

The General Board Report

The General Board of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists met October 11, 2010 at Hillsdale Free Will Baptist Bible College in Moore, Oklahoma. As a result of that meeting we offer the following items for your consideration:

- -1. We received communication from twenty-four of the twenty-four District Associations comprising the membership of this body. We recommend their letters be received and their delegates seated.
- We heard the reports of the Executive Board, Executive Director, Free Will Baptist
 Literature Center, Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, State Mission Board, State
 Christian Education Board, and the Historical Commission. We forward these reports to
 you for your consideration and refer the adoption of their budgets to the Budget
 Committee's recommendations.
- We recommend that the 2011 State Association be held at the Rejoice FWB Church in Owasso. The dates are October 10, 11, 12.
- 4. The National Association voted to increase the national representation fee from \$100 to \$150. We recommend that we acknowledge this increase and request that the State Representation fee remain at \$50 for a total of \$200 per church per year. (This increase would be reflected in next year's fees)
- We recommend that the Arms of Compassion Ministry (ACM) Projected Cash Flow Budget be as presented on pages 8 of the 2010 Digest of Reports.
- As the Budget Committee we recommend that a Cooperative Budget of \$650,000.00 be adopted for the 2011-2012 year.
- As the Budget Committee we recommend that the Cooperative Funds be distributed according to the following percentages:

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT

National Association of Free Will Baptists

I would like to begin my report by thanking all Oklahoma Free Will Baptists who helped to make this year's National Association meeting a tremendous event.

Attendance:

Oklahomans came from all over the state to one or more of the sessions. You helped to make this meeting one of the top three best attended National meetings in our FWB history.

Finances:

When the call went forth that additional funds would be needed beyond the \$30,000 that we as the host state had set aside, Oklahoma FWB responded and in the end, we were able to contribute \$52,000. Special recognition goes to the Poteau River Valley and South Grand River Associations and to the His Foundation for gifts of \$5,000 each

Participation:

Thank you to Danny Phillips, Curt Gwartney, Sheri Jenson, Roy Copeland and Traci Payne for serving on the Steering Committee and to the dozens of Oklahomans who volunteered in numerous ways to the success of the convention.

Speakers:

I would be remiss in not thanking the speakers from the state of Oklahoma at this convention. Thomas Marberry (Sunday School), Jeff Blair (Sunday evening), Charles Murphy (Monday evening), Curt Gwartney (Youth Service) and Bea Kirby (State Leaders Wives Luncheon) certainly represented our state well as each spoke at various sessions during the convention.

COOP

The total receipts for the Cooperative Plan for the 2009-2010 fiscal year totaled \$651,454.78. This represents a decrease of approximately 8% over last year's record high. The decrease is indicative of the national economic downturn that is affecting all facets of society including church giving.

The original dream of the Cooperative Plan back in 1954 was that every church would contribute 10% of their yearly income to the district association. The district association would then use up to 25% for district needs and forward 75% on to the state to be divided according to percentages agreed upon by the State Association. Presently those designations are Hillsdale 33%, National Departments 24%, State Office 22%, State Missions 15% and Christian Education Board 6%.

Honestly, 56 years later we are only scratching the surface of realizing the potential of that original dream. It is still a worthy goal. We still have several of our churches that give little or no cooperative funds. I have had the opportunity to meet with a few of our district leaders to share a Ten Year Plan of moving us closer to realizing the full potential of the original cooperative dream. Just the financial difference it would make to Hillsdale alone would be well worth the investment of energy, for it would mean literally several hundred thousand more dollars going to our college. The increase in income

would allow the state office to exist on a lower percentage allowing more monies to go where the state would direct them. I am looking forward to meeting with more district and church leaders in the coming months to encourage moving us in the direction of what our predecessors envisioned. We do not need a new dream for the original one is more than large enough. We do need to press on until it is fully realized. I am more convinced than ever that COOP is a great plan and worthy of support as we endeavor to fund our efforts to impact our world for Christ.

Another endeavor that is always much on my mind and in my heart is to assist our churches as we strive to fulfill the Great Commission. Pray that God would give us wisdom and direction to effectively reach those who are without Christ in our state and throughout the world.

As always, I thank you for the spirit of cooperation that this Association is known for and the opportunity you have given to me to serve Christ and His Church.

Thank you so much for spreading the Compassion of Christ through your support of Arms of Compassion this year. Once again we were able to touch the lives of those in need around the world due to your participation, financial gifts, and prayer.

- ACM Disaster Relief responded to three disasters this year (Haiti, Central OK Tornado, and the
 Statewide Ice storm). We responded in Haiti by supporting ministries that were already on the
 ground and ministering there at the time of the earthquake, as well as sending Mark Cole
 and Michael Hewett over to work with those organizations we supported. During the ice storm
 we touched 20 plus needy families with the placement of generators. We also trained DR teams

 inception of ACM. Call us soon to set up your Compassion Conference and to see how your
 church can make a difference.

As you will notice, we have made some changes in our budget for the next year. From the beginning it has been our goal to give basically one third of our funds to disaster relief, global ministries, and administrative funds respectively. This is pretty much where we are this year. Additionally, we have also set apart 10% for various compassion projects such as our Compassion (adoption) Grants. Please understand the administrative portion of our budget will help underwrite all aspects of our ministry, plus its promotion and the holding of Compassion Conferences around the state.

Oklahoma Free Will Baptists, you can be commended for your compassion toward those in need. Let us not be content though. There are still children dying daily around the world due to hunger, disaster, abuse, and other preventable causes. There is so much more to do....

(1) ORGANIZATIONAL AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization - The Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists (the State Association) provides central leadership and representation for the Free Will Baptists of Oklahoma and processes certain receipts and disbursements of the Free Will Baptists Churches. The Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists also governs the following auxiliary functions: the Literature Center; the Board of Church Extension, Missions and Evangelism; and the Christian Education Board. Combined financial statements are not prepared for these functions because meaningful information would not result from presenting combined financial statements.

Arms of Compassion Ministry – During the year ending June 30, 2006, the Executive Board adopted the Arms of Compassion Ministry as an official ministry of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists. The purpose of the ministry is to equip the local church for, and to serve as its extension ministering to the physical, emotional, and spiritual needs of hurting children and families around the world. This Ministry remains an integral component of the State Association.

<u>Basis of Accounting</u> – The financial statements of the State Association have been prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles. Modifications to the cash basis of accounting included recording depreciation on property and equipment and presenting investments at fair value. Revenue is recorded when received rather than when earned and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred.

Cash and Cash Equivalents - For purposes of the statement of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and cash in checking and savings accounts of the unrestricted and temporarily restricted funds. Cash equivalents include all highly liquid investments with maturity of three months or less.

<u>Property and Equipment</u> – Property and equipment are recorded at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Expenditures for repairs and maintenance are charged to operations when incurred while major improvements and renewals are capitalized.

The following useful lives were used to calculate depreciation:

Building 15 years
Building Improvements 10 to 15 years
Furniture, Fixtures & Equipment 7 years

Donations of property and/or equipment would be recorded as support by the State Association at its estimated fair value, when a voluntary and unconditional transfer of the asset has occurred.

(1) ORGANIZATIONAL AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (con't)

Income Taxes - The State Association is a not-for-profit organization associated with the Free Will Baptist religious denomination and is exempt from federal and state income taxation. Therefore, no provision has been made for income taxes in the accompanying financial statements.

<u>Estimates</u> – Management uses estimates and assumptions in preparing financial statements. Those estimates and assumptions affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, and the reported revenues and expenses. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

- <u>Basis of Presentation</u> Net assets and revenues, gains and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions as follows:
 - Unrestricted net assets Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations.
 - Temporarily restricted net assets Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that can be fulfilled by actions of the Board pursuant to those stipulations or that expire by the passage of time.
 - Permanently restricted net assets Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that they be maintained permanently by the Board. Generally, the donors of such assets permit the Board to use all or part of the income earned on the assets.

(2) - COOPERATIVE CONTRIBUTIONS AND EXPENDITURES

The State Association receives contributions from Free Will Baptist churches in Oklahoma to be cooperatively allocated among board-approved organizations. The percentage allocation of Cooperative Contributions for the years ended June 30, 2010 and 2009 was as follows:

(2) - COOPERATIVE CONTRIBUTIONS AND EXPENDITURES (con't)

Five percent of the churches Cooperative Contribution can be sent to the National Free will Baptists' Retirement Board in their pastor's individual account. These contributions made during the fiscal years ending June 30, 2010 and 2009 were \$14,619, and \$16,147, respectively.

(3) - CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

The State Association has signed note agreements as guarantor for several developing churches. Historically, none of these churches have defaulted on these note agreements and the State Association believes it is unlikely that any of these churches will default on their loans in the future. However, if these churches become unable to meet their debt service, the State Association will be liable for payment of the debt. Following is a complete list of the obligations that the State Association has guaranteed and remain outstanding as of June 30, 2010:

Heartland - \$407,000 Loan Mortgagee - Lincoln National Bank Originated September 2003, maturing 2012

(4) - TEMPORARILY RESTRICTED NET ASSETS

The State Association disburses restricted funds according to the donor's specifications during the last week of every month. Temporarily restricted net assets would represent any funds that were received before the fiscal year-end that had not been disbursed. As of June 30, 2010 the following restricted donations had not been disbursed.

(5) - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

HIS Foundation is a non-profit organization founded in June of 2000 to receive funds for the purpose of providing perpetual income for Free Will Baptists Ministries in the state of Oklahoma. The State Association is a beneficiary of this foundation. The Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists deposited funds with the Foundation in the amount of \$0 and \$6,000 for the fiscal years ending June 30, 2010 and 2009 respectfully. The funds receive interest at approximately 5% per annum. The Association balance as of June 30, 2010 for funds deposited with the Foundation was \$0. On March 9, 2010 all deposits plus interest totaling \$33,500 was withdrawn in preparation for hosting the National Convention meeting in Oklahoma City in July 2010.

