PROCEEDINGS OF THE STATE ASSOCIATION

THEME: "The Time Is At Hand"

Tuesday Evening, October 23, 1973

The 65th annual session of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists met in Arch Thompson Auditorium, McAlester, Oklahoma, October 23 - 25, 1973. A musical prelude was presented by Mr. Roger Jones. David Parish directed the music for the evening service. After the congregation sang "There Shall Be Showers of Blessings", Jack Richey led in prayer. The congregation then sang "To God Be the Glory."

The association was called into official session by the clerk, Jerry Dudley, who then introduced the officers.

Bailey Thompson delivered the moderator's message from Revelation 1:3 using the theme "Recognizing the Time."

Curtis "Pete" Butler welcomed the Association to the Gaines Creek Association and the McAlester area.

The Ministers Quartette presented the special music by singing; "Because of Grace" and "The King Is Coming."

Moderator Bailey Thompson introduced the speaker of the hour, Rev. W. Vard Wood who delivered the message "The Time Is At Hand for His Coming" from Revelation 3:11. There was a time of great rejoicing as the message unfolded.

The Girls Trio from Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College sang a medley of songs as a special offering for Hillsdale was received in the amount of \$374.83. Moderator announced appointment of committees. (see reports)

Bill Barber asked the Lord's blessing on the offering. Following announcements, Ernest Harrison, Sr. prayed the benediction.

Wednesday Morning, October 24, 1973

The Wednesday morning session opened at 9:30 a.m. with the congregation singing "Amazing Grace." Following prayer led by Homer Young, Charles Bigger brought the morning devotions from Romans 11:13.

The Moderator's admonition was delivered by Bailey Thompson.

The Clerk read a partial report from the General Board with recommendations concerning associational letters, delegates and any changes necessary. The motion carried to accept the corrections, receive the letters and seat the delegates.

The association received official welcome given by Mr. J. B. Orr, sheriff of Pittsburg County and member of Crowder Free Will Baptist Church.

Moderator recognized visitors with a number of visitors from the surrounding states and Free Will Baptist National offices, Nashville, Tennessee. Ernest M. Kennedy, former Executive Secretary of Oklahoma Free Will Baptists, now retired, brought greetings and personal testimony.

Motion carried to adopt the printed program with time and sequence flexible.

A petitionary letter from New Life Association was read with recommendation from the General Board and Executive Board. Motion carried to receive this association into the fellowship of the State Association and seat their delegates.

John West gave a report of his work as historian of the Oklahoma State Association and submitted the material gathered and information compiled. Motion carried that the Executive Secretary of this Association assume charge of this material and serve as the historian. Motion carried to repay John West \$25.00 for expenses. At Brother West's direction, the check is to be made payable to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College.

Herman Hersey, General Director, Board of Retirement and Insurance of the National Association reported on the program of this department. At special request Brother Hersey rendered his piano arrangement of "O Happy Day."

Malcolm Fry, General Director of the department of Church Training Service of the National Association, reported on the work of that department. At special request Brother Fry sang "He Looked Beyond My Fault."

Paul Kettelman, Director of Public Relations for Free Will Baptist Bible College, reported on the progress and needs of that institution.

Moderator declared a short recess before the worship hour.

WEDNESDAY MORNING WORSHIP HOUR — 11:00 A.M.

David Parish led the convention in singing "We're Marching to Zion" and "Blessed Assurance." A. D. Marchant prayed the invocation. The convention sang "I Love to Tell the Story" following which David Parish soloed "I Have No Other Song."

Delbert Akin, presiding over the worship hour, introduced Edward E. Morris as the speaker of the hour. Brother Morris spoke from Revelation 2:13a "The Time Is At Hand to Preach His Word." It was a very timely and searching doctrinal message.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION — 1:30 P.M.

The afternoon session was called together by the convention singing "If You're Saved and You Know It." Harry Lee brought afternoon devotional Scripture reading 2 Timothy 4:2-11 with pertinent thoughts. He ended his devotions by leading the Convention in prayer.

The Clerk gave a partial report of the General Board reading items three through ten. Motion carried to receive the report item by item.

Item five carried.

Item six carried.

Item seven tabled until Thursday.

Item eight carried (with understanding that these funds will be forwarded by 1975.

Item nine received with budget items to be acted on as each Board and/or agency makes their report.

Item ten carried.

The Sunday School Board report was given by Milburn Wilson. Motion carried to receive the report and approve the recommendations and budget.

Moderator declared a few minutes recess to return at call.

The Convention was called back to business by singing "Amazing Grace."

Harold Harrison brought greetings and a report from the National Association Sunday School Department.

Seven year member of the State Sunday School Board was declared open for nominations. Don Jones elected.

Delbert Akin gave the report of the State Mission Board report. Motion carried to receive the report and approve the budget. Vacancies on the Board were noted and members to be elected were seven year and three year. Kenneth Brandon elected to seven year membership. David Bigger elected to three year membership.

Roy Thomas brought greetings to the Convention and gave a report of the National Home Mission, Church Extension & Evangelism Department.

Reford Wilson brought greetings and rejoicing at the abundant provision of the Lord in the National Foreign Missions Board ministries. He also challenged the Convention to greater service and closed his report with prayer.

Rufus Coffee, our National Executive Secretary, brought greetings and reported on the work of his office.

Item No. one of the Resolution Committee read. Motion carried to receive the report. The resolution contains a Constitutional change consequently a motion carried to table this item until Thursday. (see reports).

Lynn Wood, pastor of Mountain Grove, Missouri brought greetings to the Convention. Jim Williams, Executive Secretary of Texas Free Will Baptists, brought greetings from our Texas brethren.

Motion carried to adjourn business until Thursday morning. Adjourned in prayer led by the Moderator.

WEDNESDAY EVENING WORSHIP 7:30 P.M.

The "New Life Singers" from Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College presented several inspiring songs as a prelude to the evening worship hour.

Dr. Charles Hampton led the congregation in singing "Stand Up for Jesus." Lynn Wood led the congregation in prayer.

All delegates and visitors were welcomed by Alan Wood as he presided over the hour of worship. The Congregation sang "Onward Christian Soldiers" with Starlett Ship at the piano.

Bill Jones, President of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College expressed appreciation to all for their prayer and financial support of the college. Jerry Rhoades, Promotional Director, presented plaques to ten churches for their outstanding financial contributions to the college: West Tulsa; Southern Oaks; Ada First; Pleasant Mound, Buffalo Springs, Texas; Clinton First; Poteau; Capitol Hill; Purcell First; Webb; and Mountain Grove First, Mountain Grove, Missouri.

Hillsdale F.W.B. Choir sang several choral arrangements under the direction of David Parish.

Francis Boyle, Director of Executive Church Bonds, brought greetings and reported on the ministry and progress of his department of the National Association.

Executive Board members were elected: Curtis "Pete" Butler, 7 year member; Waldo Young, 6 year member; Robert Duncan, 3 year member as the result of the resignation of Connie Cariker, 6 year member and vacancy created in James Cearley leaving the Board as an employee of Hillsdale.

