Preface To The Minutes Of The Paul Palmer Fellowship Converence Of Original Free Will Baptist Of Georgia

In July of 1963, several ministers and laymen of the Midway and Martin Associations of Georgia and Salem of Florida met in the Colquitt, Georgia Free Will Baptist Church at the invitation of the pastor, Rev. Joe Fort. The purpose of this meeting was for an open and free discussion of the conflict between brethren of the National Association of Free Will Baptist and the North Carolina State Association of Original Free Will Baptist on the subject of church government - specifically, congregational and connectional government. The brethren of the National Association insisted on a strict congregational policy, while the North Carolina brethren asserted that Free Will Baptist tradition was a combination of both congregational and connectional government. As a result of these differences, in the 1962 session of the National Association, an open discussion arose on the floor about the procedure with which a local North Carolina dealt with an issue in one of its local churches, a procedure which was deemed to be strictly "connectional" by the majority opinion of the National Association then in session. And because the North Carolina Association upheld the local association in its action, a motion was made from the floor and carried to "declare vacant each and every office in the National Association by any delegate from the state of North Carolina," which amounted to a formal dismissal of the North Carolina Free Will Baptist from the National Association of Free Will Baptist.

We brethren who met at the Colquitt Church a year later concluded that the action of the National Association against the North Carolina State Association was hasty, unadvisable, and unchristian. We agreed that it was traditional among Free Will Baptist to practice a combination of congregational and connectional government (See: Constitution of Paul Palmer Conference). We further concluded that the action of the National Association was unjustified, and that the motion should have been tabled so that more time and greater effort toward mutual understanding may have been sought by the brethren concerned.

Therefore, we concluded that we would attempt to lead the Midway Association to withdraw from the National Association in support of the position of the North Carolina Association, until such time as the National Association rescended the above motion. This conclusion was written in the form of a resolution to be presented to the next session of the Midway Association in October 1963. Should the resolution not pass, we concluded that we would withdraw as individual churches to form a separate association.

To our regret, the resolution did not pass. It was then decided that we would set a date on which to meet and write a constitution for a new association. In late 0ctober 1933, Reverends Joe Fort, Daniel F. Pelt, J.B. Lovering, and Chester H. Pelt

met with Rev. Paul Irvin in his church - White Pond Free Will Baptist Church, Damascus, Ga. There we prepared the first draft of a constitution naming the new association The Paul Palmer Fellowship Conference, and set the first session of the conference to meet in January 1964 at the Jakin Free Will Baptist Church, Jakin, Ga.

In the meantime, the Jakin Church and White Pond Church in called conferences passed the following motion: "Motion carried unanimously that we stand by the Free Will Baptist Treatise of 1902; that we withdraw from the Midway Association in protest to its neglect to act on a tabled resolution which was written to express our conviction concerning the departure of the National Association from traditional practice; that our withdrawal continue in effect until the Midway Association sets its house in order in accordance with the above treatise; and that we invite all other brethren of like mind as ours to join us in fellowship." Subsequently three other churches passed similar motions and joined the new conference—Zion, Bethlehem and Live Oak Free Will Baptist Churches.

The Constitution Of The Paul Palmer Fellowship Conference Of The Original Free Will Baptists

Preamble: -We who are of the Original Free Will Baptist church os the state of Georgia, in order to rediscover the spirit of brotherly love and peace of mind among ourselves; adhere to the customs and practices of our paul Palmer heritage of more than two hundred and fifty years in American History—an heritage which had its beginning in Eastern North Carolina—and promote the cause of our Lord Jesus Christ in one accord with that heritage through preaching, teaching, missions, the care of needy orphans, widows and the aged, do hereby establish this consititution for all churches and ministers of the said state who are of like mind and spirit as we are:

Article 1

Name: The name of this organization shall be The Paul Palmer Fellowship Conference of Original Free Will Baptist.

Article 2

Objectives - The objectives of this conference shall be to:

- 1. Co-ordinate the activities and aims of those member churches (and ministers) who recognize our true heritage as stemming from the Paul Palmer Free Will Baptist heritage (of the early 1700's in America.)
- 2. Maintain our traditional practice of church government composed of both congregational and connectional usages:
- a. Congregational insofar as internal affairs are concerned; such as, calling and dismissing pastors within the accepted rules of the conference; receiving and expending money and other values; the construction and repair of church

buildings; the purchasing and sale of real property; receiving and dismissing members within the accepted rules of the conference; establishing and maintaining cemeteries; conducting worship services; Sunday school, youth training and prayer meetings, and all other programs and activities of a purely local nature.

- b. Connectional insofar as matters of doctrine and discipline of church and ministers who deviate from accepted doctrine; ordination of ministers and deacons; the traditional practice of conferences and churches with respect to receiving and dismissing members, and of other action which may effect the spirit, harmony and good will of the the conference or any of its member churches, especially in regards to the grievances of minority groups.
- 3. Promote the use of Free Will Baptist literature published at the Free Will Baptist Press of Ayden, North Carolina, an institution that has served the cause of Christ through the printed page for more than one hundred years without financial profit to any individual—all profits being turned back into the various denominational projects.
- 4. Promote Christian education—especially Mount Olive College, a liberal arts school and "witness of Free Will Baptists in Christian higher education" whose "commitment is to make this witness as effective aspossible from the point of view of both education and the church."
- 5. Promote a missionary program which begins at home (Jerusalem) and extends to the uttermost parts of the world, a program which is not divided into two unscriptural parts called home and foreign missions.
- 6. Promote a church extension program for the purpose of establishing and maintaining in this state mission churches, or worship centers, until they are self-supporting, at which time they will be accepted into this conference as duly organized and established churches.

Article 3

Membership: The membership of this conference shall be composed of ministers and church as follows:

- 1. All duly ordained and accepted ministers of the Gospel who: (a) accept this constitution and by-laws without reservation, and who are approved and recommended by the ordaining council with final aproval of the conference; (b) are actively engaged in pastoral, or related, ministry within the scope of the objectives of this conference; and (c) whose membership in the conference takes precedence over his local church membership, since he may maintain his church membership with any Free Will Baptist church of his own choosing. However, ministers who pastor churches in this conference must hold their ministerial membership in this conference.
- 2. All duly established churches and missions of the Free Will Baptist faith that accept and embrace this constitution and by-laws without reservation, and the churches and missions must be represented by at least one deacon and one lay person for each fifteen (15) active members or fraction thereof.

Article 4

Organization: In order to equalize the voting strength of this conference, it shall be composed of three divisions, as follows:

- 1. A Ministers' Division. This division shall be charged with the responsibility of administering Free Will Baptist doctrine with the sanction of the other two divisions, together with the supervision and jurisdiction over all ordinations of both ministers and deacons.
- 2. A Deacons' Division. This division shall be charged with the responsibility of encouraging and fostering the following activities in the local churches: Administration of the ordinances baptism, communion and feet washing; giving to benevolent causes; support of the entire program of the church and handling all financial matters; seeing that the pulpit is filled in the absence of the pastor; care of the sick and needy; counseling with undisciplined, negligent and absent members, and the faithful witness of the gospel. This division will offer such resolutions to the conference as it deems advisable to be passed on to the local churches.
- 3. A Lay Division. This division shall share equally with the other two divisions in establishing policies and making constitutional changes. It may offer such resolutions to the conference as it thinks will enrich and enlarge the service rendered by the conference to the churches.

