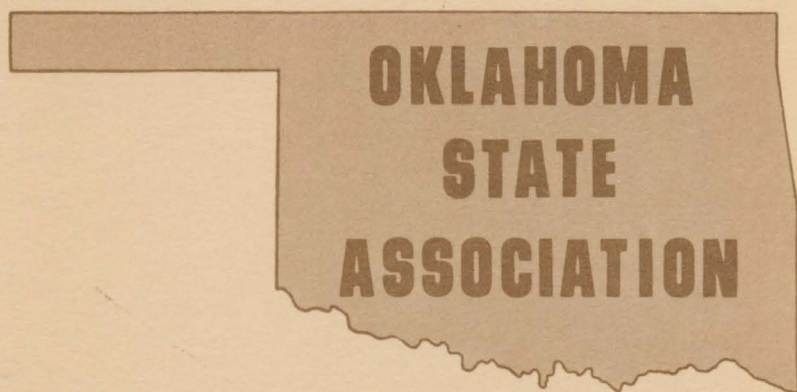

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE STATE ASSOCIATION**  
**THEME: "WE WOULD SEE JESUS" (*John 12:21*)**

**Tuesday Evening, October 22, 1974**

The 66th Annual Session of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists met in the Crystal Ball Room of the Mayo Hotel, Tulsa, Oklahoma, October 22, 23, 24, 1974. A musical prelude was presented by Mrs. Debbie Burden. Mr. Bob Followwill directed the music for the evening service. He directed the congregation in singing "Blessed Assurance" and "Amazing Grace."

Jerry Dudley, Clerk of the Association led the congregation in prayer, then called the Association into official session and introduced the officers.

Homer Young, Moderator, welcomed all delegates and visitors and gave special recognition to visiting brethren from outside our Association.

Bob Shockey, Director of Free Will Baptist National Home Missions, brought greetings to the body and led in devotional thoughts from Colossians 1:1-9.

Don Payne, President of Tulsa Area Free Will Baptist Ministerial Alliance, brought greetings and gave a special welcome to all visitors and guests and delegates, welcoming all to the Tulsa area.

Bob Followwill directed the congregation in singing "Heavenly Sunlight" and the Moderator recognized all members of the twenty-one (21) associations of the State Association.

The Ministers Quartette sang "He Gave Me Something Worth Living For" and "Because He Lives."

The Moderator, Homer Young, introduced Rev. Delbert Akin, the speaker of the evening. Brother Delbert Akin used the convention theme and spoke from the subject "We Would See Jesus in Missions" using a tape recording of greetings from Missionary Dock Caton in Spain as an introduction. Using John 12:21 and Acts 1:8, a great message was delivered. Bob Followwill sang "Have Thine Own Way" as an invitation hymn. The message was closed in prayer by Brother Akin.

Bill Jones, President of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College gave a special invitation to the Wednesday evening service where the college department of music will be featured in the service.

The Moderator introduced all missionaries who were present; Foreign Missionaries, Rev. & Mrs. Dennis Teague, Mrs. Shirley Combs; State Missionaries, Rev. & Mrs. Bob Duncan, Rev. & Mrs. David Sutton; all members of National and State Mission Boards.

Reford Wilson, Director of National Foreign Missions Department, led in the offertory prayer for missions. Offering in the amount of \$234.63 was received.

Moderator read the appointment of the various committees: Resolution; Doyle Cox, Ted Davis, Ray Gwartney, David Archer & Tim Eaton. Public Morals; Connie Cariker, Charles Bigger, H. E. Staires, Frank Giles and Jimmy Shepherd. Obituary; John H. West, Richard Gallant, Jim Cearley, Keith Burden and Joel Kircher.

Following announcements, the Moderator led in the dismissal prayer.

**Wednesday Morning Session, October 23, 1974.**

The Wednesday morning session opened with singing directed by Bob Followwill with Velma Cox at the piano. The Congregation sang "I Love to Tell the Story."

The Moderator's message and morning devotion was delivered by Homer Young from Matthew 7:7-12. Following prayer requests from all departments of the National Association, Glen Lewis led in prayer. Prayer requests were then received for all departments of the State Association and prayer was offered by Bill Jones. Dr. Billy Melvin, Executive Director of National Association of Evangelicals led in prayer following personal prayer requests.

The Association business began with the Association's Clerk reading a partial report of the General Board with all items related to seating of delegates. The General Board is the credentials committee of the Association.

As a part of the report, the Clerk read all letters from District Associations. Motion carried to receive all letters.

Motion carried to adopt items 1, 2, 3, and 4 of the General Board report. (see reports)

Visitors and messengers from outside this Association were recognized and welcomed to seat in counsel with us.

Motion carried that the printed program be adopted but flexible in time and sequence to accommodate the needs of the Association agenda.

Report of the National Church Training Service Department was given by Malcolm Fry, Director.

Billy Melvin, Executive Director of National Association of Evangelicals gave a brief report of that body with special greetings to this Association.

Paul Kettelman, Public Relations Director of Free Will Baptist Bible College, Nashville, Tennessee gave a report of that college and greetings to this Association.

Lonnie DeVault, Executive Secretary, introduced Rev. David Joslin, Executive Secretary of Arkansas Free Will Baptists. His greetings and glowing report was warmly received by the Association.

Lonnie DeVault then introduced Rev. Jim Williams, Executive Secretary of Texas Free Will Baptists. His greetings, report of Texas' work and special thanks to Oklahoma was again received by the Association quite warmly.

These messages from our sister churches in neighboring states was a source of real joy and thanksgiving to all attending.

Francis Boyle, Director of Executive Church Bonds reported on that ministry and announced his moving to become the Business Manager of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College.

Earnest Harrison, Sr., Assistant Moderator, led in prayer, dismissing the body for a short recess before morning worship.

#### **Wednesday, October 23, 1974 11:00 A.M. Worship Hour**

The call to worship opened with Bob Followwill singing "How Great Thou Art." He then led the congregation in singing "All Hail the Power."

J. C. Morgan led in the invocation and then the Congregation sang "There is a Fountain."

John Yasada, from Japan, sang "He is so Wonderful."

Doyle Cox, presiding over the service, introduced Ray Gwartney for the message. The message was based upon the theme of the convention and entitled "We Would See Jesus in Our Message." A fine, challenging message was delivered.

After convention announcements were made, David Sutton dismissed for lunch with prayer.

Dr. J. D. O'Donnell, Editorial Manager of Free Will Baptist National Sunday School Department, reported on the work of that department with warm greetings to the Association, especially remembering his former work with this people.

Milburn Wilson gave the report of the State Sunday School Board. Motion carried to receive the report. (See Reports).

Albert C. "Dugan" McDonald elected as the seven (7) year member of the Sunday School Board.

Delbert Akin gave the report of the State Mission Board. Motion carried to receive the report. (see Reports).

Delbert Akin elected as seven (7) year member of the Mission Board.

