permanent way of selecting the

Executive Secretary.

9. We recommend that the cooperative plan budget be set at \$62,500.00 for the year 1972-73.

10. We recommend that the cooperative funds be divided as follows:

National Association 43% State Mission Board 05%
State Executive Department 28% State Sunday School 02%
Hillsdale FWB College 23% CTS Board 01%

11. We recommend that this body go on record as giving commendation to Homer Young for his faithful service as Executive Secretary.

#### REPORT OF THE SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD

The Sunday School Board met 8 times during the past year. The board sponsored or assisted in three Area Conventions and four Institutes this year. The Board traveled over 10,000 miles across the state to promote Sunday School work this year.

The board is attempting to keep pace with the changing methods and concepts regarding Christian Education and the general ministry of the Sunday School in the overall mission of the church. Many schools are experiencing a substantial growth resulting from the implementation of such things as the bus ministry, new concepts in teaching and updating the Sunday School administration in general.

We request that the Sunday School Board continue to receive 2% of the

cooperative receipts for the next year.

### STATE MISSION BOARD REPORT

The board has met thirteen times during the past year.

In keeping with the projected plans as proposed in our last report, we have taken on a new dimension in our approach to mission work in the state. Instead of trying to spread our resources too thinly we have

attempted to concentrate our efforts in as few places as possible.

C. E. P. BORN As a result of our thinking along this line, the Church Establishment (CEP) has come into being. We of the mission board are hoping that with this program we will be able to establish at least one church in a densely populated area of our state each year. We know this is a lofty goal; however, with the enthusiastic response of the people of our state this goal can easily be realized.

C. E. P. '71 The first effort of the mission board under the Church Establishment Program has been the establishment of a mission in North

Oklahoma City.

From the very beginning we have felt the leading of the Lord in this effort. As we prayed the door opened in the Oklahoma City area for our first project. Land was located through the efforts of the mission board, the promotional secretary, and the First Oklahoma Association pastors. Money was found for the project, and God supplied the leader for the effort in the form of one of our own mission board members, Brother Bob Duncan.

Of course we have not been without problems. Seemingly, impossible hurdles have been leaped. With the enthusiastic response of our people we are glad to report that services are being held weekly on the property. We of the mission board have been elated at the response of our state to this project.

This, however, is not the only area in which we have been busy.

EVANGELISM CONFERENCE. The boardlaunchedtheir second annual evangelism conference April 19–21, 1971, in the South Grand River Association at the Shellenbarger Church. We feel it is our responsibility to do all we can in our state to promote missions and inspire our ministers and laymen to win souls.

Our next evangelism conference is being planned for April, 1972, and

will be held in the First Free Will Baptist Church of Ada, Oklahoma.

HARTSHORNE We are glad to report that two of our board members were present in the organizational service of the Hartshorne Mission. We now have a going church in the area.

PLAZA TOWERS The board authorized the sale of the Plaza Towers

property to the Calvary Chapel of Moore,

STATE MISSIONARY HIRED. Brother Bob Duncan was hired as our

state missionary and put in charge of our C.E.P. '71 project.

STATE ASKED TO CONSIDER We have long looked on the acres and acres of TV antennas with no Free Will Baptist steeple among them. We have long wept over these people in our thickly populated areas but have done precious little toward establishing churches among them. We feel that we are "way behind" in obeying Jesus' command to go into all the world and preach the Gospel. We, as your state mission board, feel that we must do all we can and call upon our people to do all they can to obey the Lord in getting the Gospel to as many people as possible in our day.

In the light of the great needs we recommend the following to our state

for consideration:

1. The mission board requests 10% of the cooperative receipts to support the mission program for the next year.

2. Permission be granted to incorporate the Board of Church Extension, Missions and Evangelism according to the laws of Oklahoma.

3. That we be allowed to proceed with plans to borrow \$35,000 to erect a permanent building on our church property in North Oklahoma City.

#### HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE

The outstanding event of this associational year for our college was the accreditation by The Oklahoma Regents for Higher Education, officially declaring Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College an accredited junior college. Other activities transpired to make this the busiest and most profitable years in the life of the school.

Upon his resignation from the office of president, Dr. O'Donnell left the school at the end of the spring semester, the Board of Trustees, after prayerful consultation and then under what we believe to be the direct leadership of the Holy Spirit, employed Rev. Bill M. Jones as president. Our new president comes to us with outstanding credentials, both in the educational and missionary fields of service. We look upon him as one of our denominations most outstanding churchmen, and feel that he will offer the structured leadership necessary for our Christian liberal arts junior college.

Another item that demands our praise to God relating to our present situation is the fact that we have now reached a new high in full-time enrollment. A total of 86 students enrolled this semester (60 freshmen, 16 sophomores and 10 special students) with 59 staying in the dormitories.

A look at the future prompted the Board of Trustees and the president to carefully analyze the feasibility of launching a new building program. Therefore, on August 27, 1971, the Trustees did initiate the program that is being presented to this State meeting, which may result in a \$150,000 building program. Although we state here that it will be an activities building, including a modern cafeteria, we are looking to the building committee for complete details.