Article 5 (A By-Law).

The officers of the conference shall be: a moderator, a vice-moderator, a clerk, a treasurer, a corresponding secretary, and any other officers which the conference shall see fit to elect in the administration of its affairs. These officers shall be elected in the (July) annual session of the conference. However, should an annual session not be held, the officers last elected shall serve until their successors are elected.

Article 6 (A By-Law).

Meetings: The conference shall meet quarterly, as follows:

- 1. The first quarterly session shall be held on Saturday before the Third Sunday in October of each year.
- 2. The second quarterly session shall be held on Saturday before the Third Sunday in January of each year.
- 3. The third quarterly session shall be held on Saturday before the Third Sunday in April of each year.
- 4. The fourth quarterly, or annual, session shall be held on Saturday before the Third Sunday in July of each year.

Article 7 (A By-Law).

Voting: All voting shall be of two classifications, as follows:

1. General business which shall require a simple majority vote of the conference in general session.

2. Matters of a specific nature, such as: doctrinal questions, establishment of missions and churches, discipline of member churches, matters contrary to accepted practice, questions of constitutional ammendment, and all controversial questions shall require a three-fourths majority of two divisions voting separately.

Article 8 (A By-Law)

- 1. Committees and Councils: The Executive Committee shall be composed of the Moderator, the Vice-Moderator, the Clerk, and two members elected from the conference at large.
- 2. The Ordaining Council: The Ordaining Council shall consist of the pastors of the member churches. In the event a church is without a pastor, that church shall designate a representative member from its board of deacons.

Article 9 (A By-Law).

Candidates for Ordination: A licentiate must be certified by the church of his membership; must have been a licentiate for at least one year, and he must be called to serve a church before he is permitted ordination.

Article 10

Amendments: This constitution may be amended by a three-fourths majority of the conference while meeting in any regular session, such amendment becoming valid after passing two consecutive sessions.

Article 11 (A By-Law)

Rules: The rules of practice in this conference shall be governed by Robert's Rules and Order.

This change to constitution is subject to approval by the conference at the July and October 1984 Sessions.

Covenant

Of The Free Will Baptist Church

Having given ourselves to God, by faith in Christ, and adopted the Word of God as our rule of faith and practice, we now give ourselves to one another by the will of God in this solemn covenant.

We promise, by His grace, to love and obey Him in all things, to avoid all appearance of evil, to abstain from all sinful amusements and unholy conformity to the world, from all sanction of the use and sale of intoxicating beverages, and to "provide things honest in the sight of all men."

We agree faithfully to discharge our obligations in reference to the study of the Scriptures, secret prayer, family devotions, and social worship; and by self-denial, faith, and good works endeavor to "grow in grace and in the knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

We will not forsake the assembling of ourselves together for church conferences, public worship, and the observance of the ordinances of the Gospel; nor fail to pay according to our abilty for the support of the church, of its poor, and all its benevolent work.

We agree to accept Christian admonition and reproof with meekness, and to watch over one another in love, endeavoring to "keep the unity of the Spirit" in the bonds of peace. To be careful one another's happiness and reputation, and seek to strengthen the weak, encourage the afflicted, admonish the erring, and as far as we are able, promote the success of the church and of the Gospel.

We will everywhere hold Christian principle sacred and Christian obligations and enterprises supreme: counting it our chief business in life to extend the influence of Christ in society, constantly praying and toiling that the Kingdom of God may come, and His will be done on earth as it is in heaven.

To this end we agree to labor for the promotion of educational and denominational enterprises, the support of missions, the success of Sunday schools, and evangelistic efforts for the salvation of the world. And may the God of peace sanctify us wholly, and preserve us blameless unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Foreword

Minutes of the First Quarterly Session Jakin Church - January 25, 1964

The meeting was called to order by Rev. J.O. Fort, since he was the only ordained minister present with membership in either of the two participating church – Jakin and White Pond.

The purpose of the meeting was to organize a new association, since we felt that, under the present situation, we could not continue our work for God in a Christlike manner.

Rev. Fort asked for prayers from each individual for the organizing of the new association and for himself for his part in helping to organize it, stressing very effectively the importance of standing by the original Free Will Baptist doctrine and a constitution which allows the local church to use its own authority in problems of local church government unless it should ask for help from a state or national organization. He explained in detail the matters that would compose such problems which would arise in the local church.

He asked that an association be organized that would not be affiliated with the present State or National Association in their present state of belief or standing insofar as their present constitutions are concerned.

Rev. Chester Pelt made a motion that Rev. Fort be moderator pro tem. Motion carried.

Rev. J.B. Lovering brought the morning message, a most inspiring one, using Philippians 3:1-11, with emphasis on Verse 10.

Afternoon Session

The afternoon session opened with singing and prayer led by Rev. Fort.

Rev. Chester Pelt, pastor of the Jakin Church, spoke very effectively on the problem before us and on ideals and basic steps he thought we should consider in organizing a new association.

Delegates from both churches, along with visitors from Hickory Grove Church in Florida, were recognized at this time.

Rev. J.B. Lovering made a motion to enter into the process of organizing a new association. Motion carried.

The following officers were elected to serve until the next session: Rev. Joe Fort, moderator; Joe McDowell, clerk; Wayne Carr, treasurer.

A motion carried that the moderator be empowered to appoint a committee to work with him in drafting a constitution to be considered at the next session. This committee consisted of Brothers Cleveland and Jones of the White Pond Church, and Brothers Dunning and Reeves of the Jakin Church.

A motion carried that the next session be held on Saturday before the Third Sunday in April, beginning at 10:30 a.m. with the White Pond Church, and that the host church supply the speaker.

A motion carried that ministers present here today, other than from the two affiliated churches, be granted temporary membership in the association.

Minutes of the Second Quarterly Session White Pond Church - April 18, 1964

The meeting opened with singing led by Rev. Joe Fort and prayer by Rev. J.B. Lovering; after which Rev. Joe Fort brought a very inspiring devotional.

The moderator asked that a list of all charter members be made at this time.

A motion carried that others coming during either the morning or afternoon session be listed as charter members is they so desired, annual session included.

Rev. Chester Pelt, gave us a very challenging talk concerning the organization of our new conference.

Afternoon Session

The afternoon session opened with singing led by Rev. Fort and prayer by Rev. Grady Etheridge, Jr.

The moderator read the new constitution allowing time for discussion on each individual article.

A motion by Rev. Chester Pelt and seconded by Rev. Grady Etheridge, Jr. that this constitution be adotped by the conference, carried.