Berton Perry elected as one (1) year member of the Mission Board to fill the vacancy created by Herman Wood moving from the State.

Roy Thomas, Field Director of National Home Mission Department, brought greetings and reported on the work of that department. (see Reports)

Reford Wilson, Director of National Foreign Mission Department, brought greetings and reported on the work of that department. (see Reports).

Clarence Shepherd gave the report of the State Executive Board. Motion carried to receive the report item by item. (see Reports).

Item No. 2 amended to read "A committee is to be appointed to study the possibility of changing the time of the State Association to the spring of the year. (carried)

Item No. 3 (reserved to Thursday for election of general officers)

Item No. 4 (carried).

Executive Secretary's report given by Lonnie DaVoult. Motion carried to receive the report. (see Reports).

Ray Martin gave the Free Will Baptist Bookstore report. Motion carried to receive the report. (see Reports).

A motion carried "Any future funds received from the royalties on the Ringling property be directed to Hillsdale College for the express purpose of retiring the present indebtedness."

Motion carried to adjourn business and return for worship at 7:30 P.M.

#### **Wednesday Evening, October 23, 1974**

The Wednesday evening worship hour was called to order at 7:30 P.M. by Lonnie DaVoult, presiding.

David Parish led the congregation in singing " 'Tis so Sweet to Trust in Jesus."

Prayer was voiced by Bailey Thompson.

The congregation then sang "Will Jesus Find Us Watching?"

Eugene Workman, from the Executive Department of the National Association, presented "Contact" magazine and its ministry.

Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College choir sang "I See A Day" and "In the Last Days."

The New Life Singers from Hillsdale were introduced and sang "Amazing Grace", "Jesus Lifted Me" and "Redeemed."

President Bill Jones was introduced by Lonnie Davoult. Following prayer, President Jones read Ephesians 4:11-12 as a basis for his message "We Would See Jesus in Education."

A great number of souls stood together at the invitation to indicate rededication and consecration to the will of God.

The "Sunshine Trio" from Hillsdale College sang two (2) numbers and the "Harvester's Quartette" sang two (2) songs.

Jerry Rhoades was introduced and he presented awards to the top ten (10) churches in giving toward the ministry of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College.

Lonnie DaVoult led in a special offering for Hillsdale and received a cash offering of \$1,867.75 and pledges in the amount of \$1,725.00 for the construction and furnishing of a student lounge at the school.

The service was dismissed in prayer led by Bailey Thompson.

#### **Thursday Morning, October 24, 1974**

The Thursday morning session was called to order with singing directed by Keith Burden with Debbie Burden accompanying the congregation in "Praise the Lord" and "Onward Christian Soldiers."

Clarence Campbell brought morning devotions from Hebrews 11:1-6 and closed the devotional thoughts with prayer.

Cleo Purcell, Director of Women's National Auxiliary Convention reported the work and ministry of her department and gave greetings to the Association.

**COMMITTEE REPORTS**

**Obituary Committee**

We the Obituary Committee wish to report that God in His infinite mercy has seen fit to call from our midst 143 beloved brothers and sisters of our State Association of Free Will Baptists this past year.

We recommend that we stand for a moment of silent prayer in commemoration of these loved ones whom God has called from our midst.

**Public Morals Committee**

We recommend the following items:

**Item 1.**

That our churches cooperate with the Sooner Alcoholic and Narcotic Education, Inc., in a financial way, and that our pastors warn their people, especially the youth, of the dangers of using narcotics, barbituates, glue-sniffing and misuse of any harmful drug.

**Item 2.**

That our churches support the Anti-Crime Council of Oklahoma, Inc., in a financial way, since they have incurred \$18,000.00 indebtedness in their opposition of paramutual gambling.

**Item 3.**

That we go on record as being opposed to the use or sale of tobacco in any form, and that our ministers set the example of total abstinence.

**Item 4.**

That our churches conform to a more modest dress using 1 Peter 3:3-7 as our guide, and that our churches follow the biblical principles of dress rather than the current vogue of secular society.

**Item 5.**

That we actively oppose any type of gambling.

**Item 6.**

That we go on record as being opposed to pornography, and that we do all possible to stop the sale and distribution of this type of literature.

**Item 7.**

That we stand opposed to the teaching of sex education in the public schools because of the lack of moral application and encourage our homes and churches to properly instruct our young people.

**Item 8.**

That our people encourage their grocery store to delete alcoholic beverages from their shelves.

**Item 9.**

That the State Association go on record as deploring corruption in Government, and we oppose any candidates advocating legalized intoxicants for 18 year olds.

**Item 10.**

Due to the fact that our public school system has the greatest influence on our young people, that we challenge the evolutionist monopoly on creation and ask that the Bible be placed with present material being taught.

## Resolution Committee

We recommend the adoption of the following resolutions:

1. Be it resolved that the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists go on record with a "statement of non-affiliation" with Arthur Billows. This is to concur with the action of the National Association Home Mission Board. (carried)

2. Be it resolved that we double the size of the "Promoter" (whereas it is now 4 pages, to make it 8 pages) and the State Association continue to pay for its publication. (Referred to study committee)

3. We recommend that the Executive Board study and have a recommended change to clarify Article IV of the Constitution (page 59 of 1973 Minutes) by next year's State Association. (carried)

4. Be it resolved that the Association represented by each standing board member be listed in the Oklahoma State Association minutes following his name.

5. WHEREAS: The costs of travel, printing, promotional material, and other factors involved in the expense of promotional programs of the various departments of the State Association have increased greatly in this period of inflation; and,

WHEREAS: There are now in existence duplications and overlappings within the different departments of the State Association in promotional aids; and,

WHEREAS: There are some departments which are entitled to more available help and aid in promoting their activities but are not receiving such;

THEREFORE, Be it resolved that a study committee on promotional programs, composed of the Executive Secretary, Promotional Director of Hillsdale College and Chairmen of the standing boards of the State Association be directed to study the methods and means of promotion now in effect and being used, and bring back any suggested changes or additions deemed advisable as recommendations to the State Association in October 1975.

6. It is herewith recommended that the C.T.S. Board of the Oklahoma Association of Free Will Baptists establish a youth organization within the framework of the Oklahoma Association. Said group shall be known as the "Oklahoma State Youth Conference" and shall provide a means of utilizing Free Will Baptist youth in the total service of Christ.

To attain the purpose of the Oklahoma Youth Conference, the following objectives shall be sought:

- 1) To aid in helping teens toward the knowledge of the unique contribution they can make as individuals to the ministries of the local church.
- 2) To develop in Free Will Baptist Youth an identity with the Free Will Baptist denomination through fellowship with other Free Will Baptist young people in social and religious settings.
- 3) To develop in young people an active personal relationship with Christ through spiritual activities which this organization would provide.
- 4) To develop young people in their growth toward the ideal of Christ through active participation in causes and events which are spiritually oriented.