(6) - DONATED REAL ESTATE

A Free Will Baptist Church campground has shown intent to donate property to the State Association. However, this property has not been reflected in the accompanying financial statements, since it has not yet met the criteria for recognition established by Statement of Financial Accounting Standards No. 116, Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made.

(1) ORGANIZATIONAL AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization - The Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists Literature Center (the Literature Center) is an auxiliary function of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists. This Center was created to assist in the supply of Free Will Baptist literature. The Literature Center does not combine their financial statements with those of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists because meaningful information would not result from presenting combined financial statements.

<u>Basis of Accounting</u> – The financial statements of the Literature Center have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting, wherein income and expenses are recorded as they are earned or incurred.

<u>Cash and Cash Equivalents</u> – For purposes of the statements of cash flows, cash includes cash on hand and cash in checking and savings accounts of the unrestricted and temporarily restricted funds. Cash equivalents include all highly liquid investments with a maturity on three months on less.

<u>Inventories</u> - Inventories are recorded at the lower on cost on market using the first-in, first-out method of accounting.

<u>Property and Equipment</u> – Property and equipment are recorded at cost. Repairs and maintenance are recorded as expenditures when incurred while major betterments are capitalized. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method based on the estimated useful lives of the related assets as summarized below:

Furniture, Fixtures & Equipment 3 to 10 years Building 37.5 years

Income Taxes - The Literature Center is a not-for-profit organization associated with the Free Will Baptist religious denomination and is exempt from federal and state income taxation. Therefore, no provision has been made for income taxes in the accompanying financial statements.

(1) ORGANIZATIONAL AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (con't)

Basis of Presentation - Net assets and revenues, gains and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions as follows:

- Unrestricted net assets Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations.
- Temporarily restricted net assets Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that can be fulfilled by actions of the Literature Center pursuant to those stipulations or that expire by the passage of time.
- Permanently restricted net assets Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that they be maintained permanently by the Literature Center. Generally, the donors of such assets permit the Literature Center to use all or part of the income earned on the assets.

<u>Estimates</u> – The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

<u>Shipping and handling</u> – Shipping and handling costs are recorded as an expense and are shown as a separate line item in selling, general and administrative expenses on the statement of activities.

(2) - CONTRIBUTIONS

All contributions made by the Literature Center are approved by the executive board members. The Literature Center made an initial pledge of \$100,000. For the years ending June 30, 2010 and June 30, 2009, contributions were paid to Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College in the amount of \$4,000 and \$7,400, respectfully. The balance as of July 1, 2008 was \$59,186. The current year contribution of \$4,000 reduces the remaining pledge balance as of June 30, 2010 to \$47,786.

(3) - STATEMENT OF CASH FLOWS

Cash flows from operating activities include contributions received.

(4) - CURRENT LIABILITIES

The Literature Center inventoried an Oklahoma History Book in 2010. The total cost of the History Book was \$20,900. The Center paid \$3,400 up front and borrowed \$17,500 from First American Bank in March, 2010. Principal payments for fiscal year totaled \$3,500 and the balance as of 6/30/10 was \$14,000. The Center intends to pay the debt back as soon as possible within the next fiscal year.

Oklahoma Free Will Baptist Mission Department

Greetings from the Oklahoma FWB Mission Board and Director. Our report covers a reporting year of the calendar year of 2009. Like most departments and agencies within our movement, we have experienced some unique financial challenges in 2009. Our missionaries and church planters have fared well and have continued to do a remarkable job in spite of budget challenges and cutbacks. In 2009 the economy in Oklahoma plummeted to a condition that required serious examination and reconsideration. Due to an increase in our missionary force in 2009 we actually had an increase in our budget need over 2008. With confidence in our people and our God, we moved forward knowing that a million dollar budget need would be challenging. In 2008, anticipating 2009 to be an extraordinarily challenging year, we began preparing for it by establishing a TSP "Rainy Day" fund. Before the economy took a downward plunge, we began setting back money in case of a shortfall in 2009. At the time we did not know how important this would be. By entering 2009 with about \$65,000 in reserve and all missionary accounts in the black, we were able to weather the financial storm. Although our giving to International Missions and National Home missions was down in comparison to previous years, we were able to keep all our missionary accounts fully funded and in the black.

Regardless of tough financial situations, our programs continued and even expanded. Our missionaries worked very hard to cut budgets and tighten their belts while their work continued and souls were being saved. The Foundation FWB Church in Grove continues to do amazingly well under the leadership of Sam Smith (joint project with the South Grand River Association). Foundation celebrated their 2nd Anniversary in May, 2010 and already have a "full service" ministry including Sunday School, Sunday night worship, Wednesday night Bible study, Children and teen programs, VBS, Senior adult ministry and much more. Foundation averages 80 in weekly attendance and to date, forty-four souls have been saved and eleven others have rededicated their lives to the Lord.

The Epic FWB Church in Piedmont (a joint project with the First Oklahoma District Association) launched in 2008 with church planter Zack Archer taking the lead role. Epic has been actively involved in the community and is making itself known through outreach events and activities in the community and schools. They currently average approximately forty-three in worship and have seen three salvations and over ten rededications.

In the summer of 2007 Gamaliel Botello launched the Way, the Truth and the Life FWBC, a Hispanic work in Woodward. The church has faced some difficult challenges dealing with tighter legislation and legal issues regarding the Hispanic population and has lost over seventy people due to immigration issues and the economy. Despite these issues they have continued to see many people won to Christ. Every week approximately forty-seven people gather for worship and more than one hundred thirty-five people have received Christ and fifty have rededicated themselves to the Lord as a result of this work.

In 2009 our State Mission Board was given oversight of The Potter's House, a Hispanic work in Tulsa formerly a ministry of the Cornerstone Church in Sperry. Rev. Arturo Quinones

leads this growing work and has made strides to taking this work self supporting. They require only a small amount of support from TSP and have had a history of doing a great work. They currently average one hundred-ten in weekly attendance and operate a Hispanic Bible Institute that is currently training seven Hispanic students for ministry. This church recently launched another location meeting at the Rejoice Church in Owasso to do Hispanic ministry and already have about thirty attending. Scores of Hispanic people have been won to Christ through the ministry of this church and its supporters throughout more than a decade of service to Oklahoma FWB.

Support for our National Home missionaries, Jeremy and Jill Lightsey (San Antonio, TX), Alfredo and Ruth Botello (Bartlesville, OK Hispanic), Howard and Patsy Gwartney (Sun Tan Valley, AZ) and Robert and Holly Ketchum (Seattle, WA) continued in 2009. All of these accounts are strong and ended the year positive and the works are reaching people with the Gospel message. (As of the date this report is given, Robert and Holly Ketchum no longer serve with National Home Missions but did receive support through 2009.)

International Missions has been undergoing some significant changes through the national department. 2009 was spent in preparation for the start of a new funding system in January, 2010. Although this new funding system has faced some challenges, we support the one fund system and encourage Oklahoma churches to continue to support International Missions through faithful giving to TSP. A significant amount of TSP money is invested in our TSP International missionaries including Robert and Judy Bryan (France), Dennis and Carol Teague (France), Steve and Lori Torrison (Panama), Paul and Chrissy Collins (Panama), Kimberly Johnson (Brazil), Rusty and Brenda Carney (Japan), Mike and Deleen (last name withheld intentionally) (Creative Access), and Damon and Kim (last name withheld intentionally) (Creative Access) and we commend them all for a job well done. Only eternity will reveal how many souls have been saved and what the influence of Oklahoma Free Will Baptists and our International Missionaries have been.

We are encouraged by the continued support of our churches but are concerned about those who still have not jumped on board to support TSP. If every Oklahoma FWB Church would put TSP in their budget, we could accomplish so much more. Thanks so much for the financial support, encouragement and prayers. Together we can make a difference.

(1) ORGANIZATIONAL AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization – The Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists Board of Church Extension, Missions and Evangelism (the Mission Board) is an auxiliary function of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists. This Board was created to assist in the establishment of Free Will Baptist churches in the State of Oklahoma and provide mission work around the world from donations received in Oklahoma. The Mission Board does not combine their financial statements with those of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists, due to the opinion that meaningful information would not result from presenting combined financial statements.

The Mission Board receives a percentage of the cooperative giving program sponsored by the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Basis of Accounting – The financial statements of the Mission Board have been prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles. Modifications to the cash basis of accounting included recording depreciation on property and equipment and presenting investments at fair value. Revenue is recorded when received rather than when earned and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred.

<u>Investments</u> – The Mission Board carries investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities at their fair values in the statement of assets, liabilities and net assets. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets in the accompanying statements of receipts, expenditures and other changes in net assets.

<u>Property and Equipment</u> – Property and equipment are recorded at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the related assets. Expenditures for repairs and maintenance are charged to operations when incurred while major improvements and renewals are capitalized.

The following useful lives were used to calculate depreciation:

Automobiles 5 years Furniture, Fixtures & Equipment 5 years

<u>Income Taxes</u> - The Mission Board is a not-for-profit organization associated with the Free Will Baptist religious denomination and is exempt from federal and state income taxation. Therefore, no provision has been made for income taxes in the accompanying financial statements.

Estimates – Management uses estimates and assumptions in preparing financial statements. Those estimates and assumptions affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, and the reported revenues and expenses. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

<u>Basis of Presentation</u> - Net assets and revenues, gains and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions as follows:

- Unrestricted net assets Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations.
- Temporarily restricted net assets Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that can be fulfilled by actions of the Board pursuant to those stipulations or that expire by the passage of time.
- Permanently restricted net assets Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that they be maintained permanently by the Board. Generally, the donors of such assets permit the Board to use all or part of the income earned on the assets.