A motion carried that the election of officers for the conference be postponed until the next session of the conference (annual session) and that the present officers serve as the executive committee until that time.

A motion carried that the moderator appoint a nominating committee to make its report at the next session. Those appointed were Mrs. S.T. Dunning, Mr. Albert Jones and Mr. Ed Sanders.

A motion carried that the temporary ordaining council of the conference be composed of the five ministers who are members of the conference, as follows: Joe Fort, Chester Pelt, W.F. McDuffie, Paul Irvin, Grady Etheredge, Jr.

A motion carried that Joe Fort, Paul Irvin and Joe McDowell serve as a committee to compose and distribute copies of the minutes and additional copies of the constitution; and that funds now in the treasury be used to defray expenses.

A motion carried that Paul Irvin and Grady Etheredge Jr. compose a report blank from churches to the conference.

A motion carried that the committee which composed the constitution be given a rising vote of appreciation and that White Pond Church be given a similar vote for serving as host for these committee meetings and for this session today.

The Live Oak Church from Baker County officially became a member of the Paul Palmer Conference at this session. (April, 1964)

For some reason, the proper presentation of a petitionary letter to the conference (the details accompaning such) have not been included in this copy of the minutes.

Minutes Of The First Annual Session Live Oak Church — July 18, 1964

The annual session opened with singing led by Rev. Grady Etheridge; after which, Rev. W.F. McDuffie brought an inspiring and heart-touching devotional, using the sixth chapter of Isaiah as his text.

The meeting proceeded with the moderator, Rev. Joe Fort, recognizing the ministers, delegates, and visitors.

A motion carried that all visiting ministers, deacons, and lay members be welcomed into the business session of the meeting.

Brother J.M. Etheridge welcomed the conference on behalf of the host church. Rev. Chester Pelt responded.

The minutes of the last session were read and adopoted with the addition of Brother C.J. Pelt's name as honorary deacon, and Mrs. J.B. Lovering's name as a charter member.

Rev. Grady Etheridge brought a special message in song; then Rev. Jim Pelt, brought a soul-stirring message, his text coming from Isaiah 57 with emphasis on Verse 15.

Afternoon Session

The afternoon session opened with singing led by Rev. Grady Etheridge.

Rev. Fort gave a report of the ordaining council requesting that Rev. J.B. Lovering and Rev. Daniel Pelt be granted membership in the ministers' division of the conference. Rev. Fort asked that the clerk be looked on as moderator while he discussed this matter. A motion carried to adopt this report.

Rev. Grady Etheridge read the report blank composed by him and Rev. Irvin to be used by the churches of the conference. A motion carried to adopt the report.

The matter of church letters to this session was discussed. The clerks of all three churches stated that their report blanks were incomplete because some of the information asked for on the new blank had not been obtained; they aslo stated that it was not clear to them whether or not the churches were to send funds or quarterly dues to the conference at this time. A motion carried that each clerk, upon completion of his church letter should mail it to the clerk of the conference.

Motion carried that the churches discuss individually the project of supporting a Mexican missionary and give a definite statement concerning this matter at the next conference.

The moderator asked for petitionary letters from other churches. There were none.

The moderator led a discussion concerning by-laws to accompany our conference constitution. A motion carried that the moderator appoint a committee to compose a set of by-laws and submit it to the conference for consideration. The committee appointed consists of Rev. J.B. Lovering, Chester Pelt, and Daniel Pelt.

A motion by Rev. Chester Pelt that the conference endorse a meeting of all the ministers on Friday night before the next session for the purpose of organizing a ministers' division with all interested deacons and lay members invited carried.

A motion carried that the moderator and clerk write a letter to the Pensacola church expressing a willingness to help in any way and inviting them to come into this conference if they so desire.

We, your nominating committee, submit the following nominations for officers to serve during the incoming year: moderator, Joe Fort; vice-moderator, W.F. McDuffie; clerk, Joe McDowell; corresponding secretary, Paul Irvin; treasurer, Wayne Carr. Respectfully submitted by Ed Sanders, Albert Jones, and Mrs. S.T. Dunning. A motion carried to accept the report as a whole, thereby eliminating the

voting on each name individually.

A motion carried that clerk of each church be requested to compose a mailing list of all families of the church.

A motion carried to convene with Jakin Church at the next session.

Minutes Of The First Quarterly Session Jakin Church — October 17, 1964

The meeting opened with song led by Rev. Chester Pelt. He then presented to the conference a young Chipola Junior College student, Wayne King, who very ably brought the morning devotional, using Acts 2:46 & 47 as a text. Rev. J.B. Lovering led in prayer.

Rev. Chester Pelt, gave the welcome. Rev. Joe Fort responded.

Rev. Fort spoke briefly about the Arizona-Mexico Missions and pledged his wholehearted efforts toward support of the program.

Further organization of the auxiliaries of the conference (Woman's Auxiliary and League) was discussed, and a suggestion was made that, since there is but one Woman's Auxiliary (Jakin) in the conference, a conference-wide auxiliary be formed; also that the Leagues in the conference meet in one body, quarterly, as would the Woman's Auxiliary.

Rev. Jim Pelt led the singing at the worship hour; Rev. Daniel Pelt brought the morning message, using John 3:16 as his text.

Afternoon Session

The afternoon session opened with singing led by Rev. Jim Pelt. Rev. Fort then made a brief statement concerning the meeting of the ministers' division held at White Pond Church on Friday night, October 16, saying that Rev. Daniel Pelt was elected chairman and Rev. J.B. Lovering was elected secretary-treasurer of that division.

A motion carried to adopt a project of sponsoring a Mexican Missionary and that the project be put into operation by the next quarterly session.

A motion carried to extend the privilege of contributing to this missionary project to any other churches which wished to do so.

A general discussion was entered into at this time concerning the three division of the conference (ministers, deacons, and laymen) and the organization and procedure of each division, with ideas submitted by individuals. A motion carried that the moderator appoint a committee to arrange programs for joint meetings of each division (quarterly), after which each division would then enter into business sessions seperately, and that this committee determine the location for these meetings. This committee would also determine the location of all future quarterly sessions of the conference.

A motion carried that the conference accept any invitations by other churches outside the conference to host the quarterly meetings. This committee, as ap-

pointed by the moderator, is as follows: Rev's. Daniel Pelt, chairman' Paul Irvin and J.B. Lovering.

A motion carried that the moderator appoint a finance committee. Those appointed were Lewis Cleveland, Tommy Pace, Ed Sanders and Wayne Carr.

A motion carried that this conference allocate \$25.00 per quarter, beginning with this session, to Mrs. J.N. Barnes, Mrs. T.B. Mellette, and Mrs. W.T. Wiley. These ladies are widows of deceased ministers of this area.

A motion carried that the Jakin Auxiliary be requested to lead in organizing a conference-wide woman's auxiliary.