The following reports will reveal the present needs for the continued success of our college:

The proposed budget for 1972-73, \$258,800.00; 1973-74, \$300,000.00

The academic committee is now in the process of upgrading the curriculum to meet the guidelines specified by the accrediting association.

It may be well also to acknowledge that we will move into a third and fourth year program in Bible education according to the timetable now being prepared by the academic committee of the Board of Trustees.

# RESOLUTION COMMITTEE REPORT

- 1. Article VI of the constitution, page 52, section one under officers: Be it resolved that it be amended to include the following statement: "That the moderator shall be an ex-officio member of all standing boards."
- Be it resolved that Article VI in regard to election of an Executive Secretary be suspended for this session, and this officer be hired by the Executive Board.
   Be it further resolved that a constitutional revision committee be appointed to revise Article VI of the constitution in regard to the

selection of an Executive Secretary.

3. Be it resolved that the Executive Board be authorized to pay necessary expenses of the moderator when on official business for the state

association.

4. Whereas the financial support program of the denomination is vital to the success of every board and agency both in the state and national association, and whereas there has been considerable concern, and some problems have been encountered in this area.

Be it therefore resolved that a study committee on financial support consisting of one member from each standing board and agency of the state association along with the Executive Secretary, who shall serve as chairman, be authorized to study the needs of the denominational support structure in the local church, the district, state, and national bodies. This committee shall report back to the 1972 session with its findings along with any recommendations which the committee deems advisable and appropriate.

5. Be it resolved that this state association endorse and actively support the vote for a uniform day of rest in Oklahoma which will be on the

state ballot December 7.

6. Be it resolved that this association give a rising vote of appreciation to the Dibble Association, the two churches in Lawton, and to the City of Lawton, for the hospitality shown and for the fine facilities that have been made available.

# OBITUARY COMMITTEE REPORT

We, the obituary committee, report the passing of 180 members according to records. We recommend that each association report the names of ministers deceased that they may be rendered special honor by our association; We further recommend that this convention pause for prayer in memory of those who have departed this life and our fellowship.

#### TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

We the Temperance Committee recommend the following:

- 1. That our churches cooperate with the Sooner Alcoholic and Narcotic Education, Inc., in a financial way, and that our pastors warn their people, especially the youth, of the dangers of using narcotics, barbituates, glue-sniffing, or any harmful drugs.
- 2. That we go on record as being opposed to the use or sale of tobacco in any form, and that our ministers set the example of total abstinence.
- 3. That our churches conform to a more modest dress using I Peter 3:3-7 as our guide.
- 4. That we go on record as being opposed to any type of gambling, whether raffles, pari-mutuel betting, questionable contests, and card playing.
- 5. That we go on record as being opposed to pornography, and that we do all possible to stop the sale and distribution of this type of literature.
- 6. That we stand opposed to the teaching of sex education in the public schools because of the lack of moral application.
- 7. That our people encourage their grocery store to delete alcoholic beverages from their shelves.
- 8. That we, the state association, go on record that we do not support liquor by the drink.

# OKLAHOMA STATE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY CONVENTION CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

#### ARTICLE I

# NAME

This organization shall be known as the Oklahoma State Woman's Auxiliary Convention.

# ARTICLE II

### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this convention shall be to bring the women of each district convention together for fellowship, sharing information, and encouraging one another in the work of the Lord.

#### ARTICLE III

# **OFFICERS**

The officers of this convention shall be a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and field worker. These shall serve on the state executive committee together with three members elected by the convention as desired. These shall serve for a period of 2 years.

#### ARTICLE IV

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

This convention shall be composed of the officers of the convention together with each active auxiliary member of the district or local (duly accredited by the credentials committee).

#### ARTICLE V

#### MEETINGS

The annual meeting shall be held each year on the day preceding the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and at the place designated by said association.

# ARTICLE VI

#### AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a two-thirds vote of members present.

#### BY-LAWS

# ARTICLE I

# DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1, President. The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed, call the executive committee together when necessary, be ex-officio member of all committees, and serve as chairman of the executive committee, see that reports are made

promptly to the national secretary and perform all duties usually

pertaining to such an office.

Section 2, Vice President. The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the overseeing of the work in general.

Section 3, Secretary. The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and executive committee meetings, preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor in office, and make an annual report to the national secretary on a form available from the WNAC office. She shall compile the districts slates of officers and addresses immediately after the convention. She shall also send a slate of state officers and addresses to the national executive secretary. She is chairman of the Credentials Committee.

The secretary shall also serve as historian keeping an historical record and submitting historical information to the national executive secretary

annually.

Section 4. Treasurer. The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account and shall give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She shall also send an annual report to the WNAC office (executive secretary-treasurer) at least ten days before the end of the fiscal year. She shall encourage support of missions through the WNAC Gift Plan, individual giving and special offerings.

Section 5, Field Worker. The field worker shall have charge of all field work pertaining to, or necessary to, the promotion of the work of the convention and keep the national program before the district officers.

#### ARTICLE II

# **ELECTIONS**

The general officers shall be nominated by a nominating committee and shall be elected by acclamation, unless there are other nominations. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken on each. All elections shall be held at the closing business session of the convention.