Church Training Service Board report was given by Roma Stewart. Motion carried to adopt the report. Gary Dodson elected 7 year member of the Church Training Service Board.

Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College Board of Trustees report was given by O. T. Dixon. President Bill Jones reported on student growth and the overall ministry of the college. Jerry Rhoades spoke regarding financial needs, plans and accomplishments. Motion carried to receive the entire report.

Recess declared by Moderator for morning worship hour.

THURSDAY MORNING WORSHIP 11:00 A.M.

Charles Hampton led the convention in singing "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross." "New Life Singers" sang several special songs and there was great rejoicing in the congregation.

Connie Cariker, presiding over the hour of worship, introduced Dr. Wade Jernigan as the speaker of the hour. He preached from the theme "The Time Is At Hand for Faithfulness to His Church," from Revelation 2:10d. An instructive, thought provoking, and challenging message was delivered.

THURSDAY AFTERNOON 1:30 P.M.

Charles Hampton led the convention in singing several choruses. Homer Young led the congregation in prayer. Becky Wilson sang "He Touched Me."

Joe Blair led the afternoon devotions which was closed with prayer led by Bob Followwill.

O. T. Dixon gave final report of finances and budget requests for Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. Motion carried to adopt the report.

Hillsdale F.W.B. College Board of Trustees members elected to 3 year membership: Rue Dell Smith; Bill Barber; Bob Followwill.

General Board report Item No. eleven read by clerk. Motion carried to adopt the report. (see reports).

Motion carried "Effective November 1, 1973, the cooperative plan funds be altered to provide Executive Department 26% and State Mission Board 7% for the balance of 1973-74 fiscal year.

Marguerite Kern gave the report of the Oklahoma State Woman's Auxiliary Convention. (see Minutes of Woman's Auxiliary).

Charles Christian gave the report of the Master's Men State Conference. (see reports).

Oklahoma State Free Will Baptist Minister's Conference report was given by Doyle Cox.

Motion carried to take from the table Item seven of the General Board report for action. Motion carried the item be adopted.

Motion carried "All funds received through convention fees be placed in a special fund. After all convention costs are satisfied, these funds shall not be disposed of except at the direction of the Association."

Motion to select a theme and have one speaker preach a series of sermons at the next annual conference was tabled indefinitely.

Motion carried to take from the table Resolution no. one of the Resolution Committee report. (see reports) Motion carried to table this resolution indefinitely.

Placement Committee report read. Motion carried to adopt the report. (see committee reports)

Obituary Committee report read. Report received by convention standing and Odie Nunley leading in a prayer of thanksgiving for the privilege of having these deceased members among us.

Temperance Committee report read. Motion carried to adopt the report. (see committee reports)

The convention stood for a moment of rest and were led in prayer by Charles Hampton.

Resolution Committee report read. Motion carried to receive the report and act on each item by item.

Item one (acted on previously).

Item two carried. (see reports).

Item three carried. (see reports).

Item four lost. (see reports).

Motion carried "No standing board of this association shall have a majority of its members from one association. Adjustments to be made as current terms expire."

A motion carried to adopt budget. (see Budget Report).

GENERAL BOARD REPORT

The General Board of the Oklahoma State Association met Monday, October 22, 1973 in the First Free Will Baptist Church, McAlester, and as a result of that meeting we offer the following items for your consideration:

1. Letters were received from eighteen (18) district associations, and found them to be in order. We recommend that these letters be received and the delegates seated.
2. Petitionary letter from the New Life Association read. We recommend that the letter be received and the delegates be seated, as recommended by the Executive Board in their report.
3. We heard a resolution from the Dibble Association which reads, "Be it resolved that no officer or employee in the State Association, or its agencies, be a member of a standing board". We recommend to you an amended resolution as follows: "BE it resolved that no officer, except those provided for expressly in the Constitution of this Association; or a full time employee of the Oklahoma State Association, or its agencies, be a member of a standing board."
4. We heard a resolution from the First Oklahoma Association and recommend its adoption as follows: "WHEREAS it has been observed that judges for the Church Training Service Board have been difficult to obtain; and WHEREAS judges and quiz masters need to be knowledgeable of CTS competition rules; and WHEREAS our youth spend months preparing themselves for the competition, and we should make every effort to provide them with the most equitable program possible; THEREFORE be it resolved that we support the Church Training Board in a program that would require it to appoint qualified quiz masters, timekeepers, and judges prior to the day of the competition, and that those chosen be given a set of rules used in the National Association."
5. We received a request from Hopewell Association No. 2 to host the 1975 session of the Oklahoma State Association which had been omitted from their letter and recommend it be referred to the placement committee.
6. We recommend that the State Executive Board working with the State Executive Secretary serve as placement committee following the 1975 session making their recommendation a part of their annual report.
7. We recommend that in order to eliminate confusion as to purpose of funds, that each Association contribute \$20.00 per church for support of the Association and delegate fees.
8. We recommend that each Association contribute \$20.00 per church for support of the hosting of the National Association in 1976 in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

9. This Board heard the reports of (1) Sunday School Board, (2) Church Extension, Mission and Evangelism Board, (3) The Executive Board, (4) The Executive Secretary (5) Free Will Baptist Book Store, (6) Church Training Service Board, and (7) Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College Board. We recommend their adoption as they are printed with their budgets.
10. We recommend to the Executive Board that the House at 4301 So. Walker Ave., Okla. City, Oklahoma (Executive Secretary House) be sold and the funds be reserved with recommendations from the Executive Board next year as to their use.
11. We recommend a cooperative plan budget of \$85,000.00 to be allocated as follows:

- (4) Publish again monthly "The Communicator" to create a spirit of enthusiasm among our people. (Cover each association its churches, Sunday School, their size, and history.)

MISSION BOARD REPORT

The board met eight times during the past year. Even though we are meeting less than in past years we are attempting to take care of more business thereby saving money for use in other places.

C.E.P. '71. We are glad to announce that our pilot project — Western Avenue Free Will Baptist Church of Oklahoma City is going well. We are happy that the attendance is climbing and the work is progressing. The church launched a bond program last spring to pay off the indebtedness on the land and buildings. Almost all the bonds were sold — showing confidence in our work there. The board is still helping financially with the work; however, we feel that in the very near future the work will be completely self-sustaining.

C.E.P. '72. Rev. David Sutton, one of our mission board members, resigned from his church in Shawnee to lead our project in Jenks, Oklahoma. He became director of the mission there on June 1, 1973. This is a joint project of the State and National Home Missions Boards.

We are glad to report that 3½ acres of land has been purchased west of town and plans are being made to erect a building on the property in the very near future.

C.E.P. '73. The board is exploring a new area to begin a work. We are hoping to begin a work in the Enid area by the end of this associational year if workers and finances permit.

SUPPORT NEEDED. The board launched a drive to get our churches of the state to give 3% over and above their cooperative giving for the Church Establishment Program. This effort has not met with the success we had hoped. We are urging that our people catch the vision for the need of establishing new churches throughout the state.