Minutes Of The Second Quarterly Session Hickory Grove Church — January 16, 1965

The session opened with Rev. Jim Pelt leading the song service and Bro. Wayne Carr leading the prayer.

A very impressive and appropriate devotion was given by Rev. J.C. Watson, using Matthew 18, 1-7, as his text.

Rev. Chester Pelt welcomed the body with Rev. J.B. Lovering responding.

A combined Finance-Digest committee was then named by the moderator, consisting of Bro's. Lewis Cleveland, Cheshire DeBarry, and Wayne Carr.

Rev. Fort officially recognized all ministers, deacons, and visitors. Ministers present were Reverends Daniel Pelt, Chester Pelt, Jim Pelt, visitors, J.B. Lovering, W.F. McDuffie, Paul Irvin and Rev. J.C. Watson and Coy WAtson, who were visitors. Deacons present were Brothers Cheshire DeBarry, Lewis Cleveland, Joe McDowell Johnson as visitors.

Rev. Fort spoke for a few minutes about the meeting of the Deacon's Division at Bethlehem on Friday night, Jan. 15, telling of the procedure of this meeting and the wonderful fellowship that prevailed there. The deacons elected Bro. S.T. Dunning as Chairman and Bro. Charlie Burch as Clerk of this Division.

The moderator then talked again about the organizing of a Conference-wide Woman's Auxiliary and requesting that the Jakin Auxiliary (the only one in the conference) be invited to the other two churches or to a centrally located church, to help in organizing such an Auxiliary. He then expressed views on the possibility of each Division of the Conference employing or starting various studies that would help them to better carry out their respective duties in the service of our Lord. He also mentioned the work that needs to be done in the Leagues, as far as the Conference is concerned, and of the possibility of future joint meetings of all the Leagues. He also talked of the Conference project of sponsoring a Mexican Missionary, giving various information on steps to be used in getting this project into operation.

A motion carried that each host church provide a Credentials committee to compile a list of the names of all persons who attend each session, these names to be taken at the door and arranged in the following order;

1) Lay members and Delegates. 2) Member Deacons. 3) Member Ministers. 4) Visiting Laymen. 5) Visiting Deacons 6) Visiting Ministers. This motions carried.

Rev. J.B. Lovering was the morning speaker, bringing a very inspiring message with Luke 2:52 as his text.

Afternoon Session

The afternoon session opened with singing led by Rev. Jim Pelt and prayer by Bro. Joe McDowell, followed by scripture reading and prayer by Rev. Fort.

The moderator read a letter from Mrs. J.N. Barnes, acknowledging the offering made to her but returning it and at the same time, very graciously expressing her wish that the money be used for the further speading of the Gospel in any way the Conference might see fit.

A motion carried that the Conference send \$10 monthly to Mrs. Wiley and Mrs. Mellette instead of the \$25 quarterly, which previously allocated.

Rev. Chester Pelt, as a member of the Committee on By-Laws talked of the procedure and thoughts that should be or might be followed in the composing of By-Laws as the organization of the Conference continues and grows. He particularly mentioned various themes that might be used for coming quarterly sessions and asked that the Committee on By-Laws be permitted to present suggestions of this nature to the Program Committee to be used from time to time. A motion carried that permission be granted.

A motion carried to support a Mexican Missionary and the moderator and clerk serve in getting this project underway.

A motion carried that the Conference proceed to organize the Laymen Division of the Conference.

Minutes Of The Third Quarterly Session White Pond Church - April 17, 1965

This session opened with song service led by Rev. W.F. McDuffie and prayer by Rev. Coy Watson.

The morning devotional, given by Rev. Joe Fort, a very impressive and appropriate message for the Easter season, based on the death and resurrection of our Lord.

Rev. McDuffie, a former Pastor and a member of White Pond Church, welcomed the body with Rev. Fort responding.

Rev. Coy Watson was the morning speaker in place of Rev. McDuffie.

A motion carried to include all officers of the three divisions of the Conference (Ministers, Deacons, and Laymen) as standing members of the voting body and

that all member ministers, deacons, and delegates be regarded as delegates.

The moderator then appointed a combined Digest-Finance committee, consisting of Bros. Ed Sanders, Albert Jones, and Wayne Carr.

Rev. Fort presented the morning speaker, Rev. Coy Watson, who used Luke 22:31-35 as his text and brought a very timely and inspiring message.

Afternoon Session

The afternoon session opened with Rev. Chester Pelt leading the singing followed by prayer by Rev. Pelt.

Rev. Chester Pelt talked on the progress made by this committee, pointing out that the work on the compiling of By-Laws was in its early stages, and at the same time, requesting that any suggestions by any member concerning this work be submitted to this committee. Rev. Pelt talked of various ways this committee could be of help to the three Divisions of the Conference, specifically mentioning the Deacons Division, how they might be aided in their Divisional work as well as in individual duties.

Rev. Fort then talked about the project adopted by the Conference of supporting an Arizona-Mexican missionary. A motion carried that the moderator represent the Conference at the Interanational Fellowship Conference at Rockingham, North Carolina in July, appointing any others that could go, as he wishes.

Rev. McDuffie gave a report on the meeting of the Laymen's Division at Zion church on Friday night, April 16. Rev. McDuffie, who served as Moderator for this meeting in the absence of Rev. Fort, expressed gratefulness in behalf of the Conference to Zion church for the wonderful hospitality accorded members at this meeting. The Laymen elected the following officers: Mrs. S.T. Dunning, Chairman; Albert Jones, Vice-Chairman; Mrs. W.E. McDowell, Clerk. The program for this meeting was presented by the host church with Rev. Jim Pelt bringing the message.

The moderator then led a discussion on the possibility of bringing together the Youth of the Conference at future meetings, stressing the importance of urging the young people of each individual church to attend quarterly meetings of the Conference. A motion carried to appoint a committee to survey the possibility of a Youth Organization under the sponsorship of the Conference. Those appointed to this Committee were Bros. Joe McDowell, Cheshire DeBarry, and Wayne Carr.

A motion carried that all funds coming into the Conference for missions be designated as such and that \$300.00 be set aside immediately for mission pro-

grams, this amount to be included under one account for the Treasurer's convenience.

Minutes Of The Second Annual Session Live Oak Church - July 17, 1965

This session opened with Rev. Joe Fort leading the song service and Bro. S.T. Dunning leading the opening prayer.

Rev. Fort then brought the morning devotional, using verses from the eleventh and twelth chapters of Hebrews as his text.

A motion carried to include in the voting body, the Executive Committee, all member Ministers, Deacons, and delegates.

Visitors present were Deacons Martin Still and Henry G. Wiley of the Zion church.

The moderator called for any petionary letters and Zion church of Blakely, Georgia, Early County asked for admittance into the conference by submitting a letter of petition which was read to the body by the moderator. A motion carried to accept this church into the conference, with all votings rights to its delegates extended immediately.

Bro. John Etheredge gave the welcome to the body with Rev. Paul Irvin responding.

