ORDAINING COUNCIL

The Ordaining Council met on January 19, 1986, at Trinity Church with the Rev. Henry Ward concerning his pastoring Trinity Church. The council questioned him about his beliefs and found him to be sound in his faith. The council requested and received a letter of recommendation from the Central Association of South Carolina.

The Ordaining Council was requested and met with Brother Lloyd B. Duncan, March 23, 1986, about being approved as a licensed minister. Council recommended that he be licensed. NOTE: On August 3, 1986, the council received a letter from Brother Duncan with his credentials and his request that we drop his name as a minister.

The Ordaining Council met with the Rev. Jeff Cockrell on April 13, 1986, and approved him for work in the Pee Dee Association.

The Ordaining Council met on May 25, 1986, at White Oak Church with the Rev. Bobby K. Carden concerning his pastoring White Oak Church. The council questioned him about his beliefs and found him to be sound in faith. Council requested and received a letter of recommendation from the Palmetto Conference. The council also requested that he turn in his old license and receive a new one from the Pee Dee Association.

The Ordaining Council received a letter from Mount Beulah Church dated June 16, 1986, stating that Brother Carl Gattis was in good standing and recommended him for license. The council met with Brother Carl Gattis on July 6, 1986. Council questioned him and approved him for license.

The Ordaining Council met with the Rev. Henry Ward at Pine Level Church on August 10, 1986. Mr. Ward stated that he wanted to become a minister in the Pee Dee Association. Council recommended that he turn in his old license from the Central Conference and receive a new one from the Pee Dee Association.

The Ordaining Council recommends the Revs. Henry Ward and Bobby Carden to the Association for membership and the right hand of fellowship.

EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

We, your committee, beg leave to report that we met on August 25, 1986, with all members present. The Ordaining Council members were also present. The following business was taken care of:

1. The moderator and treasurer had received a bill from the Executive Committee of the North Carolina State Convention of Original Free Will Baptists in the amount of

\$573.56 for printing of our minutes in the *Yearbook*. There was not enough money in the treasury to pay this bill. There was a motion by the Rev. Hollan Norris that the clerk write a letter to all churches that were not represented by members of the committees present, asking them to contribute at least \$50 so this bill could be paid, as it would be a bad reflection on our Association if it remained unpaid. Motion carried and letters were sent to the following churches: Cypress Creek, Little Bethel, Mount Beulah, Fireway, Pleasant Meadow, Thomasboro, Trinity and White Oak.

2. The Rev. Dale Yarborough had left this area and wanted to join the Eastern Conference and needed a letter of recommendation. Motion by Brother Howard McPherson that the clerk write a letter of recommendation to the Eastern Conference for the Rev. Dale Yarborough. Motion carried and letter of recommendation was written and sent by the clerk.

3. The Ordaining Council recommended to the Executive Committee the following: That the Ordaining Council have permission to request that any minister, coming into the Association from another conference outside the North Carolina State Convention, give his credentials from that conference to the Ordaining Council to be put on file with the clerk of the Association, and be issued Pee Dee Association credentials. When he leaves and goes to another conference outside the North Carolina State Convention, his original credentials will be given back to him. Motion by Brother Howard McPherson that we accept the Ordaining Council's recommendation. Motion carried. The ordination certificate of the Rev. William E. Ward was given to the clerk to be put on file at this time.

4. The Ordaining Council then presented a list of 90 questions that they decided to use in preparing new ministers for ordination. These questions were broken down into four topics: 1. The Scriptures. 2. Theology. 3. Church Ordinances and Government. 4. History. They are to be given to the person 90 days prior to the date of his ordination. He will be given this time to study the questions, ask for any help he might need concerning them from the Ordaining Council. Prior to his ordination, he turns the questions back into the Ordaining Council and he will be given a test on them that he must pass to the satisfaction of the council (either oral or written) prior to his being ordained. The Executive Committee took no action on this order than all agreeing that it appeared that it would be good and would help the ministers as it covered things that they should know prior to being ordained into the Free Will Baptist Association.

Motion by Elgin Cribb to take up the business of the *Yearbook* and the minutes. Motion carried.

Motion by the Rev. Bobby Carden to participate in the *Yearbook*. Motion carried.

Motion by Owens Ward to have minutes printed was defeated.

Motion by Robert Adams to pay officers same as usual. Motion carried.

