## STATISTICAL REPORT OF THE OKLAHOMA STATE ASSOCIATION

NOTE: This report is complete only as the information in the letters was complete, and in several instances such information was very much incomplete.

Number of Free Will Baptist Churches in Oklahoma, 253. Number of Associations, 23. Number of Ordained Ministers, 460, with 94 licensed ministers, and 717 deacons. Oklahoma has 247 Sunday schools, 114 Woman's Auxiliaries, and 36 Master's Men.

The total church membership is 23,165. The number received during the last year was 2,198, and the number dismissed was 1,288. The Sunday school enrollment is 17,556, with CTS enrollment at 4,164, and Woman's Auxiliary membership at 1,317.

The total giving to the churches was reported as \$3,756,253.00.

## PROCEEDINGS

The 69th annual session of the Oklahoma State Association met October 18-20, 1977, in Ardmore, Oklahoma. "Christ is Lord of All," was the theme taken from Acts 10:36. Clarence Hearron was the music director. For this opening service Ronna Timmons was pianist.

A musical prelude was provided by the Ministers Quartet.

"All Hail the Power," selected as the theme song of the convention, was the opening hymn. John Bullard led in prayer.

The congregation sang "Jesus Saves."

The clerk, Waldo Young, called the convention into official session and introduced the officers as follows: Lonnie DaVoult, Executive Secretary; Jim Haas, Assistant Clerk; Jerry Pilgrim, Assistant Moderator; and James Murray, Moderator.

The moderator drew attention to Philippians, chapter 3, and brought from this passage the moderator's message.

Local pastor, Delbert Akin, brought greetings and gave the welcome to the Arbuckle Association, and from the area.

The concert choir from Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College presented four songs, "The Old Rugged Cross," "Shall We Gather at the River," "Come as You Are," and "Because He Lives."

While an offering was being received for Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Herman Hersey played "When They Ring Those Golden Bells."

The moderator introduced Richard Gallant, pastor of the First Free Will Baptist Church of Cushing, to bring the message. Before the message, David and Karen Parish presented special music.

Richard Gallant brought the message on "Christ is Lord in Justification." He read Romans 5:1 as a text. At the close of the message he led in prayer.

The prayer to close the service was led by E. E. Morris.

### *Wednesday Morning*

The Wednesday morning session opened with the congregation singing the theme song, "All Hail the Power." Steve Koonce was pianist. The opening prayer was by Glenn Lewis.

"At the Cross" was also sung by the congregation.

The moderator made some opening remarks, and led in prayer.

A partial report of the General Board was read by the clerk. A motion carried to adopt the first item of the General Board report which was information from the letters, and seat the delegates.

Visitors from outside Oklahoma were recognized and welcomed to the convention.

A motion carried to adopt the program with the time element flexible.

The appointment of three committees were announced. The Resolutions Committee consists of J. C. Morgan, Dan Farmer, Jay Tilson, John Bullard, and Terrell Holland. The Obituary Committee was made up of James Cearley, Herman Wood, and Marvin Mann. Homer Young, Richard Shade, David Sutton, Louis Maxwell, and Tom Ballard were appointed to the Public Morals Committee.

The clerk read a combined statistical report for information.

Herman Hersey, director of the Retirement and Insurance Department of the National Association gave a report of this department.

Malcolm Fry, director of the National Church Training Service Department, gave a report of this department.

James Earl Raper, Superintendent of the Children's Home in Greenville, Tenn., gave greetings and a brief report from this institution.

Clarence Shepherd gave the report of the state Executive Board. A motion carried to receive the report and adopt the three recommendations item by item. Item 1, dealing with the budget, was tabled. Item 2, setting the site for the 1979 session of the state association, was adopted. Item 3, dealing with paying mileage, was adopted.

The meeting dismissed for the worship service.



### *Wednesday Morning Worship*

The Wednesday morning worship service opened with the congregation again singing the theme song, "All Hail the Power." Henry Braisher led in prayer. The congregation also sang "Tis so Sweet to Trust in Jesus," and "My Savior's Love."

The music director, Clarence Hearron, sang "He Lifted Me."

Tom Ballard, presiding officer, introduced Glen Lewis, pastor of the Airport Free Will Baptist Church, Tulsa, to bring the message. He read I Thessalonians 5:16-23, and brought the message on "Christ is Lord of Sanctification." He closed the sermon with prayer.

Following the announcements, Richard Rust led in the closing prayer.

### *Wednesday Afternoon*

The Wednesday afternoon session opened with the theme song sung by the congregation. David Archer, a Texas pastor, led in prayer, after which the congregation sang "Saved, Saved."

Dan Harper, pastor at Noble, brought the devotion from Acts 10:36, the theme verse for the convention. The devotion was on "Christ, Lord of Our Lives."

Mrs. Cleo Pursell, WNAC director, brought greetings and information from that department.

Roy Thomas gave a report of the National Home Missions Department.

Lonnie DaVoult gave the report of the Executive Secretary. A motion carried to receive the report.

The congregation sang "He Leadeth Me."

Ray Martin, manager, gave the report of the Free Will Baptist Book Store. A motion carried to receive the report.

Jack Williams, Executive Assistant, represented the National Executive Department with greetings and an informational report.

David McDougal was elected as a 7 year member of the state Executive Board.

Harold Harrison represented the National Sunday School Department with greetings and an informational report.

Keith Burden gave the report of the State Sunday School Board. A motion carried to receive the report.

Frank Wiley was elected as the 7 year member of the Sunday School Board.

Berton Perry, chairman, gave the report of the State Mission Board. Buddy Drake, mission worker in Enid, gave a brief report, as did also David Bigger, mission worker in Ponca City. A motion carried to adopt the report.

The meeting was dismissed in prayer by Ron Carner.

### *Wednesday Evening*

"All Hail the Power" again opened the service on Wednesday evening. Buddy Drake presided at this missionary emphasis service. The opening prayer was led by O. T. Dixon.

The congregation sang "To God Be the Glory," and "We're Marching to Zion."

An offering was received for missions.

Raymond Riggs, a Tennessee pastor, and chairman of the National Foreign Missions Board, was introduced to bring the missions message on "Christ is Lord in Proclamation." Just before the message the youth choir from the Southern Oaks Church presented special music.

The speaker gave a report of the Foreign Missions work and some available materials from that department before the message. He read Matthew 28:16-20, I Corinthians 1:17-25, and II Corinthians 3:6, and brought the message.

The message closed with an invitation for those who would make Christ Lord of Proclamation to come forward, to which many responded. Earnie Deeds, missionary to Brazil, led in a prayer of consecration.

### *Thursday Morning*

Jerry Pilgrim led the congregation in singing the theme song, "All Hail the Power," with Kathleen Sutton as pianist. "He Brought Me Out," was also sung by the congregation.

Joe Grizzle, pastor of the Norman First Church, read Matthew 17:20, and Matthew 19:26, and brought devotional thoughts from these verses.

Joe Grizzle was elected as the 2 year member of the Mission Board. J. B. Chism was elected as the 7 year member to this same board.

Raymond Riggs, chairman of the Foreign Missions Board, represented that national department with a report. Earnie Deeds, Brazil, and Arilla Wode, appointee to Ivory Coast, gave greetings.

Louis Wickham gave the report of the Church Training Service Board. He announced that the state youth camp for 1978 would be at Robber's Cave on July 24-29. A motion carried to receive the report.

Doyle Cox was elected as the 7 year member of the state CTS Board.

Delbert Akin, clerk of the board, gave the report of the Board of Trustees of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. A motion was made and seconded to adopt the report. Bill Jones, president of the college, also spoke in behalf of the school. Awards were given to the West Tulsa Church, the Southern Oaks Church, and the Ada Church as the top three churches in contributions to Hillsdale.

Since much discussion was heard concerning the building under construction, James Cearley, former maintenance man at the school, spoke explaining the difference between the building of Friends Hall and the present building.

A motion carried to suspend debate until after the worship service.