SUPPORT MUST COME. We want to remind our people of the fact that our state mission work is not optional but mandatory. Without a strong viable work in our state we cannot possibly launch out successfully in the areas of education and foreign missions. Our work in establishing new churches is vital and basic to all our work.

Someone has estimated that 25% of all the people who were ever in this world are now living. If this be so, then the Great Commission carries a greater responsibility today than ever before. We have no choice. We must get into the heavily populated areas of our state and nation with the Gospel of Christ.

We are asking that our people respond to these needs with their prayers and finances that good strong churches be established in the needy areas of our state.

HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE

A Report to the Oklahoma State Association

September 20, 1973

For four consecutive years, enrollment at Hillsdale has increased — from 69 in 1969 to 129 in 1973. The campus now has that crowded look that excites the imagination of those who envision what has now become reality and makes possible a wide fellowship among students. Extension classes continue to make possible profitable fellowship and learning in different cities across the state. This work has reached Tulsa, Ardmore, Checotah, Claremore, and Liberal, Missouri.

The first fourth-year class will graduate from Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College in May, 1974. Adding a Junior and Senior year to Hillsdale's curriculum has added a new dimension in the stability of the spiritual experiences in the lives of Hillsdale students. Continued efforts in behalf of the students has made possible an agreement with other schools for those courses we are not able to offer presently.

The ministerial program continues to do much for our young pastors and future missionaries. The Free Will Baptist pastors cooperating with us are to be commended. What they are doing today in sharing the practical side of pastoring will be fruitful in our churches for many years to come.

This past spring a special appeal was made to meet pressing financial needs. There was a significant response especially from Oklahoma and Texas. A continued concern is needed today. We are proposing a suggested quota for the different states in mid-USA. In Oklahoma we have broken it down to associations and are asking the Oklahoma State Association to adopt it officially. Some associations have already voted to accept the budget and have begun steps to reach their goal. We believe the adoption of this suggested quota will be the means of a *balanced budget*. It will also mean that we will start no new projects unless a substantial sum of money comes from some source.

We do plan the construction of two faculty houses on campus. This will not be extra expense as the house presently owned by Hillsdale will be sold and the President moved on campus, and the other faculty member who lives on campus will not receive a housing allowance.

Our students are crowded — especially in the boys' dormitory. We ask you to pray with us about the situation so that space may be obtained within the framework of our working budget.

Will you prayerfully consider the proposed budget which is as follows: 1974-75, \$409,475.00; 1975-76, \$425,000.00. We must acknowledge the contribution that has been made by states to the work of Hillsdale. Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, Texas, Virginia, and other states have given a total of \$28,312.95. These states continue to enhance the overall program of the College and the leadership of each state seems to desire a greater involvement in the work.

You may note with interest the gift income to Hillsdale which is broken down by fiscal year: 1966-67, \$35,653.87; 1967-68, \$47,765.64; 1968-69, \$53,039.56; 1969-70, \$81,244.21; 1970-71 \$97,205.31; 1971-72, \$131,273.32; 1972-73, \$191,040.76. We can see how that God has and is continually blessing.

INFORMATIONAL REPORT

Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists
National Executive Office
October 23-25, 1973

In behalf of the National Association I wish to express my deepest gratitude for the churches which are contributing to the ongoing of God's kingdom work through our denominational outreach. Because of your interest, prayers and support, each national department is experiencing significant progress. Your generous financial support of each national agency enables you to have a vital part in advancing the work of God.

In addition to forward strides by our national ministries, this past year has been a time of outstanding growth among our churches. State statistical reports reveal a new membership increase of 15,729. This annual growth of 8% reflects the largest numerical gains in 20 years. To God be the glory! It is our aim to see our denominational membership double over the next 10 years. With the present harvest of souls it is evident that by God's grace we can see this goal reached.

But even more gratifying and encouraging than a rising membership is the spiritual growth. A stronger bond of fellowship exists among us. A stronger spirit of loyalty, unity, maturity and cohesiveness prevails. Churches are manifesting a greater vision and concern to reach lost souls. The prospect for advancing the cause of Christ through the instrumentality of Free Will Baptists has never been brighter. To strengthen the spiritual life of our denomination further and to help individual believers grow in their vision and responsibility, we call attention to several specific objectives of the Executive Office.

I. INCREASE SUBSCRIPTIONS TO CONTACT

Our national magazine now has the largest number of subscribers in its 20 year history. Regrettably, the mounting interest in our national publication is not reflected by the number of subscriptions here in Oklahoma. Only 403 families in this state subscribe to CONTACT. We urge our pastors to help us promote this inspirational and interesting Christian publication.

Many churches find it feasible to order CONTACT for every family. The *Church Family Plan*, which three churches in the state are now using, offers a substantial savings over the regular single subscription rate of \$3.00 a year. Any church may start the family plan in the following manner: Send the name and address of every church family to CONTACT, P. O. Box 1088, Nashville, Tennessee 37202. In turn, the magazine will be mailed directly to each family every month. The church treasurer will be sent a statement once a quarter for 63¢ per subscription until the church gives a 30-day cancellation notice. Since the cost is less than five cents per week for each family, it would be most advisable for churches to supplement their Christian literature program by sending CONTACT to the entire membership. Sample copies, subscription forms and further information may be secured by writing to CONTACT (address given above).

II. INCREASE DENOMINATIONAL GIVING THROUGH THE COOPERATIVE PLAN

Two state associations and several district associations recently adopted the Cooperative Plan. We are encouraged by the growing interest and response to this equitable plan for fulfilling denominational stewardship responsibilities. We are requesting that each church *increase* their percentage of giving through the Cooperative Plan.

III. INCREASE PARTICIPATION OF LAYMEN AT THE NATIONAL CONVENTION

The interest and involvement of our lay people are essential to the building of a strong denomination. We are pleased with the growing number of laymen who now share in the rising attendance of our National Convention. Each church is asked to send a lay delegate to the 1974 National Convention in Wichita, Kansas, July 14-18.

IV. ELIMINATE INDEBTEDNESS ON THE NATIONAL OFFICE BUILDING

Plans are underway to erase the present indebtedness on the National Office property. Relieving the denomination of this remaining twelve year obligation will reduce the monthly rental rate charged to each department. This alone will enable the missions departments to give \$60,000 directly to missions work rather than to the mortgage holder. This would be in addition to the savings on the interest which is due on the remaining principle of \$130,000. We are confident that our people in Oklahoma can be depended upon to do their part in the forthcoming campaign.

IN CONCLUSION

We suggest that each church order the filmstrip "More Than Bricks and Mortar" which presents the National Associational ministries and the work of the Executive Office. It may be ordered on a free will offering basis or a minimum charge of \$5.00 from P. O. Box 1088, Nashville, Tennessee 37202.

Each church is urged to utilize the *new church letters* in order to help the district, state and national associations obtain more accurate and complete information.

Thank you again for the faithful support you have given to our national ministries. It is a joy and privilege to count you as a partner in the Gospel.