#### ARTICLE III

#### **EXPENSES**

Section 1. An appropriation of 6 cents per mile toward the expense of the general officers, when called upon to attend the executive committee meeting to plan program, secretary's expenses, phone calls, postage and stationery for officers will be paid by the convention. All field promotional work is subject to the state executive committee, who should approve all work done by state officers in the interest of state work, as well as expenses of the same.

Section 2. An amount of \$50.00 shall be paid on the expense of the

state president to attend WNAC.

# ARTICLE IV

#### COMMITTEES

Section 1. Executive Committee — The executive committee shall be composed of the five officers and three members elected by the convention. Five of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the executive committee to maintain an overseeing of the work at large. They shall act for the convention when necessary. They

shall meet with district presidents night preceding the state auxiliary convention.

Section 2. Resolutions Committee — A resolutions committee of five

members shall be appointed by the president as needed.

Section 3. Nominating Committee — The nominating committee shall be composed of at least one member from each district convention. Nominations shall be submitted by district with their annual report. These elected by the body at the annual meeting.

Section 4. Credentials Committee — The secretary shall be chairman of the credentials committee, and other members may be appointed by the president. The treasurer shall be a standing member of this committee.

Section 5. Finance Committee — The finance committee shall be appointed by the president. This committee audits the financial records of the year and reports on same to the convention.

Section 6. Student Loan Committee — State Auxiliary President and 2 elected members to serve 2 years each. They shall be elected on alternate

Section 7. Registration committee shall be provided by the district convention which is host to state convention.

# ARTICLE V

# FEES AND REPORTS

Active members shall pay dues of \$1.25 per year. With 25 cents remaining in the district. \$1.00 to be forwarded to state where 25 cents shall be retained, and 75 cents forwarded to WNAC as required for membership fees. It shall be the duty of each body directly affiliated with the State Auxiliary Convention to send a report to every annual session.

#### ARTICLE VI

# AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of members present at regular meeting of the state auxiliary convention.

#### ARTICLE VII

#### **GIFTS**

The desired plans for giving in the Woman's Auxiliary are those adopted by WNAC as follows:

1. Mission offerings following each special season of prayer

2. Co-Laborer offering (monthly or quarterly designated to WNAC General Fund)

3. WNAC Emphasis Month in August or other time more convenient to help in support of WNAC General Fund

4. Memorial Student Loan Fund (special program and offering in September to assist worthy and needy students at FWBBC in Nashville)

 Trinity College Student Loan Fund. (Special program and offering in September to assist worthy and needy students at Trinity College)

6. Tithes - Pay tithes on all undesignated money received

7. All offerings are to be forwarded through regular channels

# ARTICLE VIII

#### WNAC DELEGATE

Each district convention shall submit one nomination for a State delegate to WNAC with their annual report. This nomination (along with others as needed to make up 15 delegates to WNAC) shall be elected by the body at the annual meeting. It shall be the duty of delegates elected to notify president if they cannot attend WNAC. President shall appoint delegates as needed in absence of regularly elected delegates.

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# CONSTITUTION

# Preamble

The purpose of the Free Will Baptist Master's Men, state of Oklahoma is to provide a means of Christian fellowship and to deepen the spiritual lives of the laymen of the local church. Also, to provide a means of developing the abilities and talents of the laymen, and to promote the cause of Christ through a complete, "total church program", as prescribed by Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.

# ARTICLE I

#### Name

The name of this organization shall be known as the Free Will Baptist Master's Men, State of Oklahoma.

### ARTICLE II

# Membership

Section 1. The membership of this organization shall be composed of the district associations of Master's Men, and any local chapters where there is only one chapter in the district, within the state of Oklahoma.

Section 2. Every member in good standing of an affiliated district association of Master's Men, or any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, is entitled to the full benefits of membership.

Section 3. Each district association, or any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, shall submit an annual, written report to this body, (as a matter of information).

## ARTICLE III

# Officers

The officers of this organization shall consist of a president, vice-president and a secretary-treasurer.

The officers of this organization shall be elected annually and may succeed themselves, at this level,

# ARTICLE IV

#### Executive Committee

Section 1. The executive committee shall consist of the elected officers of this organization and they shall serve as the program committee for each annual convention.

Section 2. Ex-officio members of the executive committee shall be the presidents of the district associations of Master's Men, presidents of any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, and the state executive secretary of the State Association of Free Will Baptists.

# ARTICLE V

Meetings

This organization shall meet annually at 7:30 PM on the Monday night before the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists convenes.

# ARTICLE VI

# Amendments

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of any regular meeting.

BY-LAWS

Voting Rights

Section 1. Every member of each affiliated district association, or any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, is eligible to vote on all questions and matters that might come before the Free Will Baptist Master's Men, State of Oklahoma.

#### Committees

Section 2. The executive committee shall transact all routine business and shall act for the organization in the interim between meetings,

Section 3. The executive committee shall meet at the call of the president. Section 4. A nominating committee, for the annual election of officers, shall be composed of the presidents of each district association, and the president of any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district.

Section 5. The president shall appoint all other committees, subject to the approval of the body.

#### Finance

Section 6. This organization shall be financed on the basis of offerings, dues and assessments.

#### Quorum

Section 7. One-tenth of the members of this organization shall constitute a quorum at any regular meeting.