Motion by the Rev. Jay Hodge to give Mount Calvary a vote of thanks by standing for the hosting of the Association. Motion carried.

Motion by the Rev. James Nobles that if there was no more business to come before the Association that we adjourn until next year. Motion carried and the Association was dismissed with prayer by the Rev. Charles Hilbourn.

SPECIAL COMMITTEE

The special committee appointed eighteen years ago by the Association on gathering old resolutions that had been accepted recommended that the following resolutions be put in the minutes as rules and bylaws of our Association:

In October 1939, at Pine Level Church, this resolution was made: Be it resolved that we as ministers, members, or messengers use our influence against worthless criticism and gossip, and that ministers or members found guilty of such will answer for same to their church or Association.

This being adopted by motion of Brother D. F. Hester.

A protest resolution: Be it resolved that we do protest the two or three works of grace being preached in our churches. This protest was adopted by motion of Brother C. V. Ward.

At Oak Grove Church in October 1951, a resolutions committee recommended that we use our resolutions that we are using at the present time. There was a resolution passed to take a freewill offering for creating a budget for all retired ministers in the Pee Dee Association.

At Mission Valley Church in October 1952, a motion was made by the Rev. A. L. Duncan as follows: Be it resolved, that from this the eighteenth day of October, 1952, that if any preacher walks disorderly or goes contrary to the Free Will Baptist Discipline, to call in his credentials and turn them over to the clerk to be recorded in the Association record book and then burn his credentials.

At White Oak Church in October 1953, new business was called for. There was a motion by Brother W. F. Cartrette that each church enrolled in our Pee Dee Association be required to be present at forthcoming Associations either by letter, or delegate, or both. Any church failing to report in some way in the future may be subject to committee investigation.

On October 19, 1957, at White Oak Church, there was a motion by Brother D. J. Walton that each church use their choice as to number of delegates they send to the Association.

We, your committee, recommend that the above resolutions go down in the minutes continually throughout the years as rules and bylaws of our Pee Dee Association.

The following rules and regulations were approved and are to be added to this Special Committee report per Conference held at Oak Grove Church on October 17, 1981.

In October 1946, at Mount Calvary Church the following resolution was adopted: That we, as Free Will Baptist Churches, call or secure Free Will Baptist members to conduct revivals, preach, lecture, or hold special services of any kind at all times. If at any time, a minister of some other faith and practice, who is not of the Original Free Will Baptist Church, should be desired and considered worthy of conducting such services and meets approval of both the pastor and church, that such invitation shall be extended and delivered by your pastor only.

In October 1961, at Oak Grove Church a resolution to use our same resolutions that are at present printed in the minutes with the following addition: That we use preachers from the Free Will Baptist denomination in all churches.

On October 17, 1970, at White Oak Church a ruling that from now on, any minister coming into our Association from any other Conference or Association to do pastoral work must come before the Ordaining Council whether he joins the Association or not. He also must bring a letter of recommendation from the proper officials of the Association or Conference of which he is a member. Furthermore, if any minister that is now serving in the Pee Dee Association should leave the Association for as much as one year, then he must come before the Ordaining Council again.

On October 14, 1972, at Mount Calvary Church a resolution that in future years each church in our Association take up an offering for the Children's Home and bring it with them to the Association meeting.

The following rules and resolutions were approved and are to be added to this special committee report per Conference held at Beaverdam Church on October 16, 1982.

At Beaverdam Church on October 16, 1982, new business was called for and there was a motion by Robert Adams that the following resolutions be put in the Special Committee Report:

1. BE IT RESOLVED, that the Pee Dee Association and all the churches affiliated with it adhere to the *Statement of Faith and Discipline of Original Free Will Baptists of North Carolina* in conjunction with its calling and ordaining of men as ministers and deacons within our Association as stated and outlined in 1 Timothy 3 and Titus 1, so that our Association may prosper more in future years with dedicated leadership.

2. BE IT RESOLVED, that any minister who is called full-time from another Conference to a Pee Dee Association church, shall become a member of the Pee Dee Association. The incoming pastor should bring a letter of good standing from the Conference/Association of which he is presently a member. It is the responsibility of the local church to contact the Ordaining Council and give them the name of the incoming pastor. This is for them to approve him for this pastorate. This incoming pastor must be approved by the Ordaining Council before assuming the pastorate.