We thank God for what has been accomplished through our department this past year. We moved from a part-time to a full time ministry. There are now 254 participants in the retirement plan with 12 from Oklahoma. Assets of the plan now exceed \$250,000.

Our College Savings Plan is a means whereby a little money can be set aside every month to assure adequate funds when children reach college age. This plan is available to laymen as well as ministers.

We are offering three kinds of insurance:

1. Life insurance to our pastors, missionaries and employees of denominational agencies.

2. Cancer Care insurance to all Free Will Baptist families.

3. Property insurance — fire and liability at group savings and annual dividends to churches and denominational agencies.

At the present time several churches and denominational agencies have money in a trust fund with our department. In addition, various trust funds are available to any Free Will Baptist who wishes his money to be used in the Lord's work.

Our newest ministry is to senior adults. A retreat for senior adults, pastors and those interested in working with them has been planned for November 26 and 29 at Hillmont Camp in Tennessee. The cost is \$ 30.00 which includes room and board, registration fee and insurance.

We appreciate your generous support of our department through your cooperative plan. Thank you for sharing with us.

TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE REPORT

* Committee renamed "PUBLIC MORALS COMMITTEE"

We recommend the following items:

Item 1.

That our churches cooperate with the Sooner Alcoholic and Narcotic Education, Inc., in a financial way, and that our pastors warn their people, especially the youth, of the dangers of using narcotics, barbituates, glue-sniffing and misuse of any harmful drug.

Item 2.

That we go on record as being opposed to the use or sale of tobacco in any form, and that our ministers set the example of total abstinence.

Item 3.

That our churches conform to a more modest dress using 1 Peter 3:3-7 as our guide.

Item 4.

That we actively oppose any type of gambling.

Item 5.

That we go on record as being opposed to pornography, and that we do all possible to stop the sale and distribution of this type of literature.

Item 6.

That we stand opposed to the teaching of sex education in the public schools because of the lack of moral application and encourage our homes and churches to properly instruct our young people.

Item 7.

That our people encourage their grocery store to delete alcoholic beverages from their shelves.

Item 8.

That the State Association go on record as deploring the corruption in Government that brought about our present crisis as well as others who are trying to use it for political gain.

Item 9.

Due to the fact that our public school systems has the greatest influence on our young people, that we challenge the evolutionist monopoly on creation and ask that the Bible be placed with present material being taught.

Item 10.

That we change the name of this committee from "Temperance Committee" to "Public Morals Committee" to broaden the scope.

OKLAHOMA STATE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY CONVENTION CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

NAME

This organization shall be known as the Oklahoma State Woman's Auxiliary Convention.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE

The purpose of this convention shall be to bring the women of each district convention together for fellowship, sharing information, and encouraging one another in the work of the Lord.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

The officers of this convention shall be a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and field worker. These shall serve on the state executive committee together with three members elected by the convention as desired. These shall serve for a period of 2 years.

ARTICLE IV

MEMBERSHIP

This convention shall be composed of the officers of the convention together with each active auxiliary member of the district or local (dually accredited by the credentials committee).

ARTICLE V

MEETINGS

The annual meeting shall be held each year on the day preceding the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and at the place designated by said association.

ARTICLE VI

AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a two-thirds vote of members present.

BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1, President. The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed, call the executive committee together when necessary, be ex-officio member of all committees, and serve as chairman of the executive committee, see that reports are made promptly to the national secretary and perform all duties usually pertaining to such an office.

Section 2, Vice President. The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the overseeing of the work in general.

Section 3, Secretary. The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and executive committee meetings, preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor in office, and make an annual report to the national secretary on a form available from the WNAC office. She shall compile the districts slates of officers and addresses immediately after the convention. She shall also send a slate of state officers and addresses to the national executive secretary. She is chairman of the Credentials Committee.

The secretary shall also serve as historian keeping an historical record and submitting historical information to the national executive secretary annually.

Section 4, Treasurer. The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account and shall give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She shall also send an annual report to the WNAC office (executive secretary-treasurer) at least ten days before the end of the fiscal year. She shall encourage support of missions through the WNAC Gift Plan, individual giving and special offerings.

Section 5, Field Worker. The field worker shall have charge of all field work pertaining to, or necessary to, the promotion of the work of the convention and keep the national program before the district officers.

ARTICLE II

ELECTIONS

The general officers shall be nominated by a nominating committee and shall be elected by acclamation, unless there are other nominations. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken on each. All elections shall be held at the closing business session of the convention.

ARTICLE III

EXPENSES

Section 1. An appropriation of 6 cents per mile toward the expense of the general officers, when called upon to attend the executive committee meeting to plan program, secretary's expenses, phone calls, postage and stationery for officers will be paid by the convention. All field promotional work is subject to the state executive committee, who should approve all work done by state officers in the interest of state work, as well as expenses of the same.

Section 2. An amount of \$50.00 shall be paid on the expense of the state president to attend WNAC.

ARTICLE IV

COMMITTEES

Section 1. Executive Committee -- The executive committee shall be composed of the five officers and three members elected by the convention. Five of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the executive committee to maintain an overseeing of the work at large. They shall act for the convention when necessary. They shall meet with district presidents night preceding the state auxiliary convention.

Section 2. Resolutions Committee -- A resolutions committee of five members shall be appointed by the president as needed.

Section 3. Nominating Committee -- The nominating committee shall be composed of at least one member from each district convention. Nominations shall be submitted by district with their annual report. These elected by the body at the annual meeting.

Section 4. Credentials Committee -- The secretary shall be chairman of the credentials committee, and other members may be appointed by the president. The treasurer shall be a standing member of this committee.

Section 5. Finance Committee -- The finance committee shall be appointed by the president. This committee audits the financial records of the year and reports on same to the convention.

Section 6. Student Loan Committee -- State Auxiliary President and elected members to serve 2 years each. They shall be elected on alternate years.

Section 7. Registration committee shall be provided by the district convention which is host to state convention

ARTICLE V

FEES AND REPORTS

Active members shall pay dues of \$1.25 per year. With 25 cents remaining in the district, \$1.00 to be forwarded to state where 25 cents shall be retained, and 75 cents forwarded to WNAC as required for membership fees. It shall be the duty of each body directly affiliated with the State Auxiliary Convention to send a report to every annual session.

ARTICLE VI

AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of members present at regular meeting of the state auxiliary convention.

ARTICLE VII

GIFTS

The desired plans for giving in the Woman's Auxiliary are those adopted by WNAC as follows:

1. Mission offerings following each special season of prayer
2. Co-Laborer offering (monthly or quarterly designated to WNAC General Fund)
3. WNAC Emphasis Month in August or other time more convenient to help in support of WNAC General Fund
4. Memorial Student Loan Fund (special program and offering in September to assist worthy and needy students at FWBBC in Nashville)
5. Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College Student Loan Fund. (Special program and offering in September to assist worthy and needy students at Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College)
6. Tithes — Pay tithes on all undesignated money received
7. All offerings are to be forwarded through regular channels

ARTICLE VIII

WNAC DELEGATE

Each district convention shall submit one nomination for a State delegate to WNAC with their annual report. This nomination (along with others as needed to make up 15 delegates to WNAC) shall be elected by the body at the annual meeting. It shall be the duty of delegates elected to notify president if they cannot attend WNAC. President shall appoint

THE FREE WILL BAPTIST MASTER'S MEN State of Oklahoma

CONSTITUTION

Preamble

The purpose of the Free Will Baptist Master's Men, state of Oklahoma is to provide a means of Christian fellowship and to deepen the spiritual lives of the laymen of the local church. Also, to provide a means of developing the abilities and talents of the laymen, and to promote the cause of Christ through a complete, "total church program", as prescribed by Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE I

Name

The name of this organization shall be known as the Free Will Baptist Master's Men, State of Oklahoma.