#### Amendments

Section 8. These bylaws may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

# HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC. BY-LAWS BOARD OF TRUSTEES

#### SECTION I

The Board of Trustees of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc., an Oklahoma corporation, shall be composed of fifteen members, elected as provided in the Articles of Incorporation of said College, as amended:

ARTICLE A—OFFICERS: The officers of the board of Trustees shall be a Chairman, an Assistant Chairman, and a Secretary, each of whom shall be elected by the Board for a term of one year. They shall continue in office until their successors have been chosen:

Item 1—CHAIRMAN: The chairman of the Board of Trustees or his assistant shall preside at all meetings of the Board. He shall be an ex-officio member of the Executive Committee.

Item 2—SECRETARY: The Secretary shall record and preserve minutes of all meetings and acts of the Board of Trustees and countersign all deeds, conveyances, and other papers authorized by the Board. He shall have authority to call special meetings of the Trustees of the College upon the written request of two-thirds of the members of the Board; he shall mail notice of said meeting to the trustees ten (10) days in advance.

Item 3—EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE: The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, the Vice-Chairman of the Board, the Secretary of the Board. The Executive Committee shall have authority to consider and act upon all questions affecting the College which may be brought before it between the stated meetings of the Board, or whenever it is deemed impractical to convene the entire Board, or a quorum of the Board fails to attend a called or regular meeting. It shall transact such business as may be committed to it by the Board and shall act for the College on such matters as it may submit to it. The Committee shall meet at the call of the Chairman or the President of the College.

ARTICLE B—MEETINGS: The Board of Trustees shall meet each year at a time and place agreed upon by the Board. It shall, also, hold special meetings whenever called in accordance with the By-Laws of the Board. Such special meetings may be called by either the chairman of the Board, or the President of the College.

ARTICLE C-QUORUM: A majority of the members or the Board of Trustees of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc. in attendance at any called or regular meeting, written notice of which has been mailed by the Secretary to each trustee, shall constitute a quorum. No proxy votes shall be permitted. No ex-officio member shall be entitled to vote at meetings of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE D—ELECTIONS: In all elections held by the Board of Trustees each member present except ex-officio members shall be entitled to one vote, and the result shall be determined by a majority of the votes cast. Due notice of any election must be personal notice to the members or a day on the minutes of the Board not less than one week preceding the election.

#### SECTION II

## OFFICERS OF HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE

The officers of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College shall be a President, Vice-President, Dean, and a Business Manager, each of whom shall be elected by the Board of Trustees to hold office for two years exclusive of the President whose term of office shall be indefinite. It is provided, however, that retirement of any one of the officers herein named may occur at any time upon the resignation of the officer or the request of the Board. In either case, notice shall be given six weeks before the date of the proposed retirement unless otherwise agreed upon by the concerned parties.

ITEM ONE—PRESIDENT: The President shall be executive officer of the Board of Trustees and shall have general control of the College including its officers, teachers, students, and business. He shall render to the Board complete annual reports and to its chairman, Executive Committee or other committees such information as may be deemed essential to a thorough knowledge of the operation of the College and its promotion. He shall be a member of the Board of Trustees ex-officio and the Executive Committee ex-officio and shall have the rights and privileges of a member of the Board except voting. The President shall execute all documents, instruments, and conveyances on behalf of the College. Duties of the president and working relationship shall be further detailed in a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

ITEM TWO-VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice-President shall perform all

the duties of the President in the absence of the latter.

ITEM THREE—DEAN: The Academic Dean of the College shall, under the President, fix the hours of recitation, govern, control, and regulate the conduct of the students, have general oversight of curriculum, student's records, and such other internal details and administrative duties as may be

delegated to him by the President of the College.

ITEM FOUR—BUSINESS MANAGER: The Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of all accounts of the College and shall receive and expend as difected by the Board of Trustees and President, all money for the expenses of the institution. He shall make an annual report to the Board and furnish the Executive Committee with such information pertaining to his office as may be requested. He shall provide bond in whatever amount the Board may require. Until such times as the Board of Trustees may deem different the Treasurer's office shall be contained within the Business Manager's Office. The Business Manager may at the direction of the administration designate this duty to a subordinate officer. The Business Manager shall have general supervision of the financial business of the College, and shall, at the direction of the President, be responsible for the upkeep of all the physical facilities and premises of the College. His detailed duties are directed in a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

# SECTION III

#### **FACULTY**

The faculty shall consist of the President, the Dean, and all teachers of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. Instructors and assistant teachers shall have the privilege of sitting with the faculty in stated meetings but shall not have the right of voting.

It shall be the policy of the College to employ on its faculty those who are members of Free Will Baptist churches that are affiliated with the National Association. Emergencies, however arising from the resignation, illness, death, or approved leaves of absence of faculty members may be relieved by the temporary employment of instructors who are affiliated with any evangelical denomination. Part-time or short-term instructors, deemed essential to the successful prosecution of a consistent education program, may be employed at the discretion of the President without respect of denominational affiliation.

The faculty, under the authority and jurisdiction of the President, shall have general charge of instruction, attendance of students, examinations, administration of curriculum, discipline, and all matters involving the spiritual, physical, and social welfare of the College. The faculty shall be

hired upon recommendation of the President.