(2) - INVESTMENTS AND BOARD DESIGNATED NET ASSETS

During the year ended December 31, 2003, the board designated funds for the future purchase of land by the Mission Board establishing new churches. These designated funds and their earnings are held and managed by a financial institution. The balance of these investments funds as of December 31, 2009 and December 31, 2008 was \$152,364 and \$121,204, respectively.

These investments are stated at fair value and consist of mutual funds, as follows:

(3) - ENDOWMENT TRUST

Funds of \$1,082 are on deposit with the National Free Will Baptist Association as a permanent endowment trust for future use of the Board. The earnings of this endowment trust are used to support the expenses and costs for missionaries.

(4) - INVESTMENT TRUST

The Investment Trust consists of restricted funds held for future purchases of land for newly established churches and is currently on deposit with the National Free Will Baptist Home Missions. The Trust beginning and ending balances were \$104 and \$100,108, respectfully. During the year, \$4 was earned on this account. Additionally, in August 2009, the South Grand River Association remitted \$100,000 to the Mission for investment purposes. This amount was invested in the Investment Trust account and it was agreed that the interest earned on this account was to be split 50/50 with the South Grand River Association.

(5) - OTHER ASSETS

Other Assets consist of funds loaned to mission churches

In 2007, \$167,000 was loaned to a mission church in Sugar Land, TX. In 2009, an additional \$65,000 was loaned to the mission church in Sugar Land, TX. The balance of these loans totals \$232,000.

In 2008, \$266,213 was loaned to a mission church in Grove, OK. These loans are to be repaid in 5 years.

During this time, no interest is accrued and no payment is expected on the loans.

(6) - RELATED PARTY TRANSACTION

During the years ending December 31, 2009 and 2008, the Mission Board rented operating space from the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists. The rent agreement is on a month to month basis therefore, there are no future lease obligations. Total rent paid during the fiscal years 2009 and 2008 was \$1,925 and \$2,275 respectively.

OKLAHOMA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS' CHRISTIAN EDUCATION BOARD NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS JUNE 30, 2010 AND 2009

(1) ORGANIZATIONAL AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization - The Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists Christian Education Board (the Board) is an auxiliary function of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists. This Board was created to assist in the programs for Christian Education. The Christian Education Board does not combine their financial statements with those of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists, due to the opinion that meaningful information would not result from presenting combined financial statements.

The Christian Education Board receives a percentage of the cooperative giving program sponsored by the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.

<u>Basis of Accounting</u> – The financial statements of the Christian Education Board have been prepared on the modified cash basis of accounting, which is a comprehensive basis of accounting other than generally accepted accounting principles. Modifications to the cash basis of accounting included recording depreciation on property and equipment. Revenue is recorded when received rather than when earned and expenses are recorded when paid rather than when the obligation is incurred.

<u>Property and Equipment</u> – Property and equipment are recorded at cost. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the related assets, which is 5 to 10 years. Expenditures for repairs and maintenance are charged to operations when incurred while major improvements and renewals are capitalized.

<u>Income Taxes</u> – The Christian Education Board is a not-for-profit organization associated with the Free Will Baptist religious denomination and is exempt from federal and state income taxation. Therefore, no provision has been made for income taxes in the accompanying financial statements.

Estimates – Management uses estimates and assumptions in preparing financial statements. Those estimates and assumptions affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, and the reported revenues and expenses. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(1) ORGANIZATIONAL AND SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (con't)

<u>Basis of Presentation</u> – Net assets and revenues, gains and losses are classified based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions as follows:

- Unrestricted net assets Net assets that are not subject to donor-imposed stipulations.
- Temporarily restricted net assets -- Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that can be fulfilled by actions of the Board pursuant to those stipulations or that expire by the passage of time.
- Permanently restricted net assets Net assets subject to donor-imposed stipulations that they be maintained permanently by the Board. Generally, the donors of such assets permit the Board to use all or part of the income earned on the assets.

STATE HISTORICAL COMMISSION REPORT

GREETINGS TO:

OFFICERS, DELEGATES, AND FRIENDS CONVENED FOR THE 102nd SESSION OF THE STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS AT HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, OCTOBER 11-13, 2010.

The concern of the Commission this year has been to promote the sale of the 100 year history published last year. Because of a publishing error at Randall House, only 875 copies of the yearbook were received. Rusty Harrison, State Bookstore manager, reports that the State Executive Department agreed to make a loan to pay for the books when they were received. Payments totaling \$952.60 have been made on the loan and a balance of \$1669.66 is in the cash account with a balance of \$12,900.00 remaining on the loan to be paid off as money is received through the sale of the remaining books. Of the 600 history books in stock, 230 are expected to go to the churches that send in \$25.00 for an extra year of the National Association Fund fee in 2011. That will leave an anticipated balance of 370 in stock to be sold to pay off the loan in full.

The price of the history book is \$34.95. Every Free Will Baptist family in Oklahoma should have one on their front room coffee table. The Commission appreciates the help of the State Book store and manager Rusty Harrison. Also a special word of appreciation is given to Bro. Mike Wade, Executive Secretary, and Sheri Jenson, his office secretary.

The committee has spent many hours in writing and preparing the manuscript for this once in a life time publication. Thanks to all those who have contributed by sending pictures and providing information to be used. The books and material available in the Archives Room at Hillsdale College have proven invaluable for this project. Please continue to send historical documents and materials to be placed in this safe storage space for future generations to use. You are invited to stop by the Learning Center building while on campus and find out more about this valuable place to keep our church history.

Report of the President September 2010

Hillsdale finished last year with an unduplicated headcount of over 270 students, which is slightly down from the previous year. The initial census of students for the 2010-2011 college year is up in two areas: there are more full-time students, plus both dorm and apartment occupancy is 100% (the apartments have a waiting list). Freshmen enrollment is down slightly from last year. The numbers for the student categories of continuing, returning, and transfer students are up from last fall.

There are over 45 Christian Ministry majors, plus several ministry students scattered through the Arts & Science majors. Ken and Judy Bailey are serving as our Missionaries in Residence this year, while they are on furlough from Japan. Missions continues to be a prominent theme in the campus culture of Hillsdale. The current faculty, not just missions instructors, have logged over 80 years of experience on fields around the world. During this past summer break Hillsdale faculty, staff, and students participated in mission trips to Brazil, Canada, Haiti, Japan, Philippines, and Uganda. It is hoped that we can share Denny Kuhn with the Russian seminary during this academic year. Denny's fellow instructors will cover his classes in addition to each one's own teaching load, but Denny will need financial support for the trip.

The Graduate Dean, Mark Braisher, has arranged a plan to provide Logos Bible Software and a library of nearly 2,000 e-books to our new masters' students. The faculty is developing new online courses each semester and the program will be delivered completely online.

Tornado Damage

On May 10th history was made in Oklahoma when more than 20 tornados tore across the state. One, with winds near 150 miles per hour, blew into Hillsdale and passed over the middle of the campus (a video taken by a student on his phone is posted on our web site: www.hc.edu). Two Hillsdale students traveling on Interstate 40 took shelter in the Love's at Choctaw Road. The students are fine, but the car and the Love's Store were totaled.

For natives it was just another round of May weather. The result is that there was a great deal of damage to buildings and equipment, especially the roofs and air conditioners. The most common question I have been asked is, "Do you have insurance?" I am glad to say, yes, we pay tens of thousands in premiums every year. The most pressing repairs have been made and the first installment from the insurance company has been deposited in savings to assure replacements of roofs, air conditioners, and other equipment. I am praying that we can report the final resolution of all pending repairs by our fall meeting.

Report of the President

The Never Ending Needs of Hillsdale

I recently had breakfast with two of our veteran pastors; both made significant investment in the founding of Hillsdale and served on the faculty in the early years. We noted the great sacrifice of the employees that still is taking place today and the sweat equity that has allowed the College to survive. One paused and said, "it takes nearly a hundred years to get enough together to really be strong."

In Higher Education, the past does not guarantee the future. Over the summer Nebraska's Dana College announced that after decades of building a solid reputation in Higher Education, she would not reopen for this fall. The demise of Dana and recent financial disasters at Birmingham-Southern College remind us that success is not guaranteed. Numerous faith based colleges have closed during these difficult economic days.

We celebrated the Golden Anniversary of Hillsdale last year and remain grateful for God's provision over the years. Over the last 21 years I have seen God's miracles on behalf of Hillsdale. Without exception, God has used one of His people to provide the needs. I am praying that a multitude will see their place in God's stewardship plan for the Kingdom, a plan that includes Hillsdale.

A common thread, in the annual reports to this association, is an appeal for sufficient finances to operate the college at an appropriate level. I am asking each person and church to examine their giving to Hillsdale. If you are not giving monthly, please start. If you are giving, ask your church for a greater commitment. The State Association voted many years ago that each church give at least 5% of its budget to Hillsdale.

The needs of the College have not diminished over the years. The regulations, requirements, and expectations continue to mount. To underwrite the real needs of Hillsdale our daily gifts need to approach \$4,000 in the near future. To put it plainly our current gift income is approximately \$3,500 a day, but we need an additional \$500 per day to insure summer operations, make repairs, and provide for future remodels and replacement of existing facilities.

Hillsdale has been equipping men and women to make a difference for Christ in the Church and community for over 50 years and with God's help we can continue to fulfill our mission.

THE FREE WILL BAPTIST MASTER'S MEN State of Oklahoma

CONSTITUTION

The executive committee shall consist of the elected officers of this Section 1. organization and they shall serve as the program committee for each annual convention.

Section 2. Ex-officio members of the executive committee shall be the presidents of the district associations of Master's Men, presidents of any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, and the State Executive Director of the State Association of Free Will Baptists.