The organization shall be a part of the ministry of the Oklahoma C.T.S. Board, and shall be limited in membership to those persons between 13 and 19 years of age who are members of an auxiliary (C.T.S., Sunday School) of churches in the Oklahoma Association. Also, a governing board of person/or persons appointed by the CTS Board shall give guidance and direction to the work of the Youth Conference. The Youth Conference, however, shall have power to elect such officers as necessary to govern the affairs of the group. Meetings of the group would be held annually at the Hillsdale campus for a two day meeting in conjunction with the State C. T. S. Competition.

A Youth Conference of this type would fill an existing need in our denomination; and would easily fit our denominational framework and calendar.

## GENERAL BOARD REPORT

The General Board of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists met Monday, October 21, 1974 in the Studio Room of the Mayo Hotel, Tulsa, Oklahoma; and as a result of that meeting we offer the following items for your consideration:

1. Correspondence was received from twenty-one (21) District Associations. Eighteen of these we find in order and recommend that their delegates be seated.
2. We recommend that the elected delegates from Arkansas Valley and Eureka Associations be seated when associational costs and delegate fees are received.
3. We note that statistical information only is received from Hopewell # 1.
4. We recommend that all unexpended funds from representation fees be retained in a special fund for use in entertaining the National Association of Free Will Baptist in Tulsa, Oklahoma, in July 1976.
5. This Board heard the reports of (1) Executive Board; (2) Executive Secretary; (3) Free Will Baptist Bookstore; (4) State Mission Board; (5) State Sunday School Board; (6) State C.T.S. Board; and (7) Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College Trustee Board. We recommend their adoption as they are printed.
6. We recommend a cooperative plan budget of one hundred thousand (100,000.00) dollars for 1975-76 and that it be allocated as follows:

1. We recommend the State Association meet in Muskogee at the Civic Center for the 1976 session.
2. We recommend that a committee be appointed to study the possibility of changing the time of the State Association to the spring of the year.
3. We nominate (or recommend) Reverend Lonnie DaVoult to be re-elected as State Executive Secretary.
4. We recommend that the income for the sale of property at 4301 S. Walker in Oklahoma City, be applied to the monthly housing allowance of the Executive Secretary.



5. We recommend that the income of \$3,810.00 in oil royalty received on property once owned by the State Association, be used to establish a New Church Loan Fund for buying property or to aid in new buildings, the use of this money to be directed by the State Mission Board.
6. We recommend that we accept the bid from A. & A. Construction on remodeling the upstairs (outside) and build a 16 X 40 foot shipping room addition to the southwest corner of the present bookstore building (with the understanding that we do the pointing on the addition, the light fixtures will not be installed and another door is to be added to plans). The upstairs shall be re-shingled if necessary. Jim McGuire be paid \$50.00 for drawing plans for remodeling upstairs and the 16 X 40 addition. We further recommend that we finance this building and remodeling with a loan for \$7,000.00 from Capitol Hill State Bank, for five years, at 11.75% interest and the monthly payment of \$154.83.  
(Our budget will be included with the Executive Secretary's report.)

### **Executive Secretary's Report**

The years 1973-74 have proved to be great years for Oklahoma Free Will Baptist. We have matured more in this twelve months' time than in any other period. We have seen every phase of our work develop more than just annually proportionately. Our College is enjoying its greatest year of developing and training young people in every capacity. Our State Missions Board has been able to conclude one Work, develop another and anticipate a third work all within this time. Our C.T.S. has enjoyed its greatest time in the competitive field and State Youth Camps. Our Sunday School Board has conducted Enlargement Campaigns and many of our churches has experienced great growths in their Sunday Schools. Our Executive Board has been privileged to act upon great steps forward for our state. It has been my privilege to meet with and to help promote each and every phase of this work.

Our Bookstore under the direction of Bro. Ray Martin, assisted by Bro. Gene Wheeler and Sis. Wanda Nolan has enjoyed its best year. We are anticipating several changes that will enhance the store and the efficiency of serving you. Our Sunday School literature program has been most gratifying. To Serve You is our greatest desire.

I talked with the Oil Company that is exploring our Royalties and he told me that the Well has been drilled but they had not circulated yet at this printing but he assured me that we would have some production and I hope to be able to give you more complete news at the time of the State Meeting.

It is wonderful the way our neighboring States are responding to our Fellowship. We were not privileged to be in the Texas and Kansas State Meetings, but the Brethren there assured me that they enjoyed our relationship. I visited the Arkansas and Missouri State Meetings and received a very warm welcome. We are to have representatives from all these States at our yearly meeting this year. For this- I am very thankful! It is only through our United Effort that we can Glorify God and further His Kingdom here on Earth.

I attended the National Convention of the National Association of Evangelicals. This was a wonderful experience for me and our State. I wish I had time and space to express my satisfaction of our State being a member of this great Organization. Brother Billy Melvin, one of our own Free Will Baptist, who is President of N.A.E. is to be with us at the State Meeting. I am sure that he will be happy to discuss in detail the activities of the N.A.E..

**C.E.P. '72.** Our mission in Jenks has done well. They have completed a lovely building in the past year and are now having full-time services in it. They have scheduled an organizational meeting for October 20, 1974. They, too, should be on a self-sustaining basis in the near future.

**C.E.P. '73.** Enid has been designated C.E.P. '73. The board's aim of beginning a new project each year has had to slow down due to the lack of funds. However, the board has recently authorized a survey of Enid with the anticipation of beginning a work there immediately. The director of the work has already been selected. We ask that our people pray for this work and give that we may soon have a thriving work in the area.

We appreciate the response of our people to the cause of missions. During the past year we have had numerous missionaries to other states in our midst and you have responded most favorably. Oklahoma leads the nation in giving to home missions. This

## HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE

### Report to the Oklahoma State Association

For the fifth straight year, enrollment at Hillsdale continues to increase. For the fall of 1974, a thirty per cent jump was recorded as 158 men and women enrolled.

In May of 1974, the first fourth year class graduated. The program of ministerial training has added a new dimension at Hillsdale in the maturity of the students as well as in the balancing of the curriculum. The extension schools continue to be well received in both Oklahoma and Missouri.

Gift income for the last year exceeded \$175,000. Most of this was applied to our building program, which has proven to be an asset as conditions have become more crowded. We appreciate the associations in Oklahoma who adopted the suggested quota from last year at McAlester and we especially commend Green Country Association, Canadian Association, Dibble Association, Fellowship Association, and South Grand River Association, all of whom have met or exceeded their suggested quotas.

This past year has seen the construction of two houses on campus; one a home for the President and the other a duplex for two faculty families. We were not able to sell the President's home in Moore, but have retained it for temporary usage as a dormitory. At the Board Meeting on September 10, a proposal was adopted to enclose the patio of the west side of the Activity Building at a cost of approximately \$5,000 for construction and \$2,500 for furnishing. A proposal was also approved to build a four-plex designed for married student apartments but to be utilized as temporary housing for our men at a cost of approximately \$55,000. This money is to be raised in addition to the general income fund and the four-plex is not to be built until all the money is in.