ARTICLE II

Membership

Section 1. The membership of this organization shall be composed of the district associations of Master's Men, and any local chapters where there is only one chapter in the district, within the state of Oklahoma.

Section 2. Every member in good standing of an affiliated district

association of Master's Men, or any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, is entitled to the full benefits of membership.
Section 3. Each district association, or any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, shall submit an annual, written report to this body, (as a matter of information).

ARTICLE III

Officers

The officers of this organization shall consist of a president, vice-president and a secretary-treasurer.

The officers of this organization shall be elected annually and may succeed themselves, at this level.

ARTICLE IV

Executive Committee

Section 1. The executive committee shall consist of the elected officers of this organization and they shall serve as the program committee for each annual convention.

Section 2. Ex-officio members of the executive committee shall be the presidents of the district associations of Master's Men, presidents of any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, and the state executive secretary of the State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE V

Meetings

This organization shall meet annually at 7:30 PM on the Monday night before the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists convenes.

ARTICLE VI

Amendments

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of any regular meeting.

BY-LAWS

Voting Rights

Section 1. Every member of each affiliated district association, or any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, is eligible to vote on all questions and matters that might come before the Free Will Baptist Master's Men, State of Oklahoma.

Committees

Section 2. The executive committee shall transact all routine business and shall act for the organization in the interim between meetings.

Section 3. The executive committee shall meet at the call of the president.

Section 4. A nominating committee, for the annual election of officers, shall be composed of the presidents of each district association, and the president of any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district.

Section 5. The president shall appoint all other committees, subject to the approval of the body.

Finance

Section 6. This organization shall be financed on the basis of offerings, dues and assessments.

Quorum

Section 7. One-tenth of the members of this organization shall constitute a quorum at any regular meeting.

Amendments

Section 8. These bylaws may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

As adopted by the Free Will Baptist Master's Men, State of Oklahoma annual session, in Muskogee, Oklahoma October 19, 1970.

HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC. BY-LAWS BOARD OF TRUSTEES

SECTION I

The Board of Trustees of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc., an Oklahoma corporation, shall be composed of fifteen members, elected as provided in the Articles of Incorporation of said College, as amended:

ARTICLE A—OFFICERS: The officers of the board of Trustees shall be a Chairman, an Assistant Chairman, and a Secretary, each of whom shall be elected by the Board for a term of one year. They shall continue in office until their successors have been chosen:

Item 1—CHAIRMAN: The chairman of the Board of Trustees or his assistant shall preside at all meetings of the Board. He shall be an ex-officio member of the Executive Committee.

Item 2—SECRETARY: The Secretary shall record and preserve minutes of all meetings and acts of the Board of Trustees and countersign all deeds, conveyances, and other papers authorized by the Board. He shall have authority to call special meetings of the Trustees of the College upon the written request of two-thirds of the members of the Board; he shall mail notice of said meeting to the trustees ten (10) days in advance.

Item 3—EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE: The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, the Vice-Chairman of the Board, the Secretary of the Board. The Executive Committee shall have authority to consider and act upon all questions affecting the College which may be brought before it between the stated meetings of the Board, or whenever it is deemed impractical to convene the entire Board, or a quorum of the Board fails to attend a called or regular meeting. It shall transact such business as may be committed to it by the Board and shall act for the College on such matters as it may submit to it. The Committee shall meet at the call of the Chairman or the President of the College.

ARTICLE B—MEETINGS: The Board of Trustees shall meet each year at a time and place agreed upon by the Board. It shall, also, hold special meetings whenever called in accordance with the By-Laws of the Board. Such special meetings may be called by either the chairman of the Board or the President of the College.

ARTICLE C—QUORUM: A majority of the members or the Board of Trustees of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc. in attendance at any called or regular meeting, written notice of which has been mailed by the Secretary to each trustee, shall constitute a quorum. No proxy votes shall be permitted. No ex-officio member shall be entitled to vote at meetings of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE D—ELECTIONS: In all elections held by the Board of Trustees each member present except ex-officio members shall be entitled to one vote, and the result shall be determined by a majority of the votes

test. Due notice of any election must be personal notice to the members or a day on the minutes of the Board not less than one week preceding the election.

SECTION II

OFFICERS OF HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE

The officers of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College shall be a President, Vice-President, Dean, and a Business Manager, each of whom shall be elected by the Board of Trustees to hold office for two years exclusive of the President whose term of office shall be indefinite. It is provided, however, that retirement of any one of the officers herein named may occur at any time upon the resignation of the officer or the request of the Board. In either case, notice shall be given six weeks before the date of the proposed retirement unless otherwise agreed upon by the concerned parties.

ITEM ONE—PRESIDENT: The President shall be executive officer of the Board of Trustees and shall have general control of the College including its officers, teachers, students, and business. He shall render to the Board complete annual reports and to its chairman, Executive Committee or other committees such information as may be deemed essential to a thorough knowledge of the operation of the College and its promotion. He shall be a member of the Board of Trustees ex-officio and the Executive Committee ex-officio and shall have the rights and privileges of a member of the Board except voting. The President shall execute all documents, instruments, and conveyances on behalf of the College. Duties of the president and working relationship shall be further detailed in a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

ITEM TWO—VICE PRESIDENT: The Vice-President shall perform all the duties of the President in the absence of the latter.

ITEM THREE—DEAN: The Academic Dean of the College shall, under the President, fix the hours of recitation, govern, control, and regulate the conduct of the students, have general oversight of curriculum, student records, and such other internal details and administrative duties as may be delegated to him by the President of the College.

ITEM FOUR—BUSINESS MANAGER: The Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of all accounts of the College and shall receive and expend as directed by the Board of Trustees and President, all money for the expenses of the institution. He shall make an annual report to the Board and furnish the Executive Committee with such information pertaining to his office as may be requested. He shall provide bond in whatever amount the Board may require. Until such times as the Board of Trustees may deem different the Treasurer's office shall be contained within the Business Manager's Office. The Business Manager may at the direction of the administration designate this duty to a subordinate officer. The Business Manager shall have general supervision of the financial business of the College, and shall, at the direction of the President, be responsible for the upkeep of all the physical facilities and premises of the College. Detailed duties are directed in a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

SECTION III

FACULTY

The faculty shall consist of the President, the Dean, and all teachers of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. Instructors and assistant teachers shall have the privilege of sitting with the faculty in stated meetings but shall not have the right of voting.