In the selection of the faculty qualitative factors shall be kept in mind. All faculty members shall be urged to pursue graduate programs in their respective fields. Except in special cases no faculty member will be required to teach courses outside of his field.

#### SECTION IV

#### ACADEMIC COUNCIL

The Academic Council shall consist of the President, the Dean and the heads of the departments of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College: It shall determine the curriculum and academic policy of the College, prescribe requirements for admission, certificates, diplomas, and degrees, and supervise the courses of instruction offered by the various departments of the College.

#### SECTION V

#### CONTRACTS

The Board of Trustees shall establish the College policy involving the execution of contracts, deeds of conveyance, the determination of salaries, and employment of all officers, representatives, faculty members and essential domestic and maintenance employees. The President of the College shall negotiate agreements, executive contracts, employ representatives, and supply vacancies incurred by the termination of contracts, resignations, or death of any essential employees. All contracts for building construction shall be let only to persons or corporations posting a valid performance bond and recording the same in the Office of the County Clerk of Cleveland County, Oklahoma.

#### SECTION VI

#### ADVISORY COUNCIL

An advisory council shall be formed which is to be composed of interested, qualified persons in the various fields which will be of value in building and maintaining a strong academic program to carry out the educational program stated in the charter.

# SECTION VII

# **AMENDMENT**

These By-Laws may be amended by a favorable vote of two-thirds of the qualified members of the Board of Trustees of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College at any meeting of the Board, provided that the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing to each Trustee one month in advance. This change to be subject to the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.

# SECTION VIII

#### ADMINISTRATIVE FUNCTIONS

The President of the Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College shall be elected by the Board of Trustees, and he shall act for and on behalf of the Board in the conduct and management of the institution. He shall also be a member of the Board of Trustees ex-officio and of the Executive committee, ex-officio, and his duties, powers and term of office shall be prescribed in the by-laws of the College and a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

# ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC.

Know all men by these presents, that, we whose names are hereunto subscribed, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the provisions of the corporation laws of the State of Oklahoma, and for that purpose state:

#### ARTICLE ONE

The name of this corporation shall be HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC.

#### ARTICLE TWO

The purpose of this corporation shall be the creation, establishment and maintenance of a college and institution of higher learning devoted to the promotion and impartation of higher learning, Christian education and such other education, instruction, learning, training and research as may be deemed essential for the cause of Christ and to that end prescribe courses of study and grant degrees. The doctrinal and theological position of this institution shall be that of the sponsoring denomination, Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and the treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptists as endorsed by the state body, and in connection therewith, in accordance with the stipulation of the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

- (a.) To prescribe courses of study for both resident and correspondence students, which shall include general education in the arts, Christian Ministries of Service and Biblical studies for wisdom; said courses to be taught in both a Junior College Division and a Bible College Division, and to award degrees, either graduate or post-graduate, to those persons satisfactorily completing the prescribed courses of study and to grant such other literary honors, including honorary degrees, as shall be deemed advisable.
- (b.) To charge and collect tuition as determined by the Board of Trustees and to create scholarships.
- (c.) To employ professors, instructors and other subordinate employees as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the college under the direction and control of the President of the College, with the advice and consent of the majority of the Board of Trustees.
- (d.) To institute and carry on missions and commissions for missionary purposes and investigations.
- (e.) To publish and distribute such pamphlets, literature or books as may be required in the conduct of such work and the general promotion of the College.
- (f.) To sue and be sued in its corporate name and to enter into contracts of every type and nature.
  - (g.) To solicit support, receive, collect, hold and receive by gift or

bequest personal property in any amount, money or other thing of value; to purchase real estate, to receive real estate that may be given, or devised to the college for achieving the legitimate ends of the college and to sell or mortgage the same as the need arises.

(h.) To borrow money in payment of property for erecting buildings and making improvements and for any other purpose germane to the

objectives and purposes of the college.

(i.) To issue notes, bonds, debentures and other evidences of indebtedness and execute mortgages, liens and other incumbrances upon the property of the corporation, real or otherwise, to secure the payment of any such evidences of indebtedness.

(i.) To transact any and all business connected with said College as may

be necessary to achieve the purposes of said College.

(k.) To obtain under Internal Revenue Laws of the United States and of the Revenue Laws of the State of Oklahoma exemption from income property and other forms of taxation,

#### ARTICLE THREE

The location of this corporation shall be in Norman, Oklahoma.

#### ARTICLE FOUR

The duration of this corporation shall be perpetual.

#### ARTICLE FIVE

The general control of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of Trustees consisting of 15 members, 9 of which trustees shall be elected by the delegates to the annual Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists-each of which shall serve for a term of three years and until his successor is elected and qualified, and one member each shall be elected by the delegates to the annual meeting of the state association of Free Will Baptists of the States of Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico and Texas, each of which shall serve for a term of six years and until his successor is elected and qualified. Initially, the 9 trustees elected by said Oklahoma Association shall include 3 elected for three years, three elected for two years, and 3 elected for one year but their successors shall all be elected for a term of three years and until their successors are elected and qualified, Initially, said trustee elected by said Arkansas Association shall be elected for a term of six years, said trustee elected by said Colorado Association shall be elected for a term of five years, said trustee elected by said Kansas Association shall be elected for a term of four years, said trustee elected by said Missouri Association shall be elected for a term of three years, said trustee elected by said New Mexico Association shall be elected for a term of two years, and said trustee elected by said Texas Association shall be elected for a term of one year but their successors shall be elected for a term of six years. The Chairman of said Corporation shall be one of the trustees elected by said Oklahoma Association.