Looking ahead, we envision a continuing increase in our student body for several reasons. Academically, our quality of education is increasing as evidenced by our students who transfer and do well in other colleges and universities. Financial aid opportunity is a continuing important factor in the ability of many students to attend Hillsdale. Also, sports offers an outlet that many college students seek. *And*, more than any other, the emphasis to personally accomplish the will of God in the lives of students can insure the quality of future enrollments. Construction on the campus of Hillsdale must continue or our student growth will be stymied. We also plan a continued balanced curriculum that will permit all Free Will Baptist students to attend a college that is right for them, a college that ministers to the whole man.

Our budget for 1975-76 is \$492,025. This report is submitted with a thankful heart to God for his working among those of His people in this state and their personal involvement and support.

**(1) SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The College uses the fund method of accounting, whereby an individual fund is a separate accounting entity made up of assets, liabilities, revenues, expenditures, transfers and a fund balance. This method of accounting is generally accepted among colleges and universities as the most effective means of controlling financial data.

Buildings and equipment are not depreciated by the College. This is an acceptable procedure for a non-profit organization.

**OKLAHOMA STATE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY CONVENTION  
CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS**

**ARTICLE I**

**NAME**

This organization shall be known as the Oklahoma State Woman's Auxiliary Convention.

**ARTICLE II**

**PURPOSE**

The purpose of this convention shall be to bring the women of each district convention together for fellowship, sharing information, and encouraging one another in the work of the Lord.

**ARTICLE III**

**OFFICERS**

The officers of this convention shall be a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and field worker. These shall serve on the state executive committee together with three members elected by the convention as desired. These shall serve for a period of 2 years.

## ARTICLE IV

### MEMBERSHIP

This convention shall be composed of the officers of the convention together with each active auxiliary member of the district or local (duly accredited by the credentials committee).

## ARTICLE V

### MEETINGS

The annual meeting shall be held each year on the day preceding the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and at the place designated by said association.

## ARTICLE VI

### AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a two-thirds vote of members present.

## BY-LAWS

## ARTICLE I

### DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1, President. The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed, call the executive committee together when necessary, be ex-officio member of all committees, and serve as chairman of the executive committee, see that reports are made promptly to the national secretary and perform all duties usually pertaining to such an office.

Section 2, Vice President. The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the overseeing of the work in general.

Section 3, Secretary. The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and executive committee meetings, preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor in office, and make an annual report to the national secretary on a form available from the WNAC office. She shall compile the districts slates of officers and addresses immediately after the convention. She shall also send a slate of state officers and addresses to the national executive secretary. She is chairman of the Credentials Committee.

The secretary shall also serve as historian keeping an historical record and submitting historical information to the national executive secretary annually.

Section 4, Treasurer. The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account and shall give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She shall also send an annual report to the WNAC office (executive secretary-treasurer) at least ten days before the end of the fiscal year. She shall encourage support of missions through the WNAC Gift Plan, individual giving and special offerings.

Section 5, Field Worker. The field worker shall have charge of all field work pertaining to, or necessary to, the promotion of the work of the convention and keep the national program before the district officers.

## ARTICLE II

### ELECTIONS

The general officers shall be nominated by a nominating committee and shall be elected by acclamation, unless there are other nominations. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken on each. All elections shall be held at the closing business session of the convention.

## ARTICLE III

### EXPENSES

Section 1. An appropriation of 6 cents per mile toward the expense of the general officers, when called upon to attend the executive committee meeting to plan program, secretary's expenses, phone calls, postage and stationery for officers will be paid by the convention. All field promotional work is subject to the state executive committee, who should approve all work done by state officers in the interest of state work, as well as expenses of the same.

Section 2. An amount of \$50.00 shall be paid on the expense of the state president to attend WNAC.

## ARTICLE IV

### COMMITTEES

Section 1. Executive Committee — The executive committee shall be composed of the five officers and three members elected by the convention. Five of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the executive committee to maintain an overseeing of the work at large. They shall act for the convention when necessary. They shall meet with district presidents night preceding the state auxiliary convention.

Section 2. Resolutions Committee — A resolutions committee of five members shall be appointed by the president as needed.

Section 3. Nominating Committee — The nominating committee shall be composed of at least one member from each district convention. Nominations shall be submitted by district with their annual report. These elected by the body at the annual meeting.

Section 4. Credentials Committee — The secretary shall be chairman of the credentials committee, and other members may be appointed by the president. The treasurer shall be a standing member of this committee.

Section 5. Finance Committee — The finance committee shall be appointed by the president. This committee audits the financial records of the year and reports on same to the convention.

Section 6. Student Loan Committee — State Auxiliary President and 2 elected members to serve 2 years each. They shall be elected on alternate years.

Section 7. Registration committee shall be provided by the district convention which is host to state convention.

## ARTICLE V

### FEES AND REPORTS

Active members shall pay dues of \$1.25 per year. With 25 cents remaining in the district. \$1.00 to be forwarded to state where 25 cents shall be retained, and 75 cents forwarded to WNAC as required for membership fees. It shall be the duty of each body directly affiliated with the State Auxiliary Convention to send a report to every annual session.

## ARTICLE VI

### AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of members present at regular meeting of the state auxiliary convention.

## ARTICLE VII

### GIFTS

The desired plans for giving in the Woman's Auxiliary are those adopted by WNAC as follows:

1. Mission offerings following each special season of prayer
2. Co-Laborer offering (monthly or quarterly designated to WNAC General Fund)
3. WNAC Emphasis Month in August or other time more convenient to help in support of WNAC General Fund
4. Memorial Student Loan Fund (special program and offering in September to assist worthy and needy students at FWBBC in Nashville)
5. Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College Student Loan Fund. (Special program and offering in September to assist worthy and needy students at Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College)
6. Tithes — Pay tithes on all undesignated money received
7. All offerings are to be forwarded through regular channels

## ARTICLE VIII

### WNAC DELEGATE

Each district convention shall submit one nomination for a State delegate to WNAC with their annual report. This nomination (along with others as needed to make up 15 delegates to WNAC) shall be elected by the body at the annual meeting. It shall be the duty of delegates elected to notify president if they cannot attend WNAC. President shall appoint

## CONSTITUTION Preamble

The purpose of the Free Will Baptist Master's Men, state of Oklahoma is to provide a means of Christian fellowship and to deepen the spiritual lives of the laymen of the local church. Also, to provide a means of developing the abilities and talents of the laymen, and to promote the cause of Christ through a complete, "total church program", as prescribed by Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.

## ARTICLE I

### Name

The name of this organization shall be known as the Free Will Baptist Master's Men, State of Oklahoma.

## ARTICLE II

### Membership

Section 1. The membership of this organization shall be composed of the district associations of Master's Men, and any local chapters where there is only one chapter in the district, within the state of Oklahoma.