Rev. Fort then talked briefly about various committees and boards that need to be appointed and formed, asking for suggestions as to the procedure used in the appointments and the term of office of each board member. A motion carried to appoint a nominating committee composed of a minister, a deacon, and a layman with the suggestion that they appoint to the various boards a minister and four delegates from the four churches, stating the term of office (from 5 years to 1 year) for each board member. Those appointed to this nominating committee were Bro. Grady Etheredge, Bro. Martin Still, and Sister S.T. Dunning.

The moderator called for a motion that all General Officers named by the nominating committee be elected one at a time and that nominees for board membership be accepted as submitted by the committee. Motion carried.

Rev. Fort made a report on his and Mrs. Fort's trip to the General Conference of Original Free Will Baptists at Rockingham, North Carolina. He talked briefly about the program adopted by this conference to support an Arizona-Mexican missionary, stating that, the chairman of the North Carolina Mission Board was in the Arizona-Mexico area and that the conference would be contacted and directed as to its course concerning this program as soon as he returns.

A motion carried that the conference recommend to the churches as they give to various programs (Missions, Christian Education, Church Extension, Super Annuation) they give quarterly and send it to the Conference Treasurer.

Friday Night

The meeting was held with the Jakin church on July 16, 1965 and, although the number of those attending was small, it was a most enjoyable one. The ladies of the church served a very delicious evening meal which was followed by song and prayer service. The evening message was given by Rev. W.F. McDuffie and was and will continue to be a blessing to all present. Rev. Fort talked of his trip to Rockingham and of the information he obtained concerning the mission program adopted by the conference.

Minutes Of The First Quarterly Session Jakin Church - October 16, 1965

This meeting opened with Rev. Joe Fort leading the song service and Bro. Joe McDowell leading the opening prayer.

The morning devotional was given by Rev. Paul Irvin. Using Luke 19: 12-13, as his text, he brought us a very timely and inspiring message.

A Digest committee was appointed composed of Joe McDowell, Martin Still, Mrs. Kitty Tyson, and Mrs. W.T. Hudson.

Rev. Chester Pelt informed the Body that Bro. Wayne King had accepted a call to the Ministry and had been licensed to preach by the Hichory Grove Church in Florida.

Rev. J.B. Lovering presented the Morning speaker, Rev. Jim Pelt, whose text was Luke 12:35-36.

Afternoon Session

The session opened with singing by the body and prayer by Rev. McDuffie.

Rev. Fort asked that the body pause at this time for a moment of prayer in behalf of Bro. John Etheredge, a beloved Deacon of the Live Oak church, who is in ill health. Rev. Chester Pelt led us in prayer.

The report of the Digest Committee was given and a motion carried to adopt this report with instructions that the committee add to it the report of the Woman's Auxilliary of the Jakin church.

A motion carried that the Conference set up a rotation system for the location of all Friday night meetings and all Saturday meetings to be followed by the four member churches, with the understanding that an outside church, upon invitation, would be considered as a possible host to either meeting. This system would be observed in this order: Friday night meetings: Beginning with January 14, 1966, 7:00 P.M. Live Oak, Zion, Jakin, and White Pond. Saturday meetings: Beginning with January 15, 1966, 10:00 A.M. Zion, White Pond, Live Oak, and Jakin.

Rev. Chester Pelt, speaking in behalf of the committee on By-Laws, told of the work being done by this committee and read a Rough-Draft of proposed By-Laws stressing again the fact that the committee welcomed changes or suggestions by the Body concerning this work.

Rev. Fort, as chairman of the Mission Board, gave a brief report in its behalf, telling of existing conditions in the Mexican Missionary Field and stating that the Conference had the assurance of being assigned the responsibility of supporting a Missionary in this area in the near future.

A motion carried to instruct the Treasurer to send Super Annuation checks in the same amount and procedure as in previous quarter.

Friday Night Meeting

The meeting held with White Pond church on Oct. 15, 1965, began with a delicious meal served by the ladies of the church. It was followed by singing and prayer and since this was a Minister's meeting, a very interesting Panel Discussion by Minister's present was entered into with tops for discussion centering on How to be a Better Pastor. It was a very enjoyable evening for all present.

Minutes Of The Second Quarterly Session Zion Church - January 15, 1966

The meeting opened with a song service led by Rev. W.F. McDuffie and prayer by Rev. J.B. Lovering.

The morning devotional was given by Mrs. Martin Still who used Love as a theme for her message, with verses from Colossians, Romans, and John as a text.

Rev. Fort called for a reading of the list of all Board members.

Rev. J.B. Lovering brought the morning message using John 13:1-17, with emphasis on verse 17, as his text.

Afternoon Session

The session opened with singing and prayer led by Bro. Wayne King.

Rev. Fort, reporting for the Mission Board, stated that the Arizona-Mexican missionary program, which the conference had voted to support, was in the process of reorganization and that the General Conference of North Carolina was sponsoring the Texas-Arizona Mission program under the managership of Rev. J.E. Timmons. He said the information concerning this new change had not been secured and that, for the time being, church might send mission money to any area they wished to send it in the Church Extension program of the conference, in respect to missions.

Rev. Paul Irvin, reporting in behalf of the Church Extension Board, recommended that the conference proceed to investigate the possibility of organizing other churches in this or any near-by area. A motion carried that the conference follow this recommendation, with Rev. Irvin given the privilege of selecting any member of this conference to assist him in such an investigation.

Rev. J.B. Lovering reported for the Baord of Superannuation. He said the Board recommended that the conference continue to make the same payments in the same amounts as before and also that the churches start contributing funds earmarked for Superannuation. A motion carried that the conference adopt these recommendations.

Rev. Chester Pelt, reporting in behalf of the Ordaining Council, asked that this report be delayed, yielding the time to Rev. Wayne King, who wished to make a statement that would affect the report of the Ordaining Council. Rev. Pelt, inturn, presented Bro. King, who expressed his gratefulness to the conference for the love and support extended him in the past, and who also expressed his wish that he be admitted to the conference as a licensed member of the Ministers' Division.

There was no report from the Youth Committee nor from the Woman's Auxiliary. However, the moderator led a general discussion on the Youth Organization of the conference and it was decided that a meeting for this purpose would be held on Saturday night before the first Sunday in February (Feb. 5) at Zion church with the Pastor and youth of this church in charge of the program. A motion carried to appoint a committee to work on the organization of a conference-wide Woman's Auxiliary. The date for the meeting of this committee was set for Sunday afternoon after each Quarterly Conference, the location to be decided by the committee. The committee appointed consisted of Mrs. Martin Still, Zion; Mrs. H.H. Reeves, Jakin; Miss Enid McDowell, White Pond and Mrs. Charles Burch, Live Oak.

Rev. Chester Pelt made the report of the Ordaining Council. The report read as follows: "The Ordaining Council has voted to accept Bro. Wayne King as a licensee Minister and recommends him to membership in the Ministers' Division and the conference at large. Also, it has voted to petition Bro. King's local Draft Board to reclassify his draft status." A motion carried to adopt this report.