#### ARTICLE SIX

An executive committee consisting of the Chairman, Vice Chairman, and Secretary of the Board of Trustees shall possess all powers of the Board of Trustees between the stated meetings of the Board of Trustees.

#### ARTICLE SEVEN

All contracts for building construction shall be let only to persons or corporations posting a valid performance bond and recording the same in the office of the County Clerk of Cleveland, Oklahoma.

# SECTION IX

#### **AMENDMENTS**

This charter may be hereafter amended subject to the provisions contained herein and the laws of the State of Oklahoma. It is provided, however, that the Trustees of the College shall not propose or apply for any amendment which has not been previously authorized by an act of the Oklahoma State Association.

# CONSTITUTION OF MINISTER'S CONFERENCE

#### ARTICLE 1

This Minister's Conference shall be called the Oklahoma State Free Will Baptist Minister's Conference, and shall be composed of Ordained Free Will Baptist Ministers who are regular members of some Orthodox Free Will Baptist church in the State of Oklahoma who have paid their \$1.00 dues

#### ARTICLE 2

The officers for this conference shall be President, Vice-President, and Clerk Treasurer, who shall be elected annually.

#### ARTICLE 3

This conference shall have the power to discipline its members.

#### ARTICLE 4

Members of this organization shall be all ordained ministers who participate in the benefits and activities of this body, and associate members who become members by payment of the \$1.00 annual dues.

#### ARTICLE 5

This conference shall meet Semi-Annually.

## ARTICLE 6

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular session.

#### BY-LAWS OF MINISTER'S CONFERENCE

#### ARTICLE 1

The clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence the senior minister in years shall call the ministers into conference. If a quorum is present the President or in his absence the Vice-President shall moderate the meeting. If neither of these are present, the senior minister in years shall be in charge.

# ARTICLE 2

It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the ministers of the conference. Ministers shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the conference. In case of questionable representation the case under question shall be referred to the Credential Committee.

#### ARTICLE 3

It shall be the duty of each minister belonging to this conference, to be active in pastoral or evangelistic services (disabled or retired ministers excepted). Any minister belonging to this conference shall report in each

session in person or by letter, and failing to do so for two successive sessions shall be subject to discipline.

#### ARTICLE 4

Each conference shall be opened by reading a portion of God's word and prayer, and each session shall be closed with prayer.

#### ARTICLE 5

By a two-thirds vote of the members present ruling of the President may be overruled.

#### ARTICLE 6

This conference shall sit with open doors, except when it shall go into a committee as a whole.

#### ARTICLE 7

No member shall absent himself from the conference during its meeting without permission from the President.

#### ARTICLE 8

No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of a committee, unless person nominated is not elected.

#### ARTICLE 9

The President shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian Spirit, or when he thinks it will cause discord,

#### ARTICLE 10

Anyone desiring to speak shall rise and address the President by the appelation "Brother President," but shall not speak further until recognized.

# ARTICLE 11

No member of this conference shall be allowed to speak more than five minutes, nor twice on the same subject without permission from the President.

#### **ARTICLE 12**

These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this conference by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

#### ARTICLES OF FAITH OF STATE ASSOCIATION

- 1. THE BIBLE The Scriptures of the Old and New Testament were given by the inspiration of God, and are our infallible rules of faith and practice.
- 2. GOD There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver and Righteous Governor of the Universe, and in the Scriptures as the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.
- 3. CHRIST Christ is God manifest in the flesh: in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified. He is now risen and glorified is our ever-present Saviour and Lord.
- 4. THE HOLY SPIRIT The Scriptures assigns to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of all men.
- 5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of Grace, not otherwise provided for as highest welfare of man requires.
- 6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore inherited a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. THE WORK OF CHRIST The Son of God, by His incarnation, life, suffering, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin

that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.

8. THE WORK OF SALVATION — The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and the hearty renunciations of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit; freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

9. ELECTION — God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ,

men become His elect.

10. FREEDOM OF WILL — The Human will is free and self controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit and live, or to resist them and perish.

11. SALVATION FREE — God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come

and take of the water of life freely.

12. PERSEVERENCE — All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.

13. BACKSLIDING AND APOSTASY — A person who has been regenerated or born again and is living in unconfessed, unforgiven sin, is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and therefore is a backslider in a lost condition who must repent and be

restored to the right relationship with God or be eternally lost.

We recognize, according to Hebrews 6: 4-6, that it is possible for a person to get in the condition that he could never return to Christ. This, we believe, is Apostasy; However, we also recognize that a regenerate person can fall into sin, be in a lost condition and still not be an Apostate. This person, through repentance, can be reconciled to God.

14. GOSPEL ORDINANCES — Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel: Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal

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obligation, and to be administered to all true believers.