ARTICLE V - MEETINGS

This organization shall meet annually at 7:30 p.m. on Monday night before the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists convenes.

ARTICLE VI - AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended by a two-thirds vote of any regular meeting. **BY-LAWS**

VOTING RIGHTS

Section 1. Every member of each affiliated district association, or any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district, is eligible to vote on all questions and matters that might come before the Free Will Baptist Master's Men, State of Oklahoma.

COMMITTEES

Section 2. The executive committee shall transact all routine business and shall act for the organization in the interim between meetings.

Section 3. The executive committee shall meet at the call of the president. Section 4. A nominating committee, for the annual election of officers, shall be composed of the presidents of each district association, and the president of any local chapter where there is only one chapter in the district.

Section 5. The president shall appoint all other committees, subject to the approval of

the body.

FINANCE

Section 6. This organization shall be financed on the basis of offerings, dues and assessments.

OUORUM

Section 7. One-tenth of the members of this organization shall constitute a quorum at any regular meeting.

AMENDMENTS

Section 8. These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

MINISTER'S CONFERENCE CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE I

The Minister's Conference shall be called the Oklahoma State Free Will Baptist Minister's Conference, and shall be composed of ordained Free Will Baptist Ministers who are regular members of some orthodox Free Will Baptist Church in the State of Oklahoma.

ARTICLE II

The purpose of this conference is for preaching, fellowship and encouragement. ARTICLE III

This conference shall meet on Tuesday morning at the State Association.

ARTICLE IV

The program and speakers for this conference shall be planned and coordinated by the Executive Board of the State Association.

AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS OF HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC.

These Amended and Restated Bylaws were duly adopted by the Board of Trustees, in its regular meeting held on May 5, 1994, pursuant to Section VII of the original Bylaws, and amend in their entirety the original Bylaws which were heretofore adopted.

ARTICLE I POWERS OF TRUSTEES

Section 1.

The Board of Trustees shall have the power to manage the property and business of the Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc. (referred to in this and the following articles as the "College") and shall have the power to carry out any other functions which are permitted by the Charter, or these Bylaws, except insofar as such powers may be limited by law. These powers shall include but shall not be limited to the following:

- Appoint or remove the President and/or other officers of the College in accordance with these Bylaws;
- '(ii) Approve degrees in courses upon recommendations of the faculty;
- (iii) Approve the awarding of honorary degrees upon recommendation of any of the following: Faculty, President, or appropriate Board committee;
- (iv) Establish and review the educational programs of the College after review by the Board Committee on Academic Affairs, or by special committees of review set up by the President and Chairman of the Board in a financial emergency situation;
- (v) Establish annually the budget of the College, which shall be submitted to it upon recommendation of the Board Business Affairs Committee;
- (vi) Authorize the construction of new buildings and major renovations of existing buildings;
- (vii) Authorize the sale and purchase of land, buildings or major equipment for the use of the College;
- (viii) Institute and promote the major fund-raising efforts of the College;
 - (ix) Authorize any changes in tuition and fees within the College;
 - Authorize officers or agents of the College to accept gifts for the College;
- (xi) Authorize the incurring of debts by the College and securing thereof by mortgage and pledge of the real, personal, tangible and/or intangible property:
- (xii) Any other duties or responsibilities which obtain to it under the Charter of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc.

Section 2.

The Board of Trustees of the College shall not launch any expansion project, major expenditure of capital funds, creation of debt for capital needs, or any significant change in usual operations except upon prior authority given by the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists or the Executive Board thereof.

ARTICLE II MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

Section 1.

The Board of Trustees of the College shall consist of seventeen (17) members. Ten (10) of the members shall be elected by the delegates to the annual convention of The Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists, each of which shall serve for a term of five (5) years and until his/her successor is duly elected and qualified. These members shall serve staggering terms such that two (2) members shall be elected at each annual convention of The Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists. The remaining seven (7) members shall be elected by the following State Associations of Free Will Baptists and shall serve for such terms as may be established by their respective state associations, to wit: Arkansas, two (2) members; Missouri, three (3) members; and Texas, two (2) members.

Section 2.

Vacancies of the Board of Trustees shall occur through resignation, ceasing to be a resident of the state by which he/she is elected, death of a trustee, or as the result of his/her inability or failure to act. Should a vacancy on the Board of Trustees occur during the interval between the annual sessions of the State Association by which the trustee has been elected, the vacancy may be filled at the next annual session of such State Association, by the Executive Board of such State Association, or as may be otherwise prescribed or directed by such State Association.

In the event any member misses two (2) consecutive meetings of the Board of Trustees without giving advance notification to the office of the President of the College, the member shall be considered as having resigned.

Section 3.

No person shall be eligible for election prior to attaining the age of twenty-one (21) years.

Section 4.

Any member of the Board of Trustees may be removed from office, for cause, by action of the State Association, or Executive Board thereof, which elected such member.

ARTICLEIII OFFICERS OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES AND HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC.

Section 1.

The officers of the Board of Trustees shall consist of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, Vice-Chairman, Secretary, and Assistant Secretary, all of whom shall be elected annually by the Board of Trustees. For the purpose of executing legal documents in compliance with Oklahoma Law, the office of Chairman of the Board of Trustees shall be synonymous with the office of President of the Corporation, Vice Chairman with the office of Vice President of the Corporation, and Secretary with the office of Secretary of the Corporation, and Assistant Secretary with the office of Assistant Secretary of the Corporation.

Section 2.

All officers of the Board of Trustees shall hold office as such officer for a period of one year, or until their successors are duly elected and qualified.

Section 3.

The President of the College shall be an ex officio member of the Board without power to vote and shall not be counted as a member of the Board, or any committee on which he/she may serve, for any purpose. The Vice President of Business Affairs of the College shall serve as Treasurer of the Corporation and as such shall be an ex officio member of the Board without power to vote and shall not be counted a member of the Board or any committee on which he may serve for any purpose.

Section 4.

The Board may appoint one or more vice chairmen, assistant secretaries, and such other officers as may be deemed necessary for the proper management of the affairs of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc.

Section 5.

All officers of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc. shall hold office at the discretion of the Board of Trustees and shall be subject to removal by affirmative vote of a majority of the entire membership of the Board of Trustees, without prejudice to any contract rights such officer may have against the College.

ARTICLEIV POWERS AND DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1.

The Chairman of the Board of Trustees shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Trustees, sign all deeds, contracts, bonds, mortgages, and other papers evidencing the official acts of the Board of Trustees where the signature of a presiding officer is required by these Bylaws or by custom or practice, and he/she shall call all special meetings of the Board of Trustees, give notice of the time and place of all meetings of the Board of Trustees as herein provided, appoint all committees and generally exercise such authority as is

usually exercised by a chairman or president of the Board of Trustees of a non-profit corporation. He/She shall also perform any other and further duties as may be assigned to the Chairman by the Board of Trustees.

Section 2.

The Vice Chairman of the Board of Trustees shall perform all the duties of the office of Chairman of the Board of Trustees in the absence of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, or as a result of the inability of the Chairman of the Board of Trustees to act because of sickness, misfortune, casualty, or emergency absence.

Section 3.

The Secretary of the Board of Trustees shall keep minutes of the meetings of the Board, issue, or cause to be issued, notices of meetings under the direction of the Chairman, have charge of the seal of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc. and affix attest the same to all instruments which may require that the corporate seal be affixed; and shall perform the duties usually performed by a secretary of the Board of Trustees of a non-profit corporation. He/She shall also perform any other duties which may be assigned to the Secretary by the Board of Trustees.

Section 4.

The Secretary of the Board of Trustees, with the approval of the Board of Trustees and the President of the College, may authorize an officer of the College and/or a person other than the Secretary of the Board of Trustees to affix the corporate seal to any diploma, transcript, or other instrument having to do with the administration of the affairs of the College, and to exercise the administration of the affairs of the College, and to exercise the same authority with regard to the affairing of the corporate seal to such instrument as may be exercised by the Secretary of the Board of Trustees.

Section 5.

The Assistant Secretary shall perform all the duties of the Secretary of the Board of Trustees in the absence of the Secretary, or in the event of the inability of the Secretary to attend a meeting of the Board of Trustees, or as a result of the inability of the Secretary to act because of sickness, misfortune, casualty, or emergency.

Section 6.

The Treasurer shall be the Chief Financial Officer of the College and shall be, as Treasurer, an ex officio member of the Board of Trustees without power to vote and shall not be counted as a member of the Board. He/She shall have the duty to keep, or cause to be kept, full and accurate accounts of all receipts and disbursements and to follow the directives of the Trustees, the President of the College and the Business Affairs Committee respecting funds, property, and accounts of the College. He/She shall be responsible for the preparation of any corporate financial reports as may be required by departments of federal or state government. The Treasurer shall, in the name of the College, give receipts for monies or property as shall be required, deposit funds in accordance with resolution and direction of the Business Affairs Committee or the Board of Trustees, and safeguard the money of the College. He/She shall not pay out any money except by direction of the Board of Trustees or under such regulations or with such approval as the Business Affairs

Committee may prescribe. He/She shall cooperate with any independent auditors or certified public accountants retained by the Board of Trustees for the purpose of conducting audits of the accounts of the College, and shall make reports at meetings of the Board of Trustees or the Business Affairs Committee with respect to the financial condition of the College at such time and in such form as the Board or the Committee may require. The Treasurer shall give a bond to the College to faithfully perform the duties of his/her office, and to account for all monies and other matters and things which may come into his/her hands and possession by virtue of said office, in such amount as the Business Affairs Committee shall direct.

ARTICLE V POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE COLLEGE

Section 1.