Rev. Chester Pelt also reported for the Board of Christian Education. This report recommended that the conference proceed to establish a fund for furthering Christian Education within the conference and that it allocate a fund for Bro. King's use at this session. A motion carried to adopt this report.

A motion carried that the conference contribute \$75 toward Rev. Wayne King's college expenses.

A motion carried that the Body observe a moment of prayer in behalf of the memory of Bro. John Etheridge of Live Oak and Bro. Connie Gordon of White Pond, member Deacons of the conference who have recently passed away. Rev. Paul Irvin led this prayer.

The Friday night meeting was held with the Live Oak church on January 14, 1966. Those attending were treated to a very delicious supper served by the ladies of the community. This was followed by a song service, prayer and since this was a Deacon's Division meeting a program concerning Deacons was presented. Due to the absence of the chairman, Bro. S.T. Dunning, the moderator, Rev. Fort directed the program which included a brief talk by Rev. Chester Pelt on by-laws drawn up by the Committee on By-Laws, concerning the selection of a Deacon by a church, the approval of the Ordaining Council, and the Ordination service. Also, Rev. J.B. Lovering spoke briefly on the qualifications of a Deacon as given in I Timothy, Chapter 3, verses 8-13. The only matter of business of the evening was the election of Bro. Lewis Cleveland of White Pond to the office of Vice Chairman of the Deacon's Division.

Minutes Of The Third Quarterly Session White Pond Church - April 16, 1966

This session was opened with singing by the body, led by Bro. David Still, and prayer, by Rev. W.F. McDuffie.

The morning devotional was given by Rev. J.O. Fort, who used verses 1-7 of the first chapter of II Peter, as his text.

The moderator, Joe Fort, called for any petitionary letters. The Bethlehem Free Will Baptist Church of Shellman, Georgia presented a letter to the Conference petitioning for permanent membership into the Conference. A motion carried that the Conference accept this church and extend full voting rights to its delegates as listed in the letter immediately, with instructions to the clerk to write a letter to the Midway Association, of which the Bethlehem church is a former member, advising them of this action and requesting that the church be removed from the list of churches holding membership in the Midway Association. The moderator then officially welcomed The Bethlehem church into the Conference.

Rev. Paul Irvin, Pastor of the host church, presented Rev. Jim Pelt as the morning speaker, whose message, as always, was most inspiring. Bro. Pelt's text was Matthew 20:20-28.

Afternoon Session

After song service and prayer led by Rev. Paul Irvin, the first business was a brief report by Bro. David Still concerning the youth meeting at Zion on Saturday night, Jan. 15, 1966. He suggested that the conference change the date of this meeting from Saturday night before the third Sunday of each quarter to Saturday night before the second Sunday. This was suggested because the Friday night meeting, the regular conference meeting, and the youth meeting were being held on the same week-end. A motion carried that the conference make this change, with the Youth Committee deciding on the location of the meeting.

Mrs. Martin Still reported in behalf of the committee appointed to work on the organizing of a Conference-wide Woman's Auxiliary. She stated that a meeting at White Pond church would be held on Thursday night April 21 to organize an Auxiliary in that church.

Rev. Fort then spoke briefly concerning church extension work giving his views on steps that should be followed before any course of action is taken. Rev. W.F. McDuffie also expressed views concerning this and a committee consisting of Rev. McDuffie, Bro. Henry G. Wiley, and Rev. Fort was named, along with Rev. Paul Irvin, chairman of the Church Extension Board, to investigate the possibilities of church extension within the reaches of the conference.

Rev. Fort also reported for the Mission Board. He stated that he believed the churches would be safe, if they elected to do so, in sending money for Missions to the Texas-Arizona Mission Program under J.E. Timmons which the North Carolina General Conference is sponsoring, but added that it might be wise for the churches to channel all mission money to church extension within the conference. A motion carried that the conference endorse an emphasis on the individual church contributing funds for Church Extension through its own mission program.

Rev. Chester Pelt then talked of the work being done by the Committee on By-Laws and suggested that the chairman of each Board make a list of points or suggestions that would help this committee to pinpoint the exact duties of each Board member. He also made a motion that the chairman of each Board, or a member other than the chairman of a Board, if the Treasurer desires to make such an appointment, serve as a finance committee, with the conference Treasurer as chairman.

Rev. J.B. Lovering, speaking for the Board of Super Annuation, suggested that the conference continue the same payments as previously and a motion to this effect, carried.

Rev. Chester Pelt reported jointly for the Board of Christian Education and the Ordaining Council. He said that the Hickory Grove church in Florida had pledged \$10 per month to this conference for Christian Education. This church holds the membership of Rev. Wayne King, who has also been granted membership into the Minister's Division of the conference. Rev. Pelt made a motion that the conference make permanent its allocation of \$75 quarterly toward the support of Rev. King as long as he continues in his preparation for the ministry. This motion carried.

A motion carried that Rev's. Chester Pelt and J.B. Lovering serve as

delegates to the General Conference in North Carolina, with the privilege that they may name alternates, if need be, with the conference paying for the expenses of one car.

Friday Night Meeting

Meeting was held with Zion church on Friday night, April 15, 1966. The ladies served a most delicious meal. The program for the night began with singing and prayer. Since this was a Layman's Division meeting, Rev. J.O. Fort, moderator of the conference, presented Mrs. S.T. Dunning, chairman of this division, who then proceeded to present a very interesting program. Bro. Bobby Davis, of the Zion church, gave the devotional, a talk on the youth of our day, their problems and temptations and the obligations of Laymen to help them over such obstacles.

A panel discussion on the duties of the Laymen was presented with each church represented on the panel and Bro. Wayne Carr, of Jakin, serving as moderator.

Board of Super Annuation: Mrs. Margie Brown to replace Mrs. Margie Hudson. Board of Christian Education: Charlie Burch to replace Cheshire DeBarry. Church Extension Board: R.H. McDowell to replace W.E. McDowell. Youth Committee: Unchanged. Board of Publication: Mrs. Bobby Ready to replace Mrs. David Still.

Signed: Charlie Burch (For Cheshire DeBarry), Mrs. H.H. Reeves, Mrs. Martin Still, Albert Jones, Mrs. Gene Kersey.

Bro. Dunning requrested that his name be removed from nomination. The committee asked Bro. Wayne Carr be retained as Conference Treasurer.

Mrs. Martin Still announced that the next Woman's Auxiliary meeting would be the first Thursday night in October at Jakin.

Rev. W.F. McDuffie asked that the Conference send a letter of recommendation in his behalf to the Salem Association in Florida, he being a Pastor of a church in that Association. A motion carried to this effect.

5. Will you give all your effort to shape and live your life, and that of your family, according to the teaching of Christ?




History Of Bethlehem Free Will Baptist Church


Bethlehem Church was established in 1814 with a church building made from round logs. All the work was done by land owners and slaves of the community. The round log building became inadequate, being replaced by a split log building on the same church site. This served the church until during the Civil War, a frame building was erected on the same plot of saved ground.