### *Thursday Morning Worship*

The Thursday morning worship service opened with Jerry Pilgrim leading the congregation in singing "All Hail the Power." Albert Collier led in prayer. "Take the Name of Jesus With You," was also sung. For special music Jerry Pilgrim sang "Come on Down."

R. G. Hester, presiding officer, introduced Berton Perry to bring the message. Bob Ketchum led in prayer. The speaker read Romans 8:14-21, and delivered the message on "Christ is Lord in Glorification." He closed the message with prayer.

The service was dismissed with prayer by John Redfearn.

### *Thursday Afternoon*

The congregation sang, "Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus," to open the afternoon session. Larry Tuttle led in prayer.

Herman Wood, pastor of the Collinsville Church, brought the devotion. He read Romans 12:2, and brought thoughts from this and other verses.

The business at hand was the report of Hillsdale College, so the body returned to this business. Bill Jones made a few remarks. Other discussion was heard. The previous question was moved and carried. The motion carried to receive the report.

The recommendation in the report, dealing with the building of the 125'x125' classroom building, a revision of the dimensions approved by the 1976 session, was to be dealt with separately. A motion was made to table this item. The motion lost. A motion was made to amend the item to read "with all specifications and costs stipulated." The previous question was moved and carried. The motion to amend was approved.

The motion as amended was discussed. Again the previous question was moved and carried. The motion as amended was approved.

Richard Gallant, Bob Sharp, and Bailey Thompson were elected to the Hillsdale Board of Trustees for three year terms.

Tom Ballard was elected to replace Richard Gallant on the Sunday School Board.

Paul Kettelman was introduced to give a report of Free Will Baptist Bible College, Nashville, Tennessee.

Item 3, of the General Board, dealing with the budget, was read. A motion carried to adopt the item.

Newman Douglas, representative of SANE, spoke to the body about the work of this organization.

Floyd Shealy, representing Volunteers in Corrections, spoke to the body.

Lila Faye Morgan gave the report of the State Woman's Auxiliary.

Kenneth Lane gave the report of the Master's Men.

Joel Kircher gave the report of the Ministers Conference. A motion carried to receive the report.

The report of the Obituary Committee was read. After a moment of silent prayer, Homer Young led in prayer.

The report of the Public Morals Committee was read. A motion was made and seconded to adopt the report. A motion was made to amend item 1, by substituting "intoxicating beverages" in place of "alcohol." The motion to amend was approved. The report of the Public Morals Committee was approved as amended.

The report of the Resolutions Committee was read. Item 1, was considered. A motion was made to amend item 1, by adding "or designated person." A motion was made to table item 1. This motion carried.

Resolution 2, was considered. A motion was made and carried to adopt it.

Resolution 3, was considered. A motion was carried to adopt this item.

As called for in item 3, a Senator from Oklahoma to the national Master's Men was elected. The man elected to this position was Ron Smith.

Item 4, of the Resolutions Committee report was considered. A motion was made and seconded to adopt this item. A motion carried to table Item 4, until the 1978 session.

A motion carried to give the local church and the folks of the area a vote of thanks. The body stood in approving this motion.

The nominations were read from the district letters for the General Board. A motion carried that these be elected and that the moderator appoint the two, Green Country and Arkansas Valley, who did not send nominations.

A motion carried to give a rising vote of appreciation and thanks to Bill Jones, president of Hillsdale College.

Jack Richey was elected as the member representing Oklahoma on the General Board of the National Association.

A motion carried to pay the expense of the General Board Member to the National Association.

The officers to serve the state association for the coming year were elected. Jim Haas was elected as assistant clerk. Waldo Young was elected as clerk. The assistant moderator elected was J. C. Morgan. He resigned this position rather than his position on the Executive Board. Jerry Pilgrim was then elected as the assistant moderator. James Murray was elected as moderator.

A motion carried to give a standing vote of appreciation to the officers serving this session.

A motion carried to adjourn. Pastor Wilkerson from Norman led in the closing prayer.

## **RESOLUTIONS COMMITTEE REPORT**

1. Be it resolved that only the moderator or the general board member of the district association be allowed to change delegates sent to the state association and the change be put in writing and turned in to the clerk. (Tabled)
2. Be it resolved that the state association give NAE (National Association of Evangelicals) a gift of \$600.00 from the Executive Department funds and this amount be given annually hereafter until changed. (Adopted)
3. The Executive Committee of the State Master's Men Convention asks that the state association elect an Oklahoma Master's Men State Senator for a three year term. (Adopted)
4. Be it resolved that no construction project sponsored by the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists be initiated without a minimum number of bids received for each phase of the project. (Tabled until the 1978 session)

## **OBITUARY COMMITTEE REPORT**

We the Obituary Committee wish to report that 172 of our beloved brothers and sisters in Christ have gone home to be with the Lord this past year. We recommend that we stand for a moment of silent prayer in memory of those loved ones, and the dedication of ourselves to further strive toward the goal that they have attained. (Adopted)

## PUBLIC MORALS COMMITTEE REPORT

The Committee on Public Morals recommends to the State Association the following:

1. That our churches cooperate with the Sooner Alcoholic and Narcotic Education, Inc., in a financial way; and that our pastors warn our people, especially the youth, of the dangers of misusing any type of drugs; and that TOTAL abstinence of intoxicating beverages in any form be preached and practiced.
2. That we go on record against the use of tobacco in any form and ask our pastors and deacons to set the example.
3. That we actively oppose any type of gambling.
4. That the people of our churches conform to a more modest dress using I Peter 3:3-7 as a guide.
5. That we go on record as opposing pornography, making every effort possible to halt the distribution of pornographic materials in any form through any means open to us.
6. That we stand opposed to the teaching of sex education in public schools because of the lack of moral application.
7. That we publicly deplore corruption in governments and oppose any candidate who is involved in or favors any immoral issue.
8. That we challenge our public schools to present the Biblical account of creation in contrast to the theory of evolution.
9. That we stand in opposition to television programming which presents an immoral, worldly standard of conduct, and oppose any movie showing which tends toward immorality regardless of rating publicized.
10. That we adhere to the principles of our Free Will Baptist Church Covenant with special attention given to the phrase "avoid all appearance of evil."
11. That we publicly oppose divorce as is commonly practiced today.
12. That we stand opposed to those who teach that homosexuality is an acceptable practice in society since it is condemned as sin in God's Word.
13. That we stand opposed to the showing of any movie that is unscriptural and destroys the teaching of the Divinity of Jesus Christ presenting Him as an immoral character. We further recommend that our people write letters to the proper officials stating such opposition.
14. That we stand opposed to the atheistic teaching of Madelyn Murray O'Hare who is seeking by petition to remove the words "under God" from the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag, and "in God we trust" from the U.S. coins and currency.
15. That the clerk of the State Association of Free Will Baptists in Oklahoma be commissioned to write letters to governmental officials (state legislators, governors, etc.) and FCC opposing: (a) legalized liquor by the drink, (b) legalized gambling, (c) legalized marijuana, (d) television programming which lends itself toward immoral content, (e) sale of any pornographic material. He will stipulate in his letters that this body represents 23,000 plus Free Will Baptists in Oklahoma.

## THE REPORT OF THE GENERAL BOARD

The General Board of the Oklahoma State Association met October 17, in the Holiday Inn, Ardmore. As a result of this meeting we offer the following items for your consideration:

1. We received letters from 23 district associations holding membership in this body. We recommend that these letters be received and the delegates seated.
2. We heard the reports of the Executive Board, the Executive Secretary, the Free Will Baptist Book Store, the Sunday School Board, the Mission Board, the Church Training Service Board, and Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. We recommend that these reports be adopted as each is presented.
3. Serving as Budget Committee, we offer the following recommendation:
  - a. We recommend a cooperative budget of \$150,000.00 to be distributed according to the following percentages:

## STATE EXECUTIVE BOARD REPORT

The State Executive Board met five times this past year.