The affairs of the College shall be administered by the President of the College, who shall be elected by the Board of Trustees and hold office at the pleasure of the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees shall adopt a system of periodic evaluations for the purpose of evaluating the performance of the President and to, among other things, set the salary and compensation for the President for a term acceptable to the Board and the President.

Section 2.

The President of the College shall be the Chief Executive and Operational Officer of the College and the official adviser to, and executive agent of, the Board of Trustees and its Executive Committee. He/She shall, as educational and administrative head of the College, exercise a general superintendence over all the affairs of the institution, and bring such matters to the attention of the Board as are appropriate to keep the Board fully informed to meet its policy-making responsibilities. He/She shall have power, on behalf of the Trustees, to perform all acts and execute all documents to make effective the actions of the Board or its Executive Committee. Except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, he/she shall be an ex officio member of all committees of the Board without power to vote.

Section 3.

The President of the College shall have the power and authority to appoint officers to assist him/her in the administration of the affairs of the College, including such officers as Vice Presidents, Deans, Directors, Treasurers, Registrars, and their assistants. The officers so appointed by the President of the College shall hold office for such periods of time as the President determines, and the tenure of office shall be subject to the will of the President and the contractual employment procedures of the Administrative and Staff Handbook then in force.

Section 4.

The members of the faculty of the College shall be recommended by the President of the College and elected by the Board of Trustees annually, and the members of the faculty, when their election has been confirmed by the Board of Trustees, shall hold office subject to the rules of the existing contractual employment which have been approved by the Board of Trustees in the Faculty Handbook then in force. Nominations of faculty members, however, may be made by the President of the College and confirmed by the Board of Trustees at any

regular or special meeting.

Section 5.

In the event the office of President of the College becomes vacant, a Presidential Search Committee of three trustees shall be elected at a meeting of the Board prior to which two weeks notice has been given concerning this needed action. The committee, at least two of whom shall have at least four (4) years of consecutive service, shall be elected by open nomination from the floor. If the Chairman of the Board of Trustees is not one of the three trustees elected, he/she shall join the Presidential Search Committee as a voting member.

The Search Committee shall notify, in writing, all members of the Board of Trustees of the dates and times of the on-campus visit of any prospective candidates. A resume of the candidate shall accompany the notification. Members of the Board of Trustees shall have opportunity to participate in the on-campus visit. Before the Search Committee presents a candidate for election, an informal meeting of the candidate and the Board of Trustees shall be held.

ARTICLE VI MEETINGS

Section 1.

The regular meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be held at the campus of the college in Moore, Oklahoma. The Board of Trustees shall hold at least two meetings each year and such other special meetings as may be called by the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, or, in his absence from the state of Oklahoma, by the Vice-Chairman of the Board of Trustees. The first meeting shall be held in September or October, on a date selected by the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, at which time the Board of Trustees shall receive reports, and conduct any and all other business which it may desire to consider concerning the affairs of the College or its own affairs. The second meeting shall be held by a date selected by the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, at which time the Board of Trustees shall orient newly-elected trustees, receive reports. elect the faculty of the College, adopt an annual budget, receive reports, and consider any and all other business which the Board of Trustees may desire to transact. The dates of regular meetings and of all special meetings and the hour and place thereof shall be selected by the Chairman of the Board of Trustees, and notice thereof shall be mailed to each trustee not less than seven days before the meeting. Notice of the time and place of all special meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be mailed to each trustee in such time and manner as the Chairman of the Board of Trustees deems reasonable and proper, except as hereinafter provided for amendment to the Bylaws. Notice of special meetings shall include a brief summary of the purpose of the meeting and the business expected to come before it.

Section 2.

The presence of at least fifty percent of the Board of Trustees shall constitute a quorum and be sufficient to enable the Board of Trustees to pass any resolution or motion, receive reports or recommendations, and transact any business which may properly come before it.

Section 3.

The meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be in accordance with and governed by parliamentary law, insofar as is practicable, as set forth in Robert's Rules of Order.

Section 4.

No notice of the time, place, or purpose of any meeting of the Board of Trustees, except for amendment of the Bylaws, whether prescribed by law, by the Charter of the Bylaws, need be given to any member of the Board who attends in person, or who in writing, executed and filed with the records of the meeting either before or after the holding thereof, waives such notice.

ARTICLE VII ACTION WITHOUT FORMAL MEETING

Section 1.

Any action required or permitted to be taken by the Board of Trustees or by any committee thereof may be taken without a formal meeting. Meetings may be conducted by mail, telegram, cable, teleconference, or in any other way the Trustees shall decide. However, a written consent setting forth the action so taken and signed by at least two-thirds of the members of the Board or of a committee, as the case may be, must be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board or of the committee.

ARTICLE VIII COMMITTEES

Section 1.

There may be special or ad hoc committees as the Board of Trustees may from time to time establish for the discharge of particular duties.

Section 2.

There shall be the standing committees specified in this Article. Members and chairmen of standing committees shall be appointed by the Chairman of the Board after consultation with the President annually at or following, the November or December meeting of the Board of Trustees. Except as provided in these Bylaws, the Chairman of the Board and the President of the College shall be ex officio members of all standing committees, and each standing committee shall include at least three additional Trustees. Except where otherwise provided in this Article, additional ex officio members, including persons who are not on the Board of Trustees, may be enlisted as resource persons. However, the chairman of each standing committee and a majority of its members shall be Trustees.

Section 3.

The Board of Trustees may at any time discontinue any of its standing committees for such time as may be determined, and the duties of any committee so discontinued shall be performed during such discontinuance by the Executive Committee.

Section 4.

The chairman of any committee, with the consent of the Chairman of the Board, may request the President of the College to appoint an administrative officer of the College or a member of the administrative staff to serve as a liaison between the committee and the office of the President. Such liaison person shall assist the committee in the carrying out of its duties.

Section 5.

Except as provided in this section, all standing committees shall meet at least two times annually.

Section 6.

The Board of Trustees shall be organized in the following committees:

- (i) The Executive Committee. The Executive Committee shall consist of the Chairman, Vice Chairman, and Secretary of the Board. The presence of at least 50 percent of the members of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum. It shall be the duty of the Executive Committee to advise with the President of the College concerning affairs of the College when the Board of Trustees is not in session, to make recommendations to the Board of Trustees, and to perform such duties as may be referred to it by the Board of Trustees. The Executive Committee shall at all times be subject to and governed by the Board of Trustees of the College.
- (ii) Administrative Committees. There shall be four standing administrative committees of the Board: Academic Affairs Committee, Business Affairs Committee, Development Committee, and Student Affairs Committee. The committees and their chairmen shall be appointed by the Chairman of the Board in consultation with the President of the College. The Administrative Committees shall receive reports from administrative officers and consider policies and recommendations regulating the life and function of the College.
- (iii) Academic Affairs Committee. The Academic Affairs Committee shall be composed of at least three Board of Trustee members. It shall, in cooperation with the President and Vice President of Academic Affairs, study and appraise the quality of the academic program, measure the program relative to other comparable institutions in terms of teaching load, class size, student-faculty ratios, instructional expenditures, research programs, and other relevant factors; formulate desirable short and long range enrollment goals, advise the Business Affairs Committee on the specifications and requirements for financing the academic programs, recommend salary, pension, and other personnel policies concerning the academic and faculty personnel, review matters affecting the faculty of the College, consider proposals on such matters, and

report and make a recommendation thereon to the Board of Trustees as may be required.

- (iv) Business Affairs Committee. The Business Affairs Committee shall be composed of at least three Board of Trustees members. It shall review annual operating and capital budgets prepared and presented under the direction of the President and Vice President of Business Affairs, and shall make recommendations with respect thereto to the Board of Trustees. It shall review major financial transactions not provided for in the budget and submit proposed variances with recommendations to the Board of Trustees or Executive Committee. The Vice President of Business Affairs shall be an ex officio member of the Business Affairs Committee, without power to vote, and shall not be counted as a member of the Committee for any purpose.
- (v) Student Affairs Committee. The Student Affairs Committee shall be composed of at least three Board of Trustee members. It shall review matters affecting students of the College, other than those relating to the academic program, consider proposals on such matters, and report and make recommendations thereon to the Board of Trustees as may be required.
- (vi) Development Committee. The Development Committee shall be composed of at least three Board of Trustee members. It shall review and recommend student recruitment, fund-raising and public relations programs, and report to the Business Affairs Committee on recruitment and fund-raising progress and estimates of income to be received therefrom. It shall report on its activities at meetings of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLEIX INDEMNIFICATION

Each Trustee and Officer of the College shall be indemnified by it against all expenses actually and necessarily incurred by such Trustee or Officer in connection with the defense of any action, suit, or proceeding to which he/she has been made a party by reason of being or having been such Trustee or Officer except in relation to matters as to which such Trustee or Officer shall be adjudicated in such action, suit, or proceeding to be liable for gross negligence or willful misconduct in the performance of duty.

ARTICLEX CONFLICTS OF INTERESTS

A Trustee shall be considered to have a conflict of interest if (a) such Trustee has existing or potential financial or other interests which impair or might reasonably appear to impair such members' independent, unbiased judgment in the discharge of his/her responsibilities to the College, or (b) such Trustee is aware that a member of his/her family (which for purposes of this paragraph shall be a spouse, parents, siblings, children, and any other relative if the latter resides in the same household as the Trustee), or any organization in which such Trustee (or member of his/her family) is an officer, director, employee, member, partner,

trustee, or controlling stockholder, has such existing or potential financial or other interests. All Trustees shall disclose to the Board any possible conflict of interest at the earliest practicable time. No Trustee shall vote on any matter under consideration at the Board or committee meeting, in which such Trustee has a conflict of interest. The minutes of such meeting shall reflect that a disclosure was made and that the Trustee having a conflict of interest abstained from voting. Any Trustee who is uncertain whether he/she has a conflict of interest in any matter may request the Board or committee to determine whether a conflict of interest exists, and the Board or committee shall resolve the question by majority vote.