It shall be the policy of the College to employ on its faculty those who are members of Free Will Baptist churches that are affiliated with the National Association. Emergencies, however arising from the resignation, illness, death, or approved leaves of absence of faculty members may be relieved by the temporary employment of instructors who are affiliated with any evangelical denomination. Part-time or short-term instructors, deemed essential to the successful prosecution of a consistent education program, may be employed at the discretion of the President without respect of denominational affiliation.

The faculty, under the authority and jurisdiction of the President, shall have general charge of instruction, attendance of students, examinations, administration of curriculum, discipline, and all matters involving the spiritual, physical, and social welfare of the College. The faculty shall be hired upon recommendation of the President.

In the selection of the faculty qualitative factors shall be kept in mind. All faculty members shall be urged to pursue graduate programs in their respective fields. Except in special cases no faculty member will be required to teach courses outside of his field.

SECTION IV

ACADEMIC COUNCIL

The Academic Council shall consist of the President, the Dean and the heads of the departments of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College: It shall determine the curriculum and academic policy of the College, prescribe requirements for admission, certificates, diplomas, and degrees, and supervise the courses of instruction offered by the various departments of the College.

SECTION V

CONTRACTS

The Board of Trustees shall establish the College policy involving the execution of contracts, deeds of conveyance, the determination of salaries, and employment of all officers, representatives, faculty members and essential domestic and maintenance employees. The President of the College shall negotiate agreements, executive contracts, employ representatives, and supply vacancies incurred by the termination of contracts, resignations, or death of any essential employees. All contracts for building construction shall be let only to persons or corporations posting a valid performance bond and recording the same in the Office of the County Clerk of Cleveland County, Oklahoma.

SECTION VI

ADVISORY COUNCIL

An advisory council shall be formed which is to be composed of interested, qualified persons in the various fields which will be of value in building and maintaining a strong academic program to carry out the educational program stated in the charter.

SECTION VII

AMENDMENT

These By-Laws may be amended by a favorable vote of two-thirds of the qualified members of the Board of Trustees of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College at any meeting of the Board, provided that the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing to each Trustee one month in advance. This change to be subject to the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.

SECTION VIII

ADMINISTRATIVE FUNCTIONS

The President of the Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College shall be elected by the Board of Trustees, and he shall act for and on behalf of the Board in the conduct and management of the institution. He shall also be a member of the Board of Trustees ex-officio and of the Executive committee, ex-officio, and his duties, powers and term of office shall be prescribed in the by-laws of the College and a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC.

Know all men by these presents, that, we whose names are hereunto subscribed, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the provisions of the corporation laws of the State of Oklahoma, and for that purpose state:

ARTICLE ONE

The name of this corporation shall be HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC.

ARTICLE TWO

The purpose of this corporation shall be the creation, establishment and maintenance of a college and institution of higher learning devoted to the promotion and impartation of higher learning, Christian education and such other education, instruction, learning, training and research as may be deemed essential for the cause of Christ and to that end prescribe courses of study and grant degrees. The doctrinal and theological position of this institution shall be that of the sponsoring denomination, Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and the treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptist as endorsed by the state body, and in

connection therewith, in accordance with the stipulation of the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

(a.) To prescribe courses of study for both resident and correspondence students, which shall include general education in the arts, Christian Ministries of Service and Biblical studies for wisdom; said courses to be taught in both a Junior College Division and a Bible College Division, and to award degrees, either graduate or post-graduate, to those persons satisfactorily completing the prescribed courses of study and to grant such other literary honors, including honorary degrees, as shall be deemed advisable.

(b.) To charge and collect tuition as determined by the Board of Trustees and to create scholarships.

(c.) To employ professors, instructors and other subordinate employees as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the college under the direction and control of the President of the College, with the advice and consent of the majority of the Board of Trustees.

(d.) To institute and carry on missions and commissions for missionary purposes and investigations.

(e.) To publish and distribute such pamphlets, literature or books as may be required in the conduct of such work and the general promotion of the College.

(f.) To sue and be sued in its corporate name and to enter into contracts of every type and nature.

(g.) To solicit support, receive, collect, hold and receive by gift or bequest personal property in any amount, money ~~or other thing of value~~; to purchase real estate, to receive real estate that ~~may be given, or devised~~ to the college for achieving the legitimate ends of the college and to sell or mortgage the same as the need arises.

(h.) To borrow money in payment of property for erecting buildings and making improvements and for any other purpose germane to the objectives and purposes of the college.

(i.) To issue notes, bonds, debentures and other evidences of indebtedness and execute mortgages, liens and other incumbrances upon the property of the corporation, real or otherwise, to secure the payment of any such evidences of indebtedness.

(j.) To transact any and all business connected with said College as may be necessary to achieve the purposes of said College.

(k.) To obtain under Internal Revenue Laws of the United States and of the Revenue Laws of the State of Oklahoma exemption from income property and other forms of taxation.

ARTICLE THREE

The location of this corporation shall be in Norman, Oklahoma.

ARTICLE FOUR

The duration of this corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE FIVE

The general control of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of Trustees consisting of 15 members, 9 of which trustees shall be elected by the delegates to the annual Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists—each of which shall serve for a term of three years and until his

successor is elected and qualified, and one member each shall be elected by the delegates to the annual meeting of the state association of Free Will Baptists of the States of Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico and Texas, each of which shall serve for a term of six years and until his successor is elected and qualified. Initially, the 9 trustees elected by said Oklahoma Association shall include 3 elected for three years, three elected for two years, and 3 elected for one year but their successors shall all be elected for a term of three years and until their successors are elected and qualified. Initially, said trustee elected by said Arkansas Association shall be elected for a term of six years, said trustee elected by said Colorado Association shall be elected for a term of five years, said trustee elected by said Kansas Association shall be elected for a term of four years, said trustee elected by said Missouri Association shall be elected for a term of three years, said trustee elected by said New Mexico Association shall be elected for a term of two years, and said trustee elected by said Texas Association shall be elected for a term of one year but their successors shall be elected for a term of six years. The Chairman of said Corporation shall be one of the trustees elected by said Oklahoma Association.

ARTICLE SIX

An executive committee consisting of the Chairman, Vice Chairman, and Secretary of the Board of Trustees shall possess all powers of the Board of Trustees between the stated meetings of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE SEVEN

All contracts for building construction shall be let only to persons or corporations posting a valid performance bond and recording the same in the office of the County Clerk of Cleveland, Oklahoma.

SECTION IX

AMENDMENTS

This charter may be hereafter amended subject to the provisions contained herein and the laws of the State of Oklahoma. It is provided, however, that the Trustees of the College shall not propose or apply for any amendment which has not been previously authorized by an act of the Oklahoma State Association.

CONSTITUTION OF MINISTER'S CONFERENCE

ARTICLE 1

This Minister's Conference shall be called the Oklahoma State Free Will Baptist Minister's Conference, and shall be composed of Ordained Free Will Baptist Ministers who are regular members of some Orthodox Free Will Baptist church in the State of Oklahoma who have paid their \$1.00 dues.