In the December 14 meeting, a letter requesting a meeting of the board was discussed and we met on December 18 with the Northeast Association at their request.

There was a lengthy discussion in two meetings about the recommended study of purchasing a car for the use of the State Executive Secretary.

It was voted to move the portable building back to the bookstore property after the Executive Secretary had conferred with a lawyer and other officials and the idea of re-zoning the property seemed impossible.

Four members of the Board along with the Executive Secretary met with the Northeast Association in counsel. The meeting was led by Northeast Moderator, Rev. Jim Haas.

Five members of the Board met with the Executive Board of the Arbuckle Association.

We voted as the Executive Board of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists, acting in behalf of the State Association, to recommend to the National Association of Free Will Baptists, that the proposition concerning the Charismatic movement, as was adopted by the National Association in 1973, when convened in Macon, Georgia, be inserted as an appendix to chapter 7 of the Treaties of the National Association.

On March 29, the Executive Board met in joint session with the State Mission Board. After being informed on the progress of the Ponca City mission work and the possible loan, the Executive Board voted to send a letter of approval to the source of the loan and that the board sign for the loan when construction was finished.

In our August meeting it was voted that channeled money to Wesley Calvary sent to the State Office would be returned to sender and asked that it be re-channeled.

It was voted that for the protection of the Executive Office in that it has to advance money for payment of insurance, that we cancel the insurance on a person when it becomes two months delinquent.

It was voted after the study and discussion of findings on the automobile to be used by the Executive Secretary that it is the consensus of the Executive Board that we continue with our policy of the Executive Secretary providing his own car and that the office pay mileage.

It was voted that the Board suggest a Cooperative Budget of \$150,000 for 1978-1979.

It was voted to recommend the State Association be held in the Oklahoma City area in 1979.

It was voted to update the Bookstore vehicle with an expenditure of up to \$3,000.00 with the State Office loaning the bookstore the difference and the bookstore to pay the State Office back at \$200.00 per month.

Motion to recommend the budget of the State Office and Bookstore.

It was voted to recommend to the General Board that mileage be raised to 15 cents per mile.

This has been another fruitful and busy year for the Executive Secretary. I have traveled over 30,000 miles on official business in behalf of the State Association. I have had over thirty preaching appointments in various churches. I had a participating part in twenty-five quarterly meetings, twenty-seven services, twelve board meetings and ten ministerial meetings. I have also visited eight youth camps, conducted six revivals and attended the National Promotional Men's retreat. Bro. Dan Farmer and I attended a special meeting of interest in St. Louis, Mo. and he accompanied me to the National Association of Evangelicals' annual Association in Chicago. I was invited to attend the Texas State Association to help advise on the work of the Promotional Office.

I am thrilled to report that we were victorious in defeating the Liquor by the Drink ballot. With your help financially and physically we, along with thousands of other Christian people, were able to deal a decisive blow to the proponents of Liquor by the Drink.

The overall financial report is good. We were well over \$50,000.00 above last years total receipts. However, due to a couple associations doing extensive work on their camp ground and using their cooperative money to pay for it, it has caused our state Coop to be down about \$10,000.00. We were still \$7,000.00 over our proposed Coop budget. I am trusting that we will be able to get the Coop up to our \$140,000.00 budget this year.

We have been able to accumulate very little historical information during this past year. I am in need of help in this area. If anyone has any old documents relating to Free Will Baptist, I would appreciate it very much if you would get in touch with me. The Sunday School department has extended the time for preachers to get their pictures and information in to be included in the historical publication WHO'S WHO IN FREE WILL BAPTIST. Preachers please avail yourself of this privilege.

JUNE 30, 1977**

**(1) SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The State Association of Free Will Baptist is a nonprofit organization designed to provide central leadership and representation for the Free Will Baptists of Oklahoma and to handle certain receipts and disbursements of the Free Will Baptist Church. The Association uses the fund method of accounting, whereby the fund balance represents the equity the Association has in its assets. This accounting method is generally accepted among non-profit organizations as the most feasible way of reflecting their financial activity and position.

The Association's property and equipment is depreciated on the straight-line basis using the following estimated useful lives:

Furniture, fixtures and equipment acquired subsequent to July 1, 1972 -----	8 years
Furniture, fixtures and equipment acquired prior to July 1, 1972 -----	3 years

## (2) MORTGAGE RECEIVABLE

The executive residence was sold on May 30, 1974 for \$20,500. The buyer assumed the mortgage on the property and gave the Association a second mortgage on the property for \$10,300. Payments were to begin on July 1, 1974. The rate of interest is 8% and the mortgage is for 30 years. The Association does not have an amortization schedule on this loan and we were unable to verify the exact balance on this mortgage receivable.

## (3) COOPERATIVE CONTRIBUTIONS

The Executive Office of the State Association was allocated 23% in 1977 and 25% in 1976 of cooperative contributions for the financing of its operation for the fiscal year.

**BOARD OF CHURCH EXTENSION  
MISSIONS AND EVANGELISM**

The mission board met seven times during the past year. We also held one telephone conference in an effort to save time and mission money. In an effort to make our mission board more flexible and efficient we voted to have four "full" meetings during the coming year—in March, June, September, and December with the executive committee acting for the board in routine matters—thus saving both time and mission money.

We are thankful for the progress that has been made. We cannot report that "so many churches went full-time" this year; however, we feel that 1977 has been a year of taking up the "slack" and yet great progress has been made.

We have been busy with our present C.E.P.s—Enid and Ponca City.

Enid held their first services in their new building about a year ago. They are now settled in a beautiful building in a fast growing area of Enid. The reports from our missionary there, Rev. Buddy Drake, have been good, showing steady growth. We are hoping they will be on a self-sustaining basis in the near future.

Ponca City has made rapid progress. Land has been purchased and a new church building is under construction. Rev. David Bigger, our missionary, continues to give a glowing report of prospects there in Ponca City.

We had hoped to initiate another C.E.P. project in Altus this past year. However, plans to go there with a new mission have not worked out. We are hoping to launch at least one new project in 1977-78. At present we are not certain about its location.

As you know, plans for future C.E.P.s have been hampered by a lack of finances. There are many cities and towns in Oklahoma which do not have a Free Will Baptist Church. Thus, we would like to offer the following suggestions with the hope that more might be done for the cause of Christ:

1. Be sure to pray for the work of the board and the missionaries who are on location in our state. Too, pray for an awakening of our people concerning missions in general.

2. Put C.E.P. in your church budget. If you cannot give much—please give something and do it regularly. As you know the board must work on a basis of what we have coming in. If we could count on something from all our churches each month, it would amount to a sizeable sum.
3. Be responsive to the board's efforts to raise money for land and other special projects. As you know, land is very high in these cities, and it is impossible for a struggling mission to go to a new city and purchase property. Please be responsive when an appeal comes from the missions office requesting help in these areas.
4. Set a goal for C.E.P. in your church for the coming year. The goal can easily be reached if we will use such things as our vacation Bible school offerings, special C.E.P. Sundays, missions services, and special times in regular services when the work of C.E.P. is explained to the people and an opportunity for them to give is presented.

The needs of our day demand the best of all of us. When we look at our country and are reminded that not one in ten is a Christian, and not one in a thousand is a Free Will Baptist, and not one church in five preaches the Gospel, and that churches are closing at the rate of one every hour, and five of six Free Will Baptists who move will find no Free Will Baptist Church in their new city, then it is time for us to do our best.

## BOARD OF TRUSTEES REPORT TO OKLAHOMA STATE ASSOCIATION

The school year 1976-77 was a year unique in the history of Free Will Baptists. A challenge gift by the Broadhurst Foundation of \$60,000 provided an incentive for Free Will Baptists in Mid-America to give more than has ever been given in any program to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. Free Will Baptists responded to the challenge by giving \$86,000.