ARTICLEXI ADMINISTRATION OF PROPERTY

Section 1. Contracts

The Board of Trustees may authorize any officer or agent of the College to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of or on behalf of the College, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

Section 2. Checks, Drafts, etc.

All checks, drafts, or other orders for the payment of money, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the College shall be signed by such officer or agent of the College and in such matter as shall from time to time be determined by the Board of Trustees.

Section 3. Bonding

The Board of Trustees may require all officers, agents, or employees charged with responsibility for the custody of any of the funds of the College to give bonds in the amounts the Board of Trustees deems appropriate, the cost thereof to be paid by the College.

Section 4. Deposits

All funds of the College shall be deposited to the credit of the College in such banks, trust companies, or other depositories as the Board of Trustees may from time to time select or approve.

Section 5. Gifts

The Board of Trustees may accept, on behalf of the College, any contribution, gift, bequest, or device for the general purpose or for any special purpose of the College, and may delegate this authority to appropriate corporate and/or administrative officers. These officers shall make regular reports to the Board of Trustees of all gifts accepted by them in the name of the College.

Section 6. Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the College shall begin the first day of July and end the last day of June in each year.

ARTICLE IX BYLAW AMENDMENT

Section 1.

These Bylaws may be amended by the Board of Trustees at any meeting, regular or special, by a vote to amend constituting two-thirds of the members present at such a meeting, provided that the notice calling the Board meeting shall announce that amendments to the Bylaws will be voted upon and proposed amendments accompany the notice. Such notice must be mailed at least thirty (30) days prior to such meeting to each Trustee at his/her usual place of residence. Any such change shall be subject to The Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists.

Section 2.

These Bylaws shall stand in the place and stead of, and shall be substituted for all other and former Bylaws of the Board of Trustees of the College which have heretofore been adopted.

Section 3.

Prior to each meeting during the month of February of the Board of Trustees, the Executive Committee shall review these Bylaws and suggest any necessary changes thereto.

The within and foregoing Amended and Restated Bylaws of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc. have been duly adopted by the Board of Trustees on this 5th day of May, 1994.

ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF THE HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC.

Know all men by these presents, that, we whose names are hereunto subscribed, do hereby associate ourselves together for the purpose of forming a corporation under the provisions of the corporation laws of the State of Oklahoma, and for that purpose state:

ARTICLE ONE

The name of this corporation shall be HILLSDALE FREE WILL BAPTIST COLLEGE, INC.

ARTICLETWO

The purpose of this corporation shall be the creation, establishment and maintenance of a college and institution of higher learning devoted to the promotion and impartation of higher learning, Christian education and such other education, instruction, learning, training and research as may be deemed essential for the cause of Christ and to that end prescribe courses of study and grant degrees. The doctrinal and theological position of this institution shall be that of the sponsoring denomination, Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and the treatise of the National Association of Free Will Baptists as endorsed by the state body, and in connection therewith, in accordance with the stipulation of the Constitution and By-laws of the State Association of Free Will Baptists, Inc.

- (a.) To prescribe courses of study for both resident and correspondence students, which shall include general education in the arts, Christian Ministries of Service and Biblical studies for wisdom; said courses to be taught in both a Junior College Division and a Bible College Division, and to award degrees, either graduate or postgraduate, to those persons satisfactorily completing the prescribed courses of study and to grant such other literary honors, including honorary degrees, as shall be deemed advisable.
- (b.) To charge and collect tuition as determined by the Board of Trustees and to create scholarships.
- (c.) To employ professors, instructors and other subordinate employees as may be necessary for the proper conduct of the college under the direction and control of the President of the College, with the advice and consent of the majority of the Board of Trustees.
- (d.) To institute and carry on missions and commissions for missionary purposes and investigations.
- (e.) To publish and distribute such pamphlets, literature or books as may be required in the conduct of such work and the general promotion of the College.
- (f.) To sue and be sued in its corporate name and to enter into contracts of every type and nature.
- (g.) To solicit support, receive, collect, hold and receive by gift or bequest personal property in any amount, money or other thing of value; to purchase real estate, to receive real estate that may be given, or devised to the college for achieving the legitimate ends of the college and to sell or mortgage the same as the need arise.
- (h.) To borrow money in payment of property for erecting buildings and making improvements and for any other purpose germane to the objectives and purposes of the college.
- (I.) To issue notes, bonds, debentures and other evidences of indebtedness and execute mortgages, liens, and other incumbrance upon the property of the corporation, real or otherwise, to secure the payment of any such evidences of indebtedness.
- (j.) To transact any and all business connected with said College as may be necessary to achieve the purposes of said College.
- (k.) To obtain under Internal Revenue Laws of the United States and of the Revenue Laws of the State of Oklahoma exemption from exemption from income property

and other forms of taxation.

ARTICLE THREE

The location of this property shall be in Moore, Oklahoma.

ARTICLEFOUR

The duration of this corporation shall be perpetual.

ARTICLE FIVE

The general control of this corporation shall be vested in a Board of Trustees consisting of seventeen (17) members, ten (10) of which shall be elected by the delegates to the annual Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists--each of which shall serve for a term of five (5) years, and until his successor is elected and qualified. Two members shall be elected at each annual sitting of the State Association for the expiring five year term and vacancies that occur on the board. The representatives of the other supporting states shall be as follows: Missouri--three (3) members, Arkansas--two (2) members, and Texas--two (2) members, who shall be elected by the delegates of their representative state association, each to serve for a term designated by the states they represent.

The distribution for members of this board shall be reevaluated every five years beginning in 1999. A committee for this purpose shall be appointed each previous year, beginning in 1998.

ARTICLESIX

An executive committee consisting of the Chairman, Vice Chairman, and Secretary of the Board of Trustees shall possess all powers of the Board of Trustees between the stated meetings of the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLESEVEN

All contracts for building construction shall be let only to persons or corporations posting a valid performance bond and recording the same in the office of the County Clerk of Cleveland County, Oklahoma.

SECTION IX AMENDMENTS

This charter may be hereafter amended subject to the provisions contained herein and the laws of the State of Oklahoma. It is provided, however, that the Trustees of the College shall not propose or apply for any amendment which has not been previously authorized by an act of the Oklahoma State Association.

OKLAHOMA WOMEN ACTIVE FOR CHRIST CONSTITUTION ARTICLE I

NAME

This organization shall be known as the Oklahoma Women Active For Christ.

ARTICLE II

PURPOSE

The purpose of this convention shall be to bring the women of each district convention and independent local auxiliary together for fellowship, sharing information, and encouraging one another in the work of the Lord.

ARTICLE III

OFFICERS

The Officers of this convention shall be a president, vice president, secretary, assistant secretary, treasurer, assistant treasurer, and field worker. These shall serve on the state executive committee together with three members elected by the convention. These shall serve for a period of 2 years.

ARTICLE IV

MEMBERSHIP

This convention shall be composed of the officers of the convention together with each member of the district or independent local auxiliary.

ARTICLE V

MEETINGS

The annual meeting shall be held each year on the day preceding the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and at the designated by said Association.

ARTICLE VI

AMENDMENTS

This constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of the convention by a two-thirds vote of members present.

BY-LAWS ARTICLE I

DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 1, President

The President shall preside over all meetings, appoint such committees as may be needed, call the executive committee together when necessary, be ex-officio member of all committees, and serve as chairman of the executive committee, see that reports are made promptly to the national secretary and perform all duties usually pertaining to such an office.

Section 2. Vice President

The vice president shall preside in the absence of the president or by her request and otherwise assist her in the overseeing of the work in general.

Section 3. Secretary

The secretary shall keep an accurate record of all proceedings of the convention and executive committee meetings, preserve all valuable papers and turn same over to her successor in office, and make an annual report to the national secretary on a form available from the WNAC office. She shall compile the districts' slates of officers and addresses immediately after the convention. She shall also send a slate of officers and addresses to the national executive secretary.

The secretary shall also serve as historian keeping an historical record and submitting historical information to the national executive secretary annually.

Section 4, Assistant Secretary

The assistant secretary shall assist the secretary in recording proceedings of convention and executive committee meetings and shall aid the secretary in all her work as needed.

Section 5, Treasurer

The treasurer shall have charge of all funds belonging to this convention and shall pay out same only when authorized by the convention. The treasurer shall keep an accurate account and shall give a written report of all funds

received and disbursed at each annual meeting of the convention. She shall also send a monthly report to the WNAC office (executive secretary treasurer). The treasurer shall secure the services of a certified public accountant (CPA) on an annual basis. The treasurer shall receive an honorarium of \$25.00 per month and an annual honorarium of \$275 per year out of the Retreat Fund.

Section 6. Assistant Treasurer

The assistant treasurer shall assist the treasurer in all her work as needed and shall have the authority to sign checks in the absence of the treasurer or at the request of the treasurer.

Section 7. Field Worker

The field worker shall be responsible for organizing new auxiliaries and for promoting the work of the state and national convention.

ARTICLEII

ELECTIONS

The officers shall be nominated by a nominating committee and shall be elected by acclamation, unless there are other nominations. In case of more than one nominee for any particular office, a vote will be taken on each. All elections shall be held on odd numbered years at the closing business session of the convention.

Section 2. Resolutions Committee

A resolutions committee of five members shall be appointed by the president at the annual convention.

Section 3. Nominating Committee

The nominating committee shall be composed of one member from each district convention and independent local auxiliary. Nominations for this committee shall be submitted with annual reports. The nominating committee shall be elected by the body on even numbered years at the annual convention.

Section 4, Registration Committee

The registration committee, chaired by the vice president, shall be provided by the district convention which is host to state convention.