In 1957, the church entered a building program seeing the need of a larger church with Sunday School rooms. In 1960, our present church building was completed.

More precious than the building, we are grateful that through the years, this church continues to be a shelter from the storms of life to the Bethlehem and surrounding communities.

During this period of time, many dedicated servants have served the church. We would like to mention only three of these Shepherds, Rev. Charlie Martin, Rev. W.T. Wiley, serving for 50 years, to be succeeded by Rev. Daniel F. Pelt, who then served for 26 years.





History Of Jakin Freewill Baptist Church

In the early 1800's a church called Open Pond Freewill Baptist Church came into being. This building was a frame clapboard structure stituated beside a shallow pond which had none of the usual native shrubs around its edges. The location determined the name of the Church.

Records of the early history of the Church were destoryed by fire but verbal reports tell of this church's existence long before 1850.

After the civil war the church moved near the site of Open Pond Cemetery (Oldest headstone dated 1820). This church was a brush arbor. The best they could

do at the time. In 1867 a log church was built. Sometime later a frame building was erected.

Open Pond Church accepted negro slaves as members.

By 1880 a Sunday School was established. In the same year the church building had begun to be used for a day school.

Following the schooling, in 1890 the church decided to move to a more central and convenient place. This move was to the present location about one and one-half miles east of Jakin, Georgia. This building was erected at Midway Crossroads. Thus it was called Midway Church.

In 1898 the church became a charter member of the Midway Association of Freewill Baptist. In 1962 it became a member of the Paul Palmer Conference of Original Freewill Baptist.


In 1952 a cement block building was erected. It consists of a Sanctuary, Sunday School rooms, choir area, baptismal space, central heating and cooling and adequate space for parking. In this same year the name was officially changed to Jakin Freewill Baptist Church.

In 1968 a second church cemetery was established on the east side of the church.


In 1970 a kitchen and fellowship hall were added. Then in 1981 the church completed a project to renovate the church building. The project included brick veneering the outside walls, installing stained glass windows, adding a pillared porch to the front, installing stately front doors and up-grading other areas of the church.

History of Live Oak Free Will Baptist Church



Live Oak History Continued



Prior to the year of 1884, what is now known as the Live Oak Community had no church. The community was very thinly populated, and the mode of travel consisted of wagons, ox carts, and a few buggies. Several families living in the community got together and after some discussion decided that the community needed a Sunday School. A time was agreed upon and the first Sunday School in the community was organized. It met in a little log house which also served as a school, and which was located close to where the present church building sits.

A short time later a decision was made that there was also a need for a church as well as for a Sunday School. This decision resulted in a committee being appointed and given authority to extend an invitation to the Reverend Warren A. McDonald to meet with the members of the community to give counsel and advice in planning for and constituting a new church. Mr. E.L. Hudson donated two acres of land on which to build the new church, and in the Spring of 1884 work was begun on the actual construction. Mr. Mood Richardson was awarded the contract for building, although much of the labor was done by the men of the community. The first building was completed in time to hold their first revival service which began on the third Sunday in July 1884. A dedication service was held on that day, and the church was given the name of Live Oak Free Will Baptist Church. Reverend Preston McDonald preached the dedicatory sermon.

The thirteen charter members included: Mrs. Martha Walker, Mr. and Mrs. J.D.H. Sanders, Mr. N.H. Sanders, Mrs. Sarah Etheredge, Mr. and Mrs. C.J. Sanders, Mr. and Mrs. E.L. Hudson, Mr. F.C. Williford, Mrs. Richardson, and Mr. and Mrs. T.J. Sanders. A call was extended to Reverend W.A. McDonald who served as pastor of this new congregation for several years. A complete listing of the pastors who have served this church through the years will be found at the end of this brief history.

In 1908, the members recognized the need for a larger church - the recognition of such need materializing in the erection of a second building, a two-story building with the second floor to be used by the Woodmen of the World as the place for their regular monthly meetings. Considerable improvements were made on this building in 1955 including hardwood floors, gas heat, and new pews. The church had been wired for electricity when it was made available to the church by R.E.A. in 1940.

In 1933, Mr. T.J. Riley was elected clerk, and Mr. Henderson Burch, assistant clerk. Mrs. Elva Hagains served as assistant clerk during 1934. One of the great revivals experienced by the church came in July of 1934 when twenty-four new members were added to the church membership.

The Ladies Aid was organized on June 26, 1937, with twelve members. Of particular interest is a notation in the December 1937 Church Minutes which stated: "It shall be remembered that we had services at Live Oak on Christmas Day..."

The church began having Sunday School on every Sunday, including each fifth Sunday, beginning in March 1940 Prior to getting electricity in the church, aladdin lamps were used for lighting. Mrs. Myrtle Sanders resigned as church treasurer in 1942, and was succeeded by Mrs. William Tennile. Upon Mrs. Tennile's resignation in February 1945, Mrs. Kitty Tyson was elected.

Mr. Earl Jordan and Mr. Smily Johnson were elected and ordained as deacons in 1949, the ordination taking place on August 21st. Other deacons who were serving at this time were: Mr. Edd Sanders, and Mr. John Etheredge.

In March of 1955, the church elected a committee composed of the following members to secure plans for Sunday School rooms, redo floors, install gas heat, and secure new pews: J.M. Etheredge, Robert Hamil, C.V. Phillips, Charlie Burch, Grady Etheredge, Sr. The committee for new pews were: J.M. Etheredge, C.B. Kirksey, Charlie Burch, Mrs. W.H. Tennile, and Mrs. Kitty Tyson. The deacons were requested to investigate the possibility of adding a stoop to the front of the church and Mr. Grady Etheredge, Sr., Mr. Charlie Burch and Mr. Clarence Phillips were appointed and authorized to place two outdoor toilets on the church property. Mr. D.M. Phillips, Mrs. Kitty Tyson, Mrs. Pauline Johnson, Mrs. Kitty Sanders, and Mrs. Vera Etheredge were appointed to serve as a social committee for the church. A table committee was also appointed including the following members: Mr. Cheshire DeBarry, Mr. Roy Duke, and Mrs. W.H. Tennile.

In 1956 a "Lord's Acre Committee" was appointed. This committee made up of the following members, Mr. Charlie Burch, Mr. Grady Etheredge, Sr., and Mr. Albert Ellenwood, were to contact each member and encourage them to plant one acre of land for the Lord giving the proceeds to the church.

Mr. Albert Ellenwood and Mr. Cheshire DeBarry were nominated in April 1957 to serve as deacons. Mr. Ellenwood was ordained the first Sunday in August, but Mr. DeBarry asked the church for more time to pray about his decision to serve. He was ordained the first Sunday in April 1958.