One hundred eighty-six students enrolled in the fall of 1976, and in May 1977 the combined sophomore and senior classes provided the largest number of graduating students Hillsdale has ever had—a total of 51. Many people have given much to make their education possible. Some have given their time, others have given of their means, and even more have prayed that the total person of each student would be developed that each might become the person God desired and learn to appreciate the great life they can enjoy on earth.

Construction on the dorm complex began in May. The late starting date was caused by de-annexation procedures and the weather. Plans call for them to be occupied in November.

Joining Hillsdale as new faculty for the fall of 1977 is Miss Nancy Jo Fogerson, librarian and teacher of English. God has given us a good faculty and staff and we appreciate their involvement and contribution for the year.

The budget recommended by the Board of Trustees for the 1978-79 totals \$661,758. We also recommend approval of the revised design for the classroom building with the stipulation that fund raising and construction not begin until after approval by the 1978 state association with all specifications and costs stipulated.

## **(1) SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

The College uses the fund method of accounting, whereby an individual fund is a separate accounting entity made up of assets, liabilities, revenues, expenditures, transfers and a fund balance. This method of accounting is generally accepted among colleges and universities as the most effective means of controlling financial data. Buildings and equipment are not depreciated by the College, which is an acceptable procedure for a non-profit organization.

**OKLAHOMA STATE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY CONVENTION**

The Thirty-seventh convention of the Oklahoma State Woman's Auxiliary convened October 17, 1977, at the Ardmore First Free Will Baptist Church, Ardmore, Oklahoma. 1. Motion made to elect Carole Carner to serve as Recording Secretary for

October, 1977 convention. This was approved. A partial report of the Credentials Committee accepting petitionary letters from the Ardmore First Church, Calvin, Mineral Springs, Vian, Enid, and New Hope (Lone Grove) auxiliaries were read and they were accepted into full fellowship of the Oklahoma State Convention. The welcome was given by Dorothy Akin from the host church. The devotion was given by Wanda Kellett. She read from Psalm 20:5, Matthew 26:13, and Matthew 29:30. Sister Raper from the Children's Home in Greenville, Tennessee, brought greetings and introduced 3 children she had with her from the home. She told us the current needs of the home.

The treasurer's report was given by Karon Anderson and it was accepted.

Jean Deeds from Brazil and Arilla Wode, appointee to Africa, brought greetings to the convention.

Item 2 of the Executive Committee was read and accepted. Item 2, was that the 1978 state project be: A. \$2.00 per member to purchase outdoor furniture for Hillsdale Campus. B. \$1.00 per member to Arilla Wode, our missionary appointee to Africa. C. \$1.00 per member to Jim Williams, home missionary to the Institute of Gold, Monterrey, Mexico. Item 3, was read and accepted. It read, "That we urge each local to give a sacrificial offering to raise the needed \$6,000 for the Earnie Deeds vehicle fund. That we designate the pre-Easter week of prayer offerings." Item 4, was read and accepted, that we pay Sister Pursell's expenses and give her a love gift of \$100.00. The resolutions and recommendations from the WNAC were read and accepted. The East area retreat report was given by Faye Rust. She read letters she had received from Poteau, Mineral Springs, and Keefton Auxiliaries. The next East Area Retreat will be Western Hills, April 14-15. The West area retreat was given by Floretta Rhoades. The next West area retreat will be held at Texhoma April 28-29.

The Auditing Committee report was given and accepted. Appointment of delegates to the National WNAC in 1978 were as follows: Center, Kathleen Sutton; Dibble, Margaret Dixon; First Mission, Bertha Keifer; First Oklahoma, Joyce Farmer; Gaines Creek, none appointed; Greater Tulsa, Barbara Ballard; Green Country, none appointed; Hopewell 2, Francis Milner; Northeast, Tippy Shad; Poteau River Valley, Doris Deatherage; Progressive, Phyllis McDougal; South Grand River, Marguerite Kern; Enid, Janice Drake; Guymon, Brenda Nunley; Mineral Springs; Faye Emberton; Norris New Harmony, Faye Rust; Vian, Helen Swan. The meeting was dismissed for break by singing "Footsteps of Jesus."

The worship service was opened in singing by the New Life Singers from Hillsdale College singing "Greater Is He That Is In Me." Greetings were given by James Amick. The New Life Singers sang "Redeemed," and "Whatever It Takes." Floretta Rhoades presided and read the scripture verse for the convention, Song of Solomon 2:4. Carolyn McKinney sang "If Jesus Is There It Will Be Heaven for Me."

The following officers were elected to serve for the 1978-79 conventions: President, Lila Faye Morgan from Greater Tulsa; Vice President, Floretta Rhoades from First Oklahoma; Secretary, Carole Carner from Greater Tulsa; Assistant Secretary, Debbie Burden from South Grand River; Treasurer, Karon Anderson from Greater Tulsa; Field Worker, Margaret Dixon from Dibble; Members at Large, Carol Kircher from Dibble, Faye Rust from Norris New Harmony, and Joan McCuller from First Mission.

Jean Deeds led in a prayer of dedication for these officers. "This is My Father's World," was sung. A skit was presented by the Keefton Auxiliary, "Behold, The Bridegroom Cometh." A special altar of prayer and remarks and announcements were made by the president. The meeting was dismissed with the song, "God Be With You Til We Meet Again."

## **OKLAHOMA STATE WOMAN'S AUXILIARY CONVENTION CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS**

### **ARTICLE I**

#### **NAME**

This organization shall be known as the Oklahoma State Woman's Auxiliary Convention.

### **ARTICLE II**

#### **PURPOSE**

The purpose of this convention shall be to bring the women of each district convention together for fellowship, sharing information, and encouraging one another in the work of the Lord.

### ARTICLE III

#### OFFICERS

The officers of this convention shall be a president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and field worker. These shall serve on the state executive committee together with three members elected by the convention as desired. These shall serve for a period of 2 years.

### ARTICLE IV

#### MEMBERSHIP

This convention shall be composed of the officers of the convention together with each active auxiliary member of the district or local (duly accredited by the credentials committee).

### ARTICLE V

#### MEETINGS

The annual meeting shall be held each year on the day preceding the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and at the place designated by said Association.

### ARTICLE VI

#### AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a two-thirds vote of members present.

### BY-LAWS

### ARTICLE I

#### DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1, President. The president shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed, call the executive committee together when necessary, be ex-officio member of all committees, and serve as chairman of the executive committee, see that reports are made promptly to the national secretary and perform all duties usually pertaining to such an office.

Section 2, Vice President. The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the overseeing of the work in general.

Section 3, Secretary. The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and executive meetings, preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor in office, and make an annual report to the national secretary on a form available from the WNAC office. She shall compile the districts slates of officers and addresses immediately after the convention. She shall also send a slate of state officers and addresses to the national executive secretary. She is chairman of the Credentials Committee.

The secretary shall also serve as historian keeping an historical record and submitting historical information to the national executive secretary annually.

Section 4, Treasurer. The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account and shall give a written report of all funds received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She shall also send an annual report to the WNAC office (executive secretary-treasurer) at least ten days before the end of the fiscal year. She shall encourage support of missions through the WNAC Gift Plan, individual giving and special offerings.

Section 5, Field Worker. The field worker shall have charge of all field work pertaining to, or necessary to, the promotion of the work of the convention and keep the national program before the district officers.

## ARTICLE II

### ELECTIONS

The general officers shall be nominated by a nominating committee and shall be elected by acclamation, unless there are other nominations. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken on each. All elections shall be held at the closing business session of the convention.

## ARTICLE III

### EXPENSES

Section 1. An appropriation of 10 cents per mile toward the expense of the general officers, when called upon to attend the executive committee meeting to plan program, secretary's expenses, phone calls, postage and stationery for officers will be paid by the convention. All field promotional work is subject to the state executive committee, who should approve all work done by state officers in the interest of state work, as well as expenses of the same.

Section 2. An amount of \$50.00 shall be paid on the expense of the state president to attend WNAC.