15. TITHING — God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament: Jesus Christ endorsed in the Gospel (Matt. 23: 23), and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." I Cor. 16: 2.

16. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH — The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from the secular employment and amusements for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion

with God.

17. RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT, AND FINAL RETRIBUTION — The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation: then the wicked shall "Go away into eternal punishment but the righteous into eternal life."

# RULES OF ORDER

1. At every sitting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded by prayer by the Moderator or whomever he may request.

2. Ministers and deacons present are invited to seats, allowed to take

part in debates on all subjects, and to vote.

3. Those who speak shall rise and address the Moderator. Personal

reflections shall be avoided in all debates.

4. No motion may be discussed until made and seconded.

5. When a motion has been made and seconded, and a member opposes its discussion, the Moderator shall put the question. "Shall it be discussed?" If negative, the question shall not be discussed.

6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member, and the vote

taken separately.

7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.

- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.
- 9. All questions shall be decided by a majority vote of all Members present.

# BY-LAWS OF STATE ASSOCIATION

- 1. The Clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence, the senior minister in years shall call the Association into conference, and if a quorum is present the moderator, or in his absence, the assistant moderator shall take charge; and if neither of them is present the senior minister in years shall act as Moderator.
- 2. It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the delegates to the Association, who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the Association.
- 3. It shall be the duty of every District belonging to this Association to send a letter to every annual session of this Association reporting in the same, spiritual condition, benevolent work, and its statistics. Any District belonging to this Association, which shall fail to report itself for two successive sessions, may be dismissed from the Association by a two thirds vote of all members present.
- 4. Each meeting shall be opened by reading a portion of the Bible and with prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.
- 5. By a two-thirds vote of members present, a ruling of the moderator can be overruled.
- 6. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- 7. This Association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.
- 8. Any person not a member of this Association may be allowed to take part in its discussions by obtaining permission from the moderator.
- 9. It shall be the duty of all the Association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting, and anyone wishing to retire shall first obtain leave of the moderator.
- 10. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee, provided the person nominated be elected.
- 11. The moderator shall not allow discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.
- 12. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise to his feet and address the moderator by the appelation "Brother Moderator," but shall not speak further until recognized by the moderator,
- 13. No member of this association shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes nor twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator.

14. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

#### CONSTITUTION OF STATE ASSOCIATION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptists denomination, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a church; and to preserve and maintain correspondence and co-ordination with us, do therefore ordain this Constitution for our better denomination government.

#### ARTICLE I

NAME: This organization shall be known as the OKLAHOMA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS.

#### ARTICLE II

PURPOSE: The object and purpose of this organization shall be to unify the work of the various bodies composing this State Association, and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in connection with the various bodies in the Association, or that may hereafter be represented therein.

#### ARTICLE III

REPRESENTATION: Section 1. This Association shall be composed of all ordained ministers and deacons with membership in some local church which is a member of a district Association with membership in the State Association.

Section 2: Each District Association shall be entitled to a number of elected delegates equal with the number of churches composing said Association. These delegates may be recommended by the local churches and shall be endorsed by their district association.

#### ARTICLE IV

FINANCE: Each elected delegate shall be represented with a fee of ten dollars.

#### ARTICLE V

DISCIPLINE: This State Association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine or practices that may properly come before it from any of the bodies composing said organization; furthermore, if there be any question of discipline, doctrine or practices on the part of an affiliated association, delegates of that association shall not be seated until these questions have been settled to the satisfaction of the General Board.

Section 2: Decisions of the General Board may be appealed in this manner. All appeals shall come before the State Association when sitting in a committee as a whole.

#### ARTICLE VI

OFFICERS: The officers of the State Association shall consist of a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary. Each of these shall be elected at the close of each regular session except the Executive Secretary, who shall be elected every two years. These officers shall serve as the program committee for the State Association.

Section 2. COMMITTEES: Committees as necessary shall be appointed by the moderator, unless otherwise provided for, and shall hold office until their work is completed or until their successors are elected.

#### ARTICLE VII

BOARDS: All standing boards shall be composed of seven (7) elected members who shall serve terms of 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1 years with such ex-officio members as may be provided elsewhere, except: (1) the General Board which shall be composed of one (1) member from each affiliated association, the chairman of each standing board, and the current general officers of this association, and (2) the College Board of Trustees which shall be composed as provided for in the Articles of Incorporation of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc.

The standing boards of this association shall be: Executive Board; Board of Church Extension, Missions and Evangelism; Sunday School Board; Church Training Service Board; and College Board of Trustees.

No standing board shall meet in a functional meeting during the session of this association.

# ARTICLE VIII

# DUTIES, SCOPE OF ENDEAVOR AND QUALIFICATIONS OF STANDING BOARDS

Section 1. EXECUTIVE BOARD: The Executive Board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of an affiliated association and in good standing with the association of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

It shall be the duty of this board to act in behalf of the association when it is not in session. It shall be bound to carry out the directions of the association and shall hold itself bound by every consideration of morality and honor to carry out the wishes of this association and to act under its instructions in whatever technical rights, civil laws and the decisions of courts may give it in certain emergencies. It shall be the duty of this board to sign their signatures to any and all papers concerning properties, indebtedness, bonds, or other legal documents pertaining to the execution of the will of this association, exclusive of the College Board of Trustees.