In September of 1959, a contract was awarded to Mr. Leslie "Bo" Etheredge to

place white asbestos shingles on the outside walls of the church. Later in the year, heaters were placed in all the Sunday School rooms, and an additional twenty-five chairs were purchased for these rooms. A recommendation was made to license Grade Etheredge, Jr. as a Minister of the Gospel on October 14, 1959. In July of 1960, the Quarterly Meeting of the Association was requested to ordain Mr. Grady Etheredge, Jr., and also Mr. Gilbert Oldstring as Ministers.

The Reverend B.W. Clenney was elected as pastor on August 21, 1960. He passed away in December the same and was succeeded by Reverend Eugene Irvin.

The church voted in 1965 to grant the State Highway Department authority to build a State Roadside Park on property that belongs to the church. Located right next to the church, it has added more comfort and enjoyment for activities held under the big oak trees which provides abundant shade for church dinners. This project was completed in the Spring of 1966. The church added a church bulletin board inside the church during 1965.

New pulpit furniture was given to the church by the J.M. Etheredge family in 1966 in memory of Deacon John M. Etheredge who passed away in 1965. During the course of the same year, a communion table and chairs were given by the Jarvis family in memory of a faithful and dedicated member, Mrs. Stella Jarvis. A new piano and chairs to match the pulpit were also purchased during the year.

Under the leadership of Reverend Wayne King, the church undertook a major project of building a new fellowship hall. Serving on this committee were: Mr. Cheshire DeBarry, Mr. and Mrs. Jerome Phillips, Mrs. Charlie Burch, and Mrs. Roy Duke. The Building Committee were: Mr. C.V. Phillips, Mr. Charlie Burch, Mrs. Bonville Jordan, Mr. Earl Jordan. This building is located directly behind the main church building, and was completed in 1968. A dedication service was held on the fourth Sunday in July 1968.

Full-time services were begun in July of 1972. Reverend D.W. Poole was pastor.

In January of 1976, the church met with a representative of Smithwick Construction Company to discuss plans for a new church building. Plans were finalized in February, and the following committees appointed: Finance Committee: Mr. Cheshire DeBarry, Mr. Coplin Jarvin, Mr. Jimmy Barnett, Mr. E.C. Jordan. Building Committee: Mr. Robert Hamil, Mr. Cheshire DeBarry, Mr. Charlie Burch, Mr. T.E. Moye, and Mrs. Jerome Phillips. Interior Committee: Mrs. J.W. Gaines, Mrs. Charlie Burch, Mrs. Jimmy Barnett, and Mrs. Bill Etheredge.

The following men were nominated to serve as deacons in June of 1976: Mr. Jimmy Barnett, Mr. Robert Hamil, Mr. Jarrell Burch, and Mr. Larry DeBarry. Mr. Barnette and Mr. Hamil were ordained the last of June. Mr. Burch was ordained on February 13, 1983, and Mr. DeBarry requested additional time to think about being a deacon.

Dedication services were held for the new church building on July 16, 1977.

An attractive church sign was placed in front of the church during 1980 at a cost of \$266.00.

Reverend Marvin McDaniel was called as pastor in July 1982. He passed away on Thanksgiving Day of the same year. Reverend McDaniel had also served this church as pastor in a prior year. Mr. Jarrell Burch was placed on the Ordaining Council of the Paul Palmer Association.

In January of 1983, Mr. Charlie Burch was elected as Chairman of Deacons. The deacons of the church were authorized to locate and establish some type of living quarters for the pastor on the church field. In July of 1983, a new mobile home was purchased and placed on the church property to be used by the pastor and family of their "on the field" residence.



White Pond Church was founded in the year of 1872 by Jacob Lewis. The first church was built of unpeeled logs, no windows and dirt floor.

The first preacher was Circuit rider by the name of Charlie Martin, and he rode horse back.

The church now standing was built in the year 1884. Material was hauled by oxens and carts. The land on which the church now stands was given by Amanda Leyton Lewis, wife of Jim Lewis.




History Of Zion Free Will Baptist Church

In April 1880, Mt. Hebron (White Plains) extended arm to Zion Church, then belonging to the Missionaries' in the Sowhatchee Community. The constitution of Zion Church was formed during October 1880. Rev. W.B. Lane was Pastor and J. W. Anglin was Clerk. The church presbytery consisted of Rev. W.B. Lane and G.T. Wiley. In March 1881, it was agreed to extend arm back to the School House, the former place of worship. On Saturday before the second Sunday, November 1881, Zion and Mt. Hebron came together and agreed to consolidate with the regular meetings to be held at Zion Church. At a meeting of the Presbytery and after due examination of members present, it was considered that a Church of the United Free Will Baptists be formed. In June 1882, a committee was appointed for the purpose of building a house of worship. Then in March 1883, the committee was dismissed, and the entire membership was appointed on the building committee. In August 1883, Bro. Jordan Walters was received by letter from Zion Missionary Church, and he presented the deeds and land to Zion Church. The church was to retain its name of Zion, and the Free Will Baptists were to put it in good repair and keep it so.

Three pastors died while serving the Church. They are as follows: W.T. Wiley, June 26, 1952; T.B. Mellette, October 31, 1962; and Daniel F. Pelt, June 22, 1975.

The following is the length of service and dates of each of the seventeen different ministers who have served Zion Church. Each minister's call or calls to the Church is listed separately indicating the number of different calls the Church has made throughout its history.

Church Clerks and Treasurers

J.W. Anglin was elected the first clerk at the time of the organization in 1880. L.C. Weaver was elected as the second clerk in 1885. He was succeeded by J.A. Cannon from 1888 through 1900. H.A. Alston served in 1901 and 1902. J.W. Anglin was elected again in 1903. In 1904, J.A. Cannon was elected to serve again through 1906. I.G. Wiley served in 1907 and C.C. Lane served 1908 through 1912. L.C. Weaver served again from 1913 through 1919. W.E. Chambers was elected from 1920 through 1924. Jimmy Wiley was elected Clerk in 1925 and served until his death in July, 1967. Following his death, Mrs. Bernice Still was elected.

Deacons

The first records of deacons were A.J. Smith and L.C. Weaver. The following named men are the deacons, both those who were elected and those who were received by letter as deacons.

One resigned. Others presently serving as deacons of Church.

Bible School

One April 5, 1930, the subject of Bible School was introduced, embracing the states of Georgia, Alabama and Florida. Members agreed that the School House would be used, rent free. Rev. T.B. Mellette was to be the Teacher and K.V. Shutes, Secretary-Treasurer. Zion Bible School, for lack of space, moved to Dothan, Alabama in 1936. Shortly after this time, the National Association bought property in Nashville, Tennessee for a Bible College. The property in Dothan was sold, and the proceeds were given to the Bible College in Nashville; therefore, the Bible College in Nashville grew out of Zion Bible School. Records of the Bible School were sent to the Bible College in Nashville, Tennessee. Since that time efforts have been made, to no avail, to secure a copy of these. This is a historical building in Early County.

Approximately 1868, Sowhatchee Public School settled at the present location and remained until consolidation with Hilton.