## ARTICLE IV

### COMMITTEES

Section 1. Executive Committee—The executive committee shall be composed of the five officers and three members elected by the convention. Five of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the executive committee to maintain an overseeing of the work at large. They shall act for the convention when necessary. They shall meet with district presidents the night preceding the state auxiliary convention.

Section 2. Resolutions Committee—A resolutions committee of five members shall be appointed by the president as needed.

Section 3. Nominating Committee—The nominating committee shall be composed of at least one member from each district convention. Nominations shall be submitted by district with their annual report. These elected by the body at the annual meeting.

Section 4. Credentials Committee—The secretary shall be chairman of the credentials committee, and other members may be appointed by the president. The treasurer shall be a standing member of this committee.

Section 5. Finance Committee—The finance committee shall be appointed by the president. This committee audits the financial records of the year and reports on same to the convention.

Section 6. Student Loan Committee—State Auxiliary President and 2 elected members to serve 2 years each. They shall be elected on alternate years.

Section 7. Registration committee shall be provided by the district convention which is host to state convention.

## ARTICLE V

### FEES AND REPORTS

Active members shall pay dues of \$1.50 per year. With 25 cents remaining in the district. \$1.25 to be forwarded to state where 25 cents shall be retained, and \$1.00 forwarded to WNAC as required for membership fees. It shall be the duty of each body directly affiliated with the State Auxiliary Convention to send a report to every annual session.

## ARTICLE VI

### AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of members present at regular meeting of the state auxiliary convention.

## ARTICLE VII

### GIFTS

The desired plans for giving in the Woman's Auxiliary are those adopted by WNAC as follows:

1. Mission offerings following each special season of prayer
2. Co-Laborer offering (monthly or quarterly designated to WNAC General Fund)
3. WNAC Emphasis Month in August or other time more convenient to help in support of WNAC General Fund
4. Memorial Student Loan Fund (special program and offering in September to assist worthy and needy students at FWBBC in Nashville)
5. Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College Student Loan Fund. (Special program and offering in September to assist worthy and needy students at Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College)
6. Tithes—Pay tithes on all undesignated money received
7. All offerings are to be forwarded through regular channels

## ARTICLE VIII

### WNAC DELEGATE

Each district convention shall submit one nomination for a State delegate to WNAC with their annual report. This nomination (along with others as needed to make up 15 delegates to WNAC) shall be elected by the body at the annual meeting. It shall be the duty of delegates elected to notify president if they cannot attend WNAC. President shall appoint delegates as needed in absence of regular elected delegates.

## THE FREE WILL BAPTIST MASTER'S MEN

State of Oklahoma

### CONSTITUTION

#### PREAMBLE

The purpose of the Free Will Baptist Master's Men, state of Oklahoma is to provide a means of Christian fellowship and to deepen the spiritual lives of the laymen of the local church. Also, to provide a means of developing the abilities and talents of the laymen, and to promote the cause of Christ through a complete, "total church program," as prescribed by Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.

## **ARTICLE I**

### **NAME**

The name of this organization shall be known as the Free Will Baptist Master's Men, State of Oklahoma.

## **ARTICLE II**

### **MEMBERSHIP**

Section 1. The membership of this organization shall be composed of the district associations of Master's Men, and any local chapters where there is only one chapter in the district, within the state of Oklahoma.

Section 2. Every member in good standing of an affiliated district association of Master's Men, or any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, is entitled to the full benefits of membership.

Section 3. Each district association, or any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, shall submit an annual, written report to this body, (as a matter of information).

## **ARTICLE III**

### **OFFICERS**

The officers of this organization shall consist of a president, vice-president and a secretary-treasurer.

The officers of this organization shall be elected annually and may succeed themselves, at this level.

## **ARTICLE IV**

### **EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE**

Section 1. The executive committee shall consist of the elected officers of this organization and they shall serve as the program committee for each annual convention.

Section 2. Ex-officio members of the executive committee shall be the presidents of the district associations of Master's Men, presidents of any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, and the state executive secretary of the State Association of Free Will Baptists.

## **ARTICLE V**

### **MEETINGS**

This organization shall meet annually at 7:30 P.M. on the Monday night before the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists convenes.

## **ARTICLE VI**

### **AMENDMENTS**

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of any regular meeting.

## **BY-LAWS**

### **VOTING RIGHTS**

Section 1. Every member of each affiliated district association, or any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, is eligible to vote on all questions and matters that might come before the Free Will Baptist Master's Men, State of Oklahoma.

## **COMMITTEES**

Section 2. The executive committee shall transact all routine business and shall act for the organization in the interim between meetings.

Section 3. The executive committee shall meet at the call of the president.

Section 4. A nominating committee, for the annual election of officers, shall be composed of the presidents of each district association, and the president of any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district.

Section 5. The president shall appoint all other committees, subject to the approval of the body.

#### **FINANCE**

Section 6. This organization shall be financed on the basis of offerings, dues and assessments.

#### **QUORUM**

Section 7. One-tenth of the members of this organization shall constitute a quorum at any regular meeting.

#### **AMENDMENTS**

Section 8. These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

### **HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC.**

#### **BY-LAWS**

#### **BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

##### **SECTION I**

The Board of Trustees of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc., an Oklahoma corporation, shall be composed of fifteen members, elected as provided in the Articles of Incorporation of said College, as amended:

**ARTICLE A—OFFICERS:** The officers of the board of Trustees shall be a Chairman, an Assistant Chairman, and a Secretary, each of whom shall be elected by the Board for a term of one year. They shall continue in office until their successors have been chosen:

**Item 1—CHAIRMAN:** The chairman of the Board of Trustees or his assistant shall preside at all meetings of the Board. He shall be an ex-officio member of the Executive Committee.

**Item 2—SECRETARY:** The Secretary shall record and preserve minutes of all meetings and acts of the Board of Trustees and countersign all deeds, conveyances, and other papers authorized by the Board. He shall have authority to call special meetings of the Trustees of the College upon the written request of two-thirds of the members of the Board; he shall mail notice of said meeting to the trustees ten (10) days in advance.

**Item 3—EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE:** The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, the Vice-Chairman of the Board, the Secretary of the Board. The Executive Committee shall have authority to consider and act upon all questions affecting the College which may be brought before it between the stated meetings of the Board, or a quorum of the Board fails to attend a called or regular meeting. It shall transact such business as may be committed to it by the Board and shall act for the College on such matters as it may submit to it. The Committee shall meet at the call of the Chairman or the President of the College.

**ARTICLE B—MEETINGS:** The Board of Trustees shall meet each year at a time and place agreed upon by the Board. It shall, also, hold special meetings whenever called in accordance with the By-Laws of the Board. Such special meetings may be called by either the chairman of the Board, or the President of the College.

**ARTICLE C—QUORUM:** A majority of the members or the Board of Trustees of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc. in attendance at any called or regular meeting, written notice of which has been mailed by the



Secretary to each trustee, shall constitute a quorum. No proxy votes shall be permitted. No ex-officio member shall be entitled to vote at meetings of the Board of Trustees.

**ARTICLE D—ELECTIONS:** In all elections held by the Board of Trustees each member present except ex-officio members shall be entitled to one vote, and the result shall be determined by a majority of the votes cast. Due notice of any election must be personal notice to the members or a day on the minutes of the Board not less than one week preceding the election.

## **SECTION II OFFICERS OF HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE**

The officers of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College shall be a President, Vice-President, Dean, and a Business Manager, each of whom shall be elected by the Board of Trustees to hold office for two years exclusive of the President whose term of office shall be indefinite. It is provided, however, that retirement of any one of the officers herein named may occur at any time upon the resignation of the officer or the request of the Board. In either case, notice shall be given six weeks before the date of the proposed retirement unless otherwise agreed upon by the concerned parties.

