PROCEEDINGS

Resolution Committee: Brother Horace Worley and Sisters Marie Long and Gray Long.

Finance Committee: Brother Earl Clewis, and Sisters Elizabeth Edwards and Pam Hooks.

Home Missions Committee: This is a standing committee, composed of Brothers Lloyd Thomas, Willie Jones, and Bud Williams.

There was a motion by Brother Mayo Brown that if there was no more business to come before the Association today that we adjourn until next year. Motion was carried and the Association was dismissed with prayer by Brother Neil Harrelson.