ARTICLE 2

The officers for this conference shall be President, Vice-President, and Clerk Treasurer, who shall be elected annually.

ARTICLE 3

This conference shall have the power to discipline its members.

ARTICLE 4

Members of this organization shall be all ordained ministers who participate in the benefits and activities of this body, and associate members who become members by payment of the \$1.00 annual dues.

ARTICLE 5

This conference shall meet Semi-Annually.

ARTICLE 6

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular session.

BY-LAWS OF MINISTER'S CONFERENCE

ARTICLE 1

The clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence the senior minister in years shall call the ministers into conference. If a quorum is present the President or in his absence the Vice-President shall moderate the meeting. If neither of these are present, the senior minister in years shall be in charge.

ARTICLE 2

It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the ministers of the conference. Ministers shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the conference. In case of questionable representation the case under question shall be referred to the Credential Committee.

ARTICLE 3

It shall be the duty of each minister belonging to this conference, to be active in pastoral or evangelistic services (disabled or retired ministers excepted). Any minister belonging to this conference shall report in each session in person or by letter, and failing to do so for two successive sessions shall be subject to discipline.

ARTICLE 4

Each conference shall be opened by reading a portion of God's word and prayer, and each session shall be closed with prayer.

ARTICLE 5

By a two-thirds vote of the members present ruling of the President may be overruled.

ARTICLE 6

This conference shall sit with open doors, except when it shall go into a committee as a whole.

ARTICLE 7

No member shall absent himself from the conference during its meeting without permission from the President.

ARTICLE 8

No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of a committee, unless person nominated is not elected.

ARTICLE 9

The President shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian Spirit, or when he thinks it will cause discord.

ARTICLE 10

Anyone desiring to speak shall rise and address the President by the appellation "Brother President," but shall not speak further until recognized.

ARTICLE 11

No member of this conference shall be allowed to speak more than five minutes, nor twice on the same subject without permission from the President.

ARTICLE 12

These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this conference by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

ARTICLES OF FAITH OF STATE ASSOCIATION

1. **THE BIBLE** — The Scriptures of the Old and New Testament were given by the inspiration of God, and are our infallible rules of faith and practice.

2. **GOD** — There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver and Righteous Governor of the Universe, and in the Scriptures as the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.

3. **CHRIST** — Christ is God manifest in the flesh: in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified. He is now risen and glorified is our ever-present Saviour and Lord.

4. **THE HOLY SPIRIT** — The Scriptures assigns to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of all men.

5. **THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD** — God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of Grace, not otherwise provided for as highest welfare of man requires.

6. **THE SINFULNESS OF MAN** — Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore inherited a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.

7. **THE WORK OF CHRIST** — The Son of God, by His incarnation, life, suffering, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.

8. **THE WORK OF SALVATION** — The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and the hearty renunciations of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit; freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

9. **ELECTION** — God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ, men become His elect.

10. **FREEDOM OF WILL** — The Human will is free and self controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit and live, or to resist them and perish.

11. **SALVATION FREE** — God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

12. **PERSEVERENCE** — All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.

13. **BACKSLIDING AND APOSTASY** — A person who has been regenerated or born again and is living in unconfessed, unforgiven sin, is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and therefore is a backslider in a lost condition who must repent and be

restored to the right relationship with God or be eternally lost.

We recognize, according to Hebrews 6: 4-6, that it is possible for a person to get in the condition that he could never return to Christ. This, we believe, is Apostasy; However, we also recognize that a regenerate person can fall into sin, be in a lost condition and still not be an Apostate. This person, through repentance, can be reconciled to God.

14. GOSPEL ORDINANCES — Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel: Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be administered to all true believers.

15. TITHING — God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament: Jesus Christ endorsed in the Gospel (Matt. 23: 23), and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." I Cor. 16: 2.

16. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH — The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from the secular employment and amusements for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God.

17. RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT, AND FINAL RETRIBUTION — The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation: then the wicked shall "Go away into eternal punishment but the righteous into eternal life."

RULES OF ORDER

1. At every sitting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded by prayer by the Moderator or whomever he may request.

2. Ministers and deacons present are invited to seats, allowed to take part in debates on all subjects, and to vote.

3. Those who speak shall rise and address the Moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.

4. No motion may be discussed until made and seconded.

5. When a motion has been made and seconded, and a member opposes its discussion, the Moderator shall put the question. "Shall it be discussed?" If negative, the question shall not be discussed.

6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member, and the vote taken separately.

7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.

8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.

9. All questions shall be decided by a majority vote of all Members present.

BY-LAWS OF STATE ASSOCIATION

1. The Clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence, the senior minister in years shall call the Association into conference, and if a quorum is present the moderator, or in his absence, the assistant moderator shall take charge; and if neither of them is present the senior minister in years shall act as Moderator.

2. It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the delegates to the Association, who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the Association.

3. It shall be the duty of every District belonging to this Association to send a letter to every annual session of this Association reporting in the same, spiritual condition, benevolent work, and its statistics. Any District belonging to this Association, which shall fail to report itself for two successive sessions, may be dismissed from the Association by a two thirds vote of all members present.

4. Each meeting shall be opened by reading a portion of the Bible and with prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.

5. By a two-thirds vote of members present, a ruling of the moderator can be overruled.

6. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.

7. ~~This~~ The Association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.

8. Any person not a member of this Association may be allowed to take part in its discussions by obtaining permission from the moderator.

9. It shall be the duty of all the Association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting, and anyone wishing to retire shall first obtain leave of the moderator.

10. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee, provided the person nominated be elected.

11. The moderator shall not allow discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.

12. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise to his feet and address the moderator by the appellation "Brother Moderator," but shall not speak further until recognized by the moderator.

13. No member of this association shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes nor twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator.

14. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

CONSTITUTION OF STATE ASSOCIATION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptists denomination, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a church; and to preserve and maintain correspondence and co-ordination with us, do therefore ordain this Constitution for our better denomination government.

ARTICLE I

NAME: This organization shall be known as the OKLAHOMA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE: The object and purpose of this organization shall be to unify the work of the various bodies composing this State Association, and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in connection with the various bodies in the Association, or that may hereafter be represented therein.

ARTICLE III

REPRESENTATION: Section 1. This Association shall be composed of all ordained ministers and deacons with membership in some local church which is a member of a district Association with membership in the State Association.

Section 2: Each District Association shall be entitled to a number of elected delegates equal with the number of churches composing said Association. These delegates may be recommended by the local churches and shall be endorsed by their district association.

ARTICLE IV

FINANCE: Each Association shall contribute \$20.00 per Church for support of the Association and delegate fees.

ARTICLE V

DISCIPLINE: This State Association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine or practices that may properly come before it from any of the bodies composing said organization; furthermore, if there be any question of discipline, doctrine or practices on the part of an affiliated association, delegates of that association shall not be seated until these questions have been settled to the satisfaction of the General Board.