**ITEM ONE—PRESIDENT:** The President shall be executive officer of the Board of Trustees and shall have general control of the College including its officers, teachers, students, and business. He shall render to the Board complete annual reports and to its chairman, Executive Committee or other committees such information as may be deemed essential to a thorough knowledge of the operation of the College and its promotion. He shall be a member of the Board of Trustees ex-officio and the Executive Committee ex-officio and shall have the rights and privileges of a member of the Board except voting. The President shall execute all documents, instruments, and conveyances on behalf of the College. Duties of the president and working relationship shall be further detailed in a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

**ITEM TWO—VICE PRESIDENT:** The Vice-President shall perform all the duties of the President in the absence of the latter.

**ITEM THREE—DEAN:** The Academic Dean of the College shall, under the President, fix the hours of recitation, govern, control, and regulate the conduct of the students, have general oversight of curriculum, student's records, and such other internal details and administrative duties as may be delegated to him by the President of the College.

**ITEM FOUR—BUSINESS MANAGER:** The Treasurer shall keep an accurate record of all accounts of the College and shall receive and expend as directed by the Board of Trustees and President, all money for the expenses of the institution. He shall make an annual report to the Board and furnish the Executive Committee with such information pertaining to his office as may be requested. He shall provide bond in whatever amount the Board may require. Until such times as the Board of Trustees may deem different the Treasurer's office shall be contained within the Business Manager's Office. The Business Manager may at the direction of the administration designate this duty to a subordinate officer. The Business Manager shall have general supervision of the financial business of the College, and shall, at the direction of the President, be responsible for the upkeep of all the physical facilities and premises of the College. His detailed duties are directed in a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

## **SECTION III FACULTY**

The faculty shall consist of the President, the Dean, and all teachers of

Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College. Instructors and assistant teachers shall have the privilege of sitting with the faculty in stated meetings but shall not have the right of voting.

It shall be the policy of the College to employ on its faculty those who are members of Free Will Baptist churches that are affiliated with the National Association. Emergencies, however arising from the resignation, illness, death, or approved leaves of absence of faculty members may be relieved by the temporary employment of instructors who are affiliated with any evangelical denomination. Part-time or short-term instructors, deemed essential to the successful prosecution of a consistent education program, may be employed at the discretion of the President without respect of denominational affiliation.

The faculty, under the authority and jurisdiction of the President, shall have general charge of instruction, attendance of students, examinations, administration of curriculum, discipline, and all matters involving the spiritual, physical, and social welfare of the College. The faculty shall be hired upon recommendation of the President.

In the selection of the faculty qualitative factors shall be kept in mind. All faculty members shall be urged to pursue graduate programs in their respective fields. Except in special cases no faculty member will be required to teach courses outside of his field.

#### **SECTION IV ACADEMIC COUNCIL**

The Academic Council shall consist of the President, the Dean and the heads of the departments of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College: It shall determine the curriculum and academic policy of the College, prescribe requirements for admission, certificates, diplomas, and degrees, and supervise the courses of instruction offered by the various departments of the College.

#### **SECTION V CONTRACTS**

The Board of Trustees shall establish the College policy involving the execution of contracts, deeds of conveyance, the determination of salaries, and employment of all officers, representatives, faculty members and essential domestic and maintenance employees. The President of the College shall negotiate agreements, executive contracts, employ representatives, and supply vacancies incurred by the termination of contracts, resignations, or death of any essential employees. All contracts for building construction shall be let only to persons or corporations posting a valid performance bond and recording the same in the Office of the County Clerk of Cleveland County, Oklahoma.

#### **SECTION VI ADVISORY COUNCIL**

An advisory council shall be formed which is to be composed of interested, qualified persons in the various fields which will be of value in building and maintaining a strong academic program to carry out the educational program stated in the charter.

#### **SECTION VII AMENDMENT**

These By-Laws may be amended by a favorable vote of two-thirds of the qualified members of the Board of Trustees of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College at any meeting of the Board, provided that the proposed amend-

ment has been submitted in writing to each Trustee one month in advance. This change to be subject to the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.

#### **SECTION VIII ADMINISTRATIVE FUNCTIONS**

The President of the Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College shall be elected by the Board of Trustees, and he shall act for and on behalf of the Board in the conduct and management of the institution. He shall also be a member of the Board of Trustees ex-officio and of the Executive committee, ex-officio, and his duties, powers and term of office shall be prescribed in the by-laws of the College and a format approved by the Board of Trustees.

#### **ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC.**

Know all men by these presents, that, we whose names are hereunto subscribed, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the provisions of the corporation laws of the State of Oklahoma, and for that purpose state:

##### **ARTICLE ONE**

The name of this corporation shall be HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC.

##### **ARTICLE TWO**

The purpose of this corporation shall be the creation, establishment and maintenance of a college and institution of higher learning devoted to the promotion and impartation of higher learning, Christian education and such other education, instruction, learning, training and research as may be deemed essential for the cause of Christ and to that end prescribe courses of study and grant degrees. The doctrinal and theological position of this institution shall be that of the sponsoring denomination, Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and the treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptist as endorsed by the state body, and in connection therewith, in accordance with the stipulation of the Constitution and By-laws of the State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

(a.) To prescribe courses of study for both resident and correspondence students, which shall include general education in the arts, Christian Ministries of Service and Biblical studies for wisdom; said courses to be taught in both a Junior College Division and a Bible College Division, and to award degrees, either graduate or post-graduate, to those persons satisfactorily completing the prescribed courses of study and to grant such other literary honors, including honorary degrees, as shall be deemed advisable.

(b.) To charge and collect tuition as determined by the Board of Trustees and to create scholarships.

(c.) To employ professors, instructors and other subordinate employees as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the college under the direction and control of the President of the College, with the advice and consent of the majority of the Board of Trustees.

(d.) To institute and carry on missions and commissions for missionary purposes and investigations.

(e.) To publish and distribute such pamphlets, literature or books as may be required in the conduct of such work and the general promotion of the College.

(f.) To sue and be sued in its corporate name and to enter into contracts of every type and nature.

(g.) To solicit support, receive, collect, hold and receive by gift or bequest personal property in any amount, money or other thing of value; to purchase real estate, to receive real estate that may be given, or devised to the college for achieving the legitimate ends of the college and to sell or mortgage the same as the need arises.

(h.) To borrow money in payment of property for erecting buildings and making improvements and for any other purpose germane to the objectives and purposes of the college.

(i.) To issue notes, bonds, debentures and other evidences of indebtedness and execute mortgages, liens and other incumbrances upon the property of the corporation, real or otherwise, to secure the payment of any such evidences of indebtedness.

(j.) To transact any and all business connected with said College as may be necessary to achieve the purposes of said College.

(k.) To obtain under Internal Revenue Laws of the United States and of the Revenue Laws of the State of Oklahoma exemption from income property and other forms of taxation.

#### ARTICLE THREE

The location of this corporation shall be in Moore, Oklahoma.

#### ARTICLE FOUR

The duration of this corporation shall be perpetual.

#### ARTICLE FIVE

The general control of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of Trustees consisting of 15 members, 9 of which trustees shall be elected by the delegates to the annual Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists—each of which shall serve for a term of three years and until his successor is elected and qualified, and one member each shall be elected by the delegates to the annual meeting of the state association of Free Will Baptists of the States of Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico and Texas, each of which shall serve for a term of six years and until his successor is elected and qualified. Initially, the 9 trustees elected by said Oklahoma Association shall include 3 elected for three years, three elected for two years, and 3 elected for one year but their successors shall all be elected for a term of three years and until their successors are elected and qualified. Initially, said trustee elected by said Arkansas Association shall be elected for a term of six years, said trustee elected by said Colorado Association shall be elected for a term of five years, said trustee elected by said Kansas Association shall be elected for a term of four years, said trustee elected by said Missouri Association shall be elected for a term of three years, said trustee elected by said New Mexico Association shall be elected for a term of two years, and said trustee elected by said Texas Association shall be elected for a term of one year but their successors shall be elected for a term of six years. The Chairman of said Corporation shall be one of the trustees elected by said Oklahoma Association.

