PROCEEDINGS

The one hundred seventh annual session of the Pee Dee Association of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina convened at Emerson church in Columbus County, North Carolina, on October 16, 1976.

This session opened with the congregation singing "Grand And Glorious Feeling." The Rev. Hollan Norris brought the devotional service, taking his message from Romans, Chapter 8.

The welcome address was given by Brother Lacy Nealy. The response was given by Brother Leo McPherson, and the congregation sang "Where Could I Go But to the Lord?"

The Investigation Committee is a standing committee composed of Brothers Lacy Nealey, Dallas Byrd, and Horace Cartrette.

The roll of ministers was called and the following were absent: The Revs. I. G. Ward, Jerome Jenrette, Harvey Cribb, Claude Housand, Lewis J. Sprouse, Jasper Pernell, Reedy Graham, Archie Smith, and Levy J. Ward. The Rev. Jasper Pernell is on the disabled minister's list.

The Rev. Jackie Godwin gave the report on Foreign Missions, and the moderator gave reports on the Free Will Baptist Press and the Church Finance Association.

Brother Harold Herring brought greetings from Mount Olive College and gave the report on the College.

The Rev. Sam Weeks, superintendent of the Children's Home gave a report of progress on the Children's Home and the Retirement Homes. The congregation sang "I Feel Like Traveling On" and an offering of \$207.57 was taken for the Children's Home. The service was then turned over to the Rev. Sam Weeks to bring the morning message. He brought a very inspiring message from Exodus 20:1-17 and Matthew 22:36-40.

Brother Harold Herring dismissed the association and asked the blessings for the lunch that had been prepared.

SATURDAY AFTERNOON SESSION

The association reassembled with the singing of "Power in the Blood." Prayer was offered by the Rev. Leland Etheridge.

ORDAINING COUNCIL

The Ordaining Council of the Pee Dee Association reports the following meetings during 1976:

1. Met at Little Bethel Free Will Baptist Church on January 15, 1976 to examine the Rev. Gardner Jones for pastorate of the church. The Council found him sound and orthodox in the faith and approved him to pastor the church.

2. April 26, 1976—The Council met with the Rev. Lewis Sprouse at the request of Union No. 1, questioning the Rev. Sprouse concerning his attendance of Union Meetings. After questioning the Rev. Sprouse, he stated that he would attend the Union Meetings whenever possible. He further stated that if he couldn't attend, he would send an excuse. The Council gave Union No. 1, a written statement to this effect.

3. The Ordaining Council met with the Rev. Ransom McAbee on May 28, 1976, at Mount Olive Free Will Baptist Church for the purpose of accepting him into the Pee Dee Association, and examining him to pastor White Oak Free Will Baptist Church. The Rev. McAbee had a letter of recommendation from the Palmetta Conference. After questioning him, the Council found him sound and orthodox in the faith, and recommended him to pastor White Oak church, and accepted him as a minister in good standing of the Pee Dee Association.

We, your committee, met with members of Pleasant Meadow church, representing both letters that were presented to the association last October. We met with them shortly after the association adjourned at Cypress Creek church and gave the following report to the Executive Committee, to act on as God led them. We heard the discussion of one side represented by Sister Mary Benton and Brother Rossie Ward, and Brother G. B. Benton, who was not

present for discussion. This side stated that they were to have a called conference to get association delegates, but the conference was not held. They stated that Pleasant Meadow did not hold a conference to elect Brother Reedy Graham as pastor. They stated that the regular pastor's time was up on October 1, 1975, according to church regulations and they stated that the church held a conference while Brother Robert Sellers was still pastor to keep the church regulations and that Brother Robert Sellers resigned when the church killed the rule not to take a person in the church as a member that had been married more than one time. They stated that Reedy Graham resigned Mount Olive Church because of poor health problems, but took Pleasant Meadow church as pastor immediately after resigning. They stated that the people representing the other letter spoke ill of Brother I. G. Ward.

We heard the discussion from the other side, or the ones representing the other letter. This letter was represented by Brothers J. D. Sarvis, Conrad Ansback, Lawrence Hardee, and Reedy Graham. They stated that the time for their present pastor was not up until after the association. They stated that a committee from the church visited Brother Reedy Graham to see if he would replace Brother Robert Sellers as pastor. They stated that Brother Rossie Ward held a conference meeting to elect Brother Reedy Graham as pastor and that they had a written statement from Brother Reedy Graham to this effect. They stated that the church had to call the county police to help keep Brother Rossie Ward in order at the conference meeting. They stated that the only regulation voted out was the one that would not accept a person as member that had been married more than once. They stated that they held a conference meeting Saturday night before the association, but the deacons left with the church books and would not stay for the conference meeting. This report was given to the Executive Committee on November 12, 1975 at 7:30 p. m.