Section 2: Decisions of the General Board may be appealed in this manner. All appeals shall come before the State Association when sitting in a committee as a whole.

ARTICLE VI

OFFICERS: A. The officers of the State Association shall consist of a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary. Each of these shall be elected at the close of each regular session except the Executive Secretary.

B. (1) The Executive Secretary shall be elected for a two year tenure. It shall be the responsibility of the Executive Board to seek out a prospective candidate and make their recommendation to the body at the state association in its regular session, with primary consideration given to the recommendation prior to any nominations.

(2) In the event of a vacancy occurring during the course of the year, the Executive Board shall fill the vacancy until the annual setting of the association.

ARTICLE VII

BOARDS: All standing boards shall be composed of seven (7) elected members who shall serve terms of 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1 years with such ex-officio members as may be provided elsewhere, except: (1) the General Board which shall be composed of one (1) member from each affiliated association, the chairman of each standing board, and the current general officers of this association, and (2) the College Board of Trustees which shall be composed as provided for in the Articles of Incorporation of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc.

The standing boards of this association shall be: Executive Board; Board of Church Extension, Missions and Evangelism; Sunday School Board; Church Training Service Board; and College Board of Trustees.

No standing board shall meet in a functional meeting during the session of this association.

ARTICLE VIII

DUTIES, SCOPE OF ENDEAVOR AND QUALIFICATIONS OF STANDING BOARDS

Section 1. EXECUTIVE BOARD: The Executive Board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of an affiliated association and in good standing with the association of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

It shall be the duty of this board to act in behalf of the association when it is not in session. It shall be bound to carry out the directions of the association and shall hold itself bound by every consideration of morality and honor to carry out the wishes of this association and to act under its instructions in whatever technical rights, civil laws and the decisions of courts may give it in certain emergencies. It shall be the duty of this board to sign their signatures to any and all papers concerning properties, indebtedness, bonds, or other legal documents pertaining to the execution of the will of this association, exclusive of the College Board of Trustees.

This board shall have the oversight of the Executive Department of this association. The members shall assist and direct such work for the general promotion of this association as is deemed needful or necessary as the means available shall permit. The Executive Department shall serve as the coordinating agency of this association to correlate the work of all standing boards and agencies.

~~This board shall have the oversight of Free Will Baptist Book Store and shall endeavor to serve affiliated associations and churches and the community with literature and church supplies. Merchandising procedures shall be those accepted as normal retail procedures with the board being cognizant of the spiritual contribution of the store in distributing Christian literature.~~

All decisions of this board shall be governed by the general tenets of this association and shall not violate this constitution.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, and work done and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Whereas this board represents the association when not in session, it and it alone shall have the power to call the association into special conference provided each affiliated association shall be given notice at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting of such special conference.

Section 2. GENERAL BOARD: This board shall be composed of one (1) member from each affiliated association, the chairman of each standing board, and the current general officers of this association. Each member must be a member of an affiliated association and in good standing with the association of which he is a member. The members shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to meet one (1) day preceding the annual session of this association. This board shall serve as the credential committee with the duties and responsibilities assigned by Article V of this constitution. This board shall hear reports of all standing boards. It shall serve as budget committee and shall make such recommendations as deemed pertinent to this association. A complete and accurate record shall

be kept of meetings of this board and a report shall be made in writing to this association in its annual session.

The moderator of the association shall serve as chairman of this board, and the clerk of the association shall serve as its clerk.

Section 3. BOARD OF CHURCH EXTENSION, MISSIONS AND EVANGELISM: This board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

It shall be the duty of this board to labor to further the Gospel of Jesus Christ into the uttermost parts of the earth. In accomplishing this, they are to endeavor to establish missions and churches in communities within the bounds of this association with whatever moral and financial assistance that may be theirs. In cases of small churches failing to function, whatever assistance deemed appropriate shall be rendered to maintain the effective witness of that church by either direct labor with the church or with an associational board in instances where the affiliated association has a functional board or agency.

This board shall be empowered to receive and convey title to real property in the area of its labors.

The promotion of missionary endeavors from a local, state or national level shall come within the scope of endeavor of this board. This board shall assist in maintaining prayer and financial support of missionary enterprises through whatever channels available.

Whereas missionary and evangelistic labors are so intimately related, this board shall assist through participation or assistance in maintaining a strong evangelistic thrust in the life of affiliated association.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Section 4. COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES: The College Board of Trustees shall be composed as provided for in the Articles of Incorporation of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc.

Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc. is an agency of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and is incorporated under the corporate laws of the State of Oklahoma. The articles of incorporation are a part of this association's record and delineate the purpose, duty and scope of endeavor of the members of this board.

Section 5. CHURCH TRAINING SERVICE BOARD: This board shall be composed of seven members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to plan and assist in organizing and sustaining a strong Church Training Service in every church in each association affiliated with this association with every means of promotion and assistance available to them. This board shall plan, coordinate and conduct state-wide youth camps or camp.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Section 6. SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD: This board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to plan and promote Sunday schools in every church in each association affiliated with this association. This board shall use every available means to promote Sunday school clinics, seminars, institutes and conventions on local, district and state-wide basis, working with local agencies to distribute and employ all effective methods and material available.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Section 7. VACANCIES: Vacancies shall occur when a member moves from the territorial bounds of this association, by death, by resignation or by removal from office by this association. In the event of disciplinary action where charges concerning misconduct, doctrine or practice shall have been lodged against a member of any board, his office shall be held in abeyance until such charges shall be concluded or as determined by this association.

All boards shall have power to fill vacancies arising between sessions of this association. Such appointment shall terminate at the next session of the association and shall be filled by this association.

Section 8. EMPLOYEES: All employees of boards or agencies of this association shall be employed by agreement or contract with employing board or agency upon approval of this association except those elected by this association and the conditions of their employment shall be those approved by this association.

The duties of the Executive Secretary of this association shall be:

- (1) He is to represent, or cause to be represented, the association at all affairs of interest to the association.
- (2) He is to promote the work of the association in such a manner so as to unify the efforts of the association.
- (3) He is to serve with all standing boards and committees of the association in an ex-officio capacity.
- (4) He is to aid in planning the work of the association by relating the activities and plans of one board to another.
- (5) He is to report to the association during each annual session.
- (6) He is to communicate to the affiliated members of this association the pressing causes and events before the association. This can be in person or by means of a periodical bulletin or both.
- (7) He shall serve as treasurer of this association. An accurate and complete record of all funds received and disbursed shall be kept and a written report shall be included in his report to this association in its annual session.
- (8) The conditions of employment shall be determined by the Executive Board.

ARTICLE IX

DISSOLUTION: Should this association cease to function, all properties and holdings shall go to the National Association of Free Will Baptists after all creditors are satisfied and indebtedness cleared.

ARTICLE X

AMENDMENTS: This constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session of the association by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of members present and voting, provided proposed amendment or alteration be presented in writing to the body one (1) day in advance.

ARTICLE XI

SPECIAL SESSIONS: Elected delegates to the last session of this association shall be retained as standing delegates for special called sessions.