Section 2. Every member in good standing of an affiliated district

association of Master's Men, or any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, is entitled to the full benefits of membership.  
Section 3. Each district association, or any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, shall submit an annual, written report to this body, (as a matter of information).

### ARTICLE III

#### Officers

The officers of this organization shall consist of a president, vice-president and a secretary-treasurer.

The officers of this organization shall be elected annually and may succeed themselves, at this level.

### ARTICLE IV

#### Executive Committee

Section 1. The executive committee shall consist of the elected officers of this organization and they shall serve as the program committee for each annual convention.

Section 2. Ex-officio members of the executive committee shall be the presidents of the district associations of Master's Men, presidents of any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, and the state executive secretary of the State Association of Free Will Baptists.

### ARTICLE V

#### Meetings

This organization shall meet annually at 7:30 PM on the Monday night before the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists convenes.

### ARTICLE VI

#### Amendments

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of any regular meeting.

### BY-LAWS

#### Voting Rights

Section 1. Every member of each affiliated district association, or any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, is eligible to vote on all questions and matters that might come before the Free Will Baptist Master's Men, State of Oklahoma.

#### Committees

Section 2. The executive committee shall transact all routine business and shall act for the organization in the interim between meetings.

Section 3. The executive committee shall meet at the call of the president.

Section 4. A nominating committee, for the annual election of officers, shall be composed of the presidents of each district association, and the president of any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district.

Section 5. The president shall appoint all other committees, subject to the approval of the body.

#### Finance

Section 6. This organization shall be financed on the basis of offerings, dues and assessments.

#### Quorum

Section 7. One-tenth of the members of this organization shall constitute a quorum at any regular meeting.



## **Amendments**

Section 8. These bylaws may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

# **HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC. BY-LAWS BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

## **SECTION I**

The Board of Trustees of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc., an Oklahoma corporation, shall be composed of fifteen members, elected as provided in the Articles of Incorporation of said College, as amended:

**ARTICLE A—OFFICERS:** The officers of the board of Trustees shall be a Chairman, an Assistant Chairman, and a Secretary, each of whom shall be elected by the Board for a term of one year. They shall continue in office until their successors have been chosen:

Item 1—**CHAIRMAN:** The chairman of the Board of Trustees or his assistant shall preside at all meetings of the Board. He shall be an ex-officio member of the Executive Committee.

Item 2—**SECRETARY:** The Secretary shall record and preserve minutes of all meetings and acts of the Board of Trustees and countersign all deeds, conveyances, and other papers authorized by the Board. He shall have authority to call special meetings of the Trustees of the College upon the written request of two-thirds of the members of the Board; he shall mail notice of said meeting to the trustees ten (10) days in advance.

Item 3—**EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:** The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, the Vice-Chairman of the Board, the Secretary of the Board. The Executive Committee shall have authority to consider and act upon all questions affecting the College which may be brought before it between the stated meetings of the Board, or whenever it is deemed impractical to convene the entire Board, or a quorum of the Board fails to attend a called or regular meeting. It shall transact such business as may be committed to it by the Board and shall act for the College on such matters as it may submit to it. The Committee shall meet at the call of the Chairman or the President of the College.

**ARTICLE B—MEETINGS:** The Board of Trustees shall meet each year at a time and place agreed upon by the Board. It shall, also, hold special meetings whenever called in accordance with the By-Laws of the Board. Such special meetings may be called by either the chairman of the Board, or the President of the College.

**ARTICLE C—QUORUM:** A majority of the members or the Board of Trustees of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc. in attendance at any called or regular meeting, written notice of which has been mailed by the Secretary to each trustee, shall constitute a quorum. No proxy votes shall be permitted. No ex-officio member shall be entitled to vote at meetings of the Board of Trustees.

**ARTICLE D—ELECTIONS:** In all elections held by the Board of Trustees each member present except ex-officio members shall be entitled to one vote, and the result shall be determined by a majority of the votes

cast. Due notice of any election must be personal notice to the members or a day on the minutes of the Board not less than one week preceding the election.

## SECTION II

### OFFICERS OF HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE

The officers of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College shall be a President, Vice-President, Dean, and a Business Manager, each of whom shall be elected by the Board of Trustees to hold office for two years exclusive of the President whose term of office shall be indefinite. It is provided, however, that retirement of any one of the officers herein named may occur at any time upon the resignation of the officer or the request of the Board. In either case, notice shall be given six weeks before the date of the proposed retirement unless otherwise agreed upon by the concerned parties.

**ITEM ONE—PRESIDENT:** The President shall be executive officer of the Board of Trustees and shall have general control of the College including its officers, teachers, students, and business. He shall render to the Board complete annual reports and to its chairman, Executive Committee or other committees such information as may be deemed essential to a thorough knowledge of the operation of the College and its promotion. He shall be a member of the Board of Trustees ex-officio and the Executive Committee ex-officio and shall have the rights and privileges of a member of the Board except voting. The President shall execute all documents, instruments, and conveyances on behalf of the College. Duties of the president and working relationship shall be further detailed in a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

**ITEM TWO—VICE PRESIDENT:** The Vice-President shall perform all the duties of the President in the absence of the latter.

**ITEM THREE—DEAN:** The Academic Dean of the College shall, under the President, fix the hours of recitation, govern, control, and regulate the conduct of the students, have general oversight of curriculum, student's records, and such other internal details and administrative duties as may be delegated to him by the President of the College.

**ITEM FOUR—BUSINESS MANAGER:** The Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of all accounts of the College and shall receive and expend as directed by the Board of Trustees and President, all money for the expenses of the institution. He shall make an annual report to the Board and furnish the Executive Committee with such information pertaining to his office as may be requested. He shall provide bond in whatever amount the Board may require. Until such times as the Board of Trustees may deem different the Treasurer's office shall be contained within the Business Manager's Office. The Business Manager may at the direction of the administration designate this duty to a subordinate officer. The Business Manager shall have general supervision of the financial business of the College, and shall, at the direction of the President, be responsible for the upkeep of all the physical facilities and premises of the College. His detailed duties are directed in a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

## SECTION III

### FACULTY

The faculty shall consist of the President, the Dean, and all teachers of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. Instructors and assistant teachers shall have the privilege of sitting with the faculty in stated meetings but shall not have the right of voting.

It shall be the policy of the College to employ on its faculty those who are members of Free Will Baptist churches that are affiliated with the National Association. Emergencies, however arising from the resignation, illness, death, or approved leaves of absence of faculty members may be relieved by the temporary employment of instructors who are affiliated with any evangelical denomination. Part-time or short-term instructors, deemed essential to the successful prosecution of a consistent education program, may be employed at the discretion of the President without respect of denominational affiliation.

The faculty, under the authority and jurisdiction of the President, shall have general charge of instruction, attendance of students, examinations, administration of curriculum, discipline, and all matters involving the spiritual, physical, and social welfare of the College. The faculty shall be hired upon recommendation of the President.