ARTICLEIII

EXPENSES

Section 1. When performing official duties for the convention, executive committee shall be reimbursed for mileage at the current rate allowable by the IRS. Expenses incurred by executive committee, i.e. telephone calls, postage, stationery, etc., shall be reimbursed by the convention.

Section 2. An amount of \$200.00 shall be paid toward the expense of the state president to attend the WNAC. If the president is unable to attend, \$200.00 shall be paid to the executive committee member appointed by the president to attend the meeting.

Section 3. An amount of \$75.00 shall be paid toward the expense of the president when attending the national retreat or the national leadership conference.

ARTICLEIV

COMMITTEES

Section 1. Executive Committee

The executive committee shall be composed of the seven officers and three members elected by the convention. Seven of these shall compose a quorum. They shall hold meetings for the transaction of business as often as necessary. It shall be the duty of the executive committee to maintain an overseeing of the work at large. They shall act for the convention when necessary. They shall meet with district presidents the night preceding the state auxiliary convention. They will send out a newsletter with expenses paid by state convention.

Section 2, Resolutions Committee

A resolutions committee of five members shall be appointed by the president at the annual convention.

Section 3, Nominating Committee

The nominating committee shall be composed of one member from each district convention and independent local auxiliary. Nominations for this committee shall be submitted with annual reports. The nominating committee shall be elected by the body on even numbered years at the annual convention.

Section 4, Registration Committee

The registration committee, chaired by the vice president, shall be provided by the district convention which is host to state convention.

ARTICLE V

FEES AND REPORTS

Members shall pay dues of \$10.50 per year, with 25 cents remaining in the district, \$10.25 to be forwarded to state where 25 cents shall be retained, and \$10.00 forwarded to WNAC as required for membership fees. It shall be the duty of each body directly affiliated with the state auxiliary convention to send a report of membership to every annual session.

ARTICLE VI

AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of members present at the annual meeting of the Oklahoma Women Active for Christ.

ARTICLEVII

ARTICLE VIII

WNAC DELEGATE

Section 1. Each district convention shall submit one nomination for a State delegate to WNAC with their annual report. This nomination (along with others as needed to make up 15 delegates to WNAC) shall be elected by the body at the annual meeting. It shall be the duty of delegates elected to notify president if they cannot attend WNAC. President shall appoint delegates as needed in absence of regular elected delegates.

Section 2. A National Nominating Committee member shall be elected at the annual convention on odd numbered years and serve for a period of 2 years.

ARTICLES OF FAITH OF STATE ASSOCIATION

- 1. THE BIBLE The Scriptures of the Old and New Testament were given by the inspiration of God, and are our infallible rules of faith and practice.
- 2. GOD There is one living and true God, revealed in nature as the Creator, Preserver and Righteous Governor of the Universe, and in the Scriptures as the Father, Son and Holy Ghost, yet as one God, infinitely wise and good, whom all intelligent creatures are supremely to love, adore and obey.
- 3. CHRIST Christ is God manifest in the flesh: in His divine nature truly God, in His human nature truly man. The mediator between God and man, once crucified, He is now risen and glorified as our ever-present Savior and Lord.
- 4. THE HOLY SPIRIT The Scriptures assigns to the Holy Spirit all the attributes of God. He is the Reprover, Comforter, Guide and Sanctifier of all men.
- 5. THE GOVERNMENT OF GOD God exercises a wise and benevolent providence over all beings and all things by maintaining the constitution and laws of nature. He also performs special acts of Grace, not otherwise provided for as highest welfare of man requires.
- 6. THE SINFULNESS OF MAN Man was created innocent, but by disobedience fell into a state of sin and condemnation. His posterity, therefore inherited a fallen nature of such tendencies that all who come to years of accountability, sin and become guilty before God.
- 7. THE WORK OF CHRIST The Son of God, by His incarnation, life, suffering, death, and resurrection effected for all a redemption from sin that is full and free and is the ground of salvation by faith.
 - 8. THE WORK OF SALVATION The conditions of salvation are:
 - 1. Repentance or sincere sorrow for sin and the hearty renunciations of it.
- 2. Faith or the unreserved committal of one's self to Christ as Savior and Lord, with purpose to love and obey Him in all things. In the exercise of saving faith the soul is renewed by the Holy Spirit; freed from the dominion of sin and becomes a child of God.
 - Continuance in faith and obedience until death.
- 9. ELECTION God determined from the beginning to save all who should comply with the conditions of salvation. Hence by faith in Christ, men become His elect.
- 10. FREEDOM OF WILL The Human will is free and self controlled, having power to yield to the influence of the truth and the Spirit and live, or to resist them and perish.
- 11. SALVATION FREE God desires the salvation of all, the Gospel invites all, the Holy Spirit strives with all, and whosoever will may come and take the water of life freely.
- 12. PERSEVERANCE All believers in Christ, who through grace preserve in holiness to the end of life, have the promise of eternal salvation.
- 13. BACKSLIDING AND APOSTASY A person who has been regenerated or born again and is living in unconfessed, unforgiven sin, is rebellious to the principles of the

Kingdom of God and His righteousness, and therefore is a backslider in a lost condition who must repent and be restored to the right relationship with God or be eternally lost. We recognize, according to Hebrews 6:4-6, that it is possible for a person to get in the condition that he could never return to Christ. This, we believe, is Apostasy; however, we also recognize that a regenerate person can fall into sin, be in a lost condition and still not be an Apostate. This person, through repentance, can be reconciled to God.

- 14. GOSPEL ORDINANCES Baptism, or the immersion of believers in water, and the Lord's Supper, are ordinances to be perpetuated under the Gospel; Feet Washing, an ordinance teaching humility, of universal obligation, and be administered to all true believers.
- 15. TITHING God commanded tithes and offerings in the Old Testament; Jesus Christ endorsed in the Gospel (Matt. 23:23), and the Apostle Paul said, "Upon the first day of the week let every one of you lay by him in store as God hath prospered him." I Cor. 16:2.
- 16. THE CHRISTIAN SABBATH The divine law requires that one day in seven be set apart from the secular employment and amusements for rest, worship, holy works and activities, and for personal communion with God.
- 17. RESURRECTION, JUDGMENT, AND FINAL RETRIBUTION The Scriptures teach the resurrection of all men at the last day. They that have done good will come forth to the resurrection of life, and they that have done evil unto the resurrection of damnation: then the wicked shall "Go away into eternal punishment but the righteous into eternal life."

RULES OF ORDER

- 1. At every sitting of the Association, business shall be opened and concluded by prayer by the Moderator or Whomever he may request.
- 2. Ministers and deacons present are invited to seats, allowed to take part in debates on all subjects, and to vote.
- 3. Those who speak shall rise and address the Moderator. Personal reflections shall be avoided in all debates.
- 4. No motion may be discussed until made and seconded.
- 5. When a motion has been made and seconded, and a member opposes its discussion, the Moderator shall put the question, "Shall it be discussed?" If negative, the question shall not be discussed.
- 6. If any proposition or motion under debate contains two or more points, it shall be divided at the request of any member, and the vote taken separately.
- 7. Motions made and lost shall not be recorded.
- 8. No one shall speak more than twice on the same subject without special leave of the Moderator.
- 9. All questions shall be decided by a majority vote of all Members present.

BY-LAWS OF STATE ASSOCIATION

- 1. The clerk or assistant clerk, or in their absence, the senior minister in years shall call the Association into conference, and if a quorum is present the moderator, or in his absence, the assistant moderator shall take charge; and if neither of them is present the senior minister in years shall act as moderator.
- 2. It shall be the duty of the clerk to enroll the delegates to the Association, who shall present themselves with proper evidence of their rights to seats therein, and those enrolled by the clerk shall compose the Association.
- 3. It shall be the duty of every District belonging to this Association to send a letter to every annual session of this Association reporting in the same; spiritual condition, benevolent work and its statistics. Any District belonging to this Association, which shall fail to report itself for two successive sessions, may be dismissed from the Association by a two thirds yote of all members present.
- 4. Each meeting shall be opened by reading a portion of the Bible and with prayer, and shall be closed with prayer.
- 5. By a two-thirds vote of members present, a ruling of the moderator can be overruled.
- 6. This Association may correspond by messenger or otherwise with other religious bodies.
- 7. This Association shall sit with open doors except when it shall go into a committee of the whole.
- 8. Any person not a member of this Association may be allowed to take part in its discussions by obtaining permission from the moderator.
- 9. It shall be the duty of all the Association to be present at the time appointed for each meeting, and anyone wishing to retire shall first obtain leave of the moderator.
- 10. No person shall be allowed to nominate more than one member of any committee, provided the person nominated be elected.
- 11. The moderator shall not allow discussions when not carried on in a Christian spirit or when he thinks it will cause discord or division.
- 12. Anyone desiring to speak shall rise to his feet and address the moderator by the appellation "Brother Moderator," but shall not speak further until recognized by the moderator.
- 13. No member of this association shall be allowed to speak more than then minutes or twice on the same subject without permission from the moderator.
- 14. This association shall meet annually beginning on Tuesday following the second Sunday in October.
- 15. These By-Laws may be altered or amended at any regular or adjourned session of this Association by a two-thirds vote of the members present.

CONSTITUTION OF STATE ASSOCIATION

PREAMBLE: From long experience, we the members of the Free Will Baptist denomination, being regularly baptized upon a profession of our faith in Jesus Christ, and realizing the necessity of a bond in union and fellowship among us as a church; and to preserve and maintain correspondence and coordination with us, do therefore ordain this Constitution for our better denomination government.

ARTICLEI

NAME:

This organization shall be known as the OKLAHOMA STATE ASSOCIATION OF FREE WILL BAPTISTS.