This board shall have the oversight of the Executive Department of this association. The members shall assist and direct such work for the general promotion of this association as is deemed needful or necessary as the means available shall permit. The Executive Department shall serve as the coordinating agency of this association to correlate the work of all standing boards and agencies.

This board shall have the oversight of Free Will Baptist Book Store and shall endeavor to serve affiliated associations and churches and the community with literature and church supplies. Merchandising procedures

shall be those accepted as normal retail procedures with the board being cognizant of the spiritual contribution of the store in distributing Christian literature.

All decisions of this board shall be governed by the general tenets of this association and shall not violate this constitution.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, and work done and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Whereas this board represents the association when not in session, it and it alone shall have the power to call the association into special conference provided each affiliated association shall be given notice at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting of such special conference.

Section 2. GENERAL BOARD: This board shall be composed of one (1) member from each affiliated association, the chairman of each standing board, and the current general officers of this association. Each member must be a member of an affiliated association and in good standing with the association of which he is a member. The members shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to meet one (1) day preceding the annual session of this association. This board shall serve as the credential committee with the duties and responsibilities assigned by Article V of this constitution. This board shall hear reports of all standing boards. It shall serve as budget committee and shall make such recommendations as deemed pertinent to this association. A complete and accurate record shall be kept of meetings of this board and a report shall be made in writing to this association in its annual session.

The moderator of the association shall serve as chairman of this board, and the clerk of the association shall serve as its clerk.

Section 3. BOARD OF CHURCH EXTENSION, MISSIONS AND EVANGELISM: This board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

It shall be the duty of this board to labor to further the Gospel of Jesus Christ into the uttermost parts of the earth. In accomplishing this, they are to endeavor to establish missions and churches in communities within the bounds of this association with whatever moral and financial assistance that may be theirs. In cases of small churches failing to function, whatever assistance deemed appropriate shall be rendered to maintain the effective witness of that church by either direct labor with the church or with an associational board in instances where the affiliated association has a functional board or agency.

This board shall be empowered to receive and convey title to real property in the area of its labors.

The promotion of missionary endeavors from a local, state or national level shall come within the scope of endeavor of this board. This board shall assist in maintaining prayer and financial support of missionary enterprises through whatever channels available.

Whereas missionary and evangelistic labors are so intimately related, this board shall assist through participation or assistance in maintaining a strong evangelistic thrust in the life of affiliated association.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Section 4. COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES: The College Board of Trustees shall be composed as provided for in the Articles of Incorporation of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc.

Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc. is an agency of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and is incorporated under the corporate laws of the State of Oklahoma. The articles of incorporation are a part of this association's record and delineate the purpose, duty and scope of endeavor of the members of this board.

Section 5. CHURCH TRAINING SERVICE BOARD: This board shall be composed of seven members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to plan and assist in organizing and sustaining a strong Church Training Service in every church in each association affiliated with this association with every means of promotion and assistance available to them. This board shall plan, coordinate and conduct state-wide youth camps or camp.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Section 6. SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD: This board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to plan and promote Sunday schools in every church in each association affiliated with this association. This board shall use every available means to promote Sunday school clinics, seminars, institutes and conventions on local, district and state-wide basis, working with local agencies to distribute and employ all effective methods and material available.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Section 7. VACANCIES: Vacancies shall occur when a member moves from the territorial bounds of this association, by death, by resignation or by removal from office by this association. In the event of disciplinary action where charges concerning misconduct, doctrine or practice shall have been lodged against a member of any board, his office shall be held in abeyance until such charges shall be concluded or as determined by this association.

All boards shall have power to fill vacancies arising between sessions of this association. Such appointment shall terminate at the next session of the association and shall be filled by this association. Section 8. EMPLOYEES: All employees of boards or agencies of this association shall be employed by agreement or contract with employing board or agency upon approval of this association except those elected by this association and the conditions of their employment shall be those approved by this association.

The duties of the Executive Secretary of this association shall be:

- (1) He is to represent, or cause to be represented, the association at all affairs of interest to the association.
- (2) He is to promote the work of the association in such a manner so as to unify the efforts of the association.
- (3) He is to serve with all standing boards and committees of the association in an ex-officio capacity.
- (4) He is to aid in planning the work of the association by relating the activities and plans of one board to another.
- (5) He is to report to the association during each annual session.
- (6) He is to communicate to the affiliated members of this association the pressing causes and events before the association. This can be in person or by means of a periodical bulletin or both.
- (7) He shall serve as treasurer of this association. An accurate and complete record of all funds received and disbursed shall be kept and a written report shall be included in his report to this association in its annual session.
- (8) The conditions of employment shall be determined by the Executive Board.

#### ARTICLE IX

DISSOLUTION: Should this association cease to function, all properties and holdings shall go to the National Association of Free Will Baptists after all creditors are satisfied and indebtedness cleared.

# ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS: This constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session of the association by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of members present and voting, provided proposed amendment or alteration be presented in writing to the body one (1) day in advance.

# ARTICLE XI

SPECIAL SESSIONS: Elected delegates to the last session of this association shall be retained as standing delegates for special called sessions.