In the selection of the faculty qualitative factors shall be kept in mind. All faculty members shall be urged to pursue graduate programs in their respective fields. Except in special cases no faculty member will be required to teach courses outside of his field.

## SECTION IV

### ACADEMIC COUNCIL

The Academic Council shall consist of the President, the Dean and the heads of the departments of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College: It shall determine the curriculum and academic policy of the College, prescribe requirements for admission, certificates, diplomas, and degrees, and supervise the courses of instruction offered by the various departments of the College.

## SECTION V

### CONTRACTS

The Board of Trustees shall establish the College policy involving the execution of contracts, deeds of conveyance, the determination of salaries, and employment of all officers, representatives, faculty members and essential domestic and maintenance employees. The President of the College shall negotiate agreements, executive contracts, employ representatives, and supply vacancies incurred by the termination of contracts, resignations, or death of any essential employees. All contracts for building construction shall be let only to persons or corporations posting a valid performance bond and recording the same in the Office of the County Clerk of Cleveland County, Oklahoma.

## SECTION VI

### ADVISORY COUNCIL

An advisory council shall be formed which is to be composed of interested, qualified persons in the various fields which will be of value in building and maintaining a strong academic program to carry out the educational program stated in the charter.

## SECTION VII

### AMENDMENT

These By-Laws may be amended by a favorable vote of two-thirds of the qualified members of the Board of Trustees of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College at any meeting of the Board, provided that the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing to each Trustee one month in advance. This change to be subject to the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.

## SECTION VIII

### ADMINISTRATIVE FUNCTIONS

The President of the Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College shall be elected by the Board of Trustees, and he shall act for and on behalf of the Board in the conduct and management of the institution. He shall also be a member of the Board of Trustees ex-officio and of the Executive committee, ex-officio, and his duties, powers and term of office shall be prescribed in the by-laws of the College and a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

## ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC.

Know all men by these presents, that, we whose names are hereunto subscribed, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the provisions of the corporation laws of the State of Oklahoma, and for that purpose state:

### ARTICLE ONE

The name of this corporation shall be HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC.

### ARTICLE TWO

The purpose of this corporation shall be the creation, establishment and maintenance of a college and institution of higher learning devoted to the promotion and impartation of higher learning, Christian education and such other education, instruction, learning, training and research as may be deemed essential for the cause of Christ and to that end prescribe courses of study and grant degrees. The doctrinal and theological position of this institution shall be that of the sponsoring denomination, Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and the treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptist as endorsed by the state body, and in

connection therewith, in accordance with the stipulation of the Constitution and By-Laws of the State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

(a.) To prescribe courses of study for both resident and correspondence students, which shall include general education in the arts, Christian Ministries of Service and Biblical studies for wisdom; said courses to be taught in both a Junior College Division and a Bible College Division, and to award degrees, either graduate or post-graduate, to those persons satisfactorily completing the prescribed courses of study and to grant such other literary honors, including honorary degrees, as shall be deemed advisable.

(b.) To charge and collect tuition as determined by the Board of Trustees and to create scholarships.

(c.) To employ professors, instructors and other subordinate employees as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the college under the direction and control of the President of the College, with the advice and consent of the majority of the Board of Trustees.

(d.) To institute and carry on missions and commissions for missionary purposes and investigations.

(e.) To publish and distribute such pamphlets, literature or books as may be required in the conduct of such work and the general promotion of the College.

(f.) To sue and be sued in its corporate name and to enter into contracts of every type and nature.

(g.) To solicit support, receive, collect, hold and receive by gift or bequest personal property in any amount, money or other thing of value; to purchase real estate, to receive real estate that may be given, or devised to the college for achieving the legitimate ends of the college and to sell or mortgage the same as the need arises.

(h.) To borrow money in payment of property for erecting buildings and making improvements and for any other purpose germane to the objectives and purposes of the college.

(i.) To issue notes, bonds, debentures and other evidences of indebtedness and execute mortgages, liens and other incumbrances upon the property of the corporation, real or otherwise, to secure the payment of any such evidences of indebtedness.

(j.) To transact any and all business connected with said College as may be necessary to achieve the purposes of said College.

(k.) To obtain under Internal Revenue Laws of the United States and of the Revenue Laws of the State of Oklahoma exemption from income property and other forms of taxation.

### ARTICLE THREE

The location of this corporation shall be in Norman, Oklahoma.

### ARTICLE FOUR

The duration of this corporation shall be perpetual.

### ARTICLE FIVE

The general control of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of Trustees consisting of 15 members, 9 of which trustees shall be elected by the delegates to the annual Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists—each of which shall serve for a term of three years and until his

successor is elected and qualified, and one member each shall be elected by the delegates to the annual meeting of the state association of Free Will Baptists of the States of Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico and Texas, each of which shall serve for a term of six years and until his successor is elected and qualified. Initially, the 9 trustees elected by said Oklahoma Association shall include 3 elected for three years, three elected for two years, and 3 elected for one year but their successors shall all be elected for a term of three years and until their successors are elected and qualified. Initially, said trustee elected by said Arkansas Association shall be elected for a term of six years, said trustee elected by said Colorado Association shall be elected for a term of five years, said trustee elected by said Kansas Association shall be elected for a term of four years, said trustee elected by said Missouri Association shall be elected for a term of three years, said trustee elected by said New Mexico Association shall be elected for a term of two years, and said trustee elected by said Texas Association shall be elected for a term of one year but their successors shall be elected for a term of six years. The Chairman of said Corporation shall be one of the trustees elected by said Oklahoma Association.

#### ARTICLE SIX

An executive committee consisting of the Chairman, Vice Chairman, and Secretary of the Board of Trustees shall possess all powers of the Board of Trustees between the stated meetings of the Board of Trustees.

#### ARTICLE SEVEN

All contracts for building construction shall be let only to persons or corporations posting a valid performance bond and recording the same in the office of the County Clerk of Cleveland, Oklahoma.

#### SECTION IX

#### AMENDMENTS

This charter may be hereafter amended subject to the provisions contained herein and the laws of the State of Oklahoma. It is provided, however, that the Trustees of the College shall not propose or apply for any amendment which has not been previously authorized by an act of the Oklahoma State Association.

## CONSTITUTION OF MINISTER'S CONFERENCE

### ARTICLE 1

This Minister's Conference shall be called the Oklahoma State Free Will Baptist Minister's Conference, and shall be composed of Ordained Free Will Baptist Ministers who are regular members of some Orthodox Free Will Baptist church in the State of Oklahoma who have paid their \$1.00 dues.

### ARTICLE 2

The officers for this conference shall be President, Vice-President, and Clerk Treasurer, who shall be elected annually.

### ARTICLE 3

This conference shall have the power to discipline its members.

### ARTICLE 4

Members of this organization shall be all ordained ministers who participate in the benefits and activities of this body, and associate members who become members by payment of the \$1.00 annual dues.