ARTICLEII

PURPOSE:

The object and purpose of this organization shall be to unify the work of the various bodies composing this State Association, and to devise and execute measures for the extension of the Kingdom of God in connection with various bodies in the Association, or that may hereafter be represented therein.

ARTICLEIII

REPRESENTATION:

Section 1. This Association shall be composed of all ordained ministers and deacons with membership in some local church which is a member of a District Association with membership in the State Association.

Section 2. Each District Association shall be entitled to a number of elected delegates equal with the number of churches composing said Association. These delegates may be recommended by the local churches and shall be endorsed by their District Association.

ARTICLEIV

FINANCE:

Each District Association shall be responsible for sending appropriate fees as stipulated by the State and National to the annual State Association and National Convention for each church comprising its membership.

ARTICLEV

DISCIPLINE:

Section 1. This State Association shall have the right to settle any question of discipline, doctrine or practices that may properly come before it from any of the bodies composing said organization; furthermore, if there be any question of discipline, doctrine or practices on the part of an affiliated association, delegates of that association shall not be seated until these questions have been settled to the satisfaction of the General Board.

Section 2. Decisions of the General Board may be appealed in this manner. All appeals shall come before the State Association when sitting in a committee as a whole.

ARTICLEVI

OFFICERS:

A. The officers of the State Association shall consist of a Moderator, Assistant Moderator, Clerk, Assistant Clerk and an Executive Director. Each of these shall be elected at the close of each regular session except the Executive Director.

- B. (1) The Executive Director shall be elected for an indefinite term. It shall be the responsibility of the Executive Board to seek out a prospective candidate and make their recommendation to the body at the State Association in its regular session, with privilege of nominations from the floor.
- (2) In the event of a vacancy occurring during the course of the year, the Executive Board shall fill the vacancy until the annual setting of the Association.
- (3) Any time a majority of the Executive Board, or seven (7) members of the General Board requests a vote of confidence on the Executive Director, a vote shall be taken. If such action results in the termination of the Executive Director, he shall be given sixty (60) days severance pay.
- (4) In the event of immorality on the part of the Executive Director, or of him teaching or preaching doctrine contrary to the Free Will Baptist Treatise, he may be dismissed by a majority vote of the Executive Board with no severance pay.

ARTICLEVII

BOARDS:

All standing boards and committees shall be composed of seven (7) elected members who shall serve terms of 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2, and 1 years with such ex-officio members as may be provided for elsewhere with no member serving more than two (2) consecutive terms of office or portion thereof, except:

- A. (1) the Board of Christian Education which shall consist of 10 members who shall serve five (5) years with two members elected annually,
- (2) the General Board which shall be composed of one (1) member from each affiliated association, the chairman of each standing board, and the current general officers of this association, and
- (3) the College Board of Trustees which shall be composed as provided for in the Articles of Incorporation of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc.
 - B. (1) The officers of this association shall serve as the Committee on Committees.
- (2) This Committee on Committees in turn shall select the following committees that are authorized by, but function only, during the annual state convention Resolution, Obituary, and Nominating Committee. These committees shall consist of 5 member per committee, each member being from a different District Association within the State Association.
- (3) The Nominating Committee shall annually present one name to the assemble for each vacant office except General Board, with nominating privilege form the floor.

The standing boards of this association shall be: Executive Board; Board of Church Extension, Missions and Evangelism; Board of Christian Education; and College Board of Trustees.

No standing board shall meet in a functional meeting during the session of the association.

ARTICLE VIII

DUTIES, SCOPE OF ENDEAVOR AND QUALIFICATIONS OF STANDING BOARDS

Section 1.

EXECUTIVE BOARD: The Executive Board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of an affiliated association and in good standing with the association of

which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

It shall be the duty of this board to act in behalf of the association when it is not in session. It shall be bound to carry out the directions of the association and shall hold itself bound by every consideration of morality and honor to carry out the wishes of this association and to act under its instructions in whatever technical rights, civil laws and the decisions of courts may give it in certain emergencies. It shall be the duty of this board to sign their signatures to any and all papers concerning properties, indebtedness, bonds, or other legal documents pertaining to the execution of the will of this association, exclusive of the College Board of Trustees.

This board shall have the oversight of the Executive Department of this association. The members shall assist and direct such work for the general promotion of this association as is deemed needful or necessary as the means available shall permit. The Executive Department shall serve as the coordinating agency of this association to correlate the work of all standing boards and agencies.

This board shall have the oversight of The Free Will Baptist Literature Center and shall endeavor to serve affiliated associations and churches and the community with literature and church supplies. Merchandising procedures shall be those accepted as normal retail procedures with the board being cognizant of the spiritual contribution of the store in distributing Christian literature.

All decisions of this board shall be governed by the general tenets of this association and shall not violate this constitution.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, and work done and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Whereas this board represents the association when not in session, it and it alone shall have the power to call the association into special conference provided each affiliated association shall be given notice at least ten (10) days prior to the meeting of such special conference.

Section 2.

GENERAL BOARD: This board shall be composed of one (1) member from each affiliated association, the chairman of each standing board, and the current general officers of this association. Each member must be a member of an affiliated association and in good standing with the association of which he is a member. The members shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

The duties of this board shall be to meet on Tuesday afternoon during the annual session of this association. This board shall serve as the credential committee with the duties and responsibilities and assigned by Article V of this constitution. This board shall hear reports of all standing boards. It shall serve as budget committee and shall make such recommendations as deemed pertinent to this association. A complete and accurate record shall be kept of meetings of this board and a report shall be made in writing to this association in its annual session.

The moderator of the association shall serve as chairman of this board, and the clerk of the association shall serve as its clerk.

Section 3.

BOARD OF CHURCH EXTENSION, MISSIONS AND EVANGELISM:

This board shall be composed of seven (7) members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the associations of which they are members. They shall be elected at the discretion of this association.

It shall be the duty of this board to labor to further the Gospel of Jesus Christ into the

uttermost parts of the earth. In accomplishing this, they are to endeavor to establish missions and churches in communities within the bounds of this association with whatever moral and financial assistance that may be theirs. In cases of small churches failing to function, whatever assistance deemed appropriate shall be rendered to maintain the effective witness of that church by either direct labor with the church or with an associational board in instance where the affiliated association has a functional board or agency.

This board shall be empowered to receive and convey title to real property in the area of

its labors.

The promotion of missionary endeavors from a local, state or national level shall come within the scope of endeavor of this board. This board shall assist in maintaining prayer and financial support of missionary enterprises through whatever channels available.

Whereas missionary and evangelistic labors are so intimately related, this board shall assist through participation or assistance in maintaining a strong evangelistic thrust in the life

of affiliated association.

This board shall organize itself and elect such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep an accurate record of all meetings, decisions, work done, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report in writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Section 4.

COLLEGE BOARD OF TRUSTEES: The College Board of Trustees shall be composed as provided for in the Articles of Incorporation of Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc.

Hillsdale Free Will Baptist College, Inc. is an agency of the Oklahoma State Association of Free Will Baptists and is incorporated under the corporate laws of the State of Oklahoma. The articles of incorporation are a part of this association's record and delineates the purpose, duty and scope of endeavor of the members of this board.

Section 5.

BOARD OF CHRISTIAN EDUCATION: This board shall consist of 10 members who are members of affiliated associations and in good standing with the association of which they are members. The members shall serve five years with two members elected annually.

The duties of this board shall be to promote and provide assistance for the development and sustaining of a total Christian Education program in the local church and district

association.

This board shall also administer state-wide activities such as, but not limited to, youth camps, seminars, and training programs, working with local agencies to distribute and

employ effective methods and materials.

This board shall organize itself and such officers as necessary to the orderly conduct of its affairs and labors. This board shall keep accurate record of all meetings, discussions, work don, funds received and disbursed and shall make a report I writing at each annual session of this association. All records shall be available to this association at its request.

Section 6.

VACANCIES: Vacancies shall occur when a member moves from the territorial bounds of this association, by death, by resignation or by removal from office by this association. In the event of disciplinary action where charges concerning misconduct, doctrine or practice shall have been lodged against a member of any board, his office shall be held in abeyance until such charges shall be concluded or as determined by this association.

All boards shall have power to fill vacancies arising between sessions of this association. Such appointment shall terminate at the next session of this association and shall be filled by this association.

Section 7.

EMPLOYEES: All employees of boards or agencies of this association shall be employed by agreement or contract with employing board or agency upon approval of this association except those elected by this association and the conditions of their employment shall be those approved by this association.

The duties of the Executive Director of this association shall be:

- (1) He is to represent, or cause to be represented, the association at all affairs of interest to the association.
- (2) He is to promote the work of the association in such a manner so as to unify the efforts of the association.
- (3) He is to serve with all standing boards and committees of the association in and ex-officio capacity.
- (4) He is to aid in planning the work of the association by relating the activities and plans of one board to another.
 - (5) He is to report to the association during each annual session.
- (6) He is to communicate to the affiliated members of this association the pressing causes and events before the association. This can be in person or by means of a periodical bulletin or both.
- (7) He shall serve as treasurer of this association. An accurate and complete record of all funds received and disbursed shall be kept and a written report shall be included in his report to this association in its annual session.
 - (8) The conditions of employment shall be determined by the Executive Board.
- (9) He shall serve annually as Oklahoma's General Board member to the National Convention.

ARTICLEIX

DISSOLUTION:

Should this association cease to function, all properties and holdings shall go the National Association of Free Will Baptists after all creditors are satisfied and indebtedness cleared.

ARTICLEX

AMENDMENTS:

This constitution may be amended or altered at any regular session of the association by a two-thirds (2/3) majority vote of members present and voting, provided proposed amendment or alteration be presented in writing to the body one (1) day in advance.

ARTICLEXI

SPECIAL SESSIONS:

Elected delegates to the last session of this association shall be retained as standing delegates for special called sessions.