#### ARTICLE SIX

An executive committee consisting of the Chairman, Vice Chairman, and Secretary of the Board of Trustees shall possess all powers of the Board of Trustees between the stated meetings of the Board of Trustees.

#### ARTICLE SEVEN

All contracts for building construction shall be let only to persons or corporations posting a valid performance bond and recording the same in the office of the County Clerk of Cleveland County, Oklahoma.

## SECTION IX AMENDMENTS

This charter may be hereafter amended subject to the provisions contained herein and the laws of the State of Oklahoma. It is provided, however, that the Trustees of the College shall not propose or apply for any amendment which has not been previously authorized by an act of the Oklahoma State Association.

Several other speakers spoke briefly also: Paul Kettelman representing the Bible College in Nashville; Jack Williams, representing the National Executive Department, and Thomas Marberry spoke on the modular courses offered at Hillsdale. ## **CONSTITUTION OF MINISTER'S CONFERENCE**

### **ARTICLE 1**

The Minister's Conference shall be called the Oklahoma State Free Will Baptist Minister's Conference, and shall be composed of Ordained Free Will Baptist Ministers who are regular members of some Orthodox Free Will Baptist church in the State of Oklahoma who have paid their \$1.00 dues.

### **ARTICLE 2**

The officers for this conference shall be President, Vice-President, and Clerk Treasurer, who shall be elected annually.

### **ARTICLE 3**

This conference shall have the power to discipline its members.

### **ARTICLE 4**

Members of this organization shall be all ordained ministers who participate in the benefits and activities of this body, and associate members who become members by payment of the \$1.00 annual dues.

### **ARTICLE 5**

This conference shall meet Semi-Annually.

### **ARTICLE 6**

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the members present at any regular session.

## **BY-LAWS OF MINISTER'S CONFERENCE**

### **ARTICLE 1**

The clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence the senior minister in years shall call the ministers into conference. If a quorum is present the President or in his absence the Vice-President shall moderate the meeting. If neither of these are present, the senior minister in years shall be in charge.

### **ARTICLE 2**

It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the ministers of the conference. Ministers shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the conference. In case of questionable representation the case under question shall be referred to the Credential Committee.

### **ARTICLE 3**

It shall be the duty of each minister belonging to this conference, to be active in pastoral or evangelistic services (disabled or retired ministers excepted). Any minister belonging to this conference shall report in each session in person or by letter, and failing to do so for two successive sessions shall be subject to discipline.

#### ARTICLE 4

Each conference shall be opened by reading a portion of God's word and prayer, and each session shall be closed with prayer.

#### ARTICLE 5

By a two-thirds vote of the members present ruling of the President may be overruled.

#### ARTICLE 6

This conference shall sit with open doors, except when it shall go into a committee as a whole.

#### ARTICLE 7

No member shall absent himself from the conference during its meeting without permission from the President.

#### ARTICLE 8

No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of a committee, unless person nominated is not elected.

#### ARTICLE 9

The President shall not allow discussion when not carried on in a Christian Spirit, or when he thinks it will cause discord.

#### ARTICLE 10

Anyone desiring to speak shall rise and address the President by the appellation "Brother President," but shall not speak further until recognized.

#### ARTICLE 11

No member of this conference shall be allowed to speak more than five minutes, nor twice on the same subject without permission from the President.

#### ARTICLE 12

These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this conference by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

### ARTICLES OF FAITH OF STATE ASSOCIATION

1. **THE BIBLE**—The Scriptures of the Old and New Testament were given by the inspiration of God, and are our infallible rules of faith and practice.

2. **GOD**—There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver and Righteous Governor of the Universe, and in the Scriptures as the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.

3. **CHRIST**—Christ is God manifest in the flesh: in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified. He is now risen and glorified is our ever-present Saviour and Lord.

4. **THE HOLY SPIRIT**—The Scriptures assigns to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of all men.

5. **THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD**—God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of Grace, not otherwise provided for as highest welfare of man requires.

6. **THE SINFULNESS OF MAN**—Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore inherited a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.



7. **THE WORK OF CHRIST**—The Son of God, by His incarnation, life, suffering, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.

8. **THE WORK OF SALVATION**—The conditions of salvation are:  
1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and the hearty renunciations of it.  
2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Saviour and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit; freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God.  
3. Continuance in faith and obedience until death.

9. **ELECTION**—God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ, men become His elect.

10. **FREEDOM OF WILL**—The Human will is free and self controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit and live, or to resist them and perish.

11. **SALVATION FREE**—God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take of the water of life freely.

12. **PERSEVERENCE**—All believers in Christ, who through grace persevere in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.

13. **BACKSLIDING AND APOSTASY**—A person who has been regenerated or born again and is living in unconfessed, unforgiven sin, is rebellious to the principles of the Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and therefore is a backslider in a lost condition who must repent and be restored to the right relationship with God or be eternally lost.

We recognize, according to Hebrews 6:4-6, that it is possible for a person to get in the condition that he could never return to Christ. This, we believe, is Apostasy; However, we also recognize that a regenerate person can fall into sin, be in a lost condition and still not be an Apostate. This person, through repentance, can be reconciled to God.

14. **GOSPEL ORDINANCES**—Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel: Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and to be administered to all true believers.

15. **TITHING**—God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament: Jesus Christ endorsed in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." I Cor. 16:2.

16. **THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH**—The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from the secular employment and amusements for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God.

17. **RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT, AND FINAL RETRIBUTION**—The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation: then the wicked shall "Go away into eternal punishment but the righteous into eternal life."

## **RULES OF ORDER**

1. At every sitting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded by prayer by the Moderator or whomever he may request.
2. Ministers and deacons present are invited to seats, allowed to take part in debates on all subjects, and to vote.
3. Those who speak shall rise and address the Moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
4. No motion may be discussed until made and seconded.
5. When a motion has been made and seconded, and a member opposes its discussion, the Moderator shall put the question, "Shall it be discussed?" If negative, the question shall not be discussed.
6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member, and the vote taken separately.
7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.
8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.
9. All questions shall be decided by a majority vote of all Members present.

## **BY-LAWS OF STATE ASSOCIATION**

1. The Clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence, the senior minister in years shall call the Association into conference, and if a quorum is present the moderator, or in his absence, the assistant moderator shall take charge; and if neither of them is present the senior minister in years shall act as Moderator.
2. It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the delegates to the Association, who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the Association.
3. It shall be the duty of every District belonging to this Association to send a letter to every annual session of this Association reporting in the same spiritual condition, benevolent work, and its statistics. Any District belonging to this Association, which shall fail to report itself for two successive sessions, may be dismissed from the Association by a two thirds vote of all members present.
4. Each meeting shall be opened by reading a portion of the Bible and with prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.
5. By a two-thirds vote of members present, a ruling of the moderator can be overruled.
6. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.
7. This Association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.
8. Any person not a member of this Association may be allowed to take part in its discussions by obtaining permission from the moderator.
9. It shall be the duty of all the Association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting, and anyone wishing to retire shall first obtain leave of the moderator.
10. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee, provided the person nominated be elected.
11. The moderator shall not allow discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.

12. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise to his feet and address the moderator by the appellation "Brother Moderator," but shall not speak further until recognized by the moderator.

13. No member of this association shall be allowed to speak more than ten minutes nor twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator.

14. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

### **CONSTITUTION OF STATE ASSOCIATION**

**PREAMBLE:** From long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and realizing the necessity of a bond of union and fellowship among us as a church; and to preserve and maintain correspondence and co-ordination with us, do therefore ordain this Constitution for our better denomination government.

#### **ARTICLE I**

**NAME:** This organization shall be known as the OKLAHOMA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS.

#### **ARTICLE II**

**PURPOSE:** The object and purpose of this organization shall be to unify the work of the various bodies composing this State Association, and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in connection with the various bodies in the Association, or that may hereafter be represented therein.