### ARTICLE 5

This conference shall meet Semi-Annually.

### ARTICLE 6

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular session.



## BY-LAWS OF MINISTER'S CONFERENCE

### ARTICLE 1

The clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence the senior minister in years shall call the ministers into conference. If a quorum is present the President or in his absence the Vice-President shall moderate the meeting. If neither of these are present, the senior minister in years shall be in charge.

### ARTICLE 2

It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the ministers of the conference. Ministers shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the conference. In case of questionable representation the case under question shall be referred to the Credential Committee.

### ARTICLE 3

It shall be the duty of each minister belonging to this conference, to be active in pastoral or evangelistic services (disabled or retired ministers excepted). Any minister belonging to this conference shall report in each session in person or by letter, and failing to do so for two successive sessions shall be subject to discipline.

### ARTICLE 4

Each conference shall be opened by reading a portion of God's word and prayer, and each session shall be closed with prayer.

### ARTICLE 5

By a two-thirds vote of the members present ruling of the President may be overruled.

### ARTICLE 6

This conference shall sit with open doors, except when it shall go into a committee as a whole.

### ARTICLE 7

No member shall absent himself from the conference during its meeting without permission from the President.

### ARTICLE 8

No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of a committee, unless person nominated is not elected.

### ARTICLE 9

The President shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian Spirit, or when he thinks it will cause discord.

## ARTICLE 10

Anyone desiring to speak shall rise and address the President by the appellation "Brother President," but shall not speak further until recognized.

## ARTICLE 11

No member of this conference shall be allowed to speak more than five minutes, nor twice on the same subject without permission from the President.

## ARTICLE 12

These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this conference by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

## ARTICLES OF FAITH OF STATE ASSOCIATION

1. THE BIBLE — The Scriptures of the Old and New Testament were given by the inspiration of God, and are our infallible rules of faith and practice.

2. GOD — There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver and Righteous Governor of the Universe, and in the Scriptures as the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.

3. CHRIST — Christ is God manifest in the flesh: in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified. He is now risen and glorified is our ever-present Saviour and Lord.

4. THE HOLY SPIRIT — The Scriptures assigns to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of all men.

5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD — God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of Grace, not otherwise provided for as highest welfare of man requires.

6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN — Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore inherited a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.

7. THE WORK OF CHRIST — The Son of God, by His incarnation, life, suffering, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.

8. THE WORK OF SALVATION — The conditions of salvation are: 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and the hearty renunciations of it. 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit; freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God. 3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

9. ELECTION — God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ, men become His elect.

10. FREEDOM OF WILL — The Human will is free and self controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit and live, or to resist them and perish.

11. **SALVATION FREE** — God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

12. **PERSEVERENCE** — All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.

13. **BACKSLIDING AND APOSTASY** — A person who has been regenerated or born again and is living in unconfessed, unforgiven sin, is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and therefore is a backslider in a lost condition who must repent and be restored to the right relationship with God or be eternally lost.

We recognize, according to Hebrews 6: 4-6, that it is possible for a person to get in the condition that he could never return to Christ. This, we believe, is Apostasy; However, we also recognize that a regenerate person can fall into sin, be in a lost condition and still not be an Apostate. This person, through repentance, can be reconciled to God.

14. **GOSPEL ORDINANCES** — Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel: Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be administered to all true believers.

15. **TITHING** — God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament: Jesus Christ endorsed in the Gospel (Matt. 23: 23), and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." I Cor. 16: 2.

16. **THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH** — The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from the secular employment and amusements for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God.

17. **RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT, AND FINAL RETRIBUTION** — The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation: then the wicked shall "Go away into eternal punishment but the righteous into eternal life."

## **RULES OF ORDER**

1. At every sitting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded by prayer by the Moderator or whomever he may request.

2. Ministers and deacons present are invited to seats, allowed to take part in debates on all subjects, and to vote.

3. Those who speak shall rise and address the Moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.

4. No motion may be discussed until made and seconded.

5. When a motion has been made and seconded, and a member opposes its discussion, the Moderator shall put the question. "Shall it be discussed?" If negative, the question shall not be discussed.

6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member, and the vote taken separately.

7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.

8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.

9. All questions shall be decided by a majority vote of all Members present.

## BY-LAWS OF STATE ASSOCIATION

1. The Clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence, the senior minister in years shall call the Association into conference, and if a quorum is present the moderator, or in his absence, the assistant moderator shall take charge; and if neither of them is present the senior minister in years shall act as Moderator.

2. It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the delegates to the Association, who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the Association.

3. It shall be the duty of every District belonging to this Association to send a letter to every annual session of this Association reporting in the same, spiritual condition, benevolent work, and its statistics. Any District belonging to this Association, which shall fail to report itself for two successive sessions, may be dismissed from the Association by a two thirds vote of all members present.

4. Each meeting shall be opened by reading a portion of the Bible and with prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.

5. By a two-thirds vote of members present, a ruling of the moderator can be overruled.

6. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.

7. This Association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.

8. Any person not a member of this Association may be allowed to take part in its discussions by obtaining permission from the moderator.

9. It shall be the duty of all the Association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting, and anyone wishing to retire shall first obtain leave of the moderator.

10. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee, provided the person nominated be elected.

11. The moderator shall not allow discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.

12. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise to his feet and address the moderator by the appellation "Brother Moderator," but shall not speak further until recognized by the moderator.

13. No member of this association shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes nor twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator.

14. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

## CONSTITUTION OF STATE ASSOCIATION

**PREAMBLE:** From long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptists denomination, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a church; and to preserve and maintain correspondence and co-ordination with us, do therefore ordain this Constitution for our better denomination government.

## ARTICLE I

NAME: This organization shall be known as the OKLAHOMA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS.

## ARTICLE II

PURPOSE: The object and purpose of this organization shall be to unify the work of the various bodies composing this State Association, and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in connection with the various bodies in the Association, or that may hereafter be represented therein.

## ARTICLE III

REPRESENTATION: Section 1. This Association shall be composed of all ordained ministers and deacons with membership in some local church which is a member of a district Association with membership in the State Association.

Section 2: Each District Association shall be entitled to a number of elected delegates equal with the number of churches composing said Association. These delegates may be recommended by the local churches and shall be endorsed by their district association.

## ARTICLE IV

FINANCE: Each Association shall contribute \$20.00 per Church for support of the Association and delegate fees.

## ARTICLE V

DISCIPLINE: This State Association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine or practices that may properly come before it from any of the bodies composing said organization; furthermore, if there be any question of discipline, doctrine or practices on the part of an affiliated association, delegates of that association shall not be seated until these questions have been settled to the satisfaction of the General Board.

Section 2: Decisions of the General Board may be appealed in this manner. All appeals shall come before the State Association when sitting in a committee as a whole.

## ARTICLE VI

OFFICERS: A. The officers of the State Association shall consist of a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary. Each of these shall be elected at the close of each regular session except the Executive Secretary.

