

#### MINUTES OF MINISTERS CONFERENCE

Minutes of the Second Annual Ministers Conference of the Piedmont Association of the (original) Free Will Baptist, held Thursday, August 2, 1945. At Caroleen, N. C. with Caroleen Free Will Baptist Church.

The Conference opened with song, "What a Friend We Have in Jesus." Bro. James Coffey directed the choir. Led in prayer by Rev. L. P. Jordon.

The Moderator, Rev. Wade Calvert declared the house in order for business. The next thing in order was the election of Conference officers for the coming year.

Rev. L. S. Gray was elected Moderator; Rev. L. H. Clayton, Clerk; Rev. C. C. Holtzclaw, Assistant. A seat was granted Rev. Joe T. Melton from Rockfish Association.

The body motioned and carried that we hold a quarterly conference.

Dismissed by prayer by Rev. J. J. Brooks, for five-minute intermission before devotional service. Met back for the devotional service at eleven o'clock. Bro. James Coffey again had charge of the choir, they sang "Just Over in Glory Land" and "I'm Going That Way." Led in prayer by Rev. Paul Jenkins.

The Rev. N. H. English of Rockingham brought the message using a text, Matt. 13:44: "The Hidden Treasure." A wonderful message was delivered in the power of the Holy Spirit in which our hearts did rejoice.

We were happy to have with us Rev. Paul Jenkins and Rev. Ray Allman, from the Western Association.

Adjourned for lunch to meet back at 2:00 P. M. for the proceedings.

Met back at 2:00 P. M. Opened by a song, "Amazing Grace," led in prayer by Rev. L. M. Pierce.

The Moderator (Rev. L. S. Gray) called the house in order for business. Minister report called for; read and approved; called for letters of recommendation to be given to Ordaining Council for all ministers wishing to be ordained or to be licensed by the Organizing Council.

The Council reported the following for Ordination: Rev. P. M. Hobbs, Rev. Edd Reece, and Rev. L. M. Hooper, also received the transfer of Rev. Joe T. Melton's credentials was also granted; association license to Rev. E. G. Lawing, Rev. J. E. Floyd, and Rev. Jess Cannon.

We, the Ordaining Council recommend that their names be placed on the ordained and licensed list of ministers.

Benson, J. J.Brooks.

Thursday night service opened with Bro. James Coffey directing the choir. Song, "I'll Be Looking For You Up There" and "Sunshine in Glory." Prayer by Rev. Sherman Rice. A song, "My Lord Delivered Me." The right hand of fellowship was given to the following with a great expression of brotherly love into the Conference: Rev. Joe T. Melton, Rev. E. G. Lawing, Rev. Jess Cannon and Rev. J. E. Floyd.

A healing service was held for Bro. Connelly, the anointing of oil and the laying on of hands.

The people enjoyed the good singing, praised the Lord, shouted the Victory, had a wonderful time with the Lord.

The Thursday night message was delivered by Rev. L. M. Hooper, scripture lesson, Rom. 8-31, third chapter, and Rev. Wade Calvert, scripture, Job 33-34. Subject, "Down." Two wonderful messages we enjoyed.

Dismissed with a prayer by Rev. C. L. Scarborough, and adjourned until the next quarterly Conference to convene with Rocky Path Church at Nebo, near Marion, N. C. on November 3, 1945, at 10:00 A. M. (EST).

#### FRIDAY MORNING

The Piedmont Association of the (Original) Free Will Baptist Church met August 3, 1945, 10:00 A. M. at Caroleen, N. C. with the Caroleen F. W. B. Church.

The service opened with a song directed by Bro. James Coffey. Led in prayer by Rev. L. D. Gray.

Rev. J. L. Melton conducted the devotionals. The Moderator declared the house in order for business. The next thing in order was the election of the Associational Officers: Rev. O. M. Hilburn was elected Moderator.

The body motioned and carried to give Rev.O. M. Hilburn a majority vote since the ballot vote was close.

After a song and prayer, Rev. J. J. Brooks delivered the introductory message, using for his topic, "Which Things the Angels Desire to Look Into." I Pet. 1-12. A wonderful message was delivered in which our souls did feast and our hearts rejoiced. May their message long live in the hearts of us ministers, and that we might study for better qualification to face this evil world.

The Association adjourned to meet at 2:30 P. M. Friday.

Temperance: Rev. L. M. Hooper, Rev. P. M. Hobbs, and brother Ben Bailey.

Education: Rev. L. S. Gray, Rev. J. J. Brooks and Rev. C. L. Scarborough.

The roll of ministers was called, thirty being present.

The electing of the Ordaining Council was next in order for the coming year, elected as follows: Rev. L. D. Gray, Chairman; Rev. Wade Calvert, Rev. Roy Rikard, Rev. C. L. Scarborough, Rev. Sherman H. Oakes.

Friday night services opened with a song, "Tell It To Jesus" and "When We Go Sailing Home." Led in prayer by Rev. N. H. English. Song, "Moving To My New Home." A special song was called for by a selected quartet, "I'll Be Ready To Go Home." Rev. C. C. Holtzclaw, soprano, Novella Propst, alto, Rev. L. S. Gray, tenor, and Rev. H. L. Buckner, bass.

Message brought by Rev. Roy Rikard. Scripture, Psalm 119-9, using for his topic, "Young Men Cleanse Your Way."

After this wonderful message a song was rendered by the choir, "Just As I Am," and altar call was made and one precious soul was saved.

#### CONSTITUTION

- Article 1. This Association shall be called the Piedmont Association of the (Original) Free Will Baptist Church.
- Article 2. This Association shall be composed of delegates elected annually by the Free Will Baptist churches cooperating with this association and ministers who are members of this association.
- Article 3. The officers of this Association shall be a Moderator, Vice-Moderator, Clerk and Treasurer.
- Article 4. Each church shall be entitled to three delegates, and one additional delegate for every fifty members over one hundred.
- Article 5. The churches cooperating with this Association shall send by the hands of their delegates a full account of all work done by them during the year and all such statistics and information as will be interesting and helpful.
- Article 6. This Association shall meet once a year at such time and place as may be agreed upon by the preceding session, or by its Executive Board.
- Article 7. The Executive Board shall consist of three members elected by the Association, one for one year, one for two years and one for three years. The associational officials are members ex-officio of the Executive Board. The Executive Board shall have interim authority.
- Article 8. Ministers in good standing in our sister associations may be invited to a seat and take part in the deliberations and his name enrolled in our minutes.
- Article 9. The Association may withdraw from any church that becomes disorderly or refuses to represent by letter or delegates.
- Article 10. This Association will encourage a sound ministry, such as presents Christ as an all sufficient Saviour, having salvation possible to every human being on the terms of the gospel which is freely offered to all.
- Article 11. The Association assumes no higher authority than an advisory council.
- Article 12. This constitution may be amended at any annual meeting of this association by a two-thirds vote of the delegates attending such meeting, provided that notice of such change shall have been given during the first sitting of said meeting after permanent organization.