#### **ARTICLE III**

**REPRESENTATION:** Section 1. This Association shall be composed of all ordained ministers and deacons with membership in some local church which is a member of a district Association with membership in the State Association.

Section 2: Each District Association shall be entitled to a number of elected delegates equal with the number of churches composing said Association. These delegates may be recommended by the local churches and shall be endorsed by their district association.

#### **ARTICLE IV**

**FINANCE:** Each Association shall contribute \$20.00 per Church for support of the Association and delegate fees.

#### **ARTICLE V**

**DISCIPLINE:** This State Association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine or practices that may properly come before

it from any of the bodies composing said organization; furthermore, if there be any question of discipline, doctrine or practices on the part of an affiliated association, delegates of that association shall not be seated until these questions have been settled to the satisfaction of the General Board.

Section 2: Decisions of the General Board may be appealed in this manner. All appeals shall come before the State Association when sitting in a committee as a whole.

#### ARTICLE VI

**OFFICERS:** A. The officers of the State Association shall consist of a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk, and an Executive Secretary. Each of these shall be elected at the close of each regular session except the Executive Secretary.

B. (1) The Executive Secretary shall be elected for a two year tenure. It shall be the responsibility of the Executive Board to seek out a prospective candidate and make their recommendation to the body at the state association in its regular session, with primary consideration given to the recommendation prior to any nominations.

(2) In the event of a vacancy occurring during the course of the year, the Executive Board shall fill the vacancy until the annual setting of the association.

#### ARTICLE VII

**BOARDS:** All standing boards shall be composed of seven (7) elected members who shall serve terms of 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1 years with such ex-officio members as may be provided elsewhere, except: (1) the General Board which shall be composed of one (1) member from each affiliated association, the chairman of each standing board, and the current general officers of this association, and (2) the College Board of Trustees which shall be composed as provided for in the Articles of Incorporation of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc.

The standing boards of this association shall be: Executive Board; Board of Church Extension, Missions and Evangelism; Sunday School Board; Church Training Service Board; and College Board of Trustees.

No standing board shall meet in a functional meeting during the session of this association.

#### ARTICLE VIII

##### DUTIES, SCOPE OF ENDEAVOR AND QUALIFICATIONS OF STANDING BOARDS

Section 1. **EXECUTIVE BOARD:** The Executive Board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of an affiliated association and in good standing with the association of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

It shall be the duty of this board to act in behalf of the association when it is not in session. It shall be bound to carry out the directions of the association and shall hold itself bound by every consideration of morality and honor to carry out the wishes of this association and to act under its instructions in whatever technical rights, civil laws and the decisions of courts may give it in certain emergencies. It shall be the duty of this board to sign their signatures to any and all papers concerning properties, indebtedness, bonds, or other legal documents pertaining to the execution of the will of this association, exclusive of the College Board of Trustees.

This board shall have the oversight of the Executive Department of this association. The members shall assist and direct such work for the general promotion of this association as is deemed needful or necessary as the means available shall permit. The Executive Department shall serve as the

coordinating agency of this association to correlate the work of all standing boards and agencies.

This board shall have the oversight of Free Will Baptist Book Store and shall endeavor to serve affiliated associations and churches and the community with literature and church supplies. Merchandising procedures shall be those accepted as normal retail procedures with the board being cognizant of the spiritual contribution of the store in distributing Christian literature.

All decisions of this board shall be governed by the general tenets of this association and shall not violate this constitution.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, and work done and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Whereas this board represents the association when not in session, it and it alone shall have the power to call the association into special conference provided each affiliated association shall be given notice at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting of such special conference.

**Section 2. GENERAL BOARD:** This board shall be composed of one (1) member from each affiliated association, the chairman of each standing board, and the current general officers of this association. Each member must be a member of an affiliated association and in good standing with the association of which he is a member. The members shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to meet one (1) day preceding the annual session of this association. This board shall serve as the credential committee with the duties and responsibilities assigned by Article V of this constitution. This board shall hear reports of all standing boards. It shall serve as budget committee and shall make such recommendations as deemed pertinent to this association. A complete and accurate record shall be kept of meetings of this board and a report shall be made in writing to this association in its annual session.

The moderator of the association shall serve as chairman of this board, and the clerk of the association shall serve as its clerk.

**Section 3. BOARD OF CHURCH EXTENSION, MISSIONS AND EVANGELISM:** This board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

It shall be the duty of this board to labor to further the Gospel of Jesus Christ into the uttermost parts of the earth. In accomplishing this, they are to endeavor to establish missions and churches in communities within the bounds of this association with whatever moral and financial assistance that may be theirs. In cases of small churches failing to function, whatever assistance deemed appropriate shall be rendered to maintain the effective witness of that church by either direct labor with the church or with an associational board in instances where the affiliated association has a functional board or agency.

This board shall be empowered to receive and convey title to real property in the area of its labors.

The promotion of missionary endeavors from a local, state or national level shall come within the scope of endeavor of this board. This board shall assist in maintaining prayer and financial support of missionary enterprises through whatever channels available.

Whereas missionary and evangelistic labors are so intimately related,

this board shall assist through participation or assistance in maintaining a strong evangelistic thrust in the life of affiliated association.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

**Section 4. COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES:** The College Board of Trustees shall be composed as provided for in the Articles of Incorporation of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc.

Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc. is an agency of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and is incorporated under the corporate laws of the State of Oklahoma. The articles of incorporation are a part of this association's record and delineate the purpose, duty and scope of endeavor of the members of this board.

**Section 5. CHURCH TRAINING SERVICE BOARD:** This board shall be composed of seven members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to plan and assist in organizing and sustaining a strong Church Training Service in every church in each association affiliated with this association with every means of promotion and assistance available to them. This board shall plan, coordinate and conduct state-wide youth camps or camp.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

**Section 6. SUNDAY SCHOOL BOARD:** This board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to plan and promote Sunday schools in every church in each association affiliated with this association. This board shall use every available means to promote Sunday school clinics, seminars, institutes and conventions on local, district and state-wide basis, working with local agencies to distribute and employ all effective methods and material available.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

**Section 7. VACANCIES:** Vacancies shall occur when a member moves from the territorial bounds of this association, by death, by resignation or by removal from office by this association. In the event of disciplinary action where charges concerning misconduct, doctrine or practice shall have been lodged against a member of any board, his office shall be held in abeyance until such charges shall be concluded or as determined by this association.

All boards shall have power to fill vacancies arising between sessions of this association. Such appointment shall terminate at the next session of the association and shall be filled by this association.

**Section 8. EMPLOYEES:** All employees of boards or agencies of this

association shall be employed by agreement or contract with employing board or agency upon approval of this association except those elected by this association and the conditions of their employment shall be those approved by this association.

The duties of the Executive Secretary of this association shall be:

- (1) He is to represent, or cause to be represented, the association at all affairs of interest to the association.
- (2) He is to promote the work of the association in such a manner so as to unify the efforts of the association.
- (3) He is to serve with all standing boards and committees of the association in an ex-officio capacity.
- (4) He is to aid in planning the work of the association by relating the activities and plans of one board to another.
- (5) He is to report to the association during each annual session.
- (6) He is to communicate to the affiliated members of this association the pressing causes and events before the association. This can be in person or by means of a periodical bulletin or both.
- (7) He shall serve as treasurer of this association. An accurate and complete record of all funds received and disbursed shall be kept and a written report shall be included in his report to this association in its annual session.
- (8) The conditions of employment shall be determined by the Executive Board.

#### ARTICLE IX

**DISSOLUTION:** Should this association cease to function, all properties and holdings shall go to the National Association of Free Will Baptists after all creditors are satisfied and indebtedness cleared.

#### ARTICLE X

**AMENDMENTS:** This constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session of the association by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of members present and voting, provided proposed amendment or alteration be presented in writing to the body one (1) day in advance.

#### ARTICLE XI

**SPECIAL SESSIONS:** Elected delegates to the last session of this association shall be retained as standing delegates for special called sessions.