B. (1) The Executive Secretary shall be elected for a two year tenure. It shall be the responsibility of the Executive Board to seek out a prospective candidate and make their recommendation to the body at the state association in its regular session, with primary consideration given to the recommendation prior to any nominations.

(2) In the event of a vacancy occurring during the course of the year, the Executive Board shall fill the vacancy until the annual setting of the association.

## ARTICLE VII

**BOARDS:** All standing boards shall be composed of seven (7) elected members who shall serve terms of 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1 years with such ex-officio members as may be provided elsewhere, except: (1) the General Board which shall be composed of one (1) member from each affiliated association, the chairman of each standing board, and the current general officers of this association, and (2) the College Board of Trustees which shall be composed as provided for in the Articles of Incorporation of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc.

The standing boards of this association shall be: Executive Board; Board of Church Extension, Missions and Evangelism; Sunday School Board; Church Training Service Board; and College Board of Trustees.

No standing board shall meet in a functional meeting during the session of this association.

## ARTICLE VIII

### DUTIES, SCOPE OF ENDEAVOR AND QUALIFICATIONS OF STANDING BOARDS

**Section 1. EXECUTIVE BOARD:** The Executive Board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of an affiliated association and in good standing with the association of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

It shall be the duty of this board to act in behalf of the association when it is not in session. It shall be bound to carry out the directions of the association and shall hold itself bound by every consideration of morality and honor to carry out the wishes of this association and to act under its instructions in whatever technical rights, civil laws and the decisions of courts may give it in certain emergencies. It shall be the duty of this board to sign their signatures to any and all papers concerning properties, indebtedness, bonds, or other legal documents pertaining to the execution of the will of this association, exclusive of the College Board of Trustees.

This board shall have the oversight of the Executive Department of this association. The members shall assist and direct such work for the general promotion of this association as is deemed useful or necessary as the means available shall permit. The Executive Department shall serve as the coordinating agency of this association to correlate the work of all standing boards and agencies.

This board shall have the oversight of Free Will Baptist Book Store and shall endeavor to serve affiliated associations and churches and the community with literature and church supplies. Merchandising procedures shall be those accepted as normal retail procedures with the board being cognizant of the spiritual contribution of the store in distributing Christian literature.

All decisions of this board shall be governed by the general tenets of this association and shall not violate this constitution.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, and work done and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Whereas this board represents the association when not in session, it and it alone shall have the power to call the association into special conference provided each affiliated association shall be given notice at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting of such special conference.

**Section 2. GENERAL BOARD:** This board shall be composed of one (1) member from each affiliated association, the chairman of each standing board, and the current general officers of this association. Each member must be a member of an affiliated association and in good standing with the association of which he is a member. The members shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to meet one (1) day preceding the annual session of this association. This board shall serve as the credential committee with the duties and responsibilities assigned by Article V of this constitution. This board shall hear reports of all standing boards. It shall serve as budget committee and shall make such recommendations as deemed pertinent to this association. A complete and accurate record shall be kept of meetings of this board and a report shall be made in writing to this association in its annual session.

The moderator of the association shall serve as chairman of this board, and the clerk of the association shall serve as its clerk.

**Section 3. BOARD OF CHURCH EXTENSION, MISSIONS AND EVANGELISM:** This board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

It shall be the duty of this board to labor to further the Gospel of Jesus Christ into the uttermost parts of the earth. In accomplishing this, they are to endeavor to establish missions and churches in communities within the bounds of this association with whatever moral and financial assistance that may be theirs. In cases of small churches failing to function, whatever assistance deemed appropriate shall be rendered to maintain the effective witness of that church by either direct labor with the church or with an associational board in instances where the affiliated association has a functional board or agency.

This board shall be empowered to receive and convey title to real property in the area of its labors.

The promotion of missionary endeavors from a local, state or national level shall come within the scope of endeavor of this board. This board shall assist in maintaining prayer and financial support of missionary enterprises through whatever channels available.

Whereas missionary and evangelistic labors are so intimately related, this board shall assist through participation or assistance in maintaining a strong evangelistic thrust in the life of affiliated association.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

**Section 4. COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES:** The College Board of Trustees shall be composed as provided for in the Articles of Incorporation of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc.

Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc. is an agency of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and is incorporated under the corporate laws of the State of Oklahoma. The articles of incorporation are a part of this association's record and delineate the purpose, duty and scope of endeavor of the members of this board.

**Section 5. CHURCH TRAINING SERVICE BOARD:** This board shall

be composed of seven members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to plan and assist in organizing and sustaining a strong Church Training Service in every church in each association affiliated with this association with every means of promotion and assistance available to them. This board shall plan, coordinate and conduct state-wide youth camps or camp.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

**Section 6. SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD:** This board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to plan and promote Sunday schools in every church in each association affiliated with this association. This board shall use every available means to promote Sunday school clinics, seminars, institutes and conventions on local, district and state-wide basis, working with local agencies to distribute and employ all effective methods and material available.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

**Section 7. VACANCIES:** Vacancies shall occur when a member moves from the territorial bounds of this association, by death, by resignation or by removal from office by this association. In the event of disciplinary action where charges concerning misconduct, doctrine or practice shall have been lodged against a member of any board, his office shall be held in abeyance until such charges shall be concluded or as determined by this association.

All boards shall have power to fill vacancies arising between sessions of this association. Such appointment shall terminate at the next session of the association and shall be filled by this association.

**Section 8. EMPLOYEES:** All employees of boards or agencies of this association shall be employed by agreement or contract with employing board or agency upon approval of this association except those elected by this association and the conditions of their employment shall be those approved by this association.

The duties of the Executive Secretary of this association shall be:

- (1) He is to represent, or cause to be represented, the association at all affairs of interest to the association.
- (2) He is to promote the work of the association in such a manner so as to unify the efforts of the association.
- (3) He is to serve with all standing boards and committees of the association in an ex-officio capacity.
- (4) He is to aid in planning the work of the association by relating the activities and plans of one board to another.
- (5) He is to report to the association during each annual session.



- (6) He is to communicate to the affiliated members of this association the pressing causes and events before the association. This can be in person or by means of a periodical bulletin or both.
- (7) He shall serve as treasurer of this association. An accurate and complete record of all funds received and disbursed shall be kept and a written report shall be included in his report to this association in its annual session.
- (8) The conditions of employment shall be determined by the Executive Board.

#### ARTICLE IX

**DISSOLUTION:** Should this association cease to function, all properties and holdings shall go to the National Association of Free Will Baptists after all creditors are satisfied and indebtedness cleared.

#### ARTICLE X

**AMENDMENTS:** This constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session of the association by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of members present and voting, provided proposed amendment or alteration be presented in writing to the body one (1) day in advance.

#### ARTICLE XI

**SPECIAL SESSIONS:** Elected delegates to the last session of this association shall be retained as standing delegates for special called sessions.
